COURSE WORK

ADJ-2: Principles and Procedures of the Justice System. This course provides an examination and analysis of due process in criminal proceedings from prearrest through trial and appeal utilizing statutory law and state and constitutional precedents.

ADJ-3: Concepts of Criminal Law. This course reviews the historical development, philosophy of law and constitutional provisions regarding the classification of crimes and their application to the system of administration of justice.



ADJ-4: Legal Aspects of Evidence. This course provides an overview of the origin, development, philosophy and constitutional basis of evidence, constitutional and procedural considerations affecting arrest, search and seizure, degrees of evidence and rules governing admissibility.

ADJ-12 – Criminalistics. This course introduces students to the role of criminalistics in criminal investigations. It includes the methods utilized in the forensic analysis of crime scenes, pattern evidence, instruments, trace evidence, biological evidence, weapons and firearms, questioned documents, and controlled substances.

COURSE WORK

ADJ-13 - Criminal Investigation. This course introduces students to the fundamentals of investigation, crime scene search and recording, collection and preservation of physical evidence.

ADJ-14: Advanced Criminal Investigation. This course is advanced training and skill development in the conduct of crime scene investigation and in the recording, collection and preservation of physical evidence. Focus is on the understanding and working knowledge of fingerprints, ballistics, firearms identification, varieties of trace evidence and a basic introduction to forensic sciences.

ADJ-27: Forensic & Crime Scene
Photography. This course covers the
theory and practice of forensic and crime
scene photography, with a specific focus
upon the proficiency and development
of technical photography skills in legal
and field environments including basic
principles of photography, a focus upon
photographic documentation of forensic
environments, forensic light source
photography, and lawful photographic
evidence collection.
