





Thailand Prime Minister announces nationwide curfew

- Thailand has announced an indefinite, nationwide curfew starting on Friday as cases of the novel coronavirus continue to rise, the country's Prime Minister, Prayut Chan-ocha said in a televised broadcast.
- Starting Friday, residents in Thailand will not be allowed to leave their premises between 10 p.m. and 4 a.m. local time.

Germany mobilizes 15,000 soldiers to support coronavirus effort

- The German military will mobilize 15,000 soldiers starting Friday to support regional authorities in the fight against coronavirus.
- The soldiers will be used to protect critical infrastructure, distribute medical equipment and set up makeshift hospitals. This is the first time such a contingent of soldiers has been deployed in this way. However, the military – like many agencies – is experiencing a shortage of protective equipment for the long-term nature of the work.
- "The fight against coronavirus will be a long one this is a marathon," said defense minister Annegret Kramp-Karrenbauer. "It's going to depend on all of us holding out in the end. Anger as Japanese Prime Minister offers two cloth masks per family, while refusing to declare coronavirus emergency

- Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe is facing a public backlash after he said the government would distribute two reusable cloth face masks per household amid growing concern over medical shortages, as the country faces a worsening coronavirus outbreak.
- The number of confirmed cases of the virus has spiked in recent weeks, after it appeared that Japan's initial response had got the virus relatively under control. Spain deaths pass 10,000 after highest single-day increase so far

- Spain passed another grim milestone in its coronavirus outbreak on Thursday, reporting that more than 10,000 have now died in the country as a result of the virus. The Health Ministry said it recorded 950 new deaths in the past 24 hours, the highest single-day increase the country has seen so far. Its total death tally is now 10,003.
- But there was some cause for cautious optimism in the country, whose devastating outbreak appears to be slowing. The 10.5% rise reported Thursday is similar to Wednesday's increase, and smaller in percentage terms than any recorded in the past two weeks.
- The country's Health Minister said the curve of new cases in Spain has come under control, and that the drastic emergency measures put in place to lock down the country are working.








Coronavirus Cases by County (CSUN Geography)

Coronavirus Has Potential to Reshape Government Technology

- Government computer systems are operating under a massive strain. Many state and local functions have suddenly gone all-digital while having to deal with the demands on services that come with a crisis. But so far, at least, it's gone surprisingly well.
- Information technology in government has long lagged notoriously behind the private sector. There have certainly been problems — most prominently, servers crashing in several states due to the record number of unemployment applications. But most governments, having gone virtual, have been able to function.
- There's still a long way to go. Chief information officers are consciously optimistic that one silver lining from the current crisis is that it will force government leaders to make more, and smarter, investments. "Our inability to invest in our IT modernization is being exposed right now," says Doug Robinson, executive director of the National Association of State Chief Information Officers (NASCIO). "Legislators still see it as a back office. Nearly 96% of Americans are under stay-at-home orders

- More than 262 million Americans are currently under stay-at-home or shelter-in-place order -- according to a CNN count.
- That percentage 95.9% to be exact translates to at least 315,077,834 people in the U.S. The new count factors in the Texas order that went into effect early today.
- The eleven states that do not have statewide stay-at-home orders include: Alabama, Arkansas, Iowa, Missouri, North Dakota, Nebraska, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah and Wyoming.

Experts tell White House coronavirus can spread through talking or even just breathing

- A scientific panel told the White House that research shows coronavirus can be spread not just by sneezes or coughs, but also just by talking, or possibly even just breathing. "While the current [coronavirus] specific research is limited, the results of available studies are consistent with aerosolization of virus from normal breathing,"
- The Office of Science and Technology Policy at the White House. In response; "Currently available research supports the possibility that [coronavirus] could be spread via bioaerosols generated directly by patients' exhalation".
- According to the CDC, the virus spreads from person to person when people are
 within about six feet of each other. It spreads "through respiratory droplets produced
 when an infected person coughs or sneezes."
- It's possible that aerosolized coronavirus droplets can hang in the air and potentially infect someone who walks by later. How long coronavirus lingers in the air depends on several factors, including how much virus an infected individual puts out when breathing or talking, and also on the amount of circulation in the air, he said.

If the prediction models are correct the Coronavirus could be with us through the Summer

- New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo says the apex for coronavirus cases in the state is anywhere "from 7 to 21 to 30 days," according to all of the models.
- Cuomo said that all of the models show that New York would come down from the apex quickly, but about 16,000 New Yorkers could die from coronavirus, according to the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation model cited by Dr. Anthony Fauci and the White House.

National Stockpile nearly depleted

- The government's emergency stockpile of respirator masks, gloves and other medical supplies is running low and is nearly exhausted due to the coronavirus outbreak
- "The stockpile was designed to respond to a handful of cities. It was never built or designed to fight a 50-state pandemic," said a DHS official, who spoke on the condition of anonymity because the official was not authorized to speak publicly about the stockpile.

Michigan suspends face-to-face learning for the rest of the school year

- Michigan Gov. Gretchen Whitmer has closed K-12 schools for the remainder of the school year with an executive order suspending face-to-face learning.
- According to a release from the governor, "district facilities may be used by public school employees and contractors for the purposes of facilitating learning at a distance while also practicing social distancing."
- The order says the buildings will be closed "unless restrictions are lifted."
- "My number one priority right now is protecting Michigan families from the spread of COVID-19.  maintaining readiness for other disasters to include spring flooding, severe weather
 and the upcoming hurricane season. FEMA currently has 2,273 employees
 supporting the COVID-19 pandemic response out of a total 20,550 agency employees
 who are prepared to respond to other emergencies should they occur.
- Should additional support be needed, FEMA is able to activate the Department of Homeland Security's surge capacity force composed of federal employees from DHS and other agencies.







California says residents don't need to wear masks -- but cloth face coverings may give some protection

- People leaving their homes for essential activities in California are not required to wear surgical masks, according to new guidance by the state's Department of Public Health.
- "The guidance does not require people to wear face coverings and is not a substitute for the state's current guidance regarding social distancing and hand washing," the department said in a news release. "The state also does not recommend Californians use N-95 or surgical masks, which are needed for our health care workers and first responders who will be there for when our lives at risk." "Face coverings are not a substitute for physical distancing or frequent hand washing, which we know are amongst the most effective ways to reduce the spread of COVID-19," said Dr. Sonia Angell, director of the California Department of Public Health and state health officer, in the news release.

Prosecutors: Engineer deliberately ran train off tracks in attempt to smash the USNS Mercy

- An engineer deliberately ran a train off the tracks at high speed near the Port of Los Angeles in an attempt to crash into the USNS Mercy hospital ship, prosecutors say.
- The Pacific Harbor Line train derailed Tuesday, running through the end of the track and crashing through barriers, finally coming to rest about 250 yards from the docked naval ship.

California

- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has completed the assessment of eight stateselected facilities to develop large-scale, supplemental hospital space as the state works to expand existing hospital capacity by up to 50,000 beds.
- The USNS Mercy hospital ship is operational and receiving patients in Los Angeles. It has 1,000 hospital beds available to help relieve strains on local hospital systems
- Supplies from the Strategic National Stockpile have arrived in California and are being distributed to medical facilities throughout the state.
- FEMA completed the sale of 105 travel trailers to the state to support a State COVID-19 housing initiative for impacted individuals.
- On March 29, the first of eight Federal Medical Stations initiated operations.
- As of March 31, FEMA had obligated \$862 million in federal support for the state of California, including \$468 million to the state to reimburse costs related to the COVID-19 response.
