FY 22/23 Budget Performance Report

- - District Office Expenses = \$ 7.6 mil

- - 13xx's accounts overspent by \$1.7mill (13xx represents instructor salaries)
- Dramatic increase in spending \$ for faculty such as counselors ever since we transitioned to Guided Pathways

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CMAC Committee Meeting Notes

Main Points to begin with Program

- -Carol e-mail work on ZTC course mapping and stipend for OER
- For acceleration grant due on the 15th, implementation due at the end of the month (180,000\$ grant)
- -1st step is to send out solicitations to see which facility/department wants to work with grants.
- -Find out gaps in program including ZTC general eds

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- -Physics department is open to it but calculus series (which is a piece to get a physics ADT) is lose on participation
- -English department has long standing of ZTC participation
 - -Some modern material is copyrighted, but a completely English associates using ZTC Classes is possible
 - -Steven is going to check on that possibility
 - -Library can be a good resource to create a ZTC pathway.
- -ZTC is defined differently based on the institution (We define it as courses with costs lower than 50\$ to avoid having to change the definition constantly)
- -Most of grant will go towards faculty compensation in the creation of ZTC courses
- -Some money of grant is to promote idea but for grant to be fulfilled, at least one pathway has to be ZTC.
- -Hourly or flat fee (10k a course) is incentive for faculty to create a full ZTC course
- -There should be at least one section from each department that is ZTC to create a pathway to a full ZTC course.
 - -Money should be spread between disciplines rather than dumped into one discipline
- -Look into the upcoming CalGETC in tandem with IGETC.
- -Look into MVC's definition of ZTC, committee will review MVC's definition to see which definition NC would like to follow as ZTC courses are created.
- -Thinking that a summit would be a good way to promote, but it might be better to do smaller presentations
- -Faculty doesn't comprehend the impact that software/textbook costs have to students
- -Orientation for new students should showcase "ZTC" courses as a possibility
- -Should display A-frames across campus to show ZTC as a possibility
- -Could set up a booth with food as an incentive to promote ZTC/LTC to students and staff (in tandem with ASNC and ASNC activities team)
