Thousands of nurses at India's premier AIIMS strike amid pandemic

- New Delhi, India At least 5,000 nurses and paramedic staff at one of India's premier medical institutes have gone on an indefinite strike over "long-pending" demands, severely disrupting patient care during the coronavirus pandemic.
- The protesting health workers at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), a sprawling complex in New Delhi, have put forth 23 demands before the government and the AIIMS authority.

2.7 billion people did not get state aid during pandemic: Oxfam

- The COVID-19 pandemic and the lockdown measures to contain it have hit millions of people hard, with poverty set to increase sharply in almost every country for the first time in decades unless action is taken now, according to a new report by Oxfam.
- Oxfam, a United Kingdom-based nonprofit, and consulting firm Development Pathways, which works with governments and organizations in developing economies.
- Hundreds of millions of people have lost their jobs and income, and 2.7 billion people have not received any public financial support to deal with the economic devastation caused by the coronavirus pandemic, Oxfam said in the report published on Tuesday.
- "The analysis shows that investments in social protection have been highly unequal between countries, and, in most cases, within countries. The consequence may be an increase in global inequality and the erosion of social cohesion," the report said.
- With eight out of 10 countries not having given any financial support to even half their population, "women workers in low- and middle-income countries in particular are suffering, as they work in the worst-affected sectors, such as garments, services and domestic work," the report said.

Rusty pilots and insects: Issues facing jets returning to service

- Regulators, insurers and experts are warning airlines to take extra care when reactivating planes left in extended storage during the COVID-19 pandemic, citing potential pilot rustiness, maintenance errors and even insect nests blocking key sensors.
- The unprecedented number of aircraft grounded as coronavirus lockdowns blocked air travel at one point reaching two-thirds of the global fleet has created a spike in the number of reported problems as airlines return them to service.
- The number of "unstabilised" or poorly handled approaches has risen sharply this year, according to the International Air Transport Association (IATA). Such mishaps can result in hard landings, runway overshoots or even crashes.

- Moderna's COVID-19 vaccine appeared to be set for regulatory authorisation this week after US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) staff members did not raise any major new concerns about it in documents released on Tuesday.
- The FDA reviewers said a two-dose regimen of Moderna's vaccine was highly effective in preventing confirmed cases of COVID-19 and did not raise any specific safety issues with using the vaccine in adults over the age of 18.


Riverside County At 0% ICU Bed Capacity As Nurses' Strike Looms

- As coronavirus hospitalizations mount in Riverside County and intensive care unit beds are at zero capacity, unionized registered nurses and licensed medical professionals at three Southland hospitals — including Riverside Community Hospital have called a 10-day unfair labor practice strike.
- According to a statement Monday from the registered nurse union SEIU Local RN121, the workers plan to strike from December 24 through January 3 at Riverside Community Hospital in Riverside, Los Robles Regional Medical Center in Thousand Oaks and West Hills Hospital & Medical Center in West Hills.
- Union members gave the hospitals a 10-day advance notice Monday in order to allow the employers ample time to bring in temporary replacement staff, according to SEIU Local RN121.
- All three hospitals are Hospital Corporation of America facilities. Safety, staffing and workload issues impacting safety are the employees' major concerns, according to the union.



Reported to the CDC since January 21, 2020




United States COVID-19 Cases and Deaths by State




State/Local Preparations:

- Region II: NY and NJ EOCs are at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- Region III:
 - PA EOC is at Full Activation (COVID-19)
 - o DC, DE, and VA EOC are at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
 - MD and WV EOCs are Monitoring (COVID-19)
- Region IV: NC and SC are at Partial Activation (COVID-19)

FEMA Response:

- NRCC at Level III (COVID-19); NWC is monitoring
- FEMA RI RRCC at Level II (COVID-19); Maynard MOC is monitoring

- FEMA RIV RWC is monitoring






