CDC guidelines for opening US economy shelved by White House

- A set of detailed documents created by top disease investigators in the United States meant to give step-by-step advice to local leaders deciding when and how to reopen public places such as mass transit, daycare centers and restaurants during the coronavirus pandemic has been shelved by the Trump administration.
- The 17-page report by a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) team, titled "Guidance for Implementing the Opening Up America Again Framework", was researched and written to help faith leaders, business owners, educators and state and local officials as they begin to reopen.
- It was supposed to be published last Friday, but agency scientists were told the guidance "would never see the light of day", a CDC official told the Associated Press news agency.
- A White House told Axios on Thursday that administration officials were unaware of the guidelines' existence until it was leaked to the media and described the original document as "overly prescriptive". Requested revisions were never delivered, the official said.

 in February, when the unemployment rate had reached a 50-year low of just 3.5%.

- US President Donald Trump on Wednesday called the coronavirus pandemic the worst "attack" the country had ever experienced and blamed China for not stopping it, amid a deepening war of words between the United States and China over the virus.
- "This is worse than Pearl Harbor. Face masks make a political statement in era of coronavirus

The decision to wear a mask in public is becoming a political statement — a moment to
pick sides in a brewing culture war over containing the coronavirus.

- While not yet as loaded as a "Make America Great Again" hat, the mask is increasingly a
 visual shorthand for the debate pitting those willing to follow health officials' guidance and
 cover their faces against those who feel it violates their freedom or buys into a threat they
 think is overblown.
- That resistance is fueled by some of the same people who object to other virus
 restrictions. The push back has been stoked by President Donald Trump he didn't
 wear a mask during an appearance at a facility making them and some other
 Republicans, who have flouted rules and questioned the value of masks. It's a
 development that has worried experts as Americans are increasingly returning to public
 spaces.


COVID-19 Situation in the Region of the Americas as of 5 May 2020 (14:00 EST)




