RN/ADN General Education and Prerequisite Courses 2024-2025

The Associate Degree Nursing Program (ADN) is approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) and is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, Inc. (ACEN). The ADN program requires four semesters and an intersession, excluding the completion of prerequisite courses. Upon completion of the program, the graduate earns an Associate in Science Degree in Nursing and is eligible to apply for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) for licensure as a Registered Nurse in the State of California.
