Questions & Answers

Some of your coronavirus questions answered

A panel of experts have been answering your questions about life in the midst of the coronavirus pandemic. Here are some of the most common questions:

Q: Should I worry about contracting the virus from mail and newspapers?

A: Dr. Darria Long, emergency room physician: "There is not evidence you may contract the coronavirus from mail and newspapers but that said if you want to be on the safer side we know that Covid can live on cardboard for about 24 hours. If you want to take the extra precaution you can effectively quarantine that mail, say in your garage or someplace, for about 24 hours then open it up and wash your hands well after you do it."

Q: There's a lot of talk about social distancing but what do you do when you are on an overcrowded subway or bus?

A: Dr. Darria Long, emergency room physician: "For one, of course, maintain social distancing as much as you can. If you can stay six feet away from other people on the bus or subway, do so. Other than that, I would absolutely want someone to be wearing a mask the entire time they are on there, even a cloth mask. Then you can do two other things. You can wear an outer layer you carefully remove when you get out of the subway or bus or wear gloves. But key point, we are seeing a lot of people wear gloves and I do have to say you have to remove them carefully or you eliminate the effect. So you pinch the outer glove with one hand and take your clean finger to remove the other so you're not touching the outside. Of course wash your hands afterwards."


Q: How do I talk to my 65-year-old father about limiting his visits to the store without sounding like I am scolding him?


A: Dr. Gail Saltz, psychiatrist and psychoanalyst: "The relationships that are happening between adult children and their parents and kids who suddenly arrive back home, there is pressure going on and anxiety going on that things are being heard in critical ways or people are saying things in irritable ways which is all very understandable. But if you realize that your parent is used to being 'the parent' and you simply say, hey, I love you and I'm really just worried about you so I'm asking you not to do this because I understand it puts you at greater risk and for me, my worry, my anxiety, I would really feel better if you wouldn't do it which is different than saying, hey. I know better and I told you so."

Q: Mosquito season is about to start. Should we be concerned about mosquitos transmitting Covid-19?

A: Dr. Darria Long, emergency room physician: "We know mosquitos can carry other viruses, but there is not evidence right now they can actually transmit coronavirus from one person to another."



- Jahanpoor added 24,237 patients so far have recovered and have been released from hospitals across the country...





Supply Chain

FEMA is expediting movement of critical supplies from the global market to medical distributors in various locations across the U.S.

- FEMA continues to coordinate an air bridge for flights from Asia. The first flight landed Sunday, March 29, and delivered 80 tons of much needed PPE supplies to New York, New Jersey and Connecticut.
- Additional flights landed in Chicago on March 30, Miami on March 31, Los Angeles on April 1, and Chicago and Columbus, Ohio, on April 3. FEMA has more flights scheduled and is adding more daily.
- Each flight contains critical personal protective equipment (PPE), to include gloves, gowns, goggles, and masks in varying quantities. FEMA does not have detailed visibility on the amount of PPE until the flights are loaded overseas.
- Overseas flights are arriving at airports that are operational hubs. They are not indicators that the supplies will be distributed in those locations. All supplies are national supplies and will be distributed to hot spots and through the vendors regular supply chain to locations across the country.
- Upon arrival, PPE is provided, in varying quantities, first to medical distributors in areas of greatest need; then, the remainder will be infused into the broader U.S. supply chain.

** To efficiently maintain the country's existing medical supply chain infrastructure, FEMA is supplementing – not supplanting – the supply chain through a variety of strategies, including Project Airbridge.

- Trucking shipments to grocery and discount stores are soaring, growing more than 50% last week from the same week last year.
- Traffic speeds are up in a growing number of major cities. It is probable that major traffic congestion will be greatly reduced in the country's most congested cities within a week. Freight velocities for essential products will be lessened and restocking may be easier though last mile delivery may still be an issue.
- HOS laws have been suspended for truck drivers delivering loads falling into the categories of medical supplies, sanitation supplies, temporary housing, and food. HOS law suspension will mean that freight volume and freight velocity should rise substantially in the coming days.
- Truckers will be exposed to even greater risk of infection which may also contribute to viral spread due to the rapid pace of resupply and extended working hours.
- Rail industry expects a continued decline in rail volumes in the coming weeks as demand for rail service depends on the demand further down the chain for the products railroads haul and the ability of company's they serve to produce what is demanded.
- Federal Railroad Administration is considering waiving requirements related to hours of service, inspection frequency, brake tests, signal maintenance and testing, and weekly and monthly track inspections. This would benefit railroads by increasing dwindling freight volumes.

FEMA

Even as FEMA is focused on responding to COVID-19, we are also preparing and maintaining readiness for other disasters to include spring flooding, severe weather and the upcoming hurricane season.

FEMA currently has 2,533 employees supporting the COVID-19 pandemic response out of a total 20,550 agency employees who are prepared to respond to other emergencies should they occur

- On March 31, the president extended the nation's Slow the Spread campaign until April 30. The White House recommended Americans avoid grocery stores and pharmacies over the next two weeks
- On April 3, CDC issued a recommendation to the public to use cloth face coverings in community settings to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 by people are infected and do not know it.






