Since classrooms were still being constructed at the start of the fall semester, Norco College's first daytime students attended classes at the Church of the Rock in Norco. This group of about 200 students was known as the "Norco Pioneers."

The course offerings consisted of first-year transferrable courses such as Psychology, English, Guidance, Political Science, CIS, and Health Science.

The first student to arrive at the makeshift campus was Paul Nesbitt. "This is really convenient," he said. "It's a walk and I don't have to drive."

The campus would not open until spring 1991, but the Norco Pioneers took pride in being the first to attend courses. "I'm glad I'm a part of it. It will be great to be a part of the new school opening up," said Vanessa Hernandez.
