Partnerships & Programs

Military Times ranked Norco College as one of the **Best Colleges for Veterans for the ninth time in ten years**. It was also designated a Military Friendly® School.

Home to one of the largest middle college high schools in the nation, John F. Kennedy (JFK) Middle College High School, with hundreds of students enrolled each year. Since opening in 2006, JFK Middle College High School has graduated middle college students, many with at least 30 units of college credit and associate degrees.

Serving nearly 3,000 registered apprentices, the Norco College Apprenticeship program is a federal and state-registered program that partners with the **LAUNCH Apprenticeship Network** and regional industry partners. Norco College also serves as the Local Education Agency for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers and Southwest Carpenters. Apprenticeship allows students to gain technical skills in the classroom while working full-time in their fields of study.

Since 2017, Norco College has partnered with the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to offer the **Rising Scholars Prison Program** at California Rehabilitation Center, a medium-security state prison in Norco. Serving nearly 500 students each semester, it is designed to offer on-site, face-to-face courses that fulfill all California State University general education requirements. Graduates of the program earn associate degrees in Business Administration and Sociology.

In collaboration with high school partners, Norco College has expanded the **Dual Enrollment** program which addresses the low college-going rate in the area, college access, and equity among students. The program has been implemented at eleven local high schools and Charter schools saving people time and money.
