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Concurrent Enrollment vs Dual Enrollment

- High school students enrolling in Norco College classes
- Tuition is waived, but students pay all other fees because they are able to access all resources on campus
- Students are responsible for textbook and materials costs
- Students follow an educational plan by a college Counselor
- Students:
 - 10th -12th grade at JFK
 - Students from both local and out of area high schools, and homeschool/charter schools

- Norco College classes schedule for high school students
- Tuition is waived, and all fees are waived
- Access all resources on campus
- Textbooks are usually provided by the high school (OER/ZTC preferred)
- Open to students at local high school districts who have agreements with Norco College/RCCD:
 - Corona Norco USD
 - Alvord USD
 - Jurupa Valley USD
 - Charters: Excelsior, CAVA & IQLA

Registration Process - Concurrent Enrollment / JFK



- Parent and high school consent are required by Ed Code
- Students apply to Norco College and need a Norco College ID number and email address
- Students are reviewed and flagged by Admissions & Records each term
- Students register for classes during their assigned registration period
- 5 student cap reinstated Winter/Spring 2025
- Instructors can allow additional concurrent enrollment students to enroll in their class by giving them add codes on the first day of class
- Students are responsible for dropping themselves according to drop deadlines

Registration Process - Dual Enrollment



- New Platform DualEnroll.com
- Students apply to Norco College and need a Norco College ID number and email address
- Students request classes through DualEnroll.com
- Admissions & Records registers students into the dual enrollment classes
- Students request drops through DualEnroll.com according to drop deadlines

Teaching Dual/Concurrent Enrollment Students



- These are college classes with college-level rigor and expectations, but they are high school age so they are still learning skills they will need to be successful in college, such as:
 - Understanding their Syllabus
 - Communicating with Instructors
 - Navigating Drop/Census Dates
 - Following an Educational Plan
