- According to data from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Children's Hospital Association.
- The data are compiled from state reports and show 1,039,464 children have tested positive for the coronavirus as of Nov. 12. In the one-week period ending that day, there were nearly 112,000 new cases in children, the largest one-week increase.

Mouthwash can kill COVID-19 in 30 seconds: Study

- Over-the-counter mouthwash can kill coronavirus within 30 seconds of exposure, a study has found.
- Scientists at Cardiff University discovered mouthwash containing at least 0.07 percent cetylpyridinium chloride (CPC) showed "promising signs" of reducing transmission of the virus.
- heir preliminary report, which is yet to be peer-reviewed, supports a study published last week that found mouthwash containing CPC helps in reducing the viral load of people infected with the coronavirus.
- It comes ahead of a clinical trial on patients at the University Hospital of Wales in Cardiff to find out whether mouthwash can reduce coronavirus in a patient's saliva. The findings are expected to be published in early 2021.

California reimposes Covid-19 restrictions on 40 counties as cases surge and the governor warns of possible curfew

- 94% of state's population in most restrictive tier
- A staggering 40 California counties also moved backwards in the state's tier system this week, the governor announced Monday, meaning they'll now face more restrictions. What does California's alarming COVID-19 surge mean for schools?

- Campuses cannot reopen for in-person classes while a county is in the purple tier the worst rating, signifying widespread transmission. A campus can only reopen for full services, with safety measures in place, 14 days after health conditions in a county have improved enough to enter the next tier, red.
- Orange, San Diego, Ventura and Riverside counties had entered the red tier or better, and many schools districts had begun to reopen in phases and with hybrid classes — which combine in-person and distance learning. Riverside was the first to backslide, weeks ago. Then last week, San Diego fell to purple and on Monday it was Orange and Ventura.
- Schools that opened while a county was in the red tier or better, can remain open. 


United States COVID-19 Cases and Deaths by State



Business information is often not disclosed and therefore is largely missing. As exposure dates are self-reported, outbreaks include all dates investigated from July - October.






