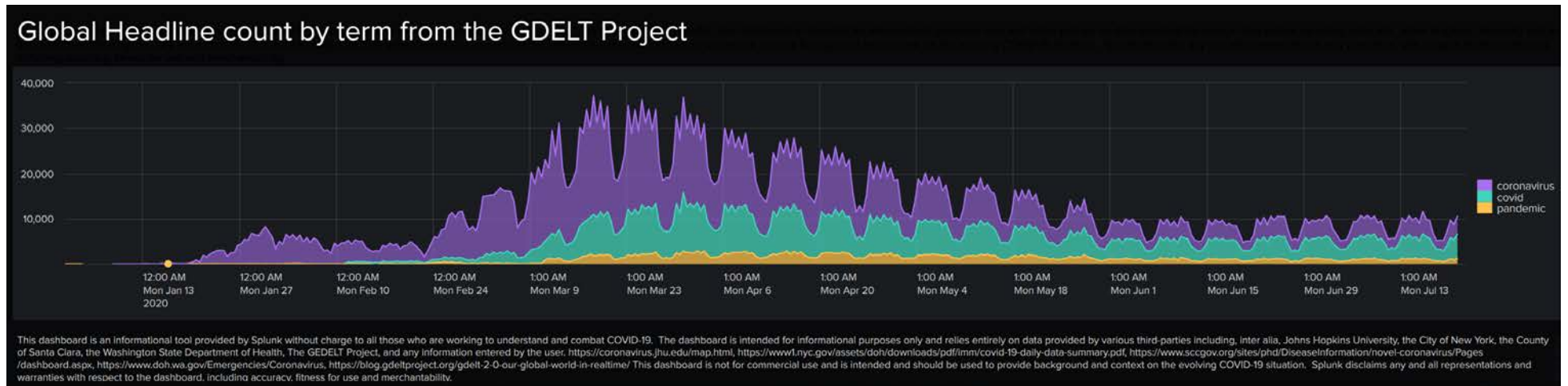

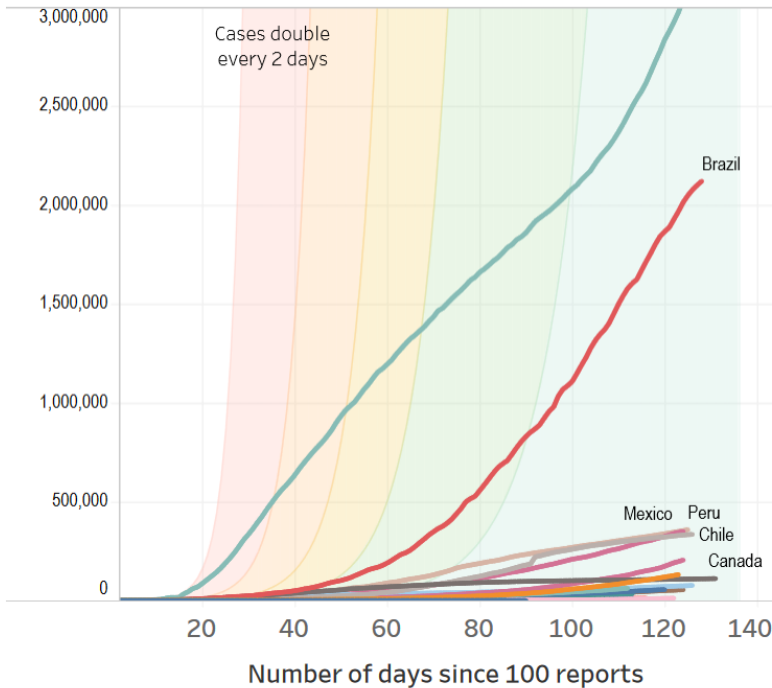

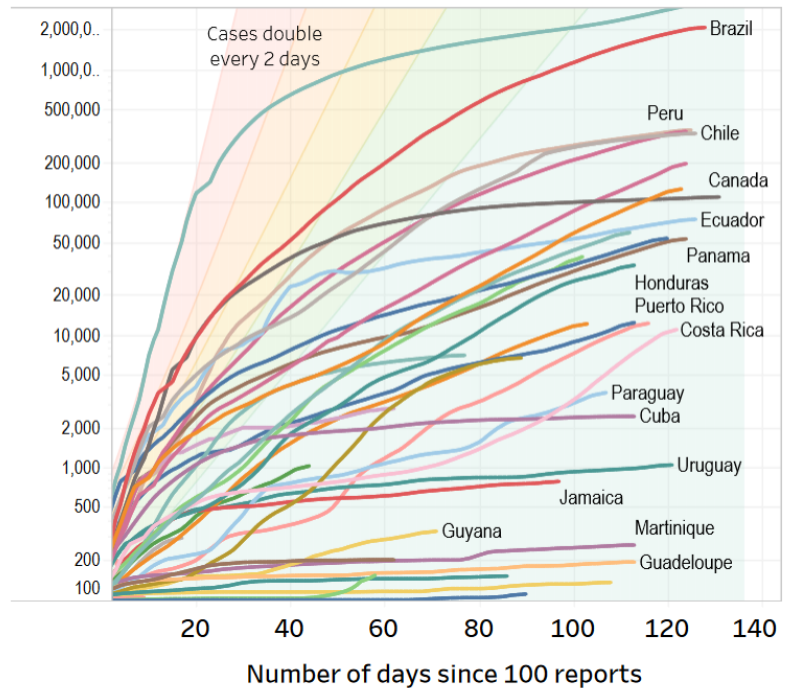

### **Crisis hits Lebanon's hospitals, among the best in Mideast**

- Lebanon's hospitals, long considered among the best in the Middle East, are cracking under the country's financial crisis, struggling to pay staff, keep equipment running or even stay open amid a surge in coronavirus cases.
- Private hospitals, the engine of the health system, warn they may have to shut down. Chronically underfunded public hospitals, which have led the fight against the virus, fear they will be overrun
- The situation is really catastrophic, and we expect a total collapse if the government doesn't come up with a rescue plan," said Selim Abi Saleh, the head of the Physicians Union in northern Lebanon, one of the country's poorest and most populated regions.

- Medical facilities have let go of nurses and reduced salaries, their finances running dry in part because they can't collect millions owed to them by the state. Nearly a third of Lebanon's 15,000 physicians aim to migrate or already have, a doctors' union official said, based on the number who have sought union documents they can use abroad to prove their credentials

### **US accuses Chinese hackers in targeting of COVID-19 research**

- Hackers working with the Chinese government targeted firms developing vaccines for the coronavirus and stole hundreds of millions of dollars worth of intellectual property and trade secrets from companies across the world, the Justice Department said Tuesday as it announced criminal charges.
- The indictment does not accuse the two Chinese defendants of actually obtaining the coronavirus research, but it does underscore the extent to which scientific innovation has been a top target for foreign governments and criminal hackers looking to know what American companies are developing during the pandemic. In this case, the hackers researched vulnerabilities in the computer networks of biotech firms and diagnostic companies that were developing vaccines and testing kits and researching antiviral drugs.

- China strongly condemned the move, the latest in a series of steps by the Trump administration as it ratchets up pressure on the world's second-largest economy over trade, technology, human rights and security.
- In Houston, firefighters responded to reports of papers being burned on the consulate grounds Tuesday night but were barred entry, according to news media reports

- Children's Hospital of OC reports increase in COVID-19 cases, mostly among school-aged children

- Doctors at Children's Hospital of Orange County (CHOC) say over the last couple of months, they've seen COVID-19 cases double every couple weeks.
- "The percentage of positive cases that we've seen over the last two months has been doubling virtually every two weeks," Golden said, adding, "Sixty-five cases have been hospitalized in the last three months cumulatively. Right now we have 13 patients in the hospital."
  - The 638 positive cases since mid-March from CHOC's hospitals and clinics ranged from infants to 24-year-olds.

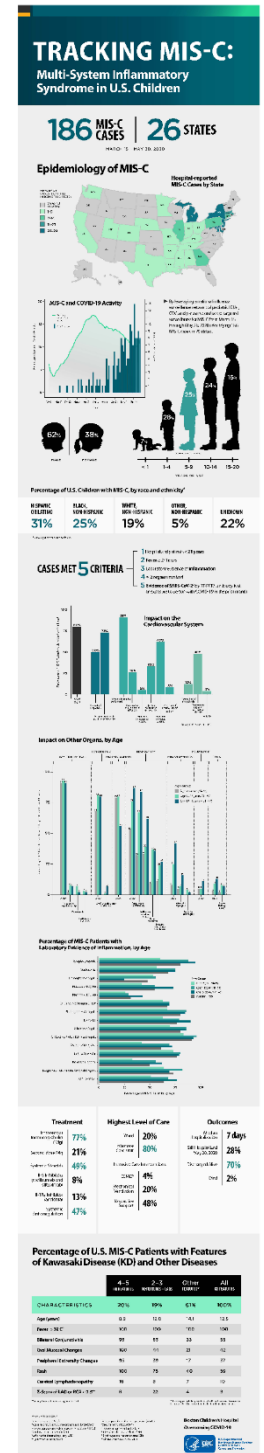

- Coronavirus in Babies and Kids

- Aaron Milstone, M.D., M.H.S., a pediatrician at the Johns Hopkins Children's Center and an infectious disease expert at The Johns Hopkins Hospital, provides information on symptoms and keeping babies and kids safe, along with an overview of PIMS.
- "Children are exposed to COVID-19 when the virus contacts their eyes, nose, mouth or lungs. This usually occurs when a nearby infected person coughs or sneezes, which releases respiratory droplets into the air and onto the child's face or nearby surfaces such as tables, food or hands."
- He says the best way to prevent children from becoming sick with COVID-19 is to avoid exposing them to people who are (or who might be) sick with the virus:
  - Avoid crowds. Keep kids away from crowded areas when possible.
  - Stay away from sick people. Keep children at least 6 feet away from anyone who is sick with a cough or fever, including family members.

## World virus cases near 15M; Trump says things will get worse

- The global tally of people infected with the coronavirus neared 15 million Wednesday, while in the worst-hit pandemic hot spot of the United States, President Donald Trump warned the pandemic would “get worse before it gets better.”
- With COVID-19 set to pass another shocking milestone, Trump delivered his first virus briefing after a three-month hiatus, offering a shifted message Tuesday, including professing a newfound respect for the protective face masks he has seldom worn.

## GOP splits as virus aid package could swell past \$1 trillion

- The price tag for the next COVID-19 aid package could quickly swell above \$1 trillion as White House officials negotiate with Congress over money to reopen schools, prop up small businesses, boost virus testing and keep cash flowing to Americans while the virus crisis deepens in the U.S.
- Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell on Tuesday promised a new round of direct payments to earners below a certain income level, similar to the \$1,200 checks sent in the spring. President Donald Trump insists on a payroll tax holiday for workers. And Democrats want billions to outfit schools and shore up local governments.

## Virus antibodies fade fast but not necessarily protection

- New research suggests that antibodies the immune system makes to fight the new coronavirus may only last a few months in people with mild illness, but that doesn’t mean protection also is gone or that it won’t be possible to develop an effective vaccine.
- “Infection with this coronavirus does not necessarily generate lifetime immunity,” but antibodies are only part of the story, said Dr. Buddy Creech, an infectious disease specialist at Vanderbilt University. He had no role in the work, published Tuesday in the New England Journal of Medicine.

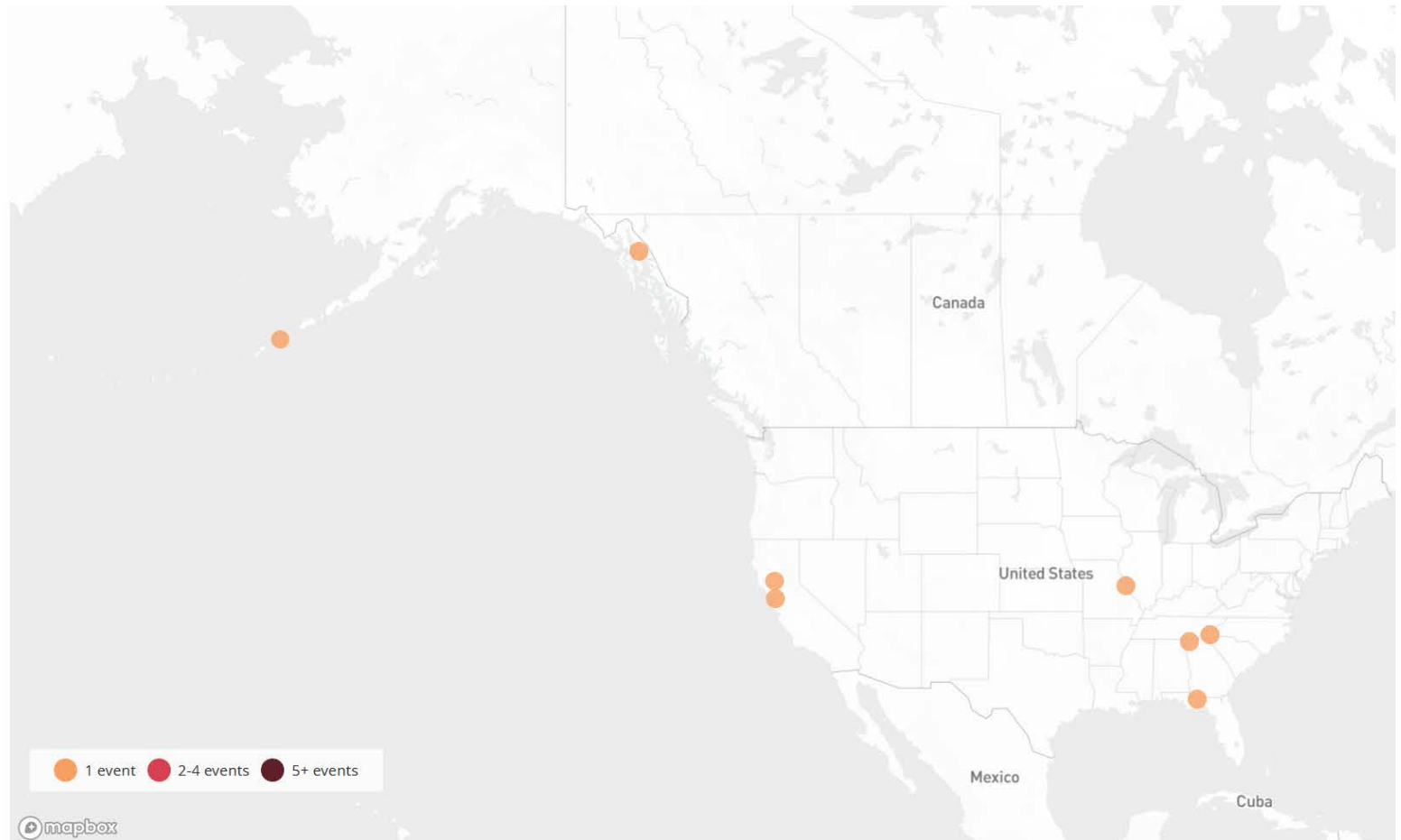

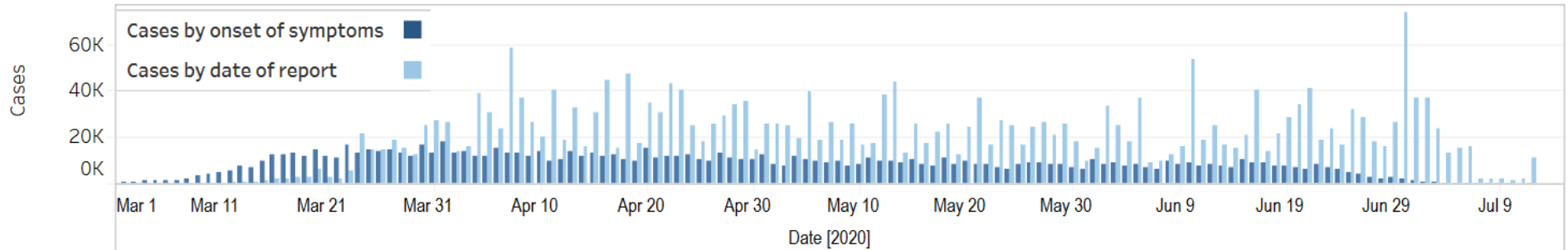

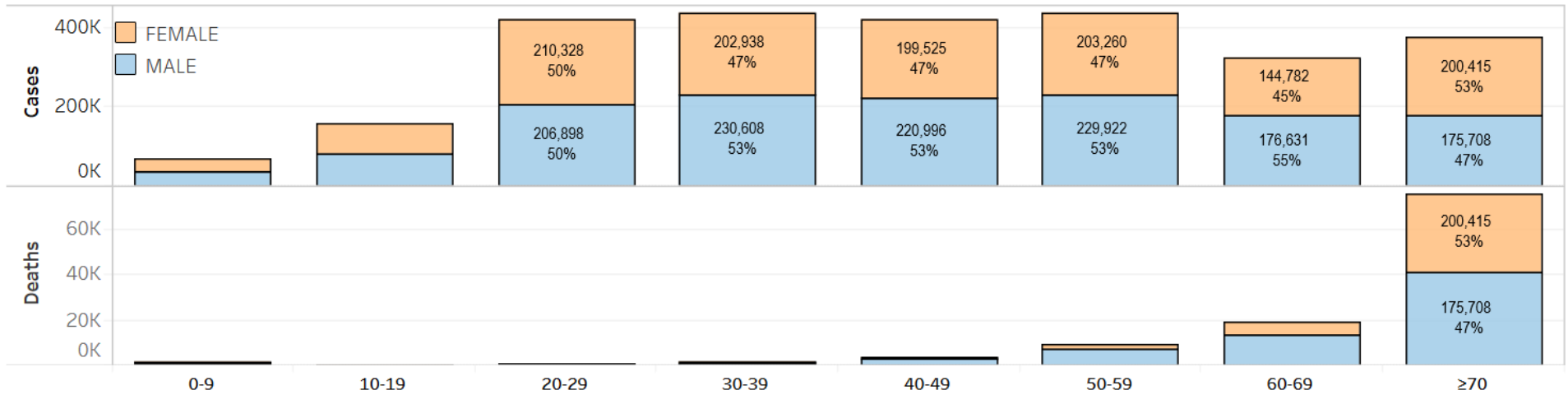




### Epidemiological curve



### Total confirmed cases and deaths by age group

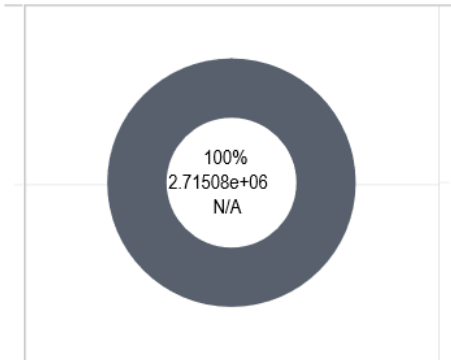

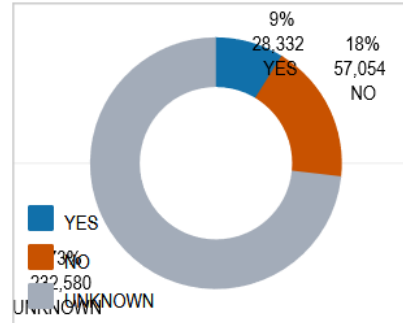

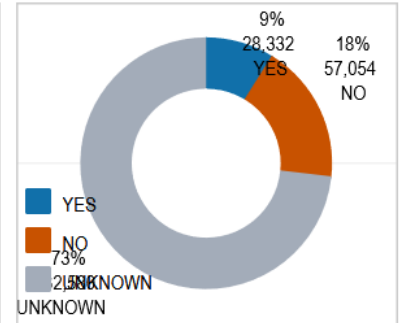

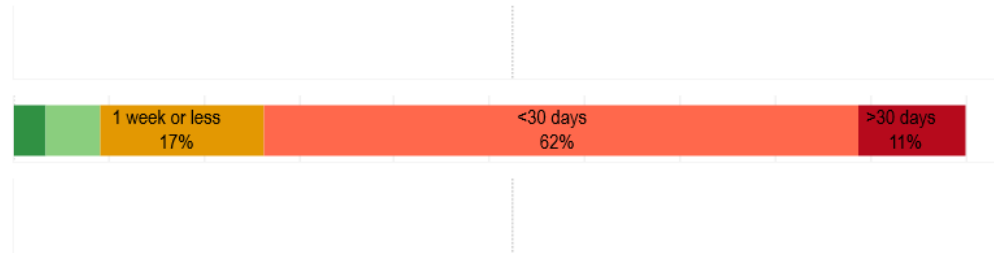

## **Earthquake – Alaska**

- At 2:19 a.m. ET on July 22, a magnitude 7.8 earthquake occurred 61 miles SSE of Perryville, AK, (*pop.* 113) at a depth of 8 miles; felt as a MMI of VII
- Green PAGER was issued, indicating a low likelihood of casualties or damage
- Tsunami generated; a 0.8 foot wave was detected at Sand Point, AK. Tsunami Warning was cancelled at 4:23 a.m. ET
- 12 aftershocks reported; additional Green PAGERs were issued for M6.1 and M5.8 aftershocks
