## How 9/11 and the Coronavirus Pushed the UAE and Israel Together

• The normalization pact between the United Arab Emirates and Israel that surprised the world on Thursday is the fruit of almost 20 years of covert ties between the two tiny Middle Eastern powers, and can ultimately be traced to the 9/11 attacks on New York and Washington. Because the Saudi hijackers used Dubai as a key point to transfer funds, the Emiratis quickly latched onto the Israelis to develop the cybersecurity software that would help the UAE rescue and rebuild its credibility as the Middle East's premier financial center. "9/11 was the big wake-up call that made it clear the UAE needed to have the best technology, and that presented an opportunity for the Israelis," said Ghanem Nuseibeh, founder of London-based Cornerstone Global Associates and a veteran advisor to companies in the region.



• Born of necessity, the two countries' first dealings blossomed into an unusually broad relationship. Over the past two decades, business relations between the UAE and Israel have spread from computer surveillance and airport security into shipping, desalination, agricultural technology, real estate, and tourism. Most prominent in recent months has been the UAE's interest in supporting and gaining access to Israeli research into a vaccine and treatment for COVID-19. While the common threat from Iran, the Emiratis' aspirations to a bigger regional role, the Palestinian issue, and pressure from Washington all played a role in the peace deal, it is these business and financial relations—and the predominance of Israeli civilian, defense, and intelligence technology—that ultimately laid the groundwork for any deal. This is also where the UAE has the most to gain.

### **UAE, Israeli Companies Sign Coronavirus Research Agreement**

- In the coming weeks, the two states are expected to announce a string of partnerships, as deals on the sidelines of the peace agreement start to take shape
- The Emirati APEX National Investment company signed a "strategic commercial agreement" with Israel's Tera Group to cooperate
  on research and development related to COVID-19, including a testing device, the UAE's state news agency WAM said late on
  Saturday.
- The deal "is considered the first business to inaugurate trade, economy and effective partnerships between the Emirati and Israeli business sectors, for the benefit of serving humanity by strengthening research and studies on the novel Coronavirus," WAM quoted APEX's chairman Khalifa Yousef Khoury as saying.
- This is not the first time companies in the two countries have brokered a deal, however. In early July, WAM itself announced a similar agreement between Group 42, an Abu Dhabi-based company, with Israeli defense companies Rafael and IAI in July. This was also aimed at finding ways to combat coronavirus.

### Russia's Covid-19 vaccine generated an immune response, study says

- A Covid-19 vaccine developed and tested in Russia generated neutralizing antibodies in dozens of study subjects, and while the vaccine often caused side effects such as fever, those side effects were mostly mild, according to data published Friday in the medical journal The Lancet.
- Russia drew criticism when it announced the world's first approved coronavirus vaccine for public use in August -- even before crucial Phase 3 trials had been completed.
- In the Phase 1 and 2 studies of the vaccine, which is named Sputnik V, all 76 study participants developed antibodies to the virus that causes Covid-19, according to Friday's report in The Lancet.
- The levels of neutralizing antibody response were similar to the immune response that people had after naturally recovering from Covid-19, according to the study.

### Tyson Foods to open medical clinics at several of its US plants

- Tyson Foods is planning to open medical clinics at several of its United States plants to improve the health of its workers and better protect them from the coronavirus.
- The Springdale, an Arkansas-based company, which processes about 20 percent of all beef, pork and chicken in the US, said its plan to open the clinics near its plants was in the works before the coronavirus struck this year, but that they will undoubtedly help the company respond to the pandemic.
- Tyson said it would initially set up clinics near seven of its plants, including in Storm Lake, Iowa, and Holcomb, Kansas, in a pilot program. It did not announce the other locations Thursday. The clinics would open early next year, providing primary care to thousands of Tyson workers and their families.





Map of news reports related to social impact events resulting from the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States, such as school closures, localized outbreaks, state of emergency declarations, etc.



## Coronavirus Pandemic Whole-of-America Response

### **Medical Supplies and Equipment**

- + As of Aug. 31, FEMA, HHS and the private sector coordinated delivery of or are currently shipping: 230 million N95 masks, 1 billion surgical and procedural masks, 42.2 million eye and face shields, 403 million gowns and coveralls and over 25.4 billion gloves.
- → As of Aug. 7, FEMA delivered 30,458 medical supplies to nursing homes to 52 states and territories. One hundred percent of scheduled shipments have been made.
- □ FEMA coordinated two shipments totaling a 14-day supply of personal protective equipment to all 15,400 Medicaid and Medicare-certified nursing homes.
- Shipments are meant to supplement existing efforts to provide equipment to nursing homes.
- → In support of the Department of Veterans Affairs, FEMA coordinated shipments of more than 8.1 million N95 respirator masks, 500,000 surgical masks, more than 3.3 million gloves, 595,360 face shields and 30,000 surgical gowns to facilities across the country.
- + As of Sept. 3, the federal government has approximately 126,029 total ventilators available in the Strategic National Stockpile.
- → To date, FEMA, HHS and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Cybersecurity Infrastructure and Security Agency (CISA), along with other federal agencies, processed and distributed nearly 350 million cloth face coverings.
- Nearly 150 million of those went to critical infrastructure workers, others went to State, Tribal, Territorial, Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD) partners/stakeholders and other government partners.

### **Testing**

- ◆ As of Sept. 3, CDC, state, local public health labs and other laboratories have tested more than 88.2 million samples.
- □ As of Sept. 3, the FDA issued 240 individual emergency use authorizations for test kit manufacturers and laboratories, including 43 antibody tests and 4 antigen tests.
- → As of July 31, all 41 original Community-Based Testing Sites have transitioned to state management (29) or have closed (12) in consultation with the states.
- $\ \square$  As of Aug. 4, 398,300 samples were collected at federally supported Community-Based Testing Sites.
- → HHS has established a public-private partnership with pharmacy and retail companies to accelerate testing.
- □ As of Sept. 2, under the CBTS public-private partnership, there are currently 789 live sites in 48 states and Washington, D.C., are conducting testing.
- □ 1.9 million samples were processed at public-private partnership testing sites.

### **Federal Funding**

- + As of Sept. 3, all 50 states, five territories, the Seminole Tribe of Florida and Washington, D.C., were approved for major disaster declarations to assist with additional needs identified.
- □ As of Sept. 3, there are 89 tribes working directly with FEMA: 45 tribes that are direct recipients with emergency declarations and 44 tribes that are recipients under state declarations. One tribe, the Seminole Tribe of Florida (STOF) is, a direct recipient with a major disaster and an emergency declaration,

- A tribal government may choose to be a subrecipient under a state receiving FEMA assistance, or to choose to be a direct recipient of FEMA.
- → As of Sept. 1, FEMA obligated over \$29.6 billion in support of COVID-19 efforts. This support includes:
- Emergency Food and Shelter: \$200 million
- □ Temporary Medical Facilities including medical personnel, mortuary and ambulance services: \$2.3 billion
- □ PPE including medical supplies and pharmaceuticals: \$2.8 billion
- □ National Guard: \$1.7 billion
- □ Public Assistance Emergency Protective Measures (Non-PPE): \$1.6 billion
- □ Commodities: \$27.3 million
- □ Crisis Counseling: \$59.7 million
- → On August 8, 2020, President Trump made available up to \$44 billion from FEMA's Disaster Relief Fund to provide financial assistance to Americans who have lost wages due to the COVID-19 pandemic. - Over \$26.1 billion made available to 42 states (see attachment)

### **Additional Federal Support**

- + As of Sept. 4, FEMA has 1,728 employees supporting COVID-19 pandemic response out of a total 20,831 agency employees ready to respond to other emergencies should they occur.
- → To date, the president has approved 49 National Guard requests for federal support for the use of National Guard personnel in a Title 32 duty status through Dec. 31.
- □ As of Sept. 3, 16,356 National Guard troops have activated in T-32 duty status and 260 troops have activated in State Active Duty status to help with testing and other response efforts.
- → As of Sept. 3, 6,785 CDC personnel are supporting the outbreak response.
- → As of Sept. 3, HHS has 207 personnel supporting the outbreak response.
- → As of Sept. 4, 102 agencies across 30 states, the District of Columbia, three tribes and one U.S. territory have used FEMA's Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS) to send a total of 405 alerts containing information on COVID-19 to cell phones and other wireless devices via the Wireless Emergency Alert system, and 91 alerts to radios/televisions via Emergency Alert System.






### **Licensed Hospital/ICU Beds Utilization Trends 8-31-2020**




## Tropical Outlook – Atlantic






