#### What's been going on with ECE at Norco College?

- Teaching online for over two years and its impact on our program and our students, and your future employees
  - Went online in 2020 and been online predominantly since. Practicum also moved online.
     Had amazing partnerships and allowed students to zoom into sessions with children and staff meetings. Students have been utilizing videos as well.
  - Have not had the opportunity to be in the classroom and teach activities to children but have been teaching to family members and others. Students are doing a lot of reflective work.
  - Have prepared students as best as possible. Theory but not practical ready.
  - As of next year, we will be back in the community. Sister colleges are back in person.
     Observations will begin in Fall.

- We have learned a lot, including a different way of getting information to students. We have come together as a community and found many great resources including the Multi-lingual Toolkit. We are also using tools to have students video themselves.
- Update on our partnership with AUSD and Stokoe Innovative Teaching Center
  - Joint venture with RCC and AUSD. Adult classrooms are embedded into the location.
     Kinder through 6<sup>th</sup> on the property.
  - o Since closing in 2010 we have been the Temple Beth El and Head Start.
  - In 2017 Assemblywoman Cervantes submitted funding for Early Childhood Education, \$5 million.
  - Currently have an MOU going to the Boards, which has been agreed upon with faculty, administration, and boards.
  - Fall of 2023, first-class will open only to our ECE students. Students will have the opportunity to learn at an elementary site
  - o Inclusion, Outdoor Classroom. Redoing the entire outdoor playground to be inclusive
  - We will be remodeling classrooms and check-in office
  - Students may have an opportunity to sub
- High Scope training
  - Will be attending High Scope training in July in order to integrate into courses.
- Participation in the UPLIFT grant with Cal Poly Pomona
  - DLL competencies
  - o Recruiting underserved students boost populations we are missing
  - Met with Employment Placement Coordinator and Adult Education Advisor
  - Create pathways for adult education students
  - Involve Umjoa program
  - Dual language competencies, aligning with teacher performance expectations.
     Integrating into our teaching.
  - The partnership will build upon each other's courses.
- Participation in Commission for Teacher Credentialing Pilots
  - Pilot 1 Aligning with the Teacher Performance Expectations CAP TPE Course Outlines
    of Record updates; tracking completion of 24 units; inclusion of diversity, equity and
    inclusion elements
    - Redo CORs to align with six teacher competencies, focusing on teacher-level permits. 16 units general ed, 175 hours.
    - Alignment has been done in CORs. Next is looking at major assignments.
  - Pilot 2 Self-Study in preparation for accreditation

- First Five
  - Pay is not equitable
  - First Five Riverside has a wage enhancement opportunity.
