I. Welcome and Introductions

Participants from various sectors in early childhood education, social services, and higher education were present. Key stakeholders included representatives from childcare centers, school districts, nonprofit organizations, family services, and higher education institutions.

II. Partner Updates & Reports

III. Programmatic and Site-Based Updates

Teacher Preparation Site

- Utilization of **storage room**.
- Upcoming Literacy Day and STEM Day events.
- Plan to invite the **STEM program** to increase **student-child interaction**.

Childcare Centers

- Noted abundant opportunities across multiple sites.
- Students can commit to 2 full days or 3 six-hour days per week.
- Centers may reimburse tuition for student workers.

IV. Student Support & Resources

Job Board & Partner Collaboration

- Strengthen use of **job boards** to connect students with employment.
- Expand partner networks.

Practicum Funding & Support

- Gas cards, books, infant mental health certification, and Conscious Discipline
 workshops available.
- Emphasis on CPR certification and site-based training.

Federal Work Study & Practicum Challenges

Norco College partner noted challenges balancing full-time work with full-time study.

Apprenticeships & Programs

- Highlighted the We People Program: no prior experience required, 16 hours/week,
 public sector career pathway.
- Encouraged development of apprenticeship programs.
- Identified the need for **more male teachers** and breaking stigma in the field.

V. Recruitment, Inclusion & Professional Development

Recruitment

Discussion of Recruitment Day and the demand for substitutes and permitted teachers.

Inclusion

- Updates on Riverside Office Inclusion Grant and Inclusion Network.
- Counties, districts, and state entities are seeking inclusion partners for fall.

Parent Engagement

- Students should attend parent meetings during practicum.
- Encouraged comfort with parent communication and participation in parent-teacher
 conferences (scheduled for May 8 & 9).

Professional Development

- Support for students to attend conferences, including NAEYC.
- Discussed early childhood marketing by professionals with business expertise.
- Stressed need for **business administration support** and enrollment management.

VI. Networking & Career Pathways

- Identified a gap between education and workforce readiness.
- Proposals:
 - o Create more **networking opportunities**.
 - o Increase **student exposure to multiple ECE career paths**, not just teaching.
 - Encourage interactions with nursing students at early childhood sites.
 - o Implement a **professional dress code** to model workplace expectations.
 - Promote global perspectives and worldwide best practices.

VII. Action Items & Next Steps

- Organize Recruitment Day.
- Expand apprenticeship and mentorship programs.
- Increase parent and community involvement in student practicum.
- Create a resource guide for alternative ECE career paths.
- Establish a **professional development calendar** (conferences, certifications, workshops).
- Continue collaboration with **partner agencies** for funding and student support.
