With No Current Cases, New Zealand Lifts Remaining COVID-19 Restrictions

- New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern says the country has officially eradicated COVID-19 and will return to normal after the last-known infected person recovered.
- Isolation and quarantine for those arriving from abroad will continue.
- The latest announcement, which brings the country of 5 million to its lowest alert level, means that large public gatherings, such as concerts and sports events, will be allowed for the first time since March 23, when Ardern announced a nationwide lockdown amid a rising number of daily cases. Restaurants and public transport will also be allowed to resume normal operations.

Judge orders Bolsonaro to resume publishing Brazil Covid-19 data

- Move comes amid accusations government was trying to suppress the scale of the crisis
- The Brazilian government sparked outrage on Saturday by purging the health ministry website of historical data relating to the pandemic and announcing it would stop publishing the cumulative death toll or number of infections.
- On Monday night, supreme court justice Alexandre de Moraes reportedly gave Bolsonaro's administration a 48-hour deadline to begin releasing the full figures again each day, after a legal challenge from two opposition parties.

Moscow Eases Coronavirus Lockdown Ahead Of Military Parade And Referendum

- The city of Moscow, the epicenter of Russia's coronavirus pandemic, is lifting lockdown restrictions as the Kremlin prepares for a massive military parade on Red Square and a national referendum that will seal President Vladimir Putin's political future.
- The mayor, though a Putin disciple, was unwilling to lift the lockdown restrictions because of the persistence of new coronavirus infections, Otkrytye Media reported, citing government sources. According to the news site, the Kremlin convinced Sobyenin to do so to allow for the parade and referendum.

Texas Reports Record-Breaking COVID-19 Hospitalizations As State Reopens

- Texas Department of State Health Services figures show 1,935 people were admitted as hospital patients for coronavirus-related treatment. That is up from a previous record of 1,888 on May 5.
- In Texas, the availability of intensive care beds and ventilators — 1,600 and 5,800 respectively — have been seen as markers of improvement and evidence that it is time to reopen the economy.

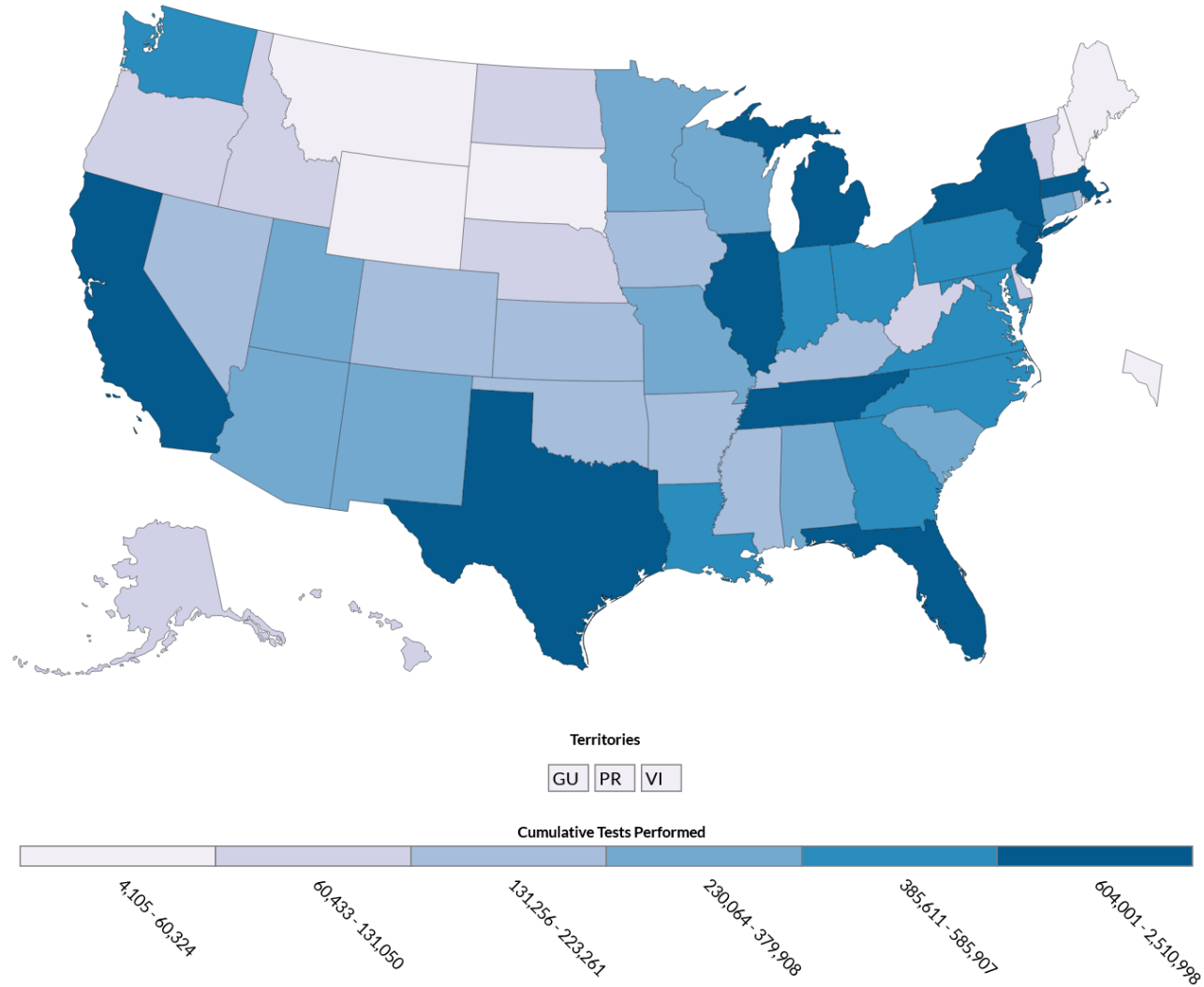

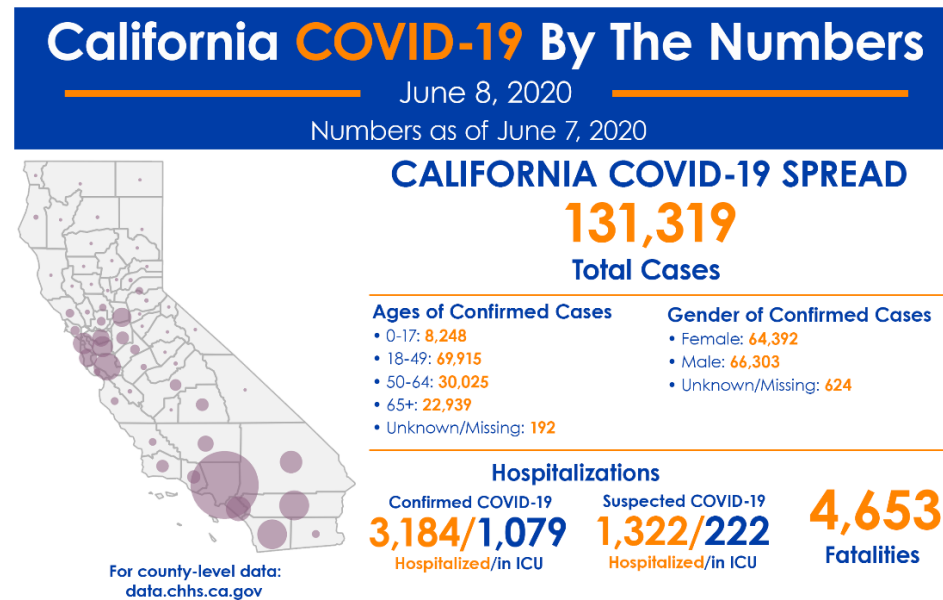

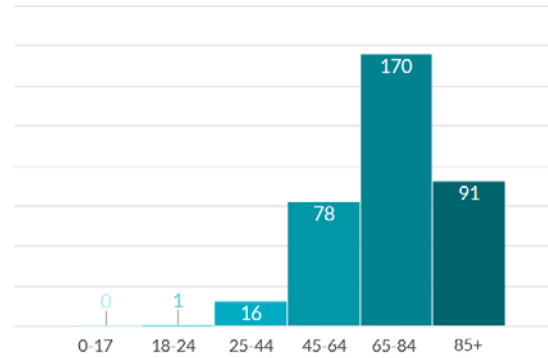

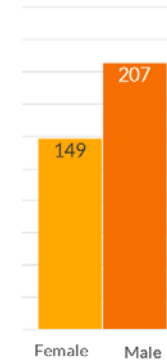

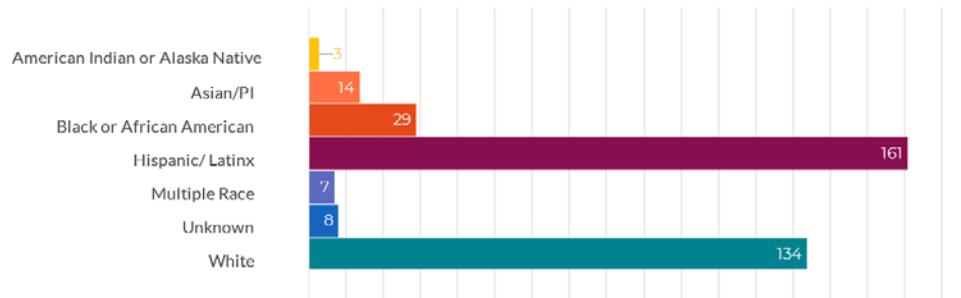

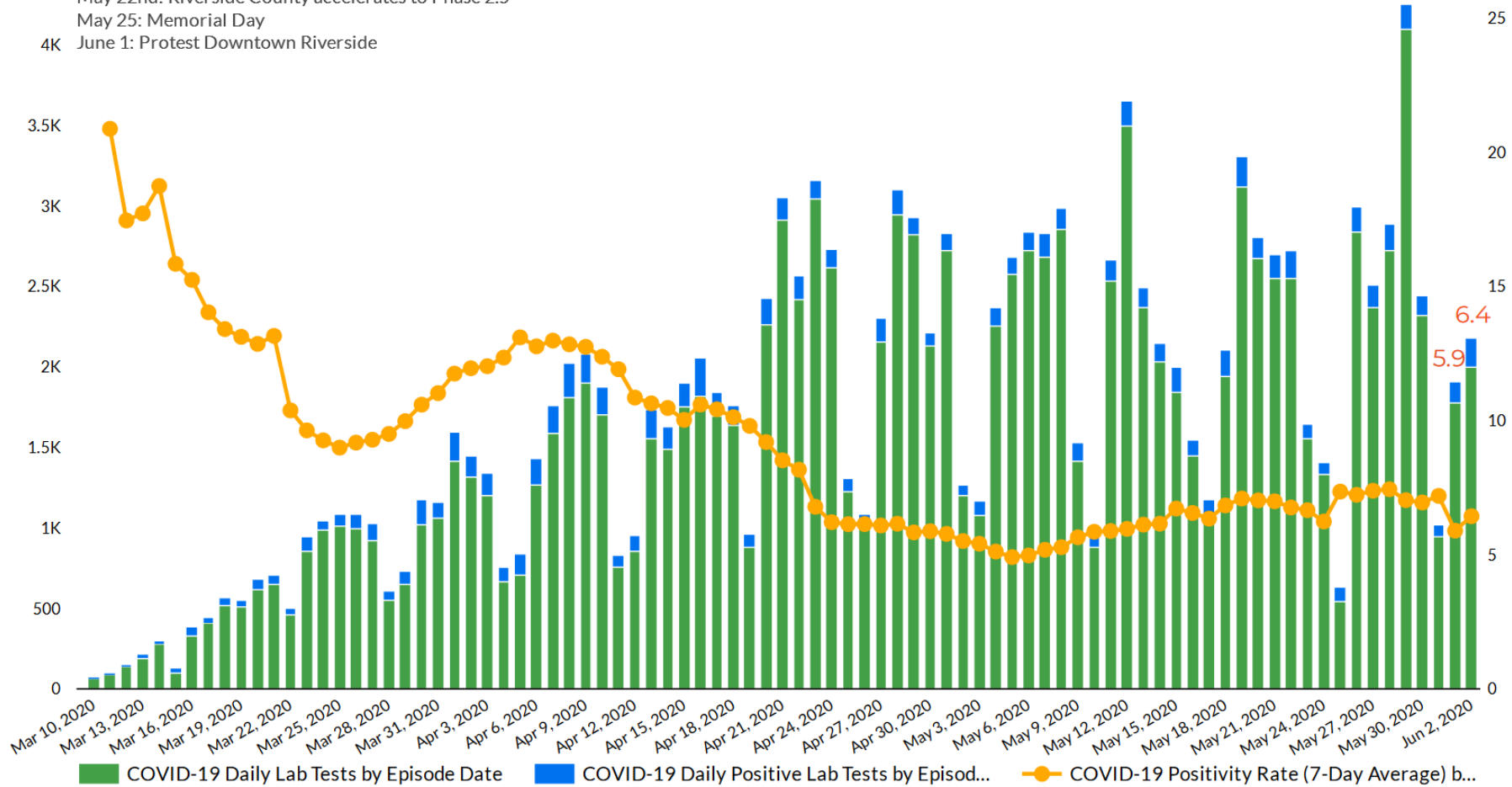

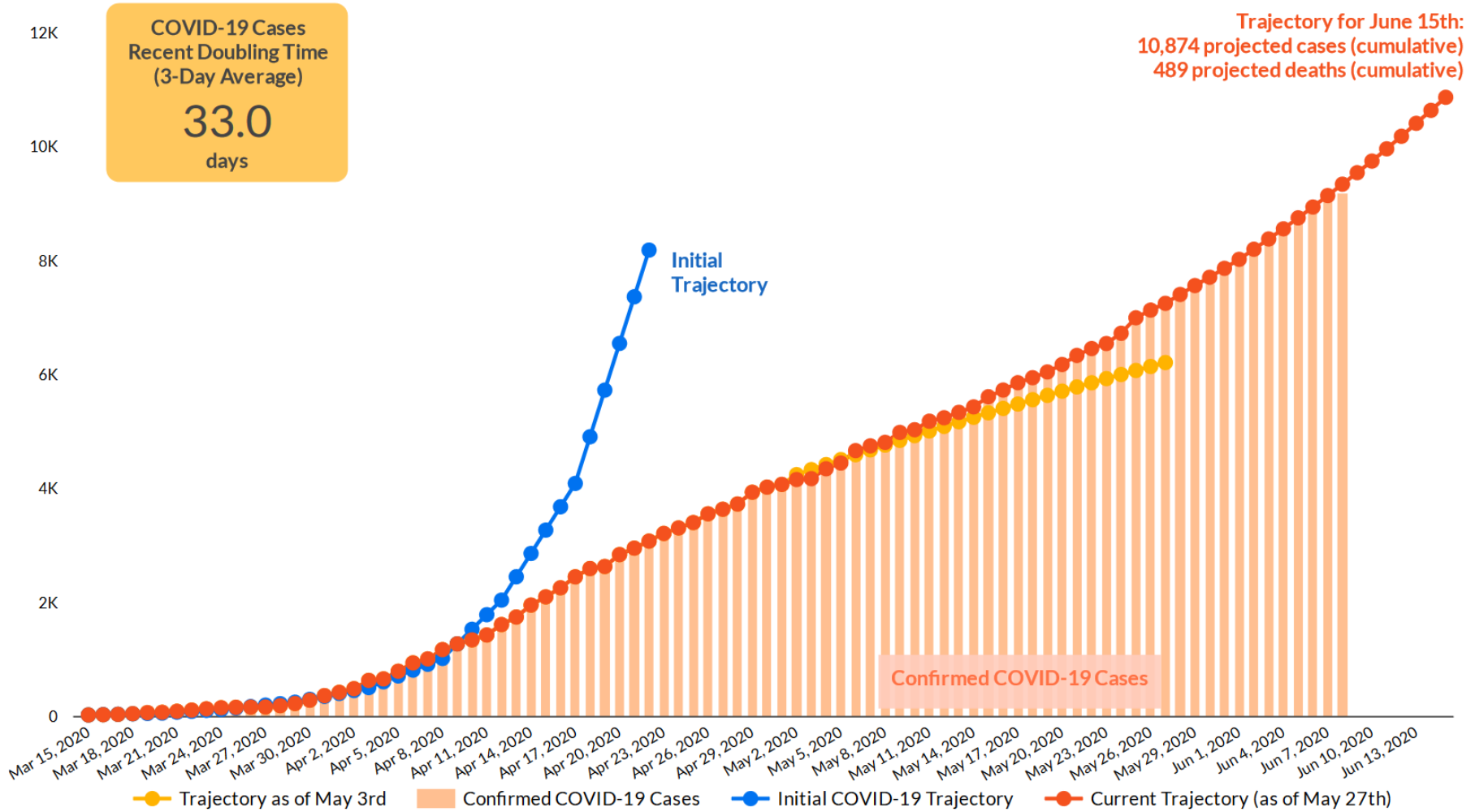

Forecast Discussion

A warmer period begins today. A Wind Advisory remains in effect for the High Desert through this evening. Strong offshore winds will develop tonight, continuing Monday, for most areas west of the mountains, except in San Diego County where the winds won't be as strong. Offshore winds will be lighter but still breezy Tuesday, with the warmest conditions at the coast (Heat Advisory likely to be issued for Tuesday). Continued warm weather through midweek, with the warmest day for the deserts on Thursday. Cooler conditions will return late in the week, as onshore flow rebuilds and marine layer clouds become more prominent as we head into the weekend.

Tropical Depression Cristobal



Situation:

TD Cristobal currently moving into Missouri. Heavy rainfall and gusty winds will spread northward through the Middle and Upper Mississippi Valley and the western Great Lakes today as Cristobal strengthens as an extratropical cyclone over the next 36 hours. Total rainfall is expected to be between 2-4 inches, with local amounts as high as 6 inches. This may produce flash flooding and is forecast to produce new and renewed minor to moderate river flooding across portions of the lower Missouri and Mid to Upper Mississippi Valleys.

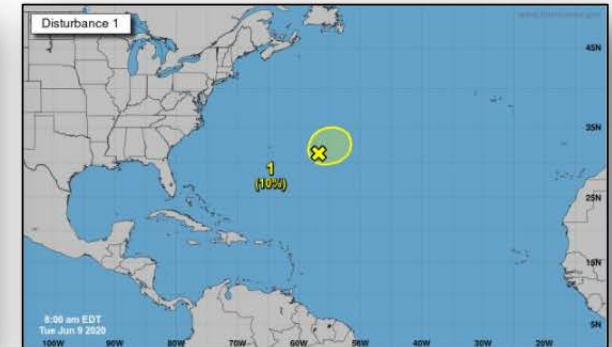
Tropical Outlook – Five Day

Eastern Pacific

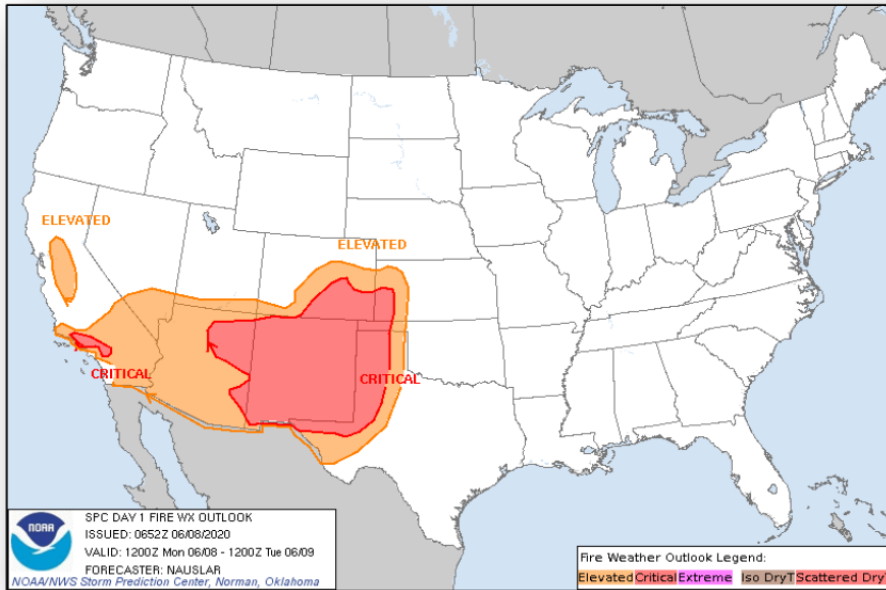

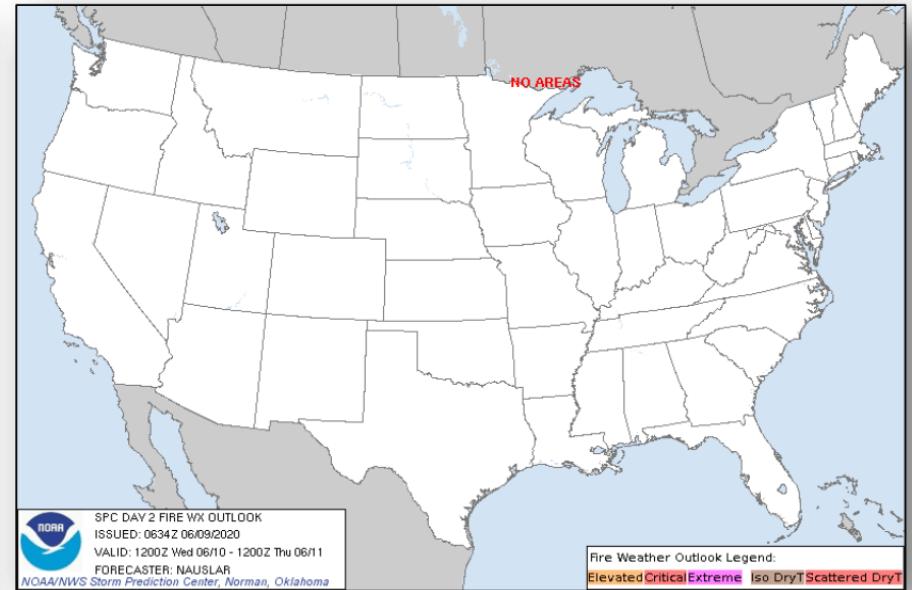
