



Gov. Newsom: Coroners to examine deaths dating back to December for COVID-19, death toll tops 1,350

- Following an announcement from the Santa Clara County Public Health Department Tuesday that two individuals <u>who posthumously tested positive for COVID-19 died</u> at their homes in February, Newsom said he has instructed coroners around the state to "dig even deeper" and perform autopsies on individuals who may have died from the novel coronavirus as far back as December, 2019. <u>https://www.mercurynews.com/2020/04/22/gov-newsom-coroners-to-examine-deaths-dating-back-to-december-for-covid-19death-toll-tops-1350/</u>

American Red Cross says it plans to implement antibody testing to help screen for Covid-19 plasma donors

• The idea is that convalescent plasma, the liquid part of blood, from recovered patients contains antibodies that could help strengthen the immune response of other patients still battling infection. Last week, the US Food and Drug Administration announced that patients who are fully recovered from Covid-19 for at least two weeks are encouraged to consider donating plasma.

- New studies find Covid-19 causes sudden strokes in young adults, doctors say
- Our report shows a seven-fold increase in incidence of sudden stroke in young
 patients during the past two weeks. Most of these patients have no past medical
 history and were at home with either mild symptoms (or in two cases, no symptoms)
 of Covid," he added.



- Every 40 seconds in the United States, someone has a stroke, according to the CDC. The statistic is nearly identical for heart attacks. But in recent weeks, emergency departments across the U.S. have been eerily devoid of patients experiencing either condition.






