• Emergency conditions allowance applications were discussed including CVC-OEI and board policy on reserves; reserves currently 5% but asking also for two full months of operating costs in reserve, which is 30-40 million (district usually carries about 16 million); fiscal plan and support allocations is 18 million and is usually divided up between the district and three colleges; the district suggested allocating a large chunk of money to the solar project; will get revenue back from the solar project but want to ensure that the funds will come back to instructional support; no money to update the buildings across the district because of the failure of the bond several years ago
