## Study of Healthcare Workers Shows COVID-19 Immunity Lasts Many Months

- New findings from a study of thousands of healthcare workers in England show that those who got COVID-19 and produced antibodies against the virus are highly unlikely to become infected again, at least over the several months that the study was conducted. In the rare instances in which someone with acquired immunity for SARS-CoV-2 subsequently tested positive for the virus within a six month period, they never showed any signs of being ill.

## CA Notify – App

- Currently in pilot at the University of California. Available statewide December 10th. All you do is keep your Bluetooth on. You will only receive alerts if you were in close contact with someone who tests positive for COVID-19. Your privacy is protected as your identity is not known and your location is not tracked.
- CA Notify does not collect or exchange any of your personal information. It does not track your location. It only logs close interactions with others. The anonymous keys are exchanged using Bluetooth and are not linked to your identity or location. The keys will change every few minutes to protect you.
- If you get tested for COVID-19 and provide your cell phone number at the time of testing, you will receive a text message from the California Department of Public Health with a verification code that is needed to activate exposure notifications. This message will come from 855-976-8462. If your test result is positive, you can follow the steps in the text message to alert others.

## Will CA's Stay-At-Home Order Be Enforced? It's Complicated

- The Golden State has handed out more than \$2 million in fines against businesses that failed to comply with coronavirus health orders. In Los Angeles, hundreds of businesses have been cited for defying health orders since summer; meanwhile, the sheriffs of Riverside and Orange counties refused to enforce the latest stay-at-home order.
- Bianco publicly decried the lockdown orders in a [YouTube video posted Friday](#), claiming the orders were hypocritical and "dictatorial." With a record number of COVID-19 patients filling beds in Riverside County hospitals, and ICU bed space diminishing rapidly statewide, the entirety of Southern California is on the verge of falling under the state-mandated "regional stay-at-home order."

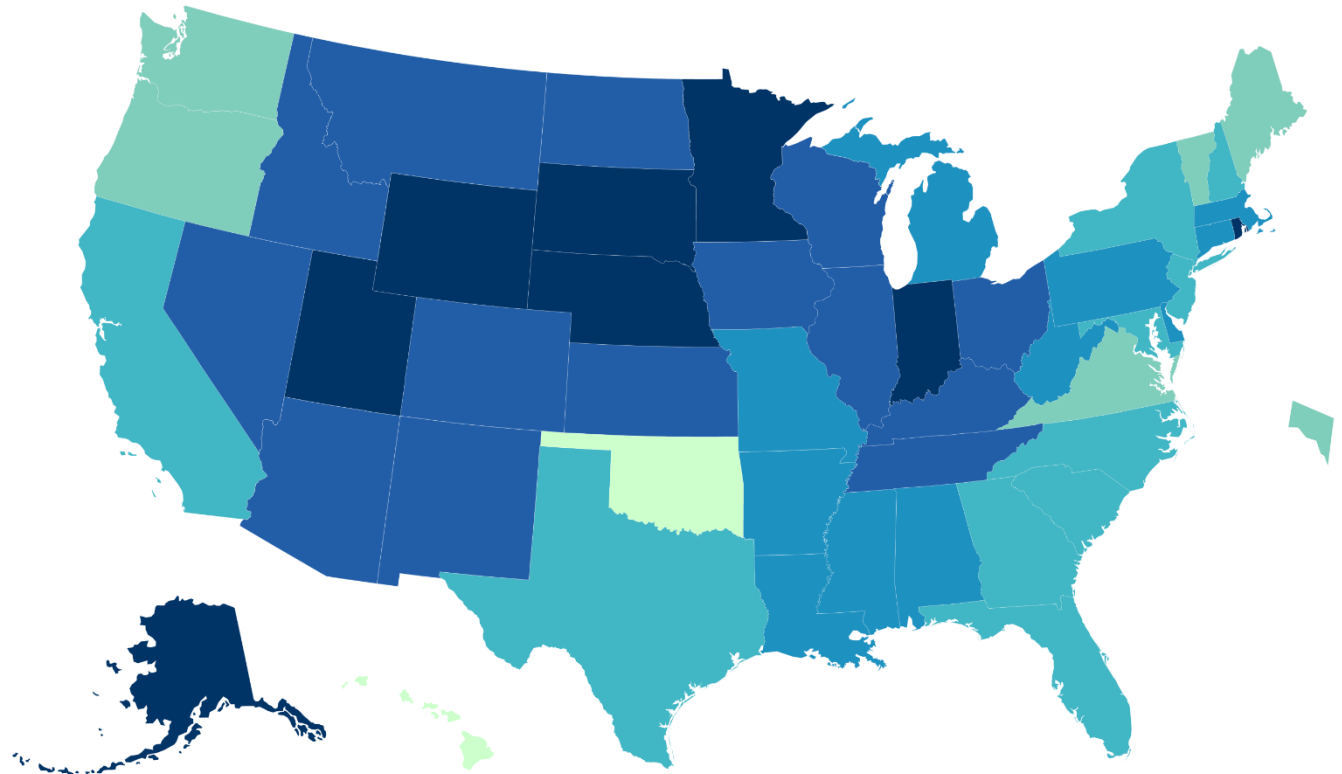

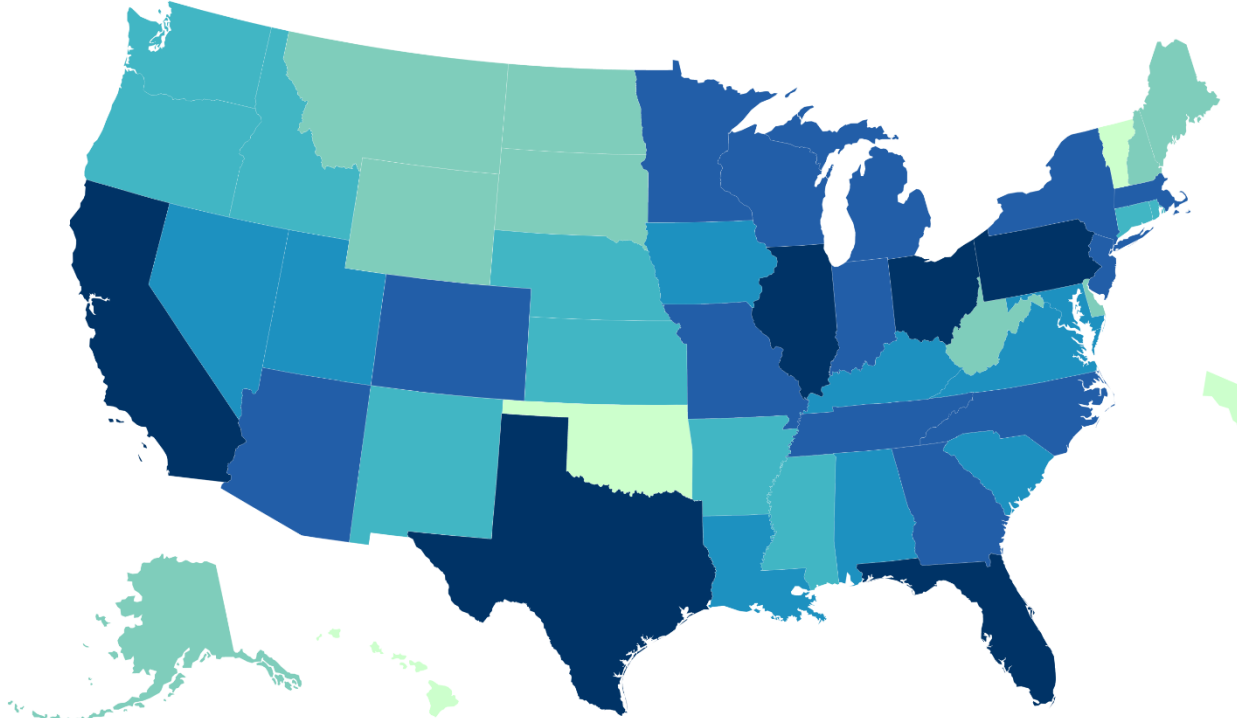

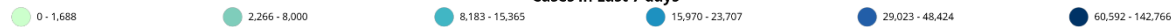
US COVID-19 Cases Reported to the CDC in the Last 7 Days, by State/Territory

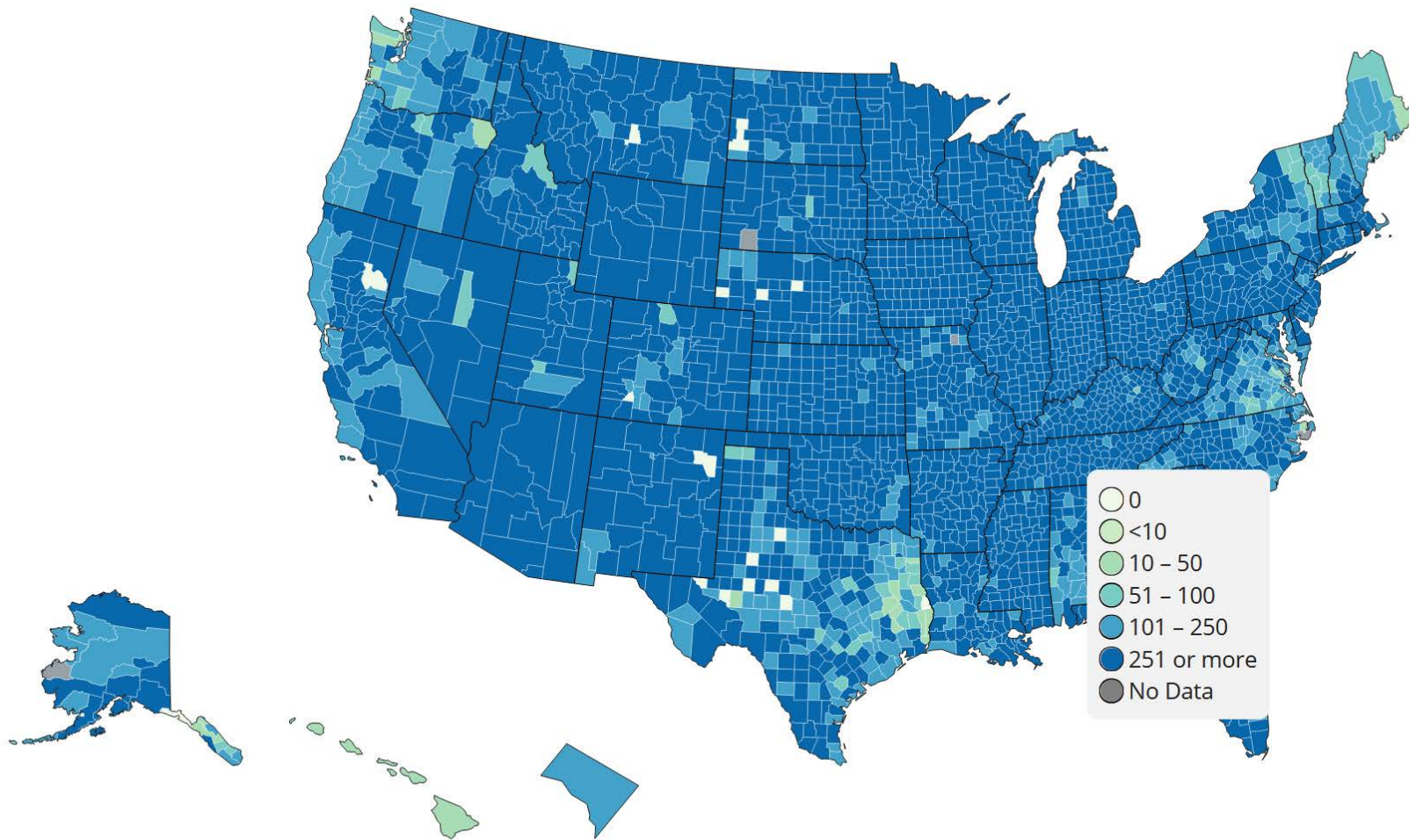

Map Data: Reported cases per 100,000 population

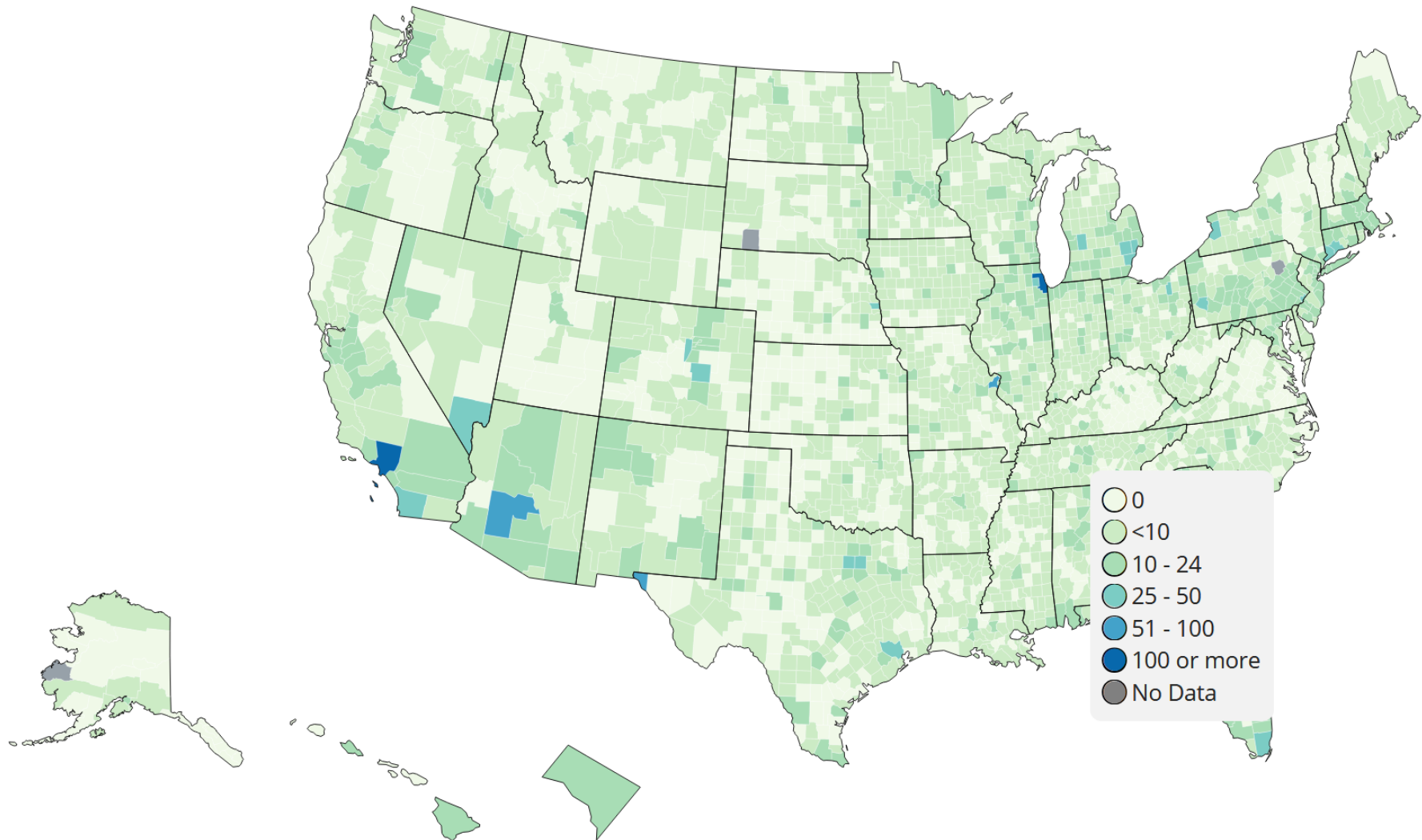

Map Data: Reported deaths

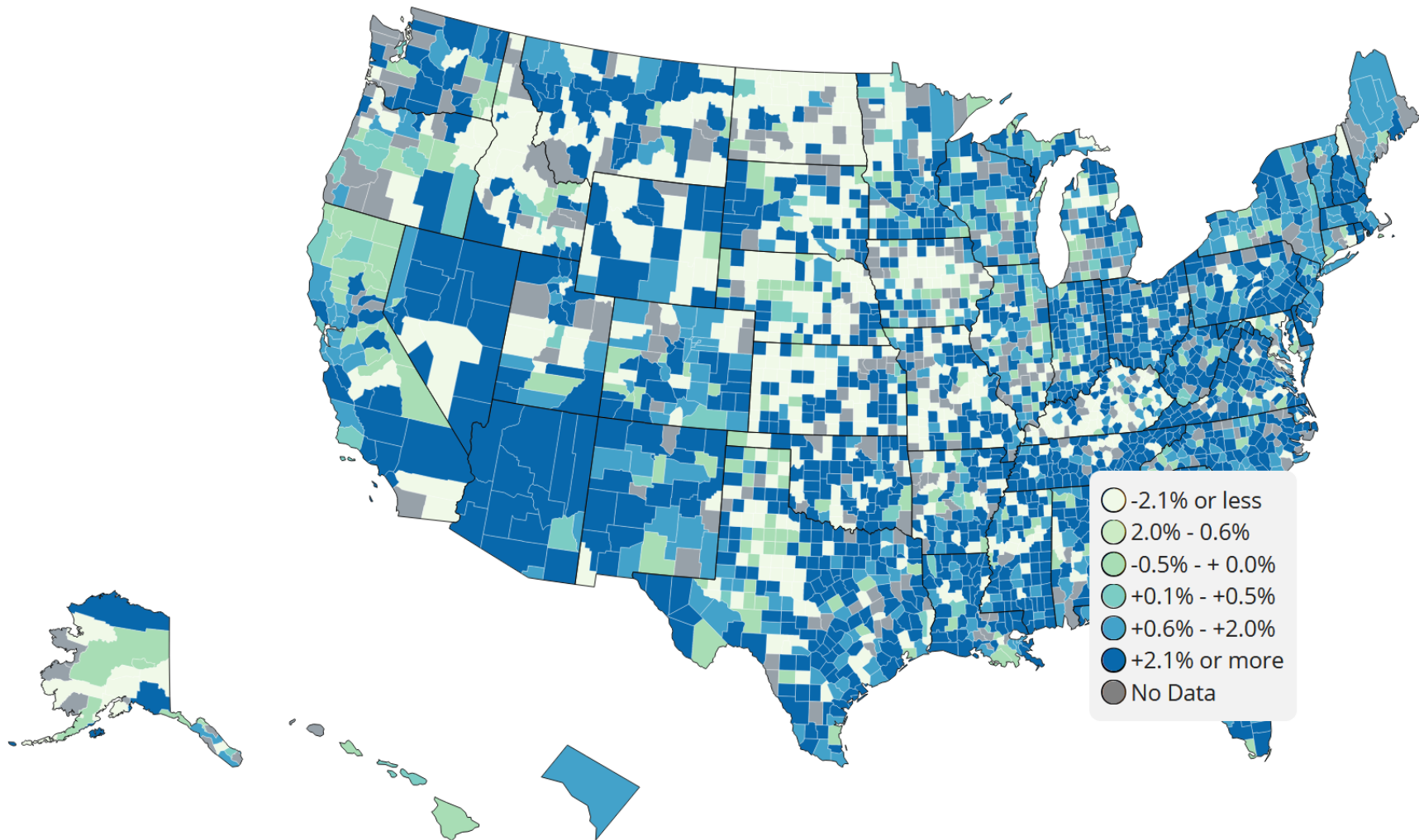

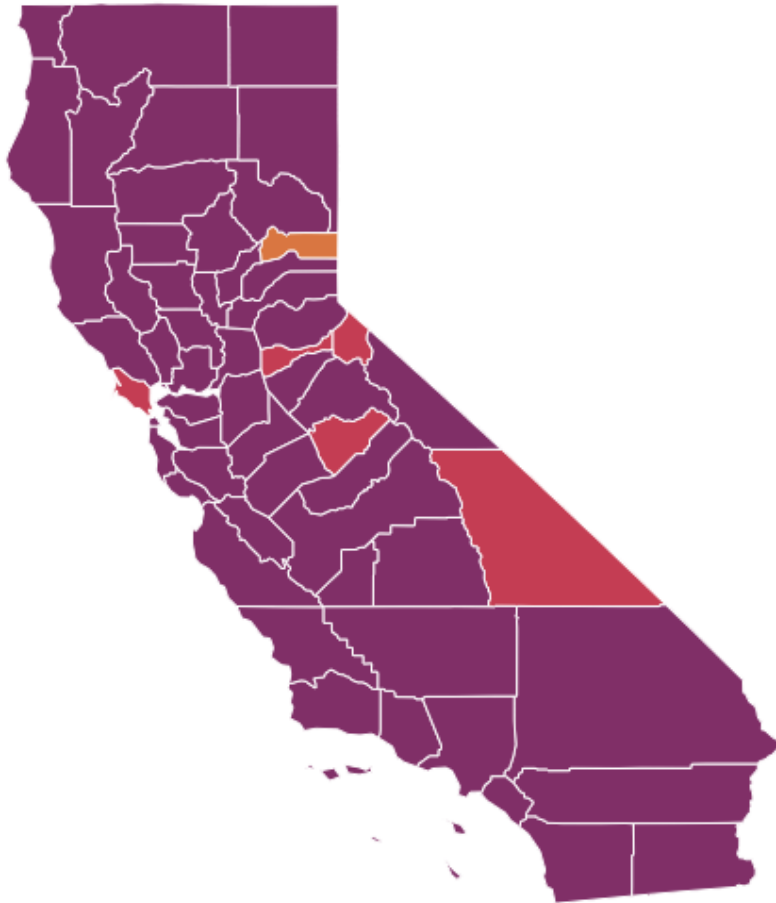

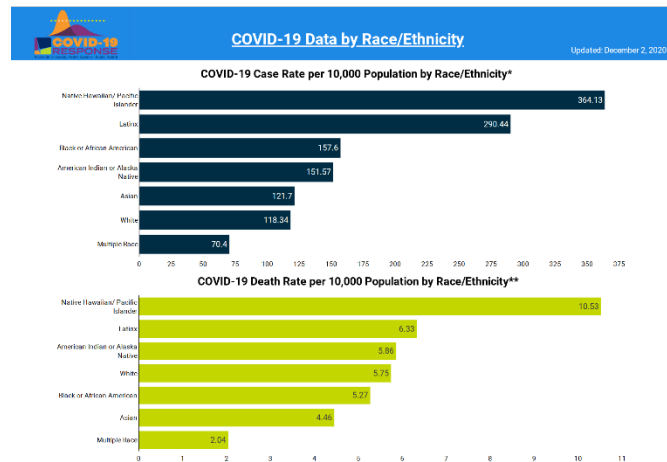
