- There are various charts, information, and statistics that show the growth and progress that Norco College has had on students.
  - There are four main standards which show us our institutional integrity and our productivity.
  - Academic 1B represents academic quality and what majors we have to offer.
    - She explains Norco Colleges' Mission statement.
    - Standard 2 has to do with creating courses for Norco College.
  - 2B is Library based. Students have shown a positive impact because of the extended hours ASNC advocated for.
    - 2C Student Support Services.
- Standard 3A is about the human resources which is how we hire people to help you be successful.
- Our annual tech survey is a great way to have your voices heard. 285 students took this survey. This is how faculty makes a lot of decisions.
  - D is our financial resources.
  - 4A is about leadership and governments like ASNC.
  - 4B is about the president and insures they help us move forward.
    - 4D is college functionality.
  - Lastly, The Quality Focus Evaluation that tests us on an institutional level.
    - This report will be completed October 25th 2019.
    - March 2-5th 2020, Team Members will be here to speak with students.

#### VIII. ASNC Advisor Report

- Sent an email about the NC Scholarship application, it is mandatory for ASNC members to apply.
- There are Scholarship Workshops on October 24th, November 12th, and December 6th from 12:50-1:50pm. Please attend one.
- We are closing applications for ASNC, but encourage people to get involved in clubs or in other programs on campus.
  - Mark: Happy that you guys helped out yesterday and thank you for what you do.
  - Mark: A budget was put based on random numbers until the semester started and we know how many students have paid their student fees.
- Mark: In the past we used money from the reserves to buy vans, sails for amphitheater.
  - Mark: Can't let this money sit and can be taken from other people.
  - Mark: The soccer field is being replaced because it wasn't done properly.

- Mark: First home game for Rugby is October 26th at 11am.

  - Rugby will fundraise and reimburse ASNC \$7,500.
- Andrea: How is the fundraiser going with Crunch? It is going great. Crunch gets nothing from the fundraiser with Rugby.

  - Andrea: For the reimbursement, how would that work?
- Edwin: We would pay for the field with ASNC funds, but reimbursements would need to be deposited into the ASNC Trust Account.
