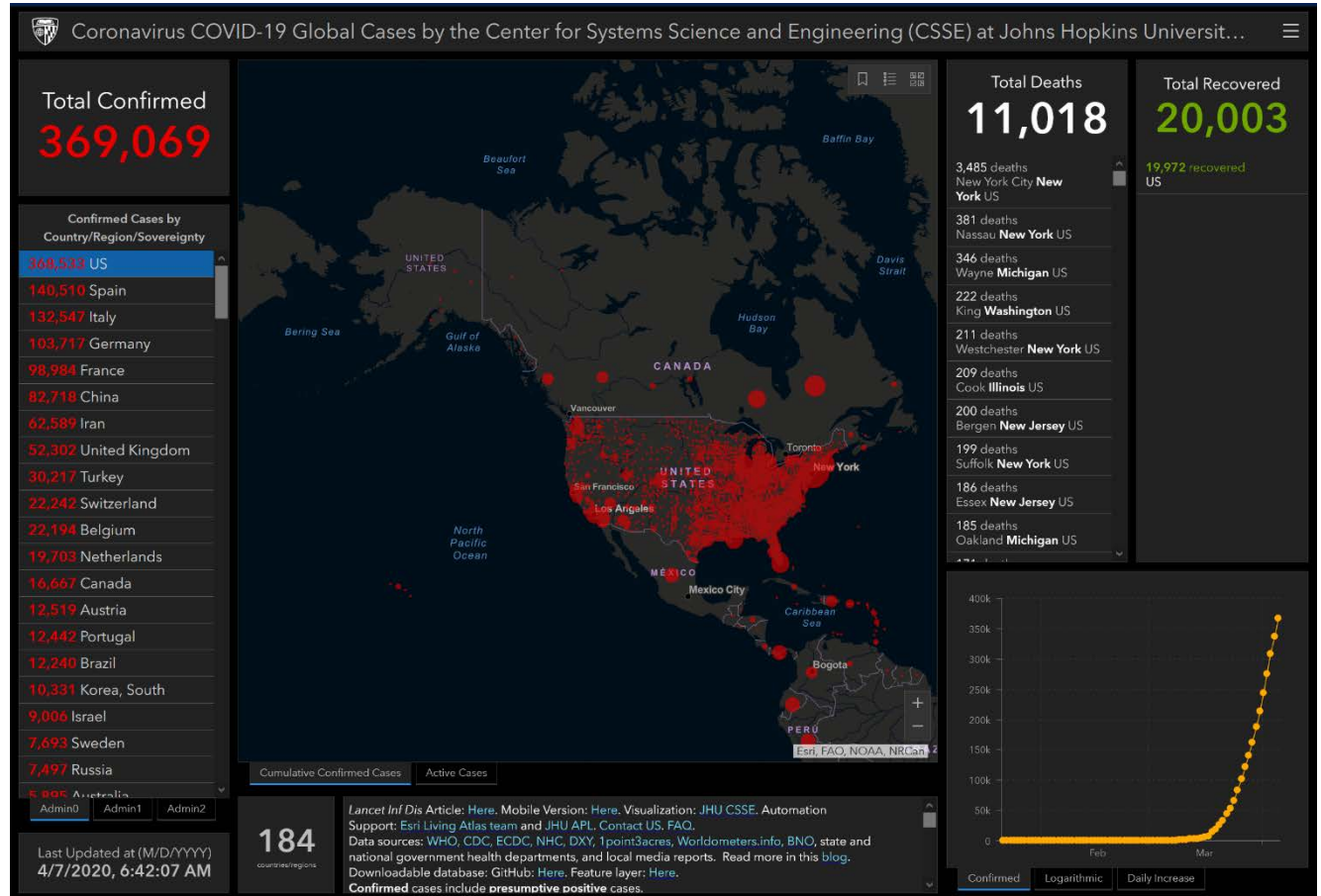

## COVID-19 Situation in the Region of the Americas as of 6 April 2020 (14:00 EST)

- In the Region of the Americas, the French Overseas Collectivity of Saint Pierre and Miquelon – a group of islands near the Canadian province of Newfoundland and Labrador reported one (1) probable case of COVID-19 – their first. If confirmed, this would be the first confirmed COVID-19 case on the Island and would also mean that all 54 countries/areas/territories in the region of the Americas has reported confirmed COVID-19 cases.
- In the past 24 hours, an additional 31,650 cases and 1,417 deaths were reported – a 9 % (cases) and 15% (deaths) relative increase compared to the previous day.

## FEMA

Even as FEMA is focused on responding to COVID-19, we are also preparing and maintaining readiness for other disasters to include spring flooding, severe weather and the upcoming hurricane season.

- The U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) issued a new directive requiring anyone on DoD property, installations, or facilities to wear a cloth face covering when they cannot maintain six feet of social distance in public area or work centers

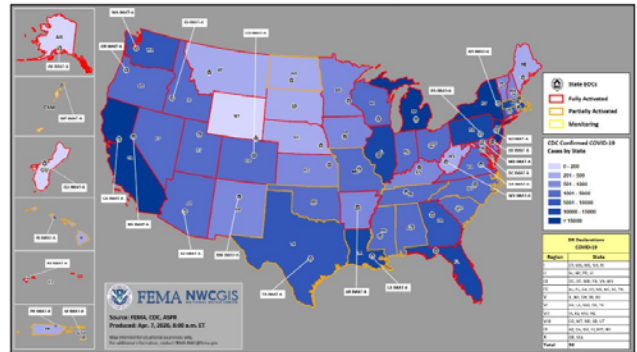
- Situation:** FEMA and HHS continue to work requirements to allocate and deliver key resources
- Working with industry partners on producing, allocating and distributing PPE and ventilators, including expediting critical supplies from overseas to various US locations
  - Coordinating with USACE on the build-out of alternate care sites (ACS), with significant expansion capacity
  - Regional Administrators are in contact with governors, tribal leaders, state emergency managers, and state public health officials to execute a whole of government response to fight the COVID-19 pandemic

- USNS Mercy 9/920 beds filled; 2/80 ICU beds filled; 22 (+3) patients seen
- U.S. Coast Guard facilitated the arrival of 2 cruise ships in Florida; processing 1,200 passengers expected to take 2-3 days
- 50 Major Disaster Declarations approved and 3 (+2) Major Disaster Declarations in process
- Eight task forces, jointly led by HHS and FEMA, continue work on assigned focus areas

## California makes concession for nursing students after coronavirus affects training access

- The director of the Department of Consumer Affairs waived rules on the clinical hours that nursing students must complete after many hospitals suspended their on-the-job training programs in preparation for a surge of patients sickened by the new coronavirus.
- In an executive order issued Mar. 4, Gov. Gavin Newsom gave the leaders of public health, consumer affairs, emergency medical services, radiologic technologists and several other licensing agencies the authority to suspend certain requirements during the state of emergency.

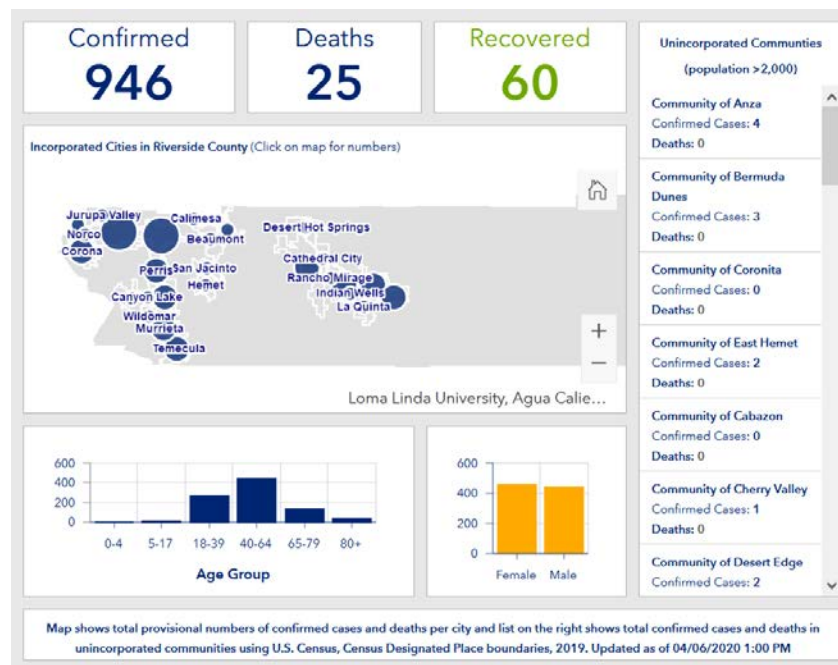

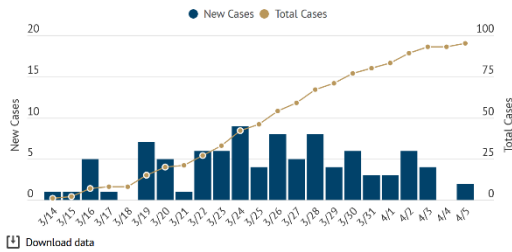

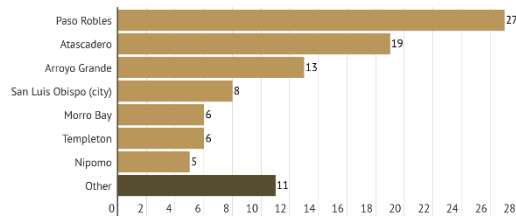

Forecast Discussion

An atmospheric river frontal band with heavy rain is moving through Orange County and western Riverside County and will move into San Diego County this afternoon and tonight. Southwest winds of 25 to 40 mph in mountains/deserts into tonight. An unseasonably strong storm slows and brings waves of precipitation (some lightning) on Tuesday and Wednesday, increasing showers with rain **heavy at times** - precipitation continues into Thursday. Rainfall increases in the deserts and could last into Thursday. **Significant totals of rainfall (1.5 to 3.5 inches) most areas** (locally 6-8 inches mountains) and snowfall (12-30 inches above 6000 ft and 3-7 above 5000 ft).
