








#### **Confirmed Cases by City of Residence**

# Tropical Outlook – Atlantic


#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over Cuba, the central and northwestern Bahamas, and adjacent Atlantic waters
- Expected to move WNW over the southeastern Gulf of Mexico by today, across the central Gulf tomorrow, and reach the northwestern Gulf on Thursday and Friday
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)

#### Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located midway between the west coast of Africa and the Lesser Antilles
- Moving W at 10 mph
- · A tropical depression could form during the next couple of days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (60%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (60%)

#### Tropical Storm Douglas (Advisory #4 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- · About 2000 miles ESE of Hilo, HI
- · Moving WSW at 14 mph
- · Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Strengthening is forecast during the next couple of days
- Expected to become a hurricane by Wednesday

#### Tropical Depression Seven-E (Advisory #5 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- · About 1500 miles E of Hilo, HI
- Moving W at 13 mph
- · Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Expected to become a remnant low today and dissipate by Thursday

#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- · Forecast to form well south of the southern coast of Mexico

- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)








