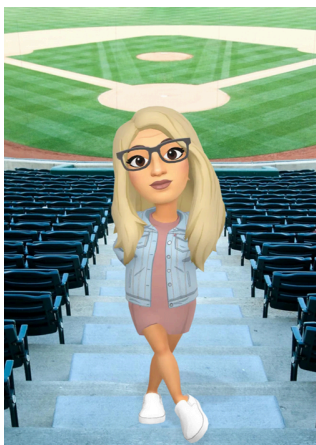

ADJ 1- 38217 , Intro to Administration of Justice
Online, Start/End Dates: 8/19/24 - 12/14/24

The history and philosophy of administration of justice in America; recapitulation of the system; identifying the various subsystems, role expectations, and their interrelationships; theories of crime, punishment, and rehabilitation; ethics, education, and training for professionalism in the system.

UC/CSU transferable.

3 units

ADJ 8 32831 Juvenile Law and Procedure
Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

The organization, functions, and jurisdiction of juvenile agencies; the processing and detention of juveniles; juvenile case disposition; juvenile statutes and court procedures

UC/CSU transferable.. 3 units

ADJ 9- 39353 , Law American Society
Online, Start/End Dates: 8/19/24 - 12/14/24

A general survey of practical law intended as an introduction to the American legal system and to acquaint the student with elements of the law that affect everyday legal relationships: criminal and juvenile justice, consumer law, family law, housing law, and individual rights and liberties. Emphasis is placed on the philosophical and political foundations of law and on civil law. Recommended for prelaw students and for others interested in the practical application of the law. UC/CSU transferable.

AHS 6 38246, 39397 & 38297 Art Appreciation
Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

An introductory course for the non-art major. The creative process and the diversity of style, technique and media, evident in various art forms throughout history and culture

UC/CSU transferable.. 3 units

BIO 10 38308 Life Science Principles
Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

For non-life science majors. An introduction to the principles of life sciences through the study of basic biological concepts of living organisms involving structure, behavior, evolutionary relationships and the social and environmental implications of life science.

UC/CSU transferable.. 3 units

BIO 18 38311 Human Genetics
Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

A general education course for non-biology majors and allied health students who are interested in the underlying mechanisms of human heredity. Emphasis will be given to the role of genetics and environment on cells, individuals, family and human populations. Discussion on human genetic disorders and the social implications of modern human genetics will be included.

UC/CSU transferable.. 3 units

BIO 45 38319 Human Anatomy and Physiology
Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

An introductory and survey course of structural and functional aspects of the human body. Emphasis is placed on cell organization, human tissues, and discussion of each of the human systems.

UC/CSU transferable.. 3 units

COM 1 38439 , Public Speaking
Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

Prepares students to compose (develop outlines and research) and present a minimum of four speeches, including informative and persuasive presentations in front of a live audience. Emphasis will include: different purposes of speaking, types of speeches and organizational patterns, topic choice and audience adaptation, rhetorical principles, development and support of sound reasoning and argument, theories of persuasion, application of ethics in public speaking, listening skills, and theory and principles of effective delivery.

GENERAL DUAL ENROLLMENT

COM 9 38472, Interpersonal Communication

Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

Analyzes the dynamics of the two-person communication process in relationships. Students study values, communication models, listening, verbal and nonverbal communication, perception, self-concept, self-disclosure, management of emotions, relationship theories and conflict management.

UC,CSU transferable 3 units

ENG 1A 39304 39332, English Composition

Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

Emphasizes skills in critical reading, and writing, including research. Integrated reading and writing assignments respond to various rhetorical situations. Students will produce a minimum of 7500 words of assessed writing. Classroom instruction integrates writing lab activities.

UC/CSU transferable. 4 units

ENG 1B 38709, Critical Thinking and Writing

Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

Students will critically read diverse literary texts in order to compose inquiry-driven writing.

UC/CSU transferable. 4 units

GAM 1 38770, Business of Video Games

Online, Start/End Dates: 8/19/24 - 12/14/24

An introduction to the field of game development. Students will explore the job market, career paths and business aspects of game development professionals.

UC/CSU transferable. 3 units

GAM 2 38773, History of Video Games

Online, Start/End Dates: 8/19/24 - 12/14/24

A comprehensive study of the evolution of video games, including their technological and artistic antecedents, with analysis of how video games reflect the beliefs, aspirations and values of the cultures where they flourish. Study includes gameplay experience and analysis of notable game genres, identifying significant artistic and technological innovations.

UC/CSU transferable. 3 units

GUI 47 38814 38820 38821, Career Exploration and life planning

Online, Start/End Dates: 8/19/24 - 12/14/24

In depth career and life planning: Topics include extensive assessment of one's values, skills, interest, abilities, opportunities, and personality; life problem-solving and self-management skills; adult development theory and the changes that occur over the life span; and exploration of career opportunities based on personal attributes and goals. An intensive focus on decision making, goal setting and job search strategies, as well as resume writing and interviewing skills will also be addressed. UC/CSU transferable. 3 units

GUI-48-39389 39388 College Success Strategies

Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24 - 12/14/24

This comprehensive course integrates personal growth and values, academic study strategies and critical thinking techniques. Students will obtain skills and personal/interpersonal awareness necessary to succeed in college. 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

HIS 2 38851 World History Since 1500

Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

A survey of the evolution of modern world history from the 16th century emergence of new global political, economic, social, and intellectual patterns, through the era of industrialization and imperialism, to the world wars of the 20th century and the present.

UC/CSU transferable.. 3 units

HIS 7 38869 & 38870 US History from 1865

Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

Political, social and economic development of the United States from 1865 to the present; the evolution of American thought and institution; principles of national, state, and local government.

UC/CSU transferable.. 3 units

MAT 12- 38974 , Statistics

Prerequisite: MAT-9 or MAT-37 or MAT-42 or qualifying placement level

Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

A comprehensive study of measures of central tendency and variation, correlation and linear regression, probability, the normal distribution, the t-distribution, the chisquare distribution, estimation, testing of hypotheses, analysis of variance, and the application of statistical software to data, including the interpretation of the relevance of the statistical findings. Applications using data from business, education, health science, life science, psychology, and the social sciences will be included. UC/CSU transferable. 4 units

MAT 25- 39007, Liberal Arts Math

Online, Start/End Dates: 8/19/24 - 12/14/24

A college level survey course of selected topics from the history and development of mathematics, patterns and inductive reasoning, set theory and deductive reasoning, geometry, probability, statistics, and problem solving. You may cover 2 of the following topics: dimensional analysis, geometry, mathematics of different bases, or development of numerical systems from ancient cultures. It is designed for students majoring in liberal arts, education, or communication. Calculators or computers may be used for selected topics. 4 units UC CSU Transferable

POL 1 39116, American Politics

Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24-12/14/24

An introduction to the principles, structures, processes, and culture that inform American politics. Specific focus is placed on the development of the Constitution, the government it engenders, the development of the American polity, the formation of policy, and the connections between the national government and California's government.

SOC 1 39418 , Into to Sociology

Online. Start/End Dates: 8/19/24- 12/14/24

An introduction to the basic concepts relating to the study of society. Includes investigation into the foundations of sociology including its overall perspective, theoretical orientations, and research methodology; the foundations of social life including the components of culture, social interaction and the process of socialization, groups, organizations, and deviance; economic social inequality based upon class, race, sex, and age; social institutions; and dimensions of social change.

UC/CSU transferable. 3 units

1. Who can participate?

All students starting freshman year through 12th grade at any of the following High Schools:

-All CNUSD High Schools, Jurupa Valley High School, CAVA, IQLA, and La Sierra High School

2. How do I apply?

Complete the Norco College admissions application through cccapply.org using your personal email address. **(Do not use your CNUSD email)** Students must create an account and apply online for the upcoming term. After submitting the application, students must wait 1-2 business days to receive the "Welcome to Norco College" email.

3. How to Access MyPortal?

Wait 1-2 business days to receive your "Welcome to Norco College" email sent from admissions@norcollege.edu (search through all folders, including junk/spam)

Follow steps on Welcome email to login with temporary password.

*Activate your RCCD student email account right away through MyPortal using your RCCD student email and password.

4. How to reset MyPortal Password?

You can request to have your password reset by:

- Visiting the Admissions & Records office in person with a photo ID.
- Emailing Admissions@norcollege.edu, be sure to include your college ID #, Name, Date of Birth, and a copy of your photo ID for verification.

5. How do I get a registration date?
