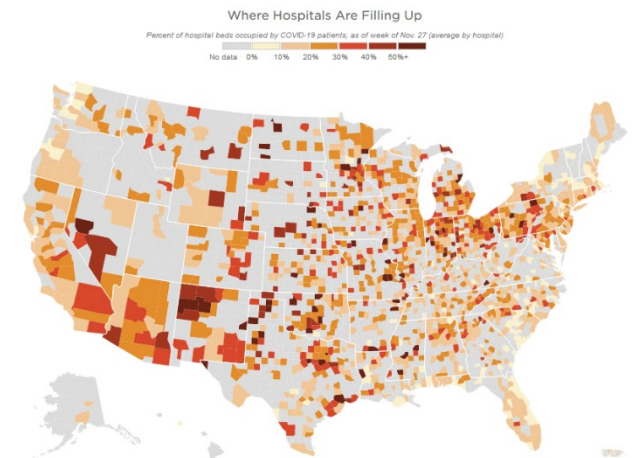

NHS told not to give Covid vaccine to those with history of allergic reactions

- People with a history of significant allergic reactions should not receive the Covid vaccine, the medicines regulator has said, after two NHS workers experienced symptoms on Wednesday.
- Both of the NHS staff carry adrenaline autoinjectors, suggesting they have suffered reactions in the past. These kind of devices, of which the best-known brand is the EpiPen, administer a swift adrenaline boost to counter allergic reactions that occur when some people, for instance, eat nuts.
- The patient information leaflet with the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine says it should not be given to people allergic to any substance in the vaccine.
- “Signs of an allergic reaction may include itchy skin rash, shortness of breath and swelling of the face or tongue,” says the leaflet.

New Data Reveal Which Hospitals Are Dangerously Full. Is Yours?

- The federal government on Monday released detailed hospital-level data showing the toll COVID-19 is taking on health care facilities, including how many inpatient and ICU beds are available on a weekly basis.
- Using an analysis from the University of Minnesota's [COVID-19 Hospitalization Tracking Project](#), NPR has created a tool that allows you to see how your local hospital and your county overall are faring. ([Jump to look-up tool.](#))
- It focuses on one important metric — how many beds are filled with COVID-19 patients — and shows this for each hospital and on average for each county.
- The ratio of COVID-19 hospitalizations to total beds gives a picture of how much strain a hospital is under. Though there's not a clear threshold, it's concerning when that rate rises above 10%, hospital capacity experts told NPR.
- Anything above 20% represents "extreme stress" for the hospital, according to a framework developed by the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation at the University of Washington.

Covid-19 Confusion: What You Need To Know About The Dueling Stay-At-Home Orders From L.A. City, L.A. County And The State Of California

- After three separate Covid-19 stay-at-home orders in the past week, many Los Angeles residents are understandably confused.
- Very briefly, the orders emanate from the State of California, L.A. County and L.A.'s mayor. Counties and cities may be more restrictive than the state mandates, but not less restrictive. For the most part, the California order is more stringent.
- The state edict prohibits gatherings of any size of people from more than one household, closes many sector operations including in-person dining at restaurants and personal grooming services, and requires 100% masking and physical distancing. It does allow essential workers to continue mostly as before. Schools will be required to stay in whatever state of opening they are at the time the order takes effect.

Judge Orders L.A. County Authorities to Show Evidence for Outdoor Dining Ban

- Los Angeles Superior Court Judge James Chalfant said in a 53-page ruling that the state's most populous county "failed to perform the required risk-benefit analysis" before issuing the ban.
- "By failing to weigh the benefits of an outdoor dining restriction against its costs, the county acted arbitrarily and its decision lacks a rational relationship to a legitimate end," Chalfant wrote.
- "The balance of harms works in petitioners' favor until such time as the county concludes after proper risk-benefit analysis that restaurants must be closed to protect the healthcare system".

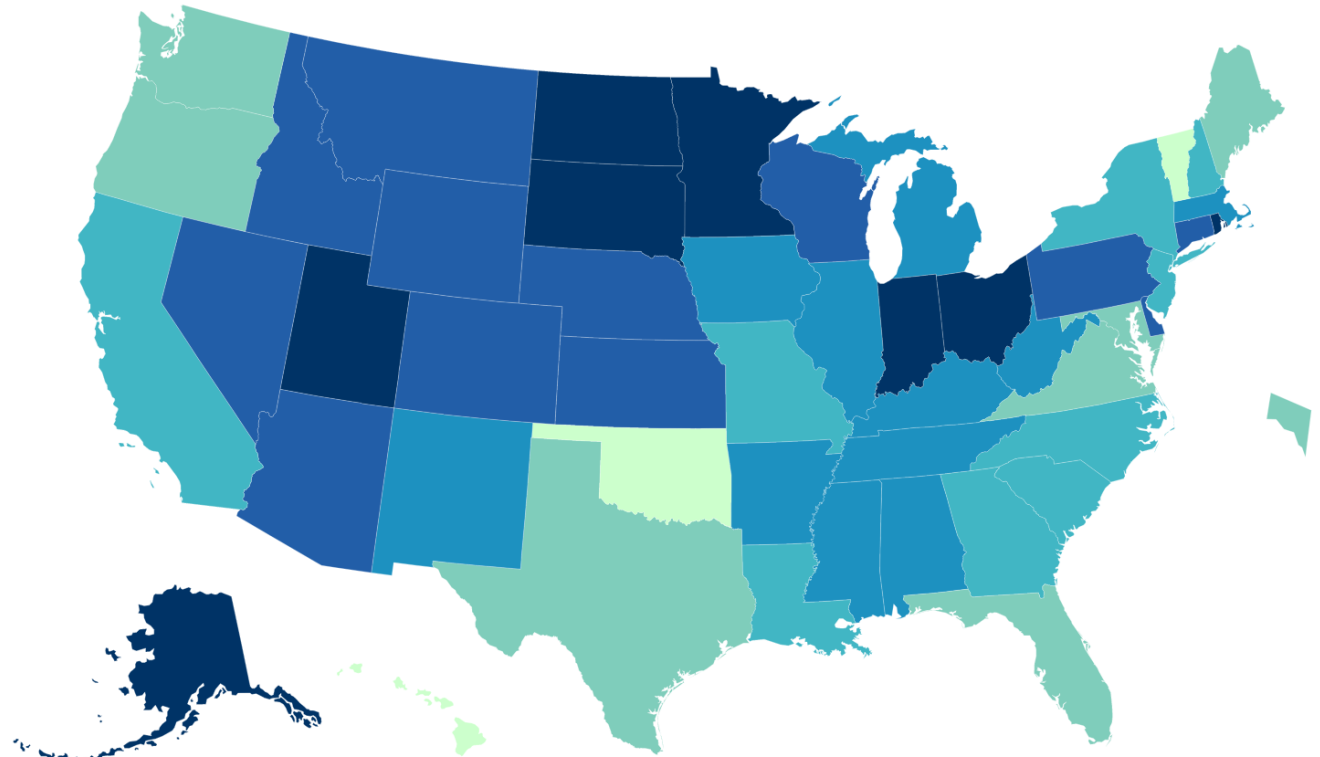

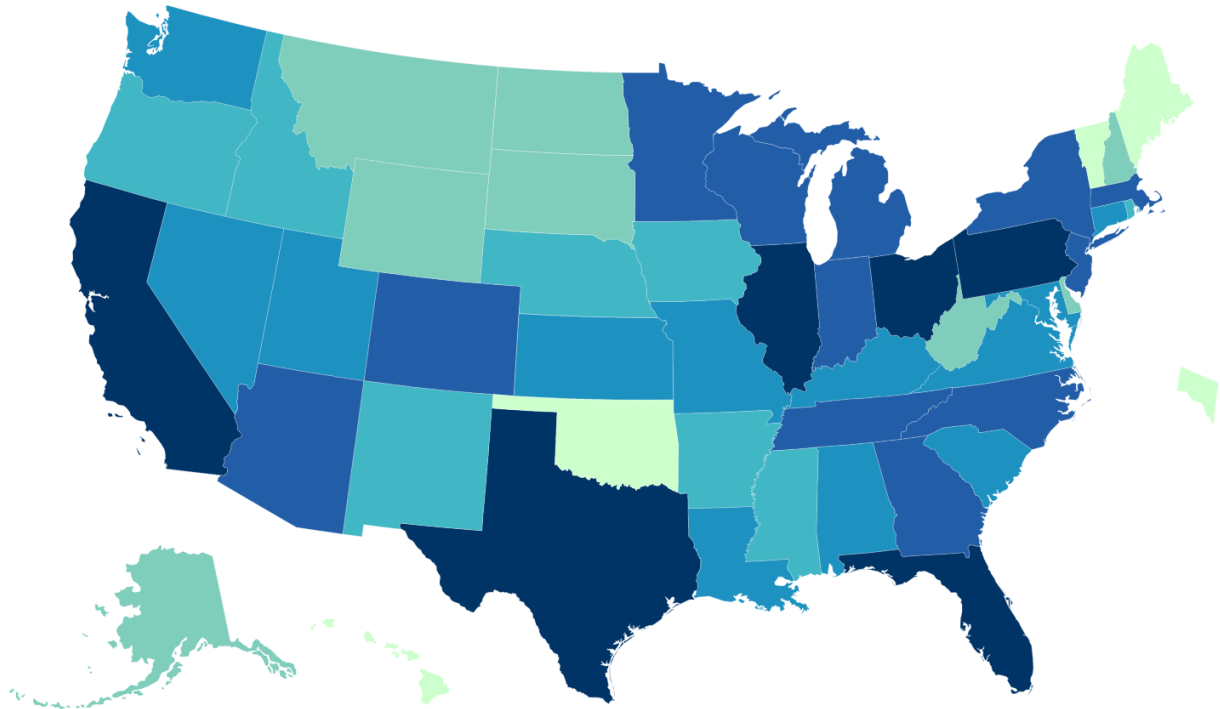

US COVID-19 Cases Reported to the CDC in the Last 7 Days, by State/Territory



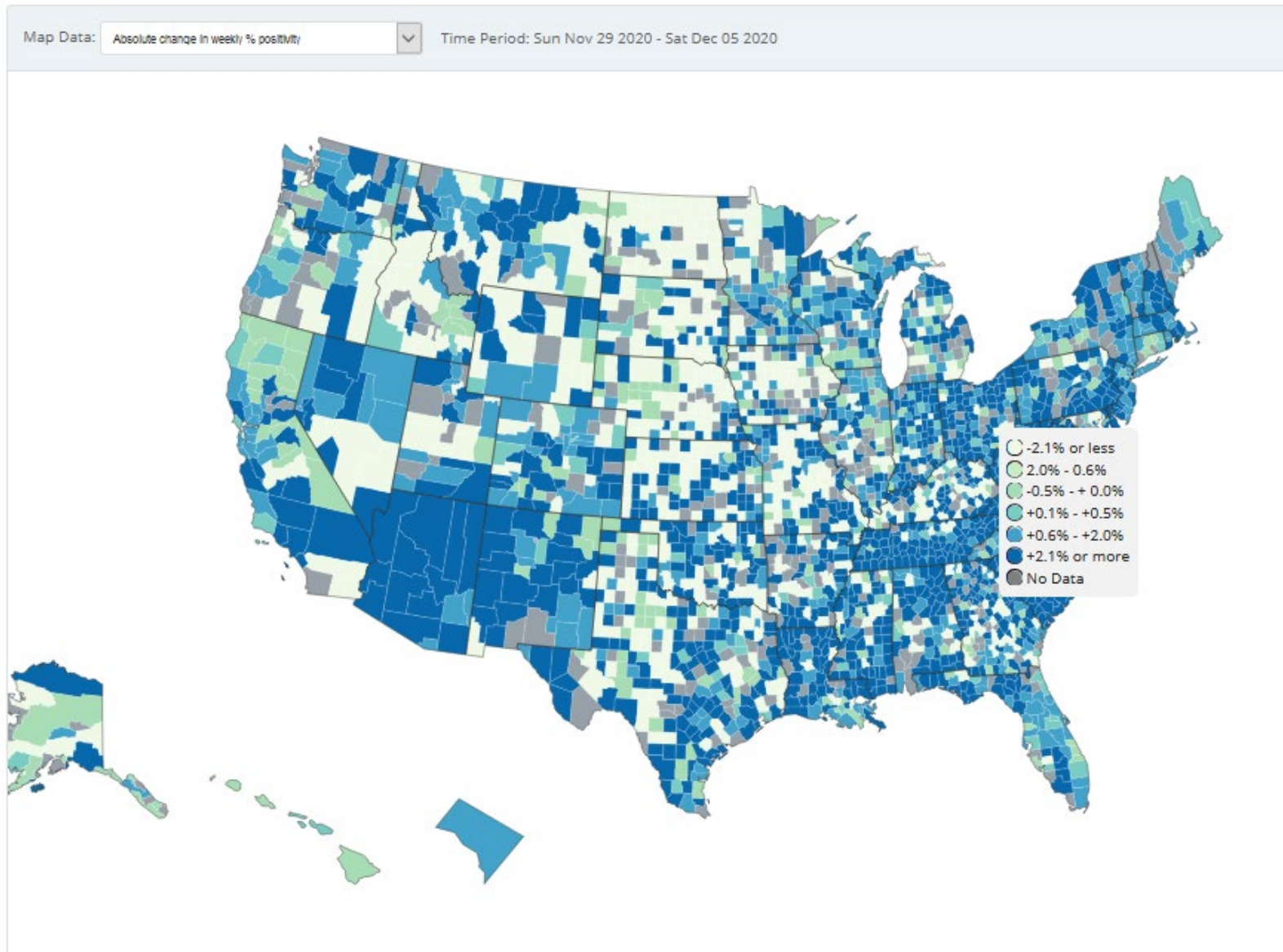

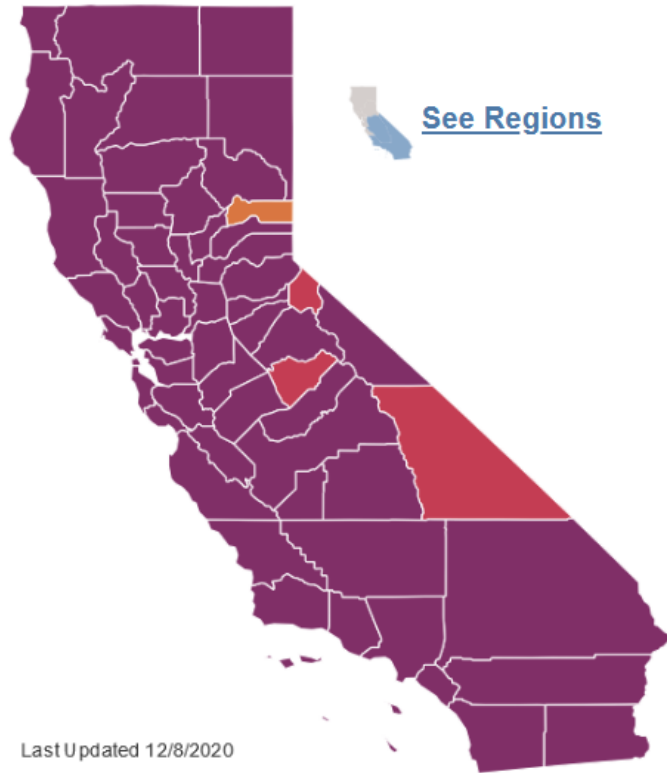
