An additional 45,715 cases and 3,954 deaths were reported in the past 24 hours, representing a 4% and 5% relative increase in total cases and deaths respectively compared to the previous day. Majority of the new cases (31,379) and deaths (2,902) continue to be reported from the United States of America, which represents 80% of both cumulative cases and deaths reported in the region to date.

The President released Guidelines for Opening American Up Again and the Federal Government is continuing to work with governors across the country to ensure they have the equipment, supplies, and testing resources they need to reopen safely and responsibly. The HHS Secretary issued a renewal of the January 31 COVID-19 Public Health Emergency

Lessons from China: How global business has changed forever

China has been living seven weeks in the future. The world's second largest economy
was the first to be hit by the coronavirus outbreak, which forced it to halt travel, shutter
stores and theme parks, mandate masks in public and encourage the public to embrace
social distancing.

- As the country is gradually reopening, and as the rest of the world prepares to do the same, companies that were forced to first respond to the outbreak in China are using their early experiences to form a blueprint for other regions.
- Corporate responses in China have become a focal point for Wall Street analysts in recent months, as global brands such as Nike (NKE), Starbucks (SBUX) and Disney (DIS) share their experiences in the country on calls with investors and credit their teams there for guiding them through the crisis.

Expert report predicts up to two more years of pandemic misery

- The new coronavirus is likely to keep spreading for at least another 18 months to two years—until 60% to 70% of the population has been infected, a team of longstanding pandemic experts predicted in a report released Thursday.
- They recommended that the US prepare for a worst-case scenario that includes a second big wave of coronavirus infections in the fall and winter. Even in a best-case scenario, people will continue to die from the virus, they predicted.
- "This thing's not going to stop until it infects 60 to 70% of people," Mike Osterholm, who
 directs the Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy (CIDRAP) at the University
 of Minnesota, told CNN. "The idea that this is going to be done soon defies microbiology."

Airlines require passengers to wear face masks

- Three major US airlines have separately announced they are going to require their passengers to wear face masks.
- Two days after Jet Blue became the first major airline to announce this change, American, Delta and Frontier followed suit, releasing statements explaining their new policies.
- Earlier this week Delta said that employees were required to wear masks and passengers
 "were strongly encouraged" to do so. Today, Delta released a statement saying
 passengers were required to wear masks on all flights starting May 4, the same date as
 Jet Blue.

Coronavirus Cases Surpass 4,000 In Riverside County, 6 More Dead

Kaiser's revised directive also keeps the countywide shutdown mandate in place for all
public and private schools, including colleges and universities, until June 19. Newsom has
proposed beginning the 2020-21 school year early, perhaps late July or early August, but
there is no word yet on when Riverside County schools will reopen.

Riverside County Board of Supervisors Board Chair V. Manuel Perez and Vice Chair Karen Spiegel are bringing forth a proposal Tuesday to rescind County Public Health orders currently in place amid coronavirus.

- Riverside County Public Health Officer Dr. Cameron Kaiser is extending his order requiring residents to wear face coverings when outside and to continue practicing social distancing through June 19. The county is also moving to fully align with the governor's "stay-at-home" order until amended or rescinded.
- According to a news release issued Thursday by Perez' office, "I want to thank Riverside
 County Public Health Officer Dr. Cameron Kaiser who has led the charge with actions that
 have no doubt made a measurable impact in saving lives in our county," Perez said. "His
 early and proactive leadership got us very far ahead as a county. That, combined with
 data and strong economic arguments, is why I have the confidence that it is appropriate
 to lift these measures while we continue to align ourselves with the state's stay-at-home
 order and roadmap for reopening."

Government workers tempted with COVID-19 scam offering free food

- Hackers are finding every opportunity they can to exploit the coronavirus pandemic, even using the disease to promise free meals for government officials, Google detailed in a report Wednesday.
- The attacks differ from cybercriminal schemes in that government-backed hackers are
 often doing it for espionage purposes rather than financial gain. Google said it found one
 campaign that targeted United States government employees by offering coupons and
 free meals from American fast food chains.
- The scam involved COVID-19 messaging and directed victims to a website disguised as a page for arranging meal deliveries. The ploy was designed to steal government workers' Google account login credentials, the tech giant said.
