Coronavirus sweeps through Afghanistan's security forces

- The novel coronavirus is sweeping through Afghanistan's security forces, according to senior Afghan security officials from four
 provinces who report suspected infection rates of 60 to 90 percent among their units reducing the number of forces available to
 conduct operations or take up duty at outposts.
- The Afghan government refuses to release data on the number of coronavirus cases within the security forces. Spokesmen from the Afghan ministries of defense and the interior acknowledge that there are cases within the security forces but say the virus's spread has been contained because troops displaying symptoms are quickly isolated, masks have been made mandatory and medical supplies have been distributed to bases nationwide.
- Security officials from Nangarhar, Ghazni, Logar and Kunduz provinces all heavily contested by the Taliban spoke to The
 Washington Post about infection rates within their ranks on the condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to talk to the
 media.

Coronavirus restrictions threaten democracy, global leaders warn

- More than 500 political and civil society leaders, Nobel laureates and rights groups have warned that some governments are using the coronavirus pandemic to "tighten their grip on power", undermining democracy and civil liberties.
- In an open letter on Thursday, signed by former US Secretary of State Madeleine Albright, actor Richard Gere and Nobel Peace Prize laureates Shirin Ebadi, Lech Walesa and Jose Ramos-Horta among others, the authors said the measures introduced to stem the spread of the virus pose a threat to human and political rights.
- "The current pandemic represents a formidable global challenge to democracy," the letter said.
- Lockdown restrictions have also led to a "horrifying global surge" in domestic violence and threatened human rights, according to the United Nations.
- Nearly 70 pro-democracy institutions also supported it.

Kentucky Derby will have fans in the stands 'under strict guidelines,' officials say

- The Kentucky Derby will have fans in the stands "under strict guidelines" when it runs on the rescheduled date of Sept. 5, officials said Thursday.
- The annual horse racing spectacle at Churchill Downs had been rescheduled earlier this year from the first Saturday in May to the first Saturday in September due to the coronavirus pandemic.
- Churchill Downs announced Thursday that "after consultation with Gov. Andy Beshear and state public health officials," officials determined the 146th edition of the Run for the Roses will take place with spectators "under strict guidelines."
- The new plan, which was put into place with guidance from Kentucky's "Healthy at Work" plan and the Louisville Metro Department of Public Health and Wellness, will include several rules meant to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, National Institutes of Health (NIH) Swimming with the High-Tech Sharks to Improve COVID-19 Testing (Directors Blog)

- So much has been reported over the past six months about testing for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) that keeping up with the issue can be a real challenge. To discuss the latest progress on new technologies for SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic testing in the United States, I spoke recently with NIH's Dr. Bruce Tromberg, director of the National Institute of Biomedical Imaging and Bioengineering (NIBIB). Not only does Bruce run a busy NIH institute, he is helping to coordinate the national response for expanded testing during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Bruce also has a leading role in one of NIH's most-exciting new initiatives. It's called the Rapid Acceleration of Diagnostics (RADx)
 initiative, and it is on the fast track to bolster the country's diagnostic testing capacity within months. Here's a condensed transcript of
 our chat, which took place via videoconference, with Bruce linking in from Bethesda, MD and me from my home in Chevy Chase, MD

Disneyland Reopening Delayed Indefinitely

- Disneyland reversed plans Wednesday to reopen July 17, indefinitely delaying the reopening of the theme park.
- In a statement, the company blamed the state for the delay while also implying that ongoing union negotiations are a factor.
- "The State of California has now indicated that it will not issue theme park reopening guidelines until sometime after July 4. Given the time required for us to bring thousands of cast members back to work and restart our business, we have no choice but to delay the reopening of our theme parks and resort hotels until we receive approval from government officials. Once we have a clearer understanding of when guidelines will be released, we expect to be able to communicate a reopening date."
- According to the company, Disney developed enhanced health and safety protocols for employees and guests at Shanghai Disney
 Resort, Hong Kong Disneyland Resort and Walt Disney World Resort that passed muster with health officials in those communities.
- The Downtown Disney District will reopen on July 9 as previously announced, despite the delay in reopening the theme park. Guests can expect to see a series of health and safety protocols in place. The Downtown Disney District reopening was approved along with restaurant and retail openings throughout California.

Infectious Coronavirus Encounters Now 'Likely' In LA

- The county is not in immediate danger of hospitals being overwhelmed with coronavirus cases, said the county's health services director, Dr. Christina Ghaly. However, if the virus's spread continues to accelerate, it could threaten the availability of intensive care unit beds, she warned.
- hat does concern health officials is the climbing percentage of people testing positive for the virus. The overall percentage of people testing positive over the past seven days has risen to 8.8 percent, up from 8.4 percent on Monday and from 5.8 percent just 11 days ago. The trend would appear to indicate that the virus is spreading in the community. The new cases raised the county's overall total to 88,512. So far 3,172 Angelenos have died from COVID-19.
- Enough people have COVID-19 that the average Angeleno is likely to encounter potentially infectious people on a typical day, officials say.






Total Cases

Confirmed Cases of COVID-19





Post-Tropical Depression Dolly - Final (Advisory #9 as of 11:00 a.m. ET)

- · Located 370 miles SW of Cape Race Newfoundland
- Moving NE at 16 mph
- · Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- · Last public advisory issued by the National Hurricane Center



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



<u>Tropical Depression Three-E</u> (Advisory 4 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- About 1,455 miles ESE of Hilo, Hawaii
- Moving W at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds of 35 mph
- Some strengthening is forecast over the next 48 hours
- Likely to become a tropical storm tonight or tomorrow

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Several hundred miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Development of this system is no longer expected due to unfavorable environmental conditions
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (0%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- · A few hundred miles SW of the coast of Mexico
- · Conditions forecast to be conducive for development in a couple of days
- Likely to become a tropical depression in a few days while it moves WNW parallel to the coast of Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (60%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)


Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Forecast to form south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec by late this week
- Conditions expected to be conducive for gradual development over the weekend as it moves WNW parallel to the coast of Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)
