Woman arrested for surfing in northern Spain after testing positive for Covid-19

- A woman was arrested on Monday at Zurriola beach in San Sebastián, in Spain's Basque Country, after going surfing when she should have been in quarantine. After confirming that the woman had tested positive for Covid-19 and was meant to be at home, several officers – some in protective suits to avoid contagion – went down to the beach to take her out of the water. When the woman, a lifeguard at La Concha beach, refused to stop surfing and tried to flee from the officers, she was arrested for disobeying authorities and crimes against public health.
- “San Sebastián: A young woman with Covid-19 is surprised while surfing at a Zurriola beach and later tries to flee the Ertzaintza. The woman, a lifeguard at La Concha beach, was arrested for serious disobedience and crimes against public health.”
- According to the security department of the Basque regional government, the officers were notified around noon that a woman, who had tested positive for the coronavirus, was surfing at a beach instead of [observing her quarantine](#). Lifesavers approached the woman on a lifeboat and told her to go to the shore. The woman, however, ignored the orders and did not leave the water for another hour. When she finally got out, officers from the Basque regional police force, the Ertzaintza, arrested her for disobeying law enforcement officials. She will also be fined for breaking the quarantine.

9 Drugmakers Sign Safety Pledge In Rush To Develop Coronavirus Vaccine

- Nine drug companies pledged Tuesday that they will not submit vaccine candidates for FDA review until their safety and efficacy is shown in large clinical trials. The move is intended to bolster public confidence amid the rush to make a COVID-19 vaccine widely available, and counter fears of political pressure to have a vaccine before the November presidential election.
- The CEOs of AstraZeneca, Moderna and Pfizer are among those who signed the pledge to follow "high ethical standards and sound scientific principles." All three companies are conducting large studies of potential vaccines for the disease that has killed nearly 200,000 people in the U.S. and nearly 900,000 worldwide. The other biopharmaceutical companies are Johnson & Johnson, GlaxoSmithKline, Merck, Novavax, BioNTech and Sanofi.
- Pfizer CEO Albert Bourla, in an interview on the Today show, called the pledge historic.

Doctors studying why obesity may be tied to serious COVID-19

- Excess weight increases the chances of developing a number of health problems, including heart disease and diabetes. And those are among the conditions that can make COVID-19 patients more likely to get very sick.

- But there's some evidence that obesity itself can increase the likelihood of serious complications from a coronavirus infection. One study of more than 5,200 infected people, including 35% who were obese, found that the chances of hospitalization rose for people with higher BMIs, even when taking into account other conditions that could put them at risk.

West Virginia University suspends in-person undergrad classes amid spike in COVID-19 cases

- West Virginia University announced Monday that it would suspend in-person classes at its main campus because of concerns over a recent spike in coronavirus infections.
- The university said in-person undergraduate classes would be canceled Tuesday at its main campus in Morgantown and then shift to online-only instruction through Sept. 25. The school said graduate-level and professional courses would continue to be offered in person during the same period.
- In a statement, university officials said the decision was made "in direct response to a recent increase in positive cases in students on the Morgantown campus, as well as concern for the probability of increased cases following several reports of parties held this holiday weekend where groups should have been in quarantine."

'Reckless' And 'Reprehensible' Frat Party Linked To Coronavirus Outbreak At UNH: Here Are The Latest College Coronavirus Updates

- A number of institutions of higher learning are already dealing with dangerous and disruptive coronavirus outbreaks shortly after reopening for in-person classes.
- September 7:
 - According to the school's president, at least 11 cases of Covid-19 have been traced to a [University of New Hampshire](#) fraternity party where people did not follow public health guidelines. "This is reckless behavior and the kind of behavior that undermines our planning and will lead to us switching to a fully remote mode," UNH President James Dean [said](#). "The August 29 party is reprehensible and will not be tolerated. As soon as we heard of this party at Theta Chi, we started an investigation with the Interfraternity Council."
- September 6:
 - According to the New York Times, Brazos County, Tex., home to [Texas A&M University](#), recorded 742 new coronavirus cases during the last week of August, the county's worst week so far, as the university reported hundreds of new cases.
 - [East Carolina University](#) has seen at least 846 infections involving students, faculty and staff since mid-August.

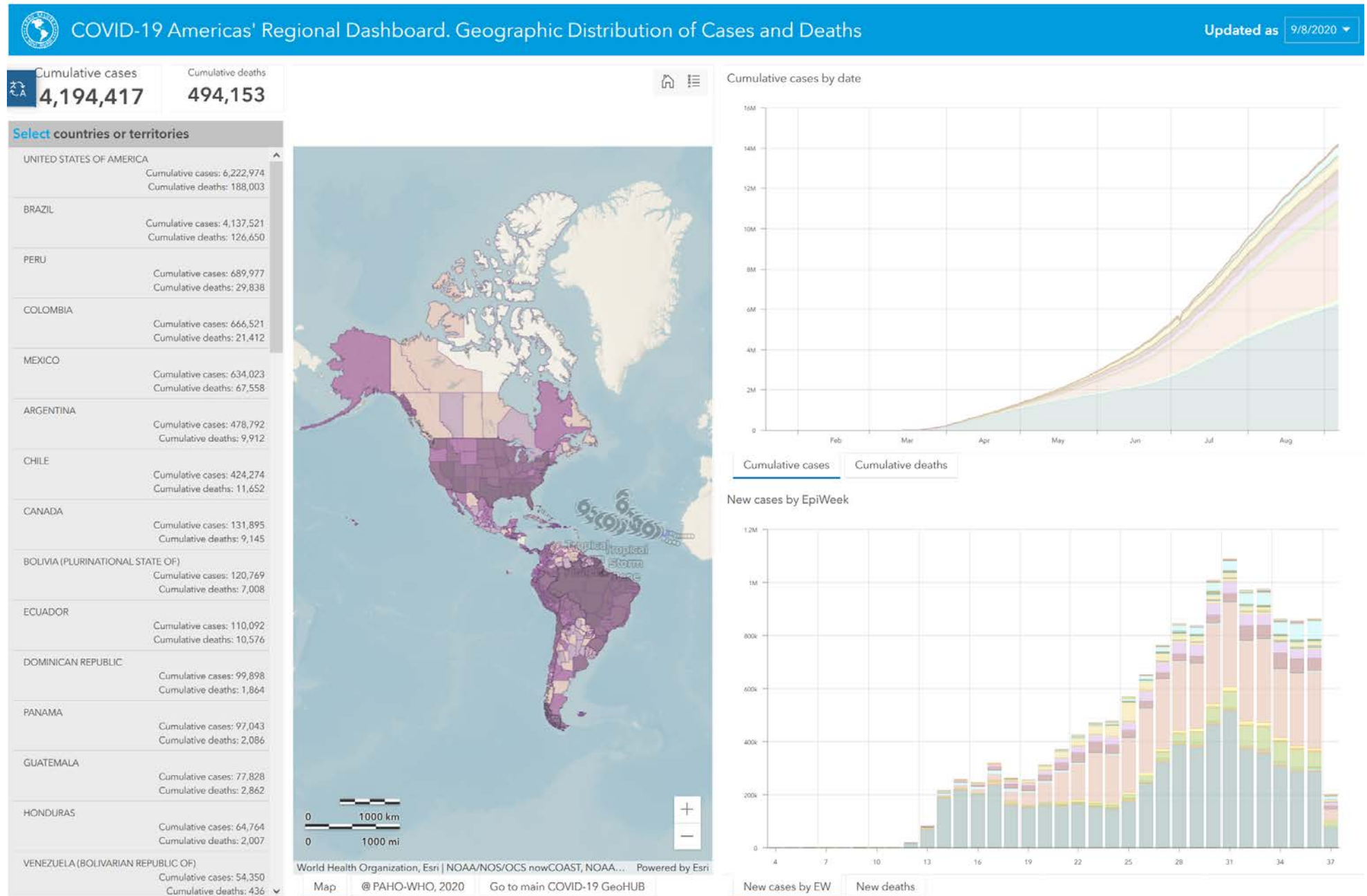

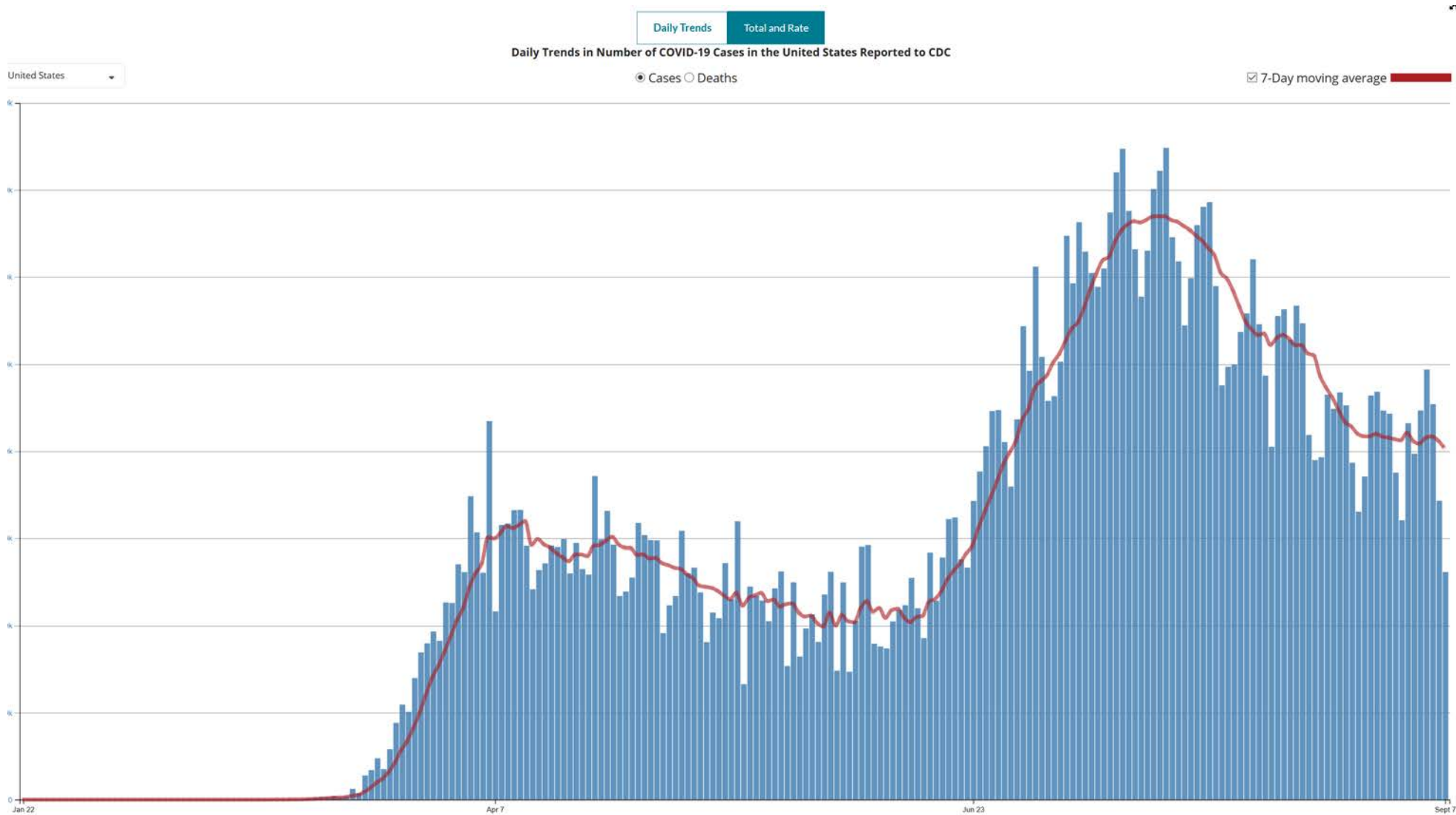

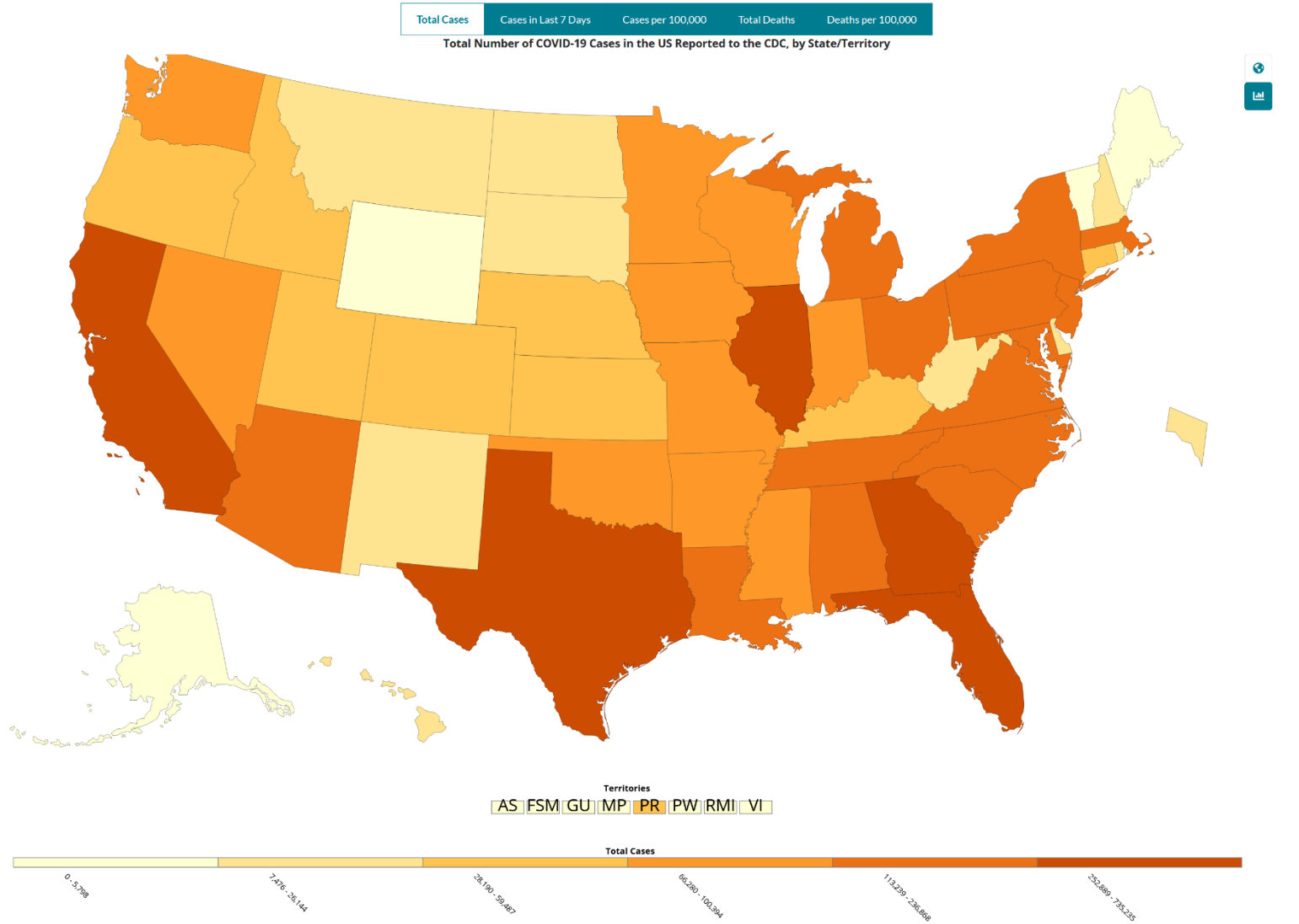

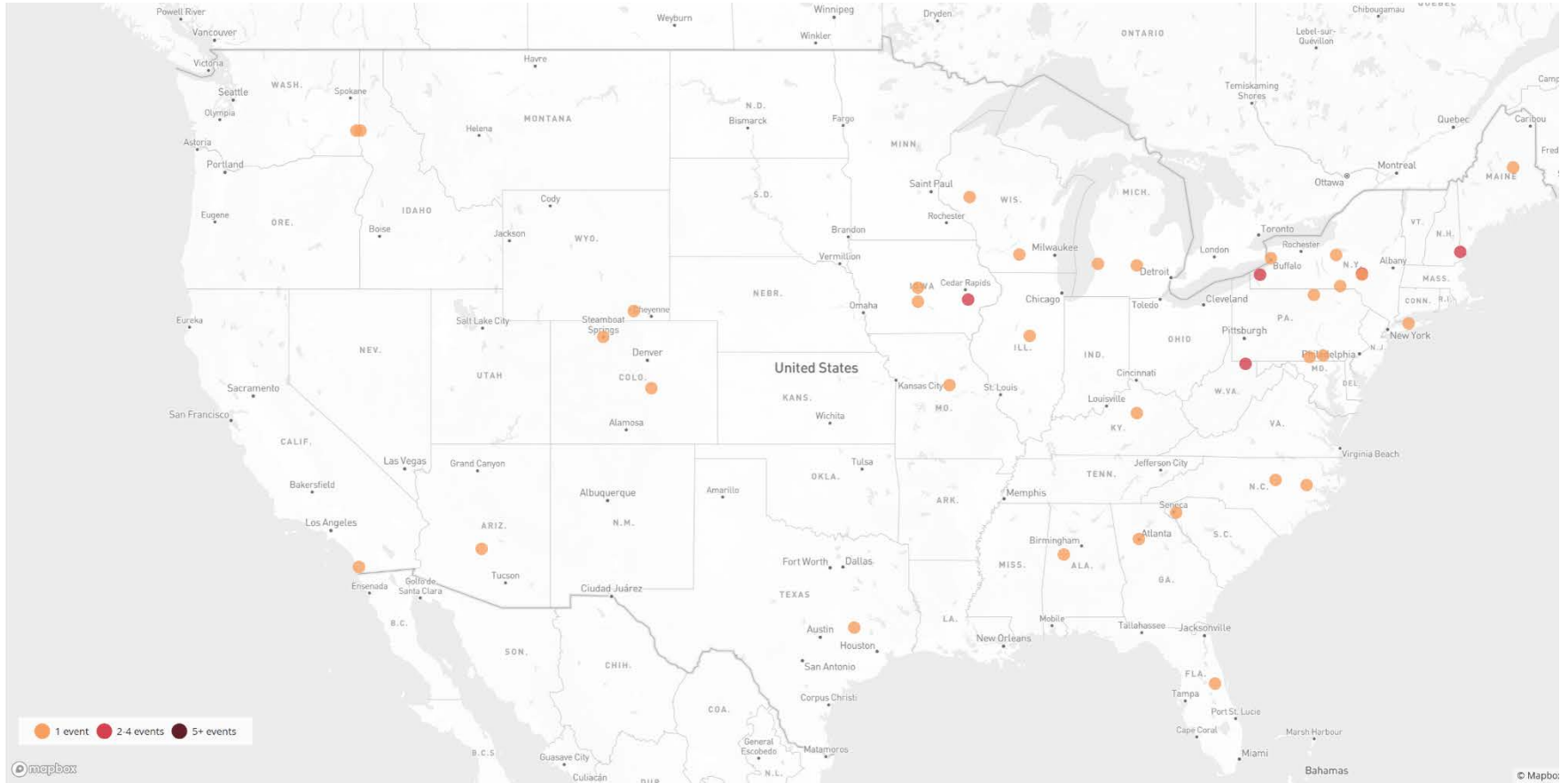

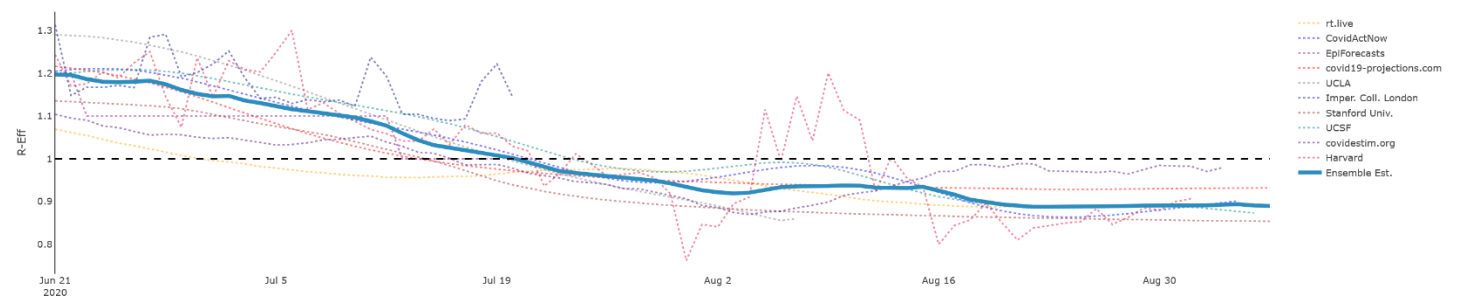

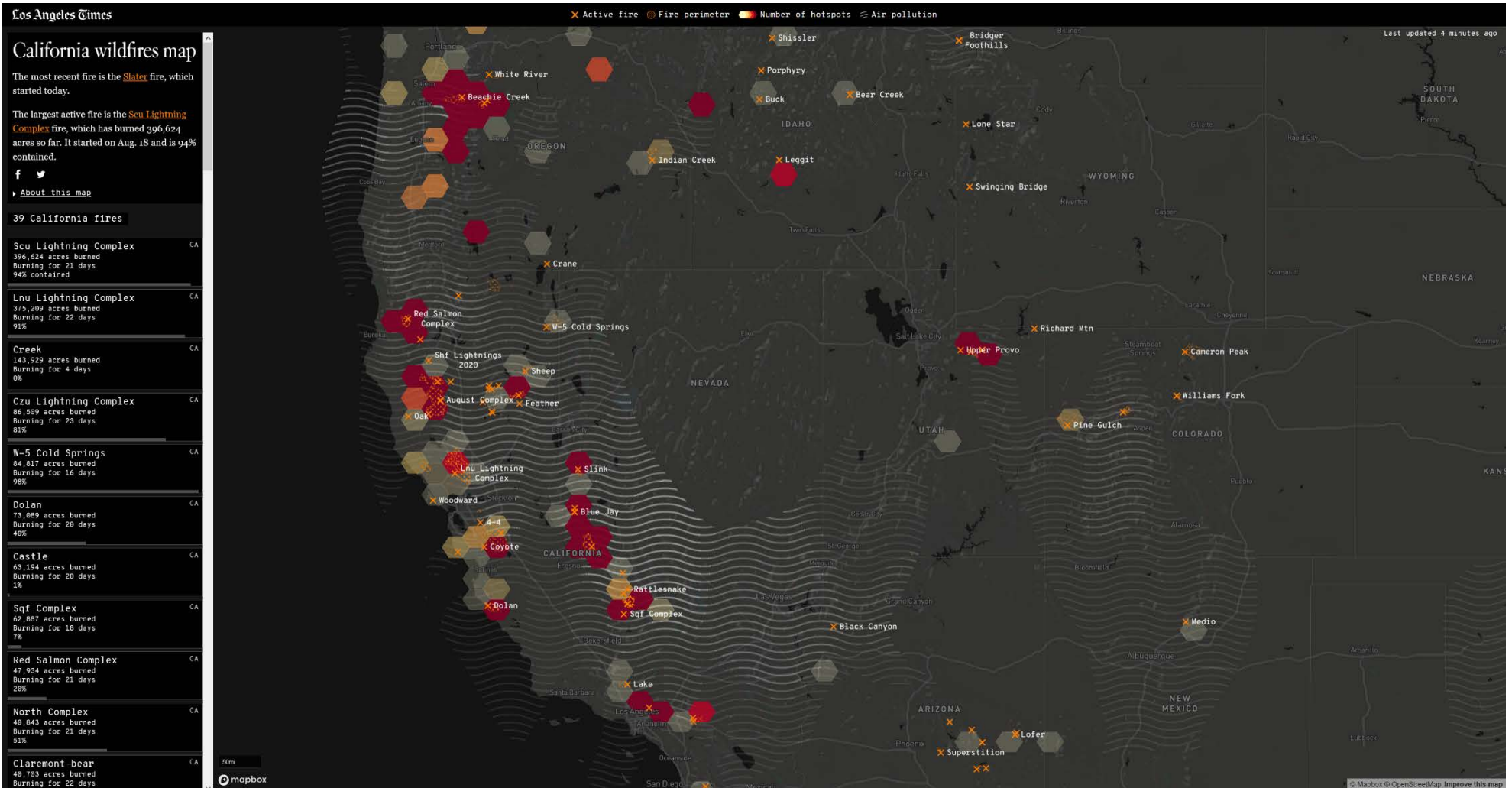
