- *Evangelina Abeyta, the president of PRISM, reports that this event has been done in the past and has been proven to be very successful. Many students have appreciated the campus support of the LGBTQ+ community. This shares numerous topics such as how to be more involved with campus. Last year, PRISM had funding for this event, but this year they don't, so they need funding for the entire \$5,000.*

*The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote on funding to send 25 Umoja students on a field trip to Knott’s Berry Farm.*

- *Umoja presents that community college enrollment has greatly decreased over the past years. Many of these declines were in minority communities as they were the most affected by school enrollment. This trip will reward students for continuously showing up to classes during the pandemic. They must meet Umoja’s minimum requirements to attend.*

**Sen.03.18.05 Approval of up to \$13,000, \$5,000 from Representation Fee Obligation (92142), and \$ 8,000 from Transportation Fee Obligation (92133 ) to subsidize the cost of graduation regalia for approximately 250 students.**

*The Associated Students of Norco College will consider approval of subsidizing the cost of graduations gowns for students participating in commencement, on a first come first serve basis, so that the total costs of the students would be \$20 for associates degree recipients and \$15 for certificate recipients, in order to promote participation in the 2022 Commencement Ceremony.*

- *We would be spending close to \$13,000 for commencement items. Some of the funds will be coming from students as there will be around 500 students walking this year.*
