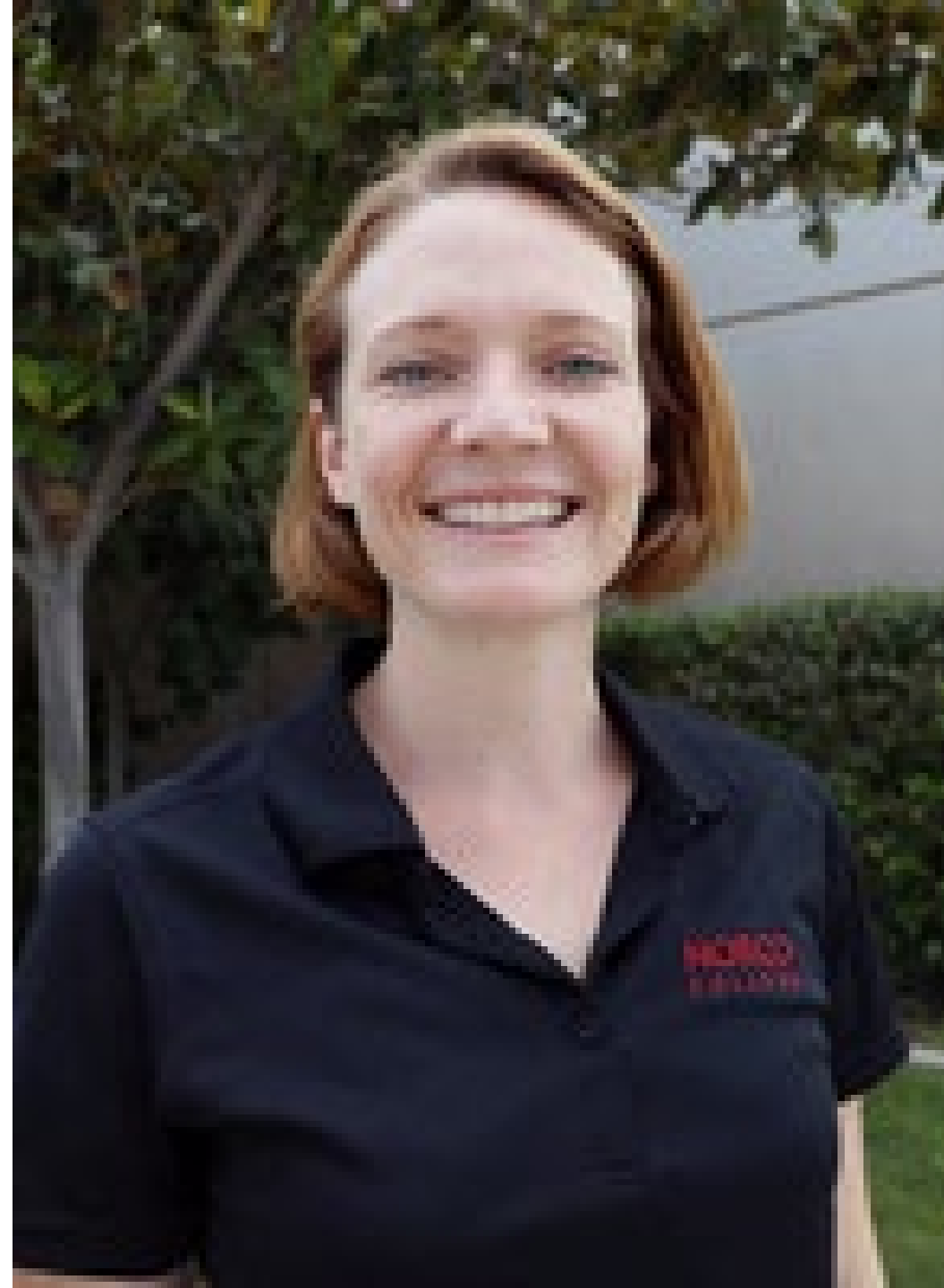

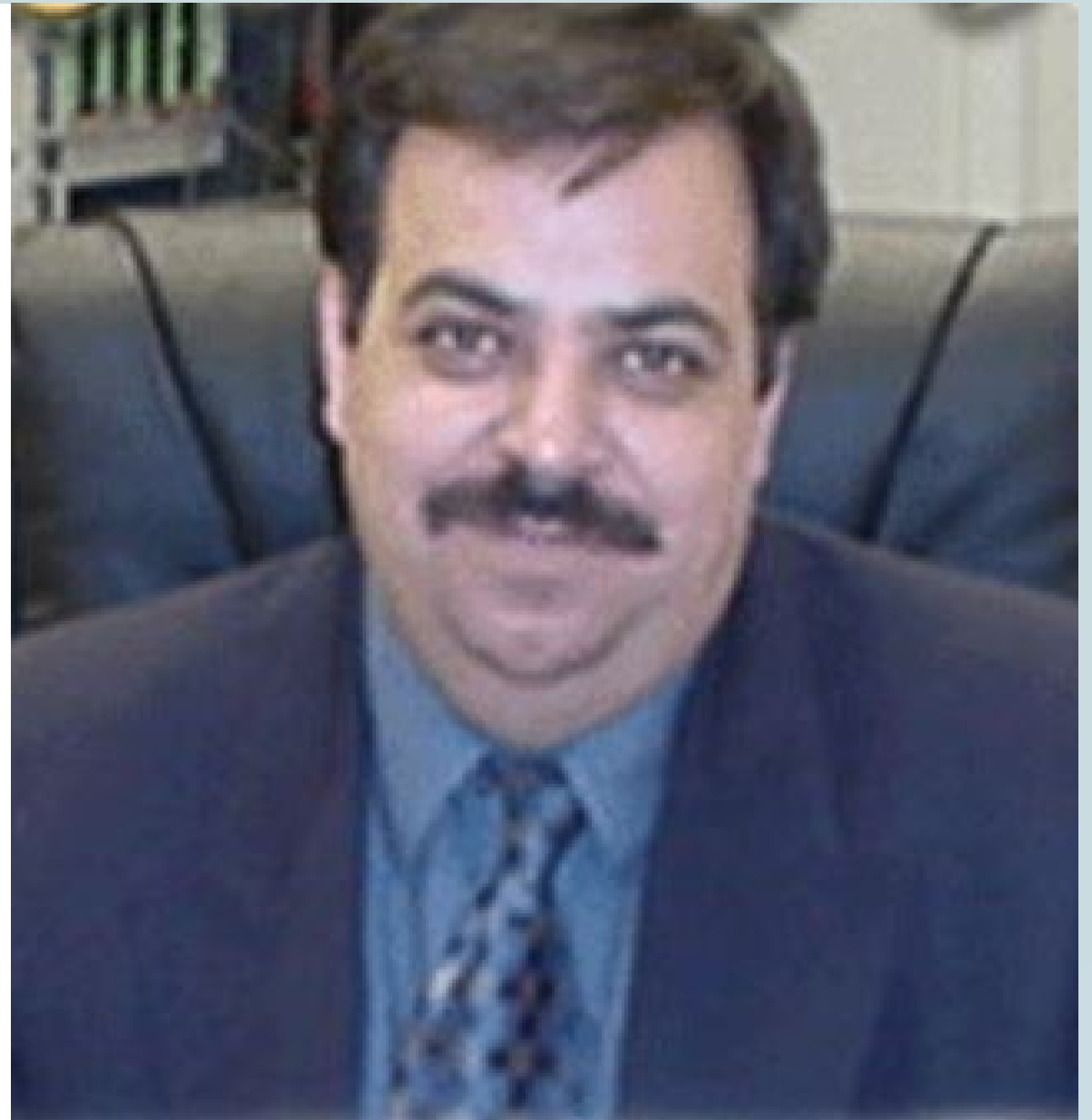

Graduation Stats

- A total of 1,110 graduates earned a combined total of 2,177 degrees and certificates.*
- 298 certificates awarded
- 255 students graduated with distinction (3.3 to 3.6 grade point average)
- 189 students graduated with great distinction (3.7 grade point average and above)
- 34 students graduated with a 4.0 grade point average or greater
- 66 Honors students
- 14 Veterans of the armed services graduated
- Our most senior graduate was age 65 and our youngest graduate was 17
- 34 JFK students graduated with a total of 114 associate degrees. This equals to \$192,970 in college savings.

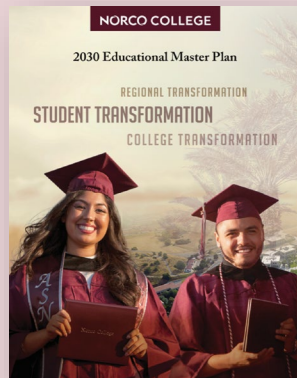

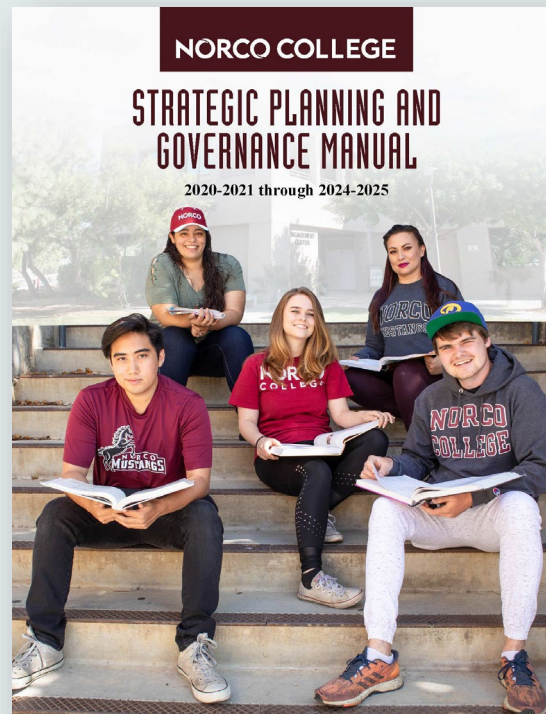

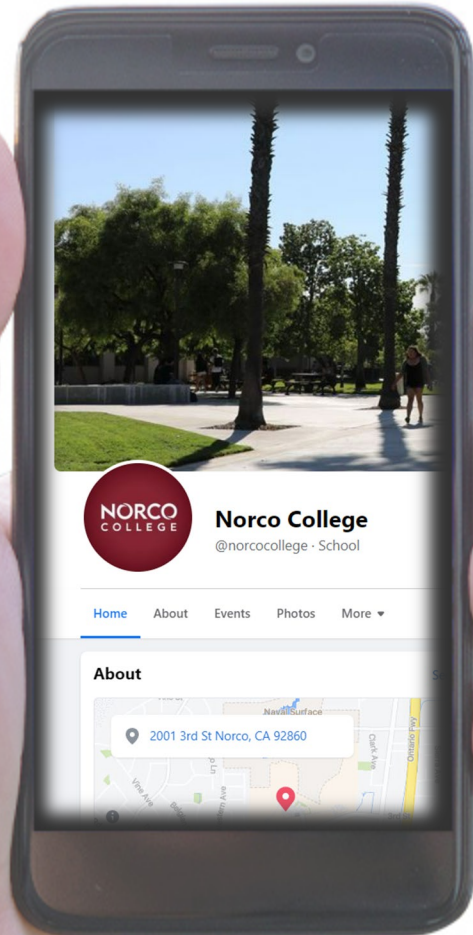
