Fell sick?

Coronaviruses can cause mild to moderate symptoms like the common cold. Complications and outcomes of COVID-19 are still being investigated.

Symptoms of COVID-19 may include:

- Runny nose
- Headache
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Fever
- General feeling of being unwell

Stay Home if You're Sick

Please do NOT contact the Public Health Department directly to request testing.

If you have symptoms other than fever, cough and shortness of breath, County Public Health recommends staying home until you are well.

- Wash your hands frequently for at least 20 seconds
- Clean & Disinfect Frequently
- If you develop a fever while home, stay home until 24 hours after the fever resolves without fever-reducing medicines - Tylenol, Advil or cold medicine that contains these products.

If you have to go out

- Wear a mask if available
- Cover your nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing
- Avoid touching eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands
- Wash your hands frequently for at least 20 seconds
- Clean & Disinfect Frequently
- Social Distancing – 3 to 6 feet

Do I have COVID-19 What are the symptoms?

If you have shortness of breath or a fever or cough, or if you had recent contact with someone who had shortness of breath or a fever or cough. Contact a medical professional who will determine if you need to be tested. If you need to seek medical care, please call ahead before you go in.

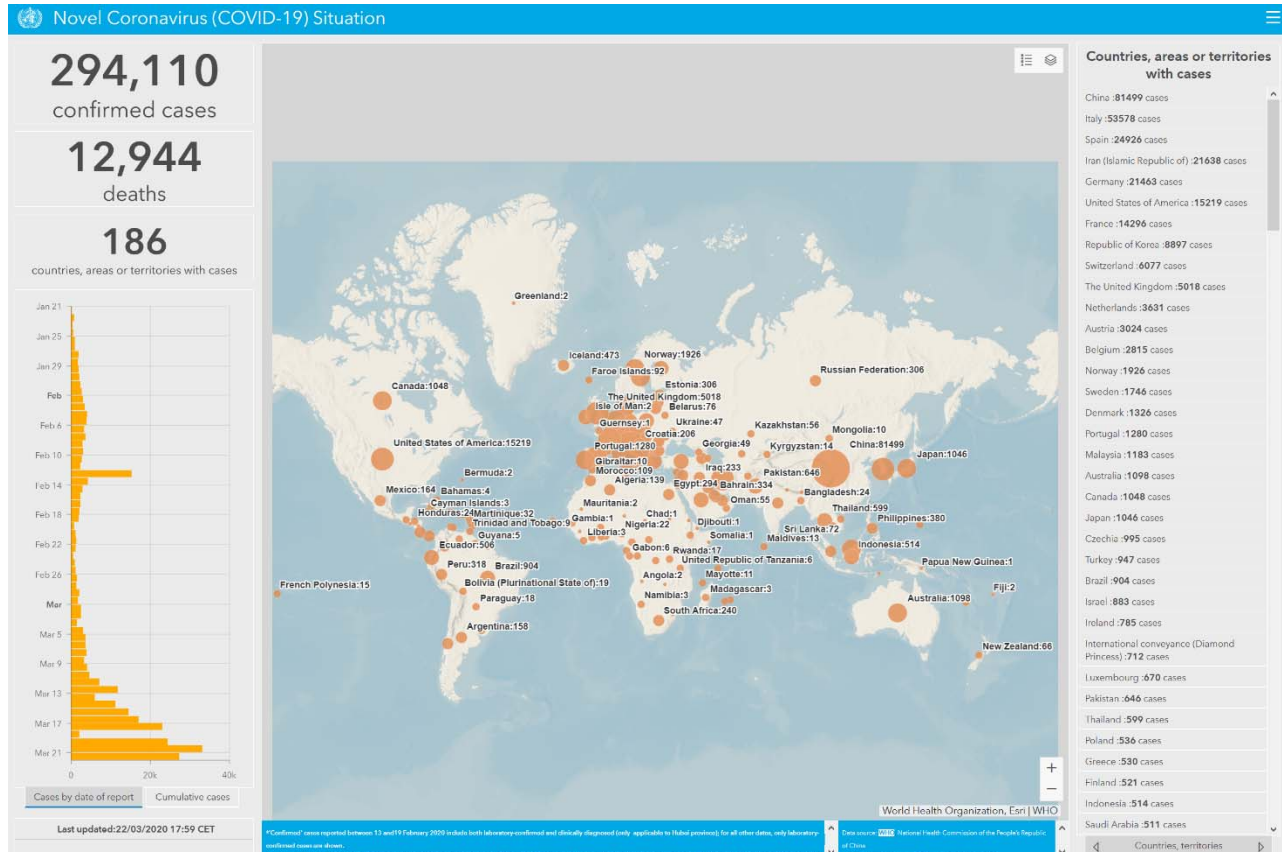

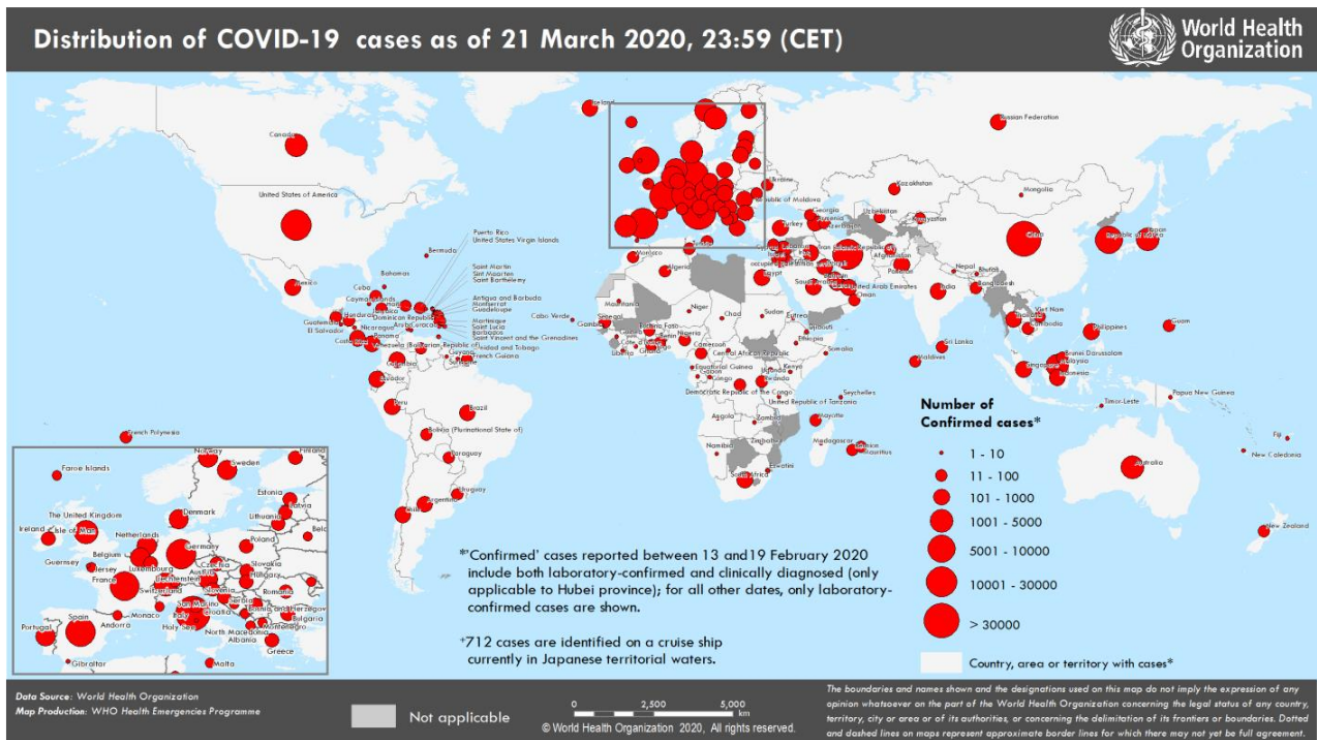

For the first time, Japan's Prime Minister says postponing the Olympics is a possibility

- Speaking to lawmakers on Monday, Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe said postponing the 2020 Summer Olympics is a possibility.
- A growing number of countries and athletes have called for the games to be postponed, while Canada said it will not send any teams.
- The International Olympic Committee (IOC) responded Sunday, saying a final decision on postponement will be made within four weeks, due to the vast complexities of rescheduling a massive global sporting event like the Olympics

Indian states impose complete lockdowns, affecting most of country's 1.3 billion population

- Nineteen out of India's total 28 states and nine union territories have ordered a complete lockdown in a bid to tackle the spread of coronavirus.
- Six states and union territories have issued a full lockdown only in certain districts, while three states/union territories have imposed partial restrictions to promote social distancing

India to ground domestic commercial flights

- Domestic commercial airlines in India will stop operations starting Wednesday, according to a press release from India's Civil Aviation Ministry.
- "Airlines have to plan operations to land at their destination before 23:59 hours on 03/24/2020" The restrictions do not apply to cargo-only flights

At least 23 Italian doctors have died in coronavirus epidemic

- The total number of fatalities reported in the country at the new epicenter of the outbreak has now surpassed China's death toll.

McDonald's and Nando's shut down all their UK restaurants, even for takeout until further notice

- McDonald's and Nando's will close all their restaurants in the United Kingdom and Ireland starting Monday, including for takeout, to help limit the spread of the coronavirus.
- In statement Sunday the decision had been taken because it was "increasingly difficult" to maintain safe social distancing while operating "busy takeaway and drive thru restaurants"

Spain expects outbreak to peak as soon as Wednesday

- Spanish authorities expect the so-called "peak" of the Covid-19 pandemic in the country to happen as soon as Wednesday.
- Enrique Ruiz Escudero, senior health official of Madrid's Regional Government, told radio COPE on Monday that the number of cases in the country is expected to begin decreasing by the end of this week. "We believe this week we'll reach the famous 'peak' - in which we see new cases, but less than the day before," he said.
- **Health workers test positive:** Escudero also added that in Madrid, 600 health workers tested positive for Covid-19, and 1,400 others who were in direct contact with infected patients and are in preventive home isolation.

Mexico will hand hospitals over to the army to prepare for "critical stage" of coronavirus outbreak

- Mexico will hand over control of approximately 10 hospitals to the army to prepare the country to deal with the "critical stage" of the coronavirus outbreak, Mexican president Andrés Manuel López Obrador said in a video posted on his Twitter account on Sunday.
- The hospitals are new and in need of equipment and staffing. Obrador ended his remarks by announcing the country "is prepared" and will be triumphant against the war on coronavirus.

Saudi Arabia orders daily curfew

- Saudi Arabia has ordered a daily curfew between 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. local time beginning Monday. The curfew is scheduled to last for 21 days and came directly from Saudi Arabia's King Salman bin Abdulaziz Al-Saud, said in its report according to Saudi state-run SPA news.
- Saudi Arabia says it is taking these measures to contain the spread of coronavirus in the country. Security, health, water, electricity, trash collection and media sectors are excluded from the curfew, according to SPA.

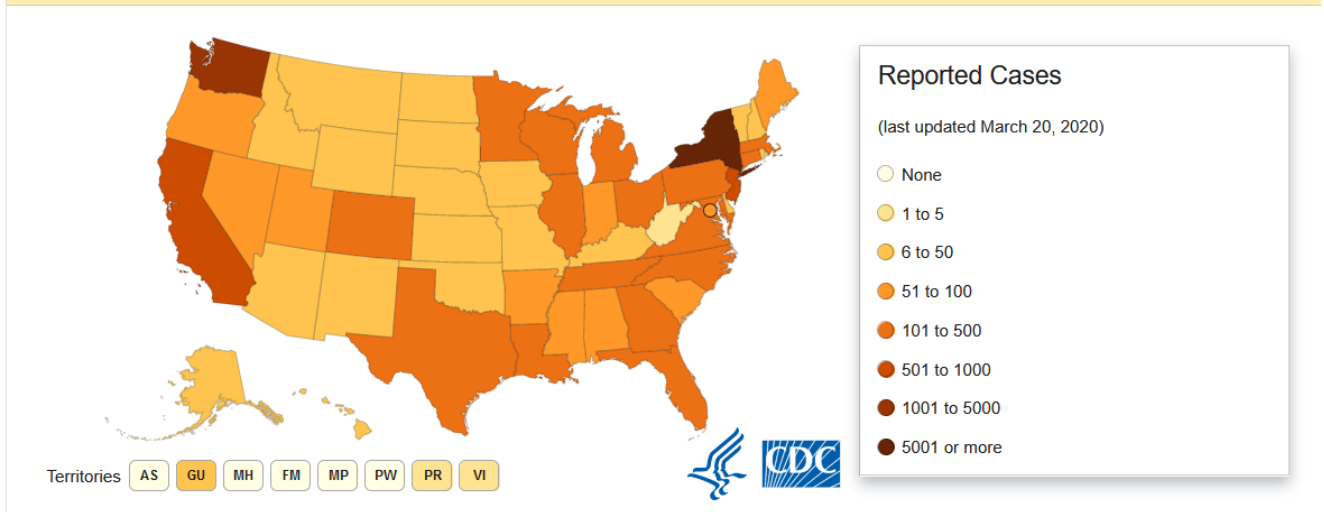

US Surgeon General: "This week, it's going to get bad"

- US Surgeon General Dr. Jerome Adams gave a "somber" message to the nation while speaking on NBC this morning, "I want America to understand — this week, it's going to get bad," Adams told NBC's Savannah Guthrie, adding that some people have not been properly practicing social distancing.
- "This is how the spread is occurring. So we really, really need everyone to stay at home," Adams said. "I think that there are a lot of people who are doing the right things, but I think that unfortunately we're finding out a lot of people think this can't happen to them."

FDA cracks down on fake coronavirus tests, preventions and treatments

- The US Food and Drug Administration said Friday that it is closely watching the market and will take appropriate action against firms claiming to offer fraudulent coronavirus tests, preventions and treatments. "Fraudulent health claims, tests, and products can pose serious health risks," the FDA statement said. "They may keep some patients from seeking care or delay necessary medical treatment."

Yosemite National Park closed until further notice

- Yosemite National Park in California is now closed until further notice. Visitors are not permitted inside the park, and the closure will be enforced around the clock, according to the National Park Service. Most national parks have announced facility closures, but this is the first full closure of a park

Anyone who arrives in Hawaii will be subject to a 14-day quarantine

- Anyone arriving in the state of Hawaii -- including returning residents -- will be subject to a 14-day quarantine. The mandate, which is the first of its kind in the United States, this is currently in effect and remain in place until further notice

Crowds packed California beaches despite shelter in place order

- Crowds descended on California beaches, hiking trails and parks over the weekend in open defiance of a state order to shelter in place and avoid close contact with others. Instead, many public spaces were packed, prompting officials in some cities to order parks, recreation areas and beaches to close.
- In response to the crowds, Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti announced on Twitter late Sunday that he was closing sports and recreation at all LA City Parks. He said people should heed the closures and stay home.

General Motors will help produce ventilators for coronavirus

- General Motors in partnership with Ventec Life Systems are collaborating to produce respiratory care products, including ventilators, to fight Covid-19.

American vodka company Tito's Vodka says it is working to produce hand sanitizer

- American vodka company Tito's Vodka says it plans to use its distillery for something a little different: Hand sanitizer. "While we advise that you cannot use our standard vodka product as a hand sanitizer, our team at the distillery has been working hard to get all of the pieces in place to begin production on a hand sanitizer that adheres to industry and governmental guidance," the company said in a statement.

Coronavirus: First inmate in CA state prison system tests positive for COVID-19

- An inmate at the California State Prison, Los Angeles County in Lancaster tested positive for coronavirus, becoming the first confirmed case of the illness among the state's prison population, officials said Sunday.
- A California Department of Corrections spokesperson said the two employees at California State Prison, Sacramento, two employees at California Institution for Men, and one employee at Folsom State Prison have tested positive for COVID-19. Officials did not provide information on the health of the infected workers.

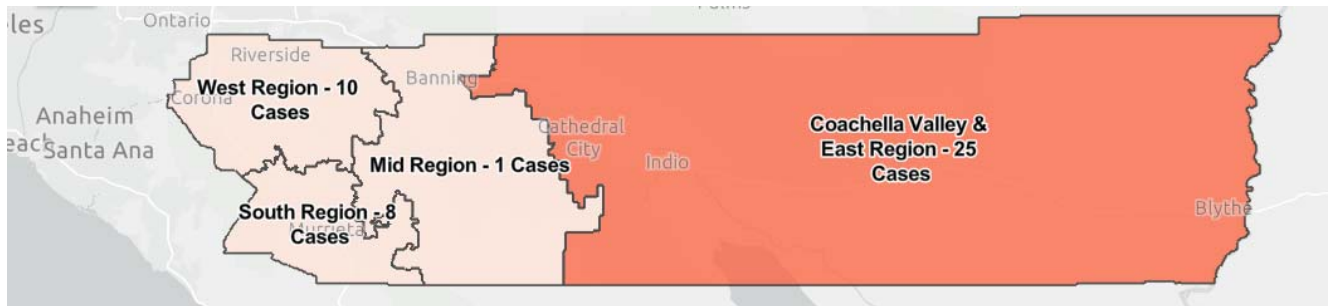

Coronavirus drive-through testing in Lake Elsinore will continue and expand

- A drive-through novel coronavirus testing program at Lake Elsinore's Diamond Stadium will continue and expand, with an online scheduling site added Sunday and the testing available for Southern California residents who live within a 50-mile radius of the City of Riverside, officials said.

The Diamond Stadium site has been designated as a Community-Based Testing Site, directed by the State of California and receiving federal support. There was testing there Saturday and Sunday, and the program had tentatively been scheduled to end Sunday, but was extended along with the announcement of online scheduling.

There were 211 tests administered Saturday and slightly more on Sunday, said Jose Arballo Jr., a Riverside County public health spokesman.
