Sen.09.22.01 Grab and Go Food Bags/Student Housing Motion Author: Angelica Calderon (Discussion/Action Item)

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote on using \$10,000 from Supplies (92906) and another \$10,000 from District Student Employment (92315) and move it to Food Pantry/Hotel Vouchers (92803) for food distribution and student housing.

Angelica Calderon: Discussed the money with Mark and Tharek about budgeting. Plan was to take \$10,000 each from Supplies and District Student Employment. Trying to get a grant for student housing, \$2,000 per student. Some students are without housing, if they reach out to Mark they are able to get housing then directed to the career center.

Sen.09.22.02 Approval of up to \$500 from Executive Contingencies (92199) to purchase incentives for students who participate in the National Assessment of Collegiate Campus Climates (NACCC).

Motion Author: Edwin Romero (Discussion/Action Item)

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote on using \$1,000 to purchase 40 \$25 gift cards that will go to NC students as an incentive for taking the NACCC survey by November 2. Edwin Romero: Purchasing incentives for the survey that will be taking place next month. Survey is national and they are asking for gift cards that they can give out to students who do take it. They do not have a line item, so they are asking ASNC to fund for the gift cards. Controversy about the survey being 6 pages long and it will take students about 10 or so minutes to take. Survey is good but does not ask open ended questions and good data couldn't be taken. Several surveys may be put out. \$500 would be given for the gift cards and any student at Norco College would be eligible to win the gift cards if completed the survey. Put in a request to shorten the survey. Working with Greg A with Institutional Effectiveness that conducts the survey to see if we can reduce the amount of questions. Survey is to target racial, climate, and diversity on campus to see if they are comfortable and to see if they are experiencing racism on campus.

Michael Moreno: Did a survey for a gift card. Halfway through the survey he was thinking of giving up, but \$5 gift cards were given to every student who took the survey rather than a selective few.

Isaac Nunez: Doubling the money to \$1,000 and making the gift cards \$25 each so that more students participate, and more data can be drawn. 40 random students would be chosen out of the participants to receive the \$25 gift card. Seconded By: Tharek Phounsavat

Strategic Planning

Makenna Ashcraft: Spoke about all the great things that the campus is doing. Just an introduction about all the things that Norco College has done.

Edwin Romero: Received an email from Dr. Green that she wants ASNC to look at the strategic plan and to go over it, make recommendations, and then send it back. The strategic plan is a book around 90 pages.

Circle of Change

Edwin Romero: 40 students and 4 advisors will be able to attend for free. Students will need to apply through a Google doc.

Student Leadership Conference

Edwin Romero: For student leadership, club organizations and advisors to see how they are financing their clubs. Workshops and trainings will take place. Networking is good overall. Purchased an unlimited package which means we can open this to an unlimited amount of people. Event will take place on October 2nd. Begins at 10am and ends at 5:30pm. Link will be shared with the conference schedule. Four workshops and one keynote speaker. Once registration is available, sign up for the workshops that will fit your schedule and that interest you. Will be open to all students but will be more directed towards ASNC and clubs and organizations.

Propositions 16 & 17

Edwin Romero: Stem cell research and taxes. Proposition 16 is about reintroducing affirmative action to the state of California. A constitutional change that would take place. Voting yes would mean that you support this constitutional amendment including race and gender when something to consider in college and job applications. It is currently illegal in the state of California. There

must be criteria through strict scrutiny and through the legal processes and voted on by the legislature.

Tharek Phounsavat: The Supreme Court ruled that it was unconstitutional. Edwin Romero: Proposition 17 would allow those on parole, after convicted and served time, to vote. Currently, if you are on parole and have convicted a felony, you cannot vote.

Townhall Event

Angelica Calderon: Edwin did send out an email and Ms. Moore had sent out an email as well. She is meeting with her this Thursday. We can implement an incentive for students to attend.

Housing & Grab and Go Food Bags

Since more money was put towards housing and food, we should promote it. If students are struggling, then it may be hard for them to reach out. Students that were given housing were in abusive relationships or kicked out of their homes.

Edwin Romero: Touch base with Mark and see if they have shirts available to give out. There is a committee called the CARE Committee that is referred to Mark. They have an interview with Mark, and he will then offer the assistance. Grab and go food bags are on social media and on the websites. We would have to contact Mark about housing promotion.

Anisha: Concerned about the qualifications for housing.

Academic Senate

Angelica Calderon: Brought up previous concerns. Sharing the Potential Language to Consider. There was a conflict with professors and regular meetings and occasional meetings. If occasional meetings conflict with other class meetings, you cannot register them both. They are working about the language that is going to be considered. If the professors do not list a date and time, they cannot make it mandatory because it was not listed.

Diversity and Inclusion

Anisha Salhotra: They sent an update for the panels but have not mentioned anything else. The panel was going to be different students from different clubs and organizations, we would pick a couple student delegates and speak about their journey and what they must go through.
