US biotech firm sees promise in new coronavirus vaccine

- Early data from a US biotechnology firm's COVID-19 vaccine, the first to be tested in the United States, has showed that it produced protective antibodies in a small group of healthy volunteers, the company, Moderna Inc, said on Monday.
- In the trial of 45 volunteers, conducted by the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, eight volunteers who got two doses of the vaccine produced protective antibodies roughly on par with people who recovered from a natural infection of the virus that causes the COVID-19 illness, the company said in a news release.

- To respond to the generational public health crisis caused by the global COVID-19 pandemic, a swift, coordinated effort across many sectors of society is necessary, say National Institutes of Health (NIH) Director Francis S. Collins, M.D., Ph.D., and Johnson & Johnson Vice Chairman of the Executive Committee and Chief Scientific Officer Paul Stoffels, M.D. In a Viewpoint published today in JAMA
- A public-private initiative organized by NIH and the Foundation for the NIH. ACTIV's partners, which include at least 18 leading biopharmaceutical companies, multiple U.S. federal agencies, and the European Medicines Agency, are developing an international strategy for an integrated research response to COVID-19.

DHS S&T Launches Indoor Predictive Modeling Tool for Coronavirus Stability

- The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Science and Technology Directorate (S&T) today released a predictive modeling tool to estimate natural decay of SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19) under a range of temperatures and relative humidity. Leveraging the results of research being conducted at S&T's National Biodefense Analysis and Countermeasures Center (NBACC), the tool is designed to assist response efforts and estimate the environmental persistence of the virus under certain combinations of temperatures and humidity.

More Productive from Home: Governments Learn to Love Remote Work

- Despite some hurdles, government through remote work is performing better than expected. It will likely lead to permanent changes in everything from labor management and technology to physical footprints
- This was designed initially as a workaround, with employees of the suburban Milwaukee region scattered by the coronavirus, but now this more efficient way of holding meetings will become standard. "We will not go back," says Dale Shaver, director of parks and land use for Waukesha County. "This has changed the way we work forever."

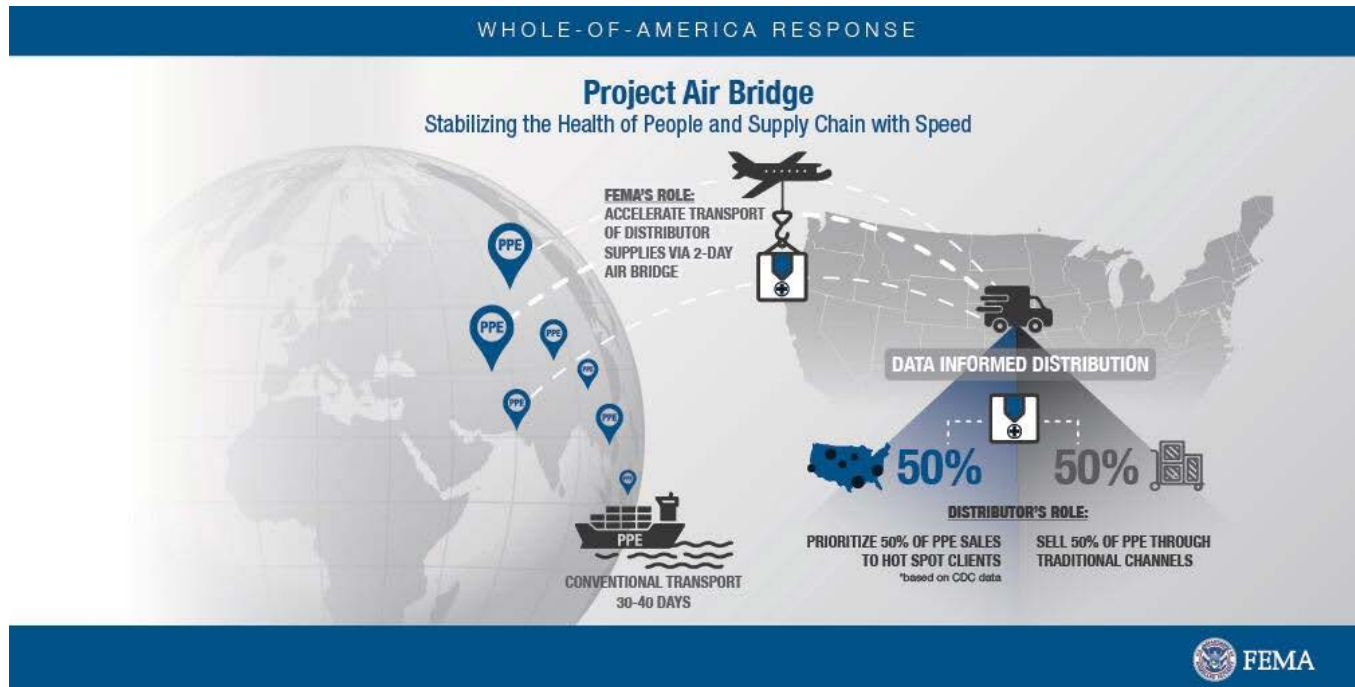

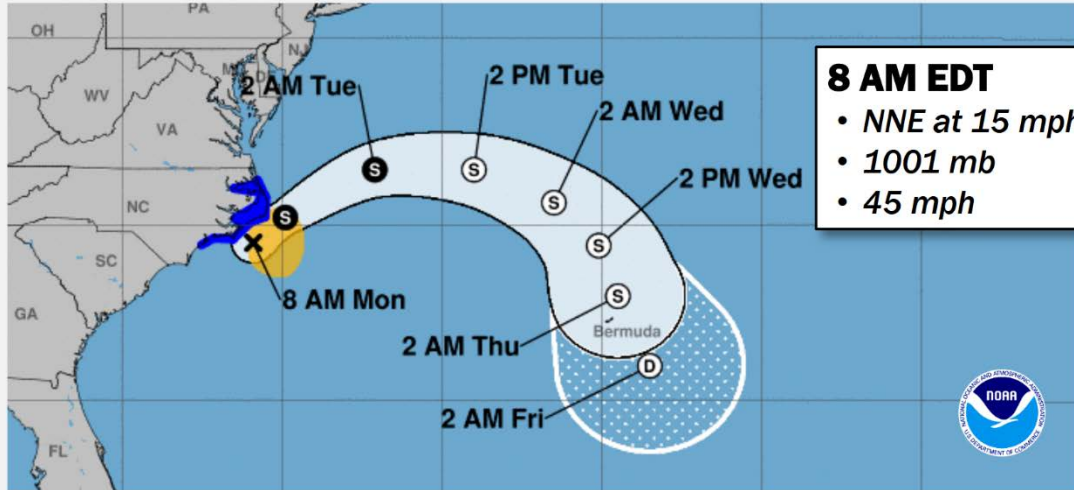
Project Air Bridge

As of May 15, Project Air Bridge has completed 141 flights with an additional 64 scheduled, or in transit, for a total of approximately 205 flights.

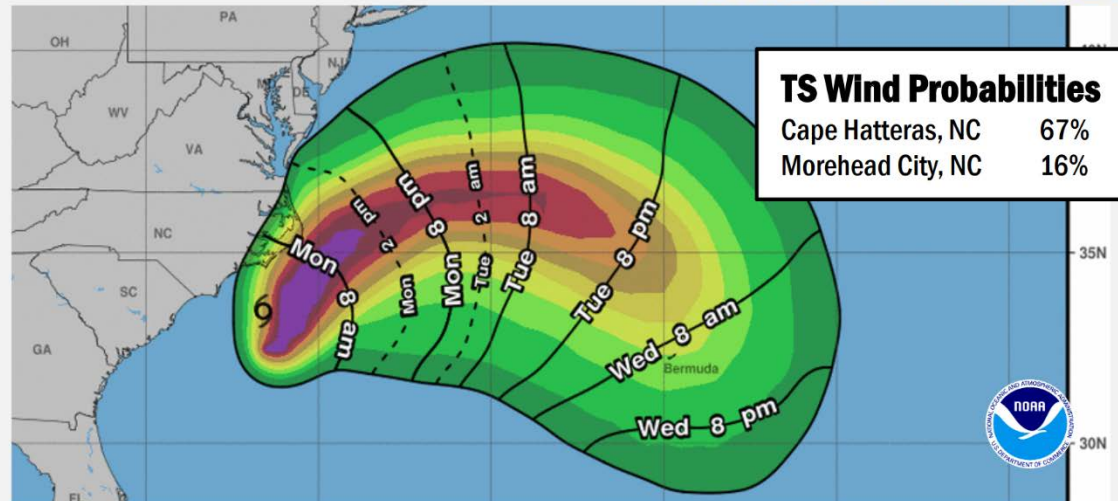
- Two flights landed yesterday, May 15 in Chicago.
- Four flights are scheduled to land today, May 16: one in Chicago, two in Los Angeles and one in New York City (JFK).
- It is important to note that any number of variables can affect international flight schedules, causing unexpected delays or cancellations.
- Through Project Air Bridge, the following supplies have been delivered from overseas manufacturers to the U.S. and into private sector supply chains from March 29 through May 15:
 - Nearly 1.4 million N95 respirators
 - 921 million gloves
 - 97.4 million surgical masks
 - 17.8 million surgical gowns
 - More than 2.3 million thermometers
 - More than 1.3 million face shields
 - Nearly 392,000 coveralls
 - 109,000 stethoscopes
 - 370,000 oxygen masks
 - More than 160,000 cannulas



Tropical Storm Arthur FORECAST TRACK

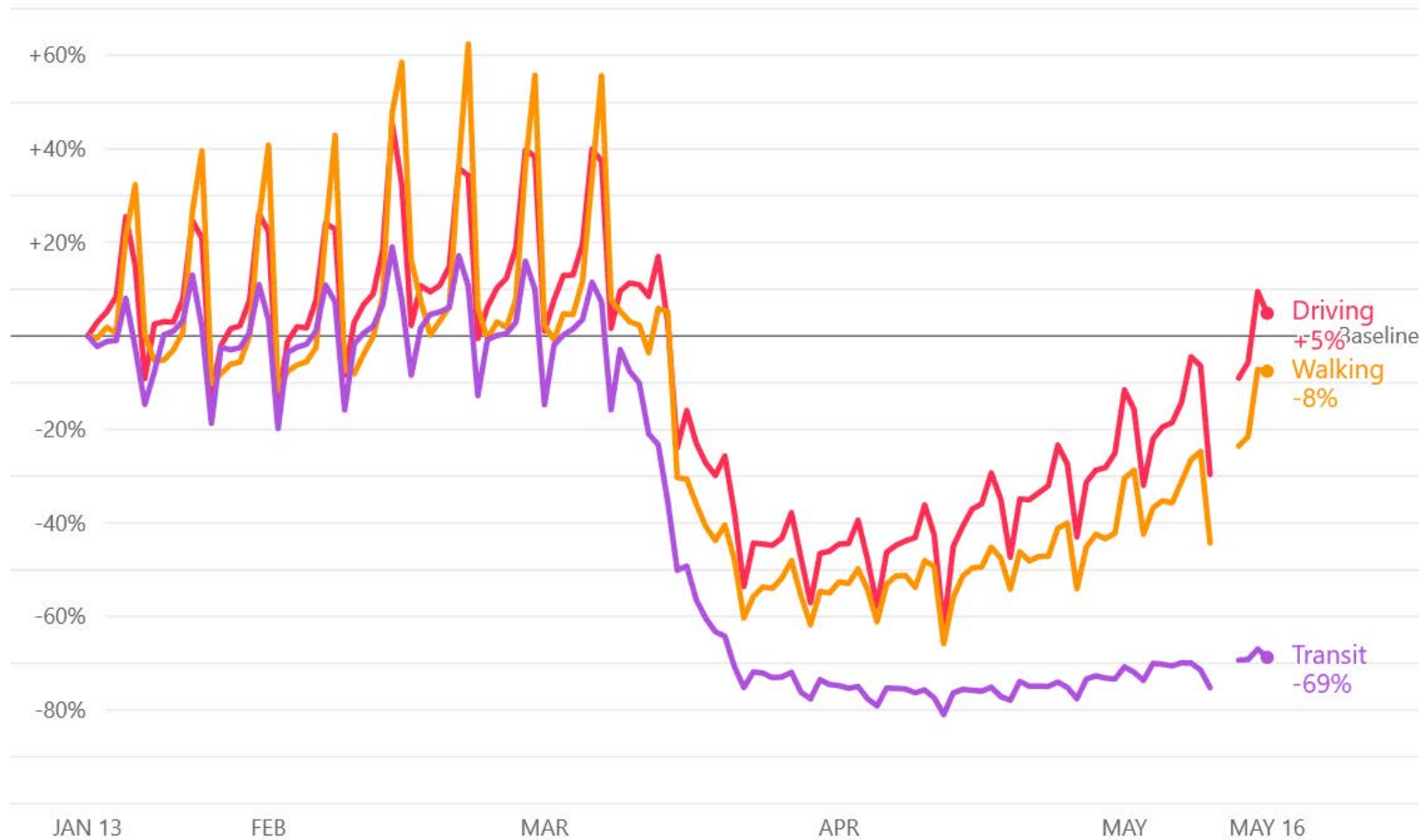


Tropical Storm Arthur ONSET OF TS WINDS

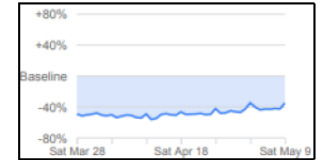

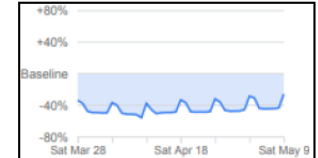

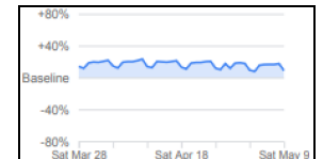

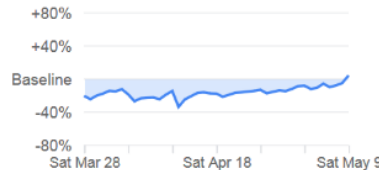

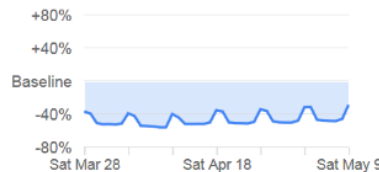

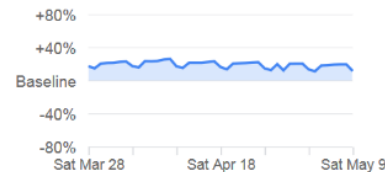

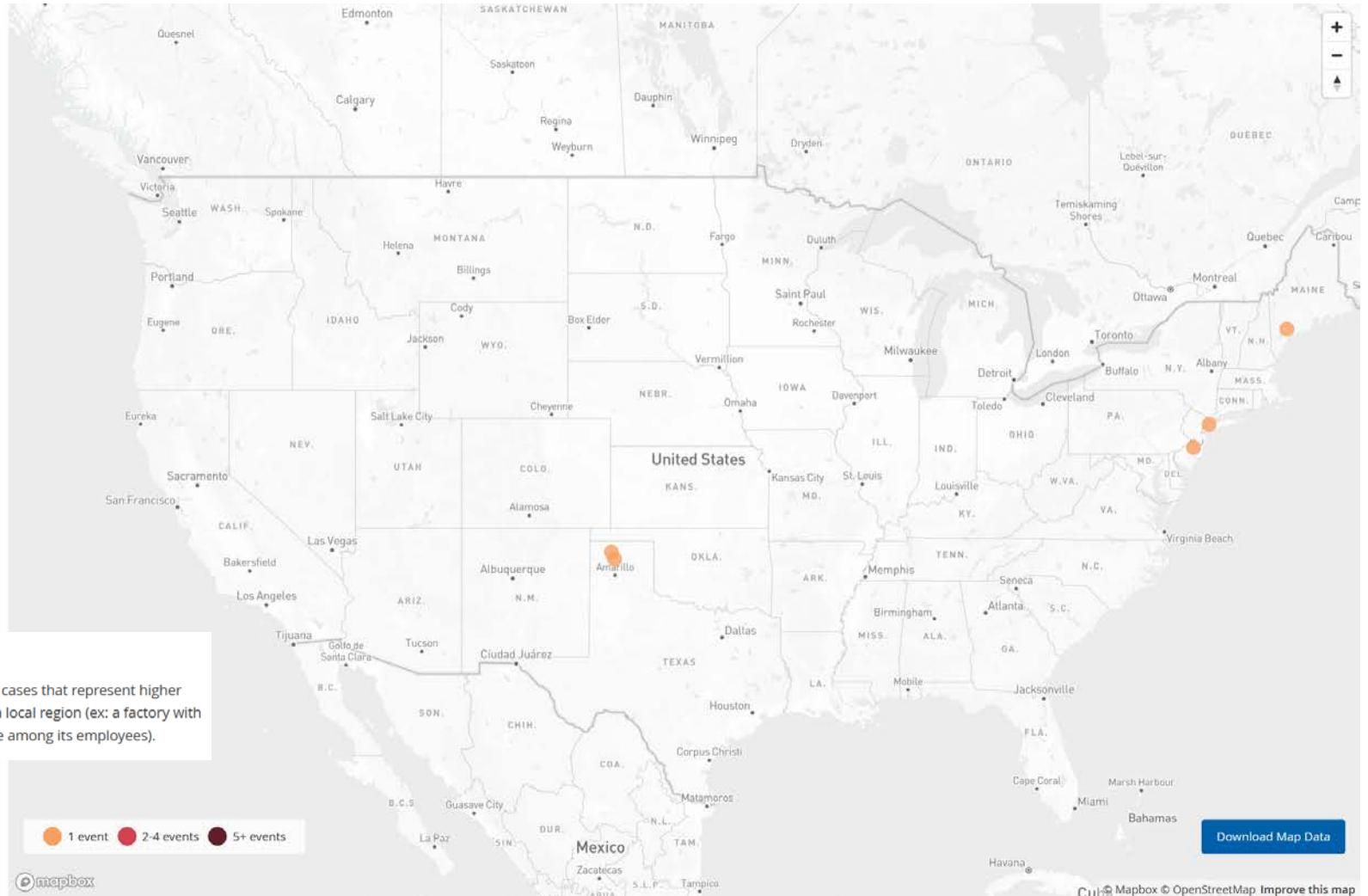

Forecast Discussion

Temperatures will cool through Tuesday, and areas west of the mountains should see some light rain and drizzle starting tonight and continuing through Monday night, with light showers persisting into Tuesday morning on the slopes of the San Bernardino Mountains. Highest amounts will be on the coastal slopes with a few tenths of an inch accumulating (generally less than 0.10" for coast/valley areas). Strong west winds will affect desert-facing mountain slopes and all desert areas tonight through early Tuesday. Warming Wednesday and Thursday, with cooler conditions late week. Locally gusty for mountains/deserts again on Friday.
