Jobless claims rose last week as coronavirus surge threatens to undermine recovery

- The number of Americans applying for state unemployment benefits rose again last week as a surge in coronavirus cases across the country threatens to undermine the economy's recovery.
- The latest jobless claims figures from the Labor Department, which cover the week ending Nov. 21, show that 778,000 workers sought aid last week, about four times the pre-crisis level. While it's well below the peak of nearly 7 million in late March, when states first implemented lockdown measures to curb the spread of COVID-19, it marks the second consecutive week of an increase in claims.

Understand the risks in cyberspace and the steps you can take to defend yourself.

- CISA has launched a public awareness initiative to inform consumers of common risks around the holiday shopping season and encourage basic cybersecurity practices. During the holiday season, millions of Americans engage in online shopping in search of the best gifts and Cyber Monday deals. As people stay inside to protect themselves from the COVID-19 pandemic, even more Americans will be shopping online.
- Unfortunately, this is also the season for cyberattacks. According to the Federal Trade Commission, the number of fraud reports for online shopping increased in the fourth quarter of last year, which coincides with the holiday season. Hackers, scammers, and online thieves will be looking to take advantage of unsuspecting shoppers by searching for weaknesses in our devices or internet connections or attempting to extract personal and financial information through fake websites or charities.
- The CISA's "Holiday Online Shopping" launch includes a website complete with easy-to-follow safety tips for online shopping, and additional resources to promote healthy shopping practices.

What you can do

- **Check your devices** – Before starting your hunt for the best deal, make sure your devices are up-to-date and all of your accounts have strong passwords. If you purchase an internet connected device or toy, change the default password and check the devices' privacy and security settings to make sure you're not sharing more information than you want.
- **Shop through trusted retailers** – Before making a purchase and providing any personal or financial information, make sure you're using a reputable, established vendor. Similarly, if you're planning to make a charitable donation, be sure to research who or where your donation is going, to ensure it's a legitimate organization.
- **Using safe methods for purchases** – If you can, use a credit card or other forms of digital payments opposed to a debit card as credit cards often have better fraud protections.

Cal/OSHA has approved [emergency COVID-19 prevention regulations](#). Upon the expected approval of the Office of Administrative Law, they will become effective by November 30. These extensive and complex regulations place significant and immediate new requirements on employers. They mandate training, demand the drafting and implementation of new COVID-19 prevention manuals, and include provisions requiring of the payment of wages and employer-paid COVID testing in certain circumstances.

TITLE 8, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 4

Subchapter 7. General Industry Safety Orders

Amend Section 3205 to read:

§ 3205. ~~“Shall” and “Should.” [Repealed]~~ COVID-19 Prevention.

(a) Scope.

- (1) This section applies to all employees and places of employment, with the following exceptions:
 - (A) Places of employment with one employee who does not have contact with other persons.
 - (B) Employees working from home.
 - (C) Employees when covered by section 5199.
- (2) Nothing in this section is intended to limit more protective or stringent state or local health department mandates or guidance.

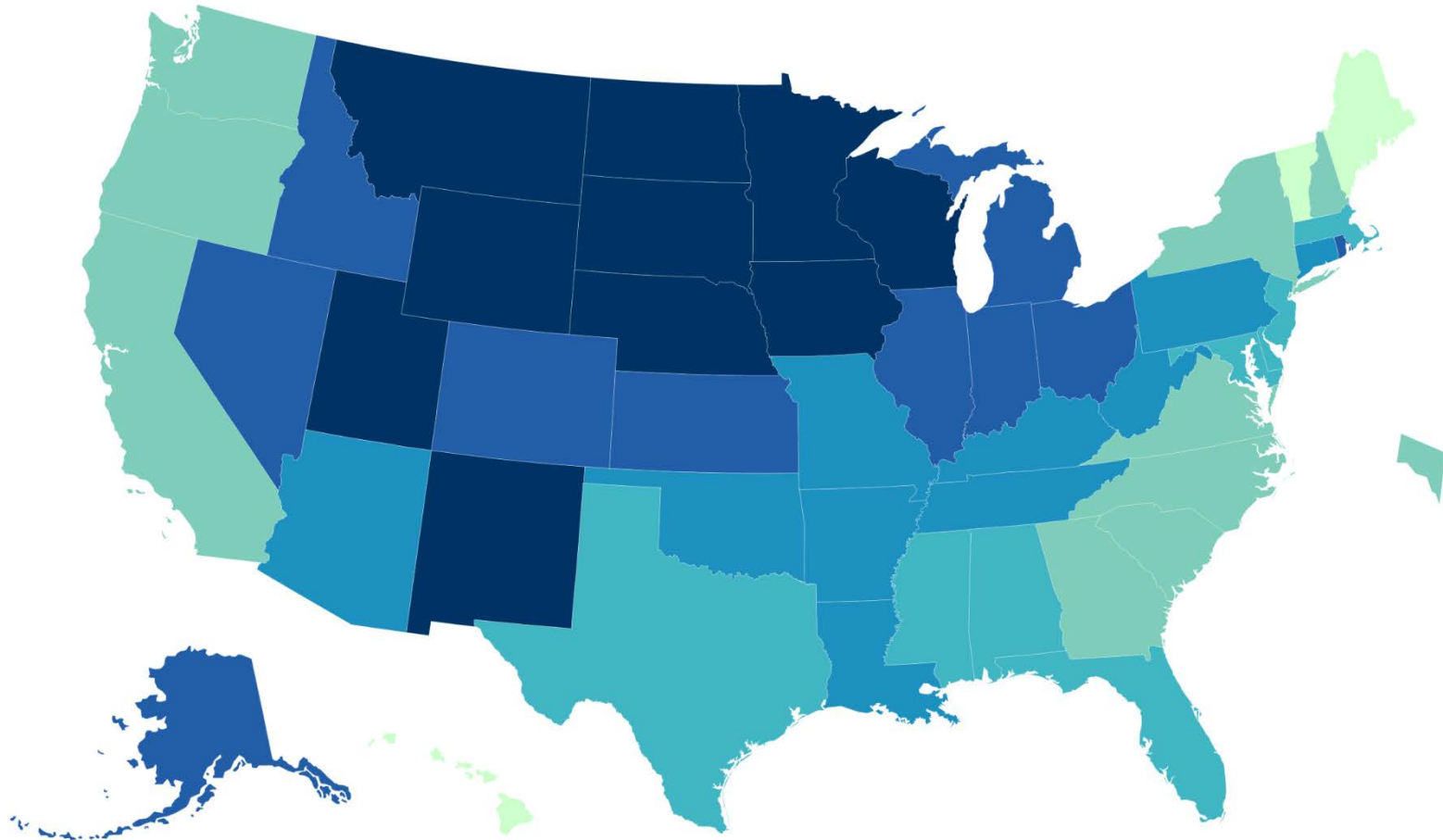

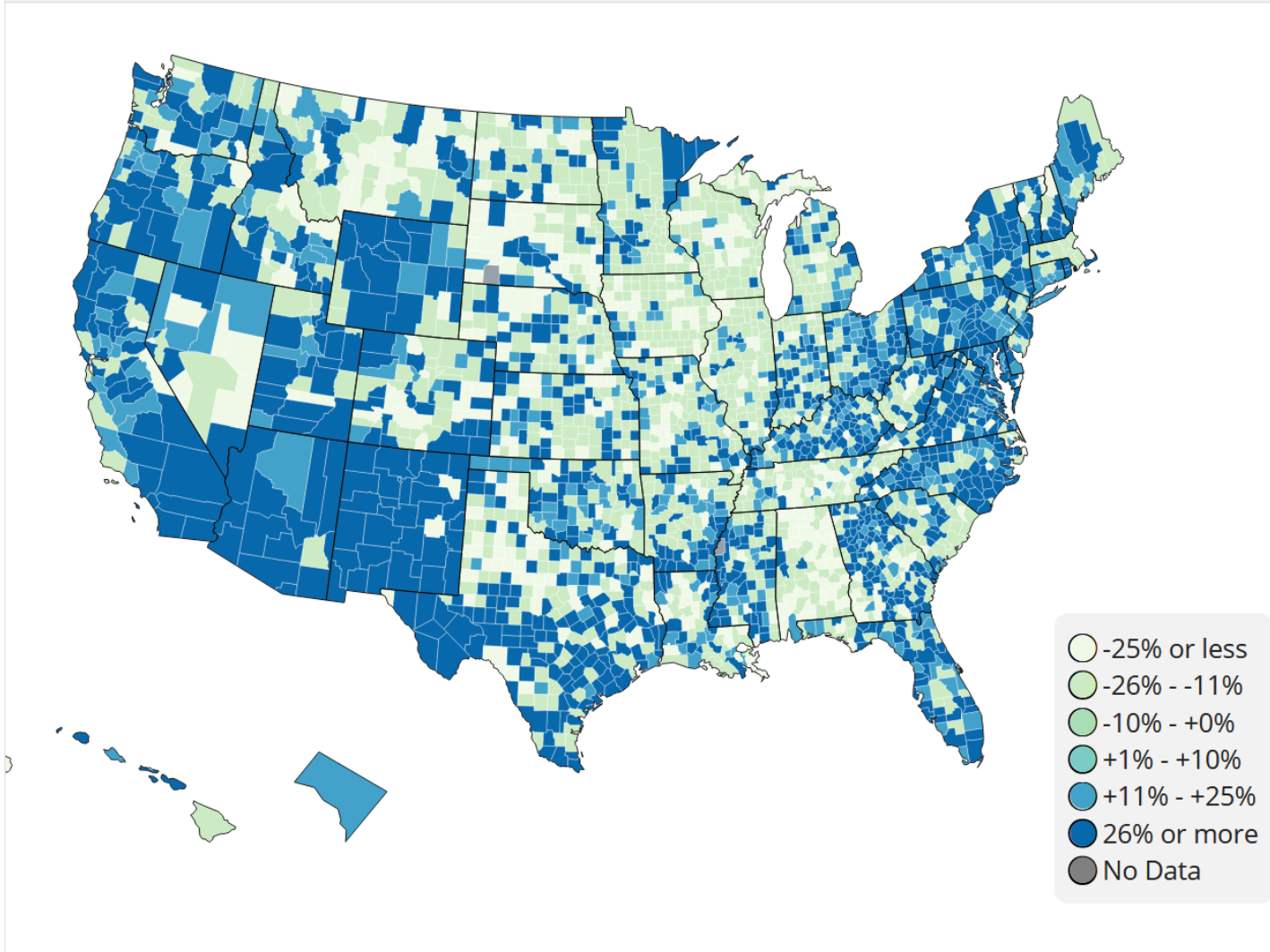

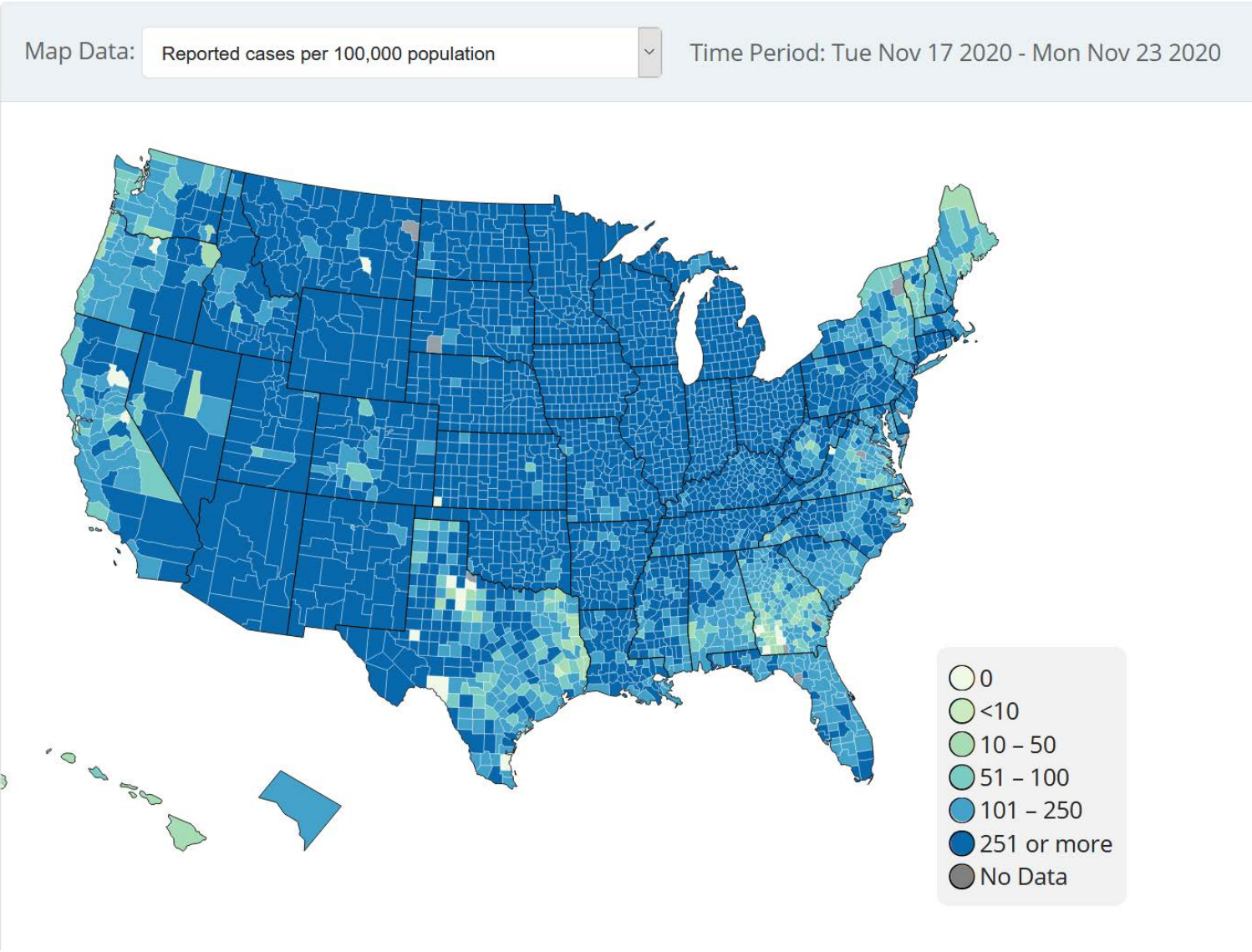

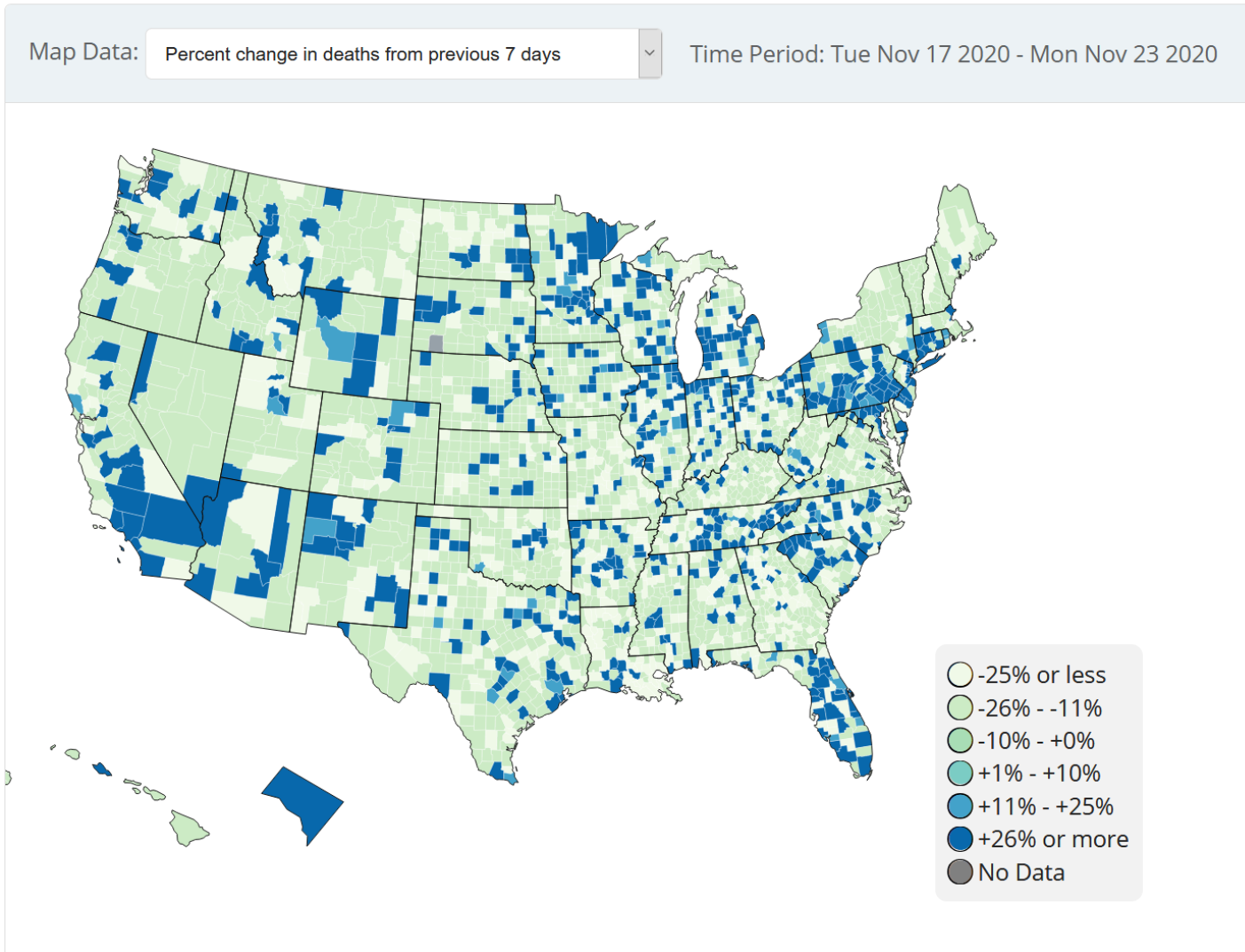

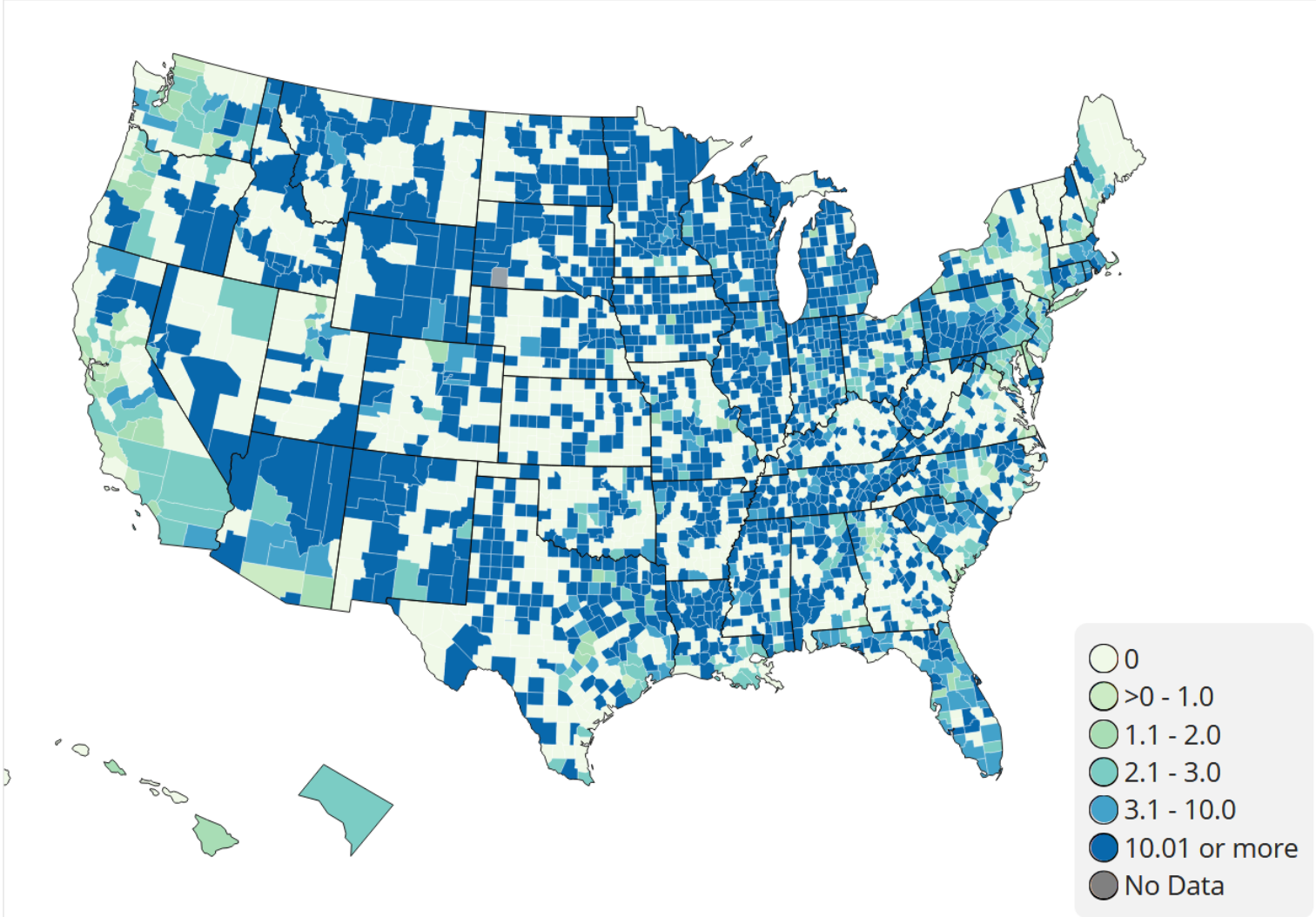

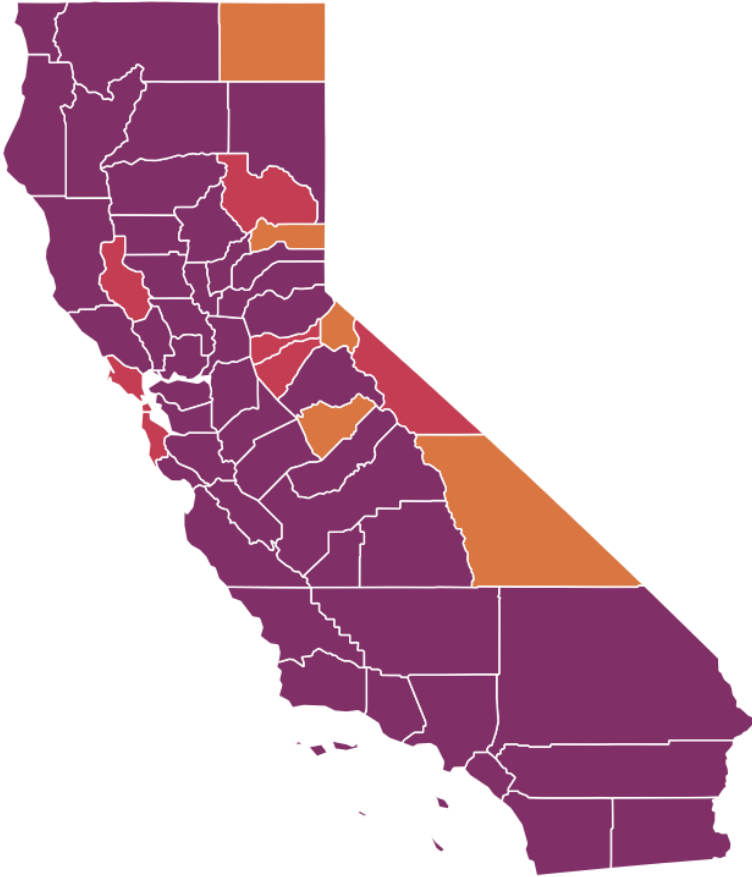

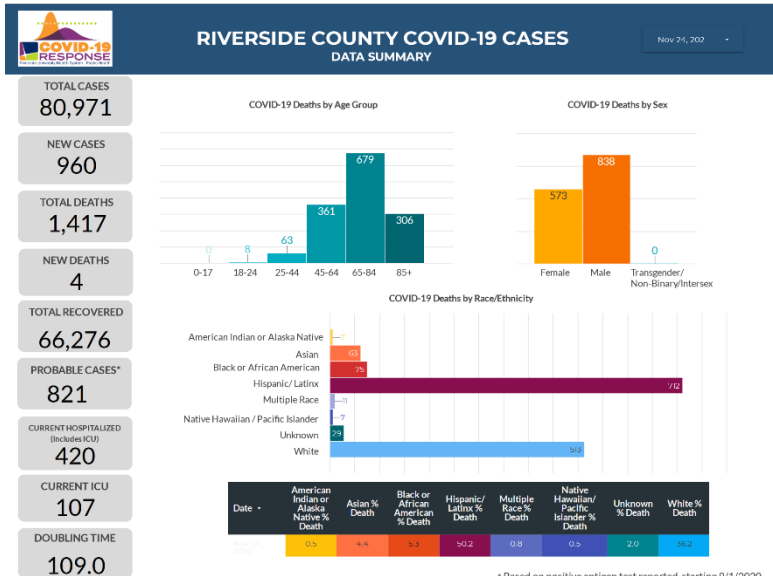

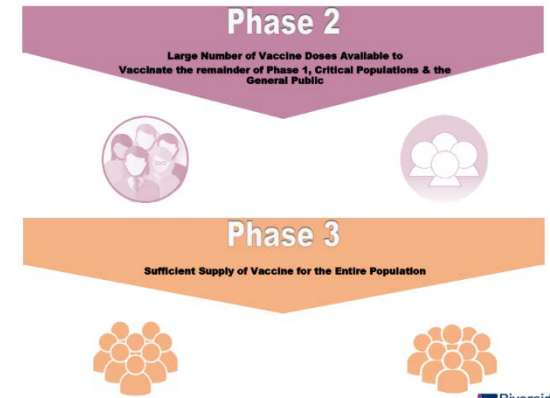
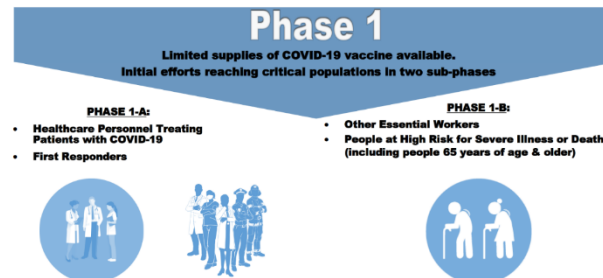
