## **States call in National Guard and train volunteers to help boost vaccination pace as US hits a Covid-19 daily death toll record**

- As numbers climb, governors are now taking new measures to get the distributed vaccines into arms faster, including mobilizing National Guard members and training more volunteers to administer vaccines.
- The federal government's Operation Warp Speed said it distributed more than 3 million vaccines on Tuesday -- bringing the US total of distributed vaccines to more than 19 million. Earlier Tuesday, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention data showed 17 million doses had been distributed and more than 4.8 million had been administered.
- That means only about 28% of the distributed doses have been administered.

## **After a freezer filled with Covid-19 vaccines broke, a California hospital scrambled to administer more than 800 doses in about 2 hours**

- When a freezer that was used to store the Moderna Covid-19 vaccine at a Northern California hospital broke, officials soon realized they only had about two hours to administer the more than 800 doses that were inside.
- The executive team at Mendocino County's Adventist Health Ukiah Valley Medical Center was notified during a safety inspection Monday morning that a freezer was found to be at room temperature, Judson Howe, of Adventist Health, told CNN. And the alarm that was supposed to alert staff of the temperature change had also malfunctioned.
- Hospital officials contacted Moderna but did not hear back. So, the hospital decided to race the clock and administer the vaccines.
- "It was our main focus to make sure that we got every single vaccine into every arm. We reached out to the county public health officer and informed them of the situation and with a collaborative approach, we were able to administer all 830 vaccines in a matter of two hours," Howe said.

## **Pharmacist Arrested, Accused Of Destroying More Than 500 Moderna Vaccine Doses**

- A Milwaukee pharmacist was arrested accused of "tampering with and causing the destruction" of more than 550 doses of the Moderna vaccine against the coronavirus.
- In a statement, Grafton Police Department officials said the pharmacist — now fired from the Advocate Aurora Health hospital system — was arrested on recommended charges of first-degree recklessly endangering safety, adulterating a prescription drug and criminal damage to property.

## Your dentist may be able to give you a COVID-19 vaccine shot soon

- California Governor Gavin Newsom announced on Monday that the state is working aggressively to accelerate the pace of the vaccine shots in California.
- To help speed up the pace, the governor will not only increase the number of distribution sites, but also expand the list of those who can distribute the vaccine.
- Health workers like pharmacy techs, clinicians, and even dentists will start administering the vaccine, a move some say is necessary.
- "All hands on deck - the more we can administer this vaccine, the better," says Dr. Judee Tippett-Whyte, the president of the California Dental Association. Before being able to vaccinate, dentists would need to complete a 3-4 hour online CDC training on the COVID-19 shot.

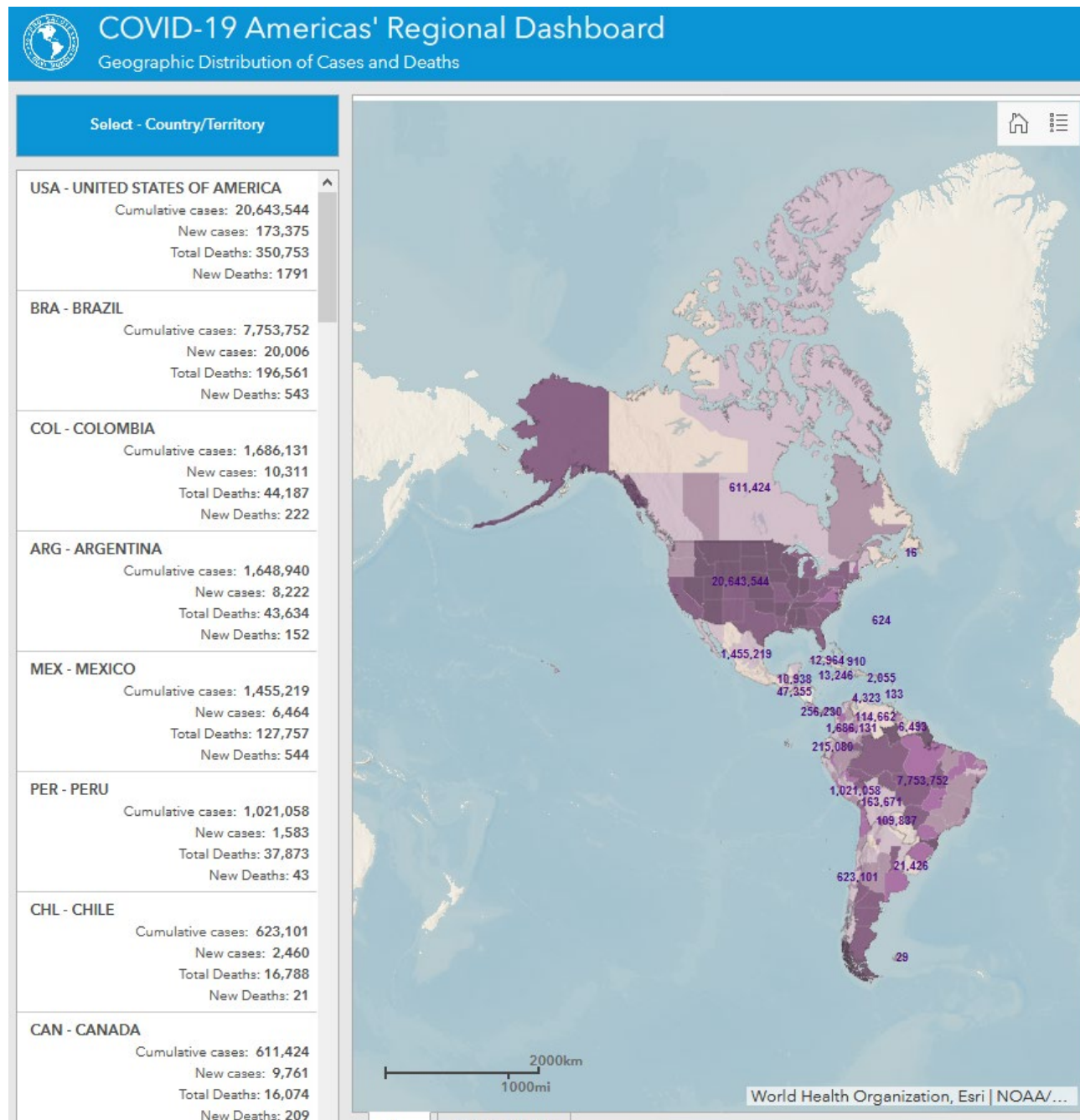
## Corona-Norco USD Halts Reopening Of K-6 Classes

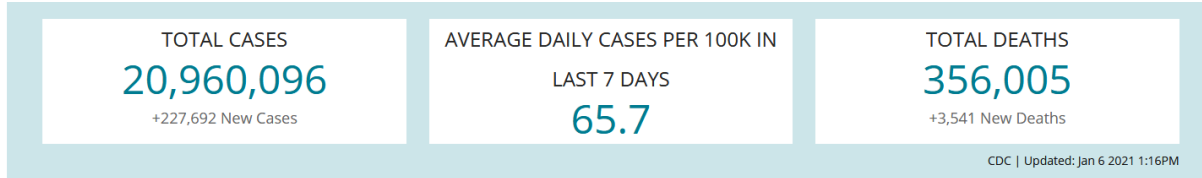

Reported to the CDC since January 21, 2020

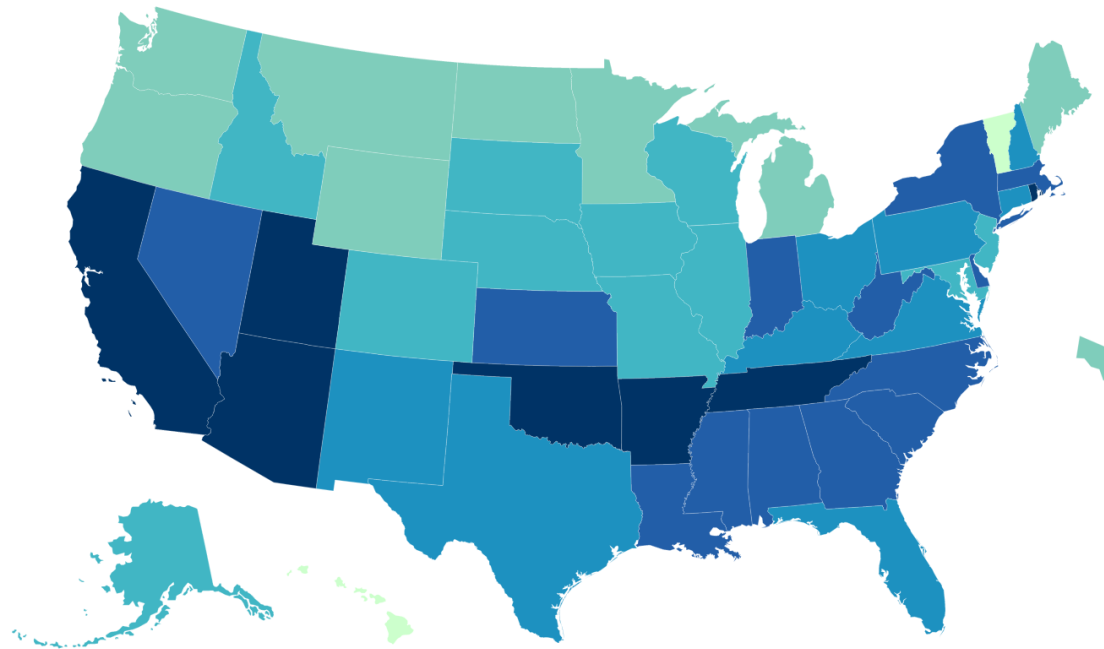

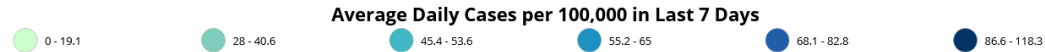

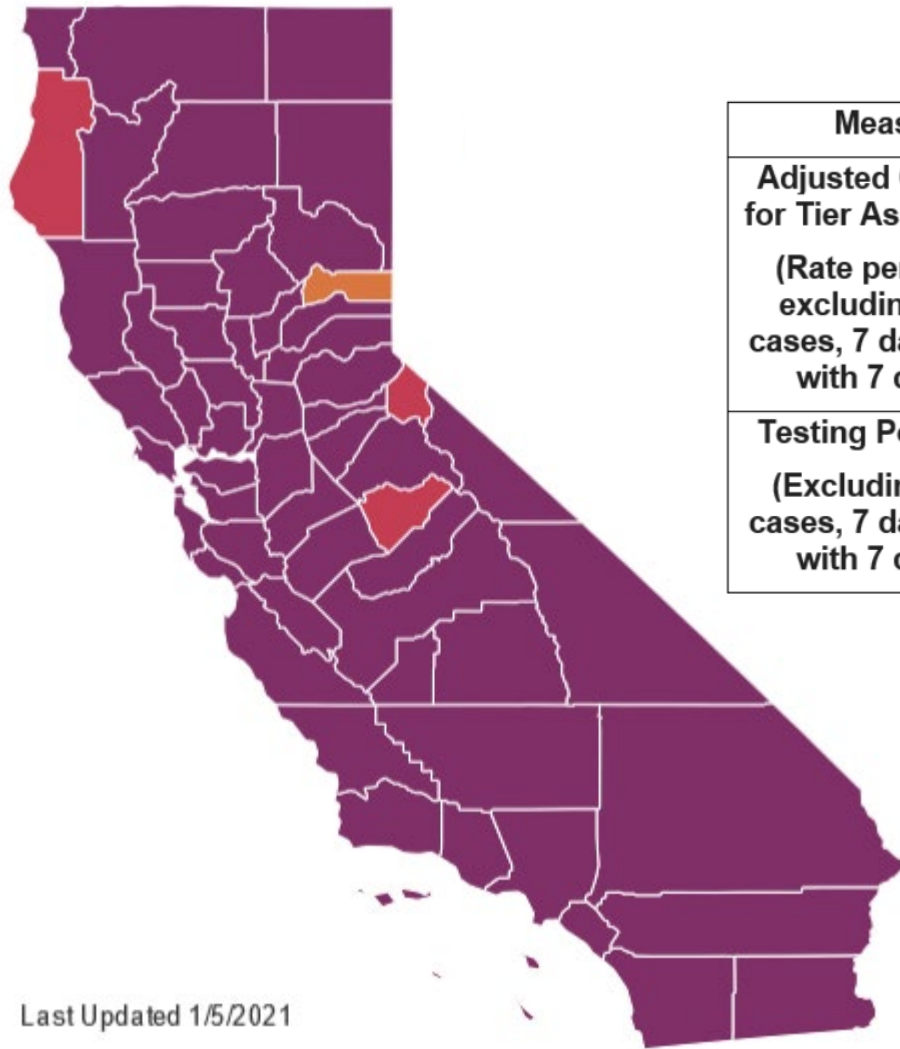

### State Officials Announce Latest COVID-19 Facts

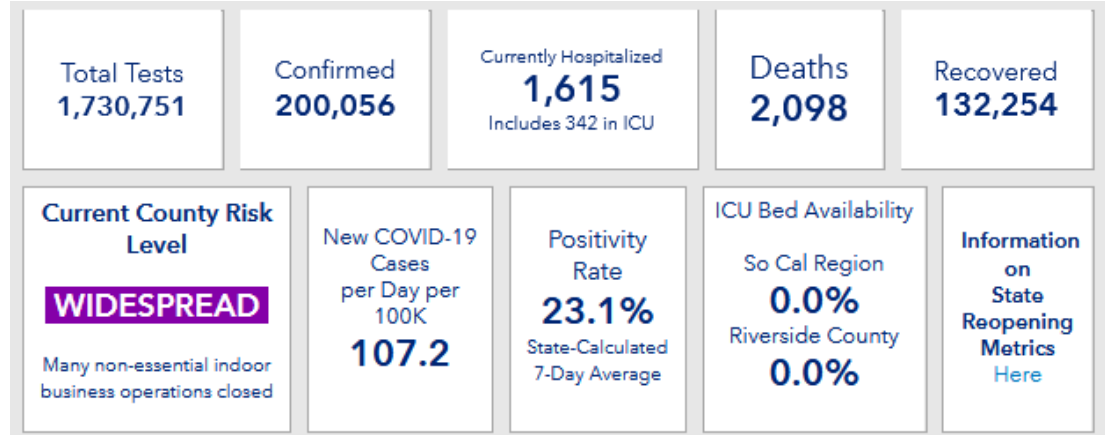

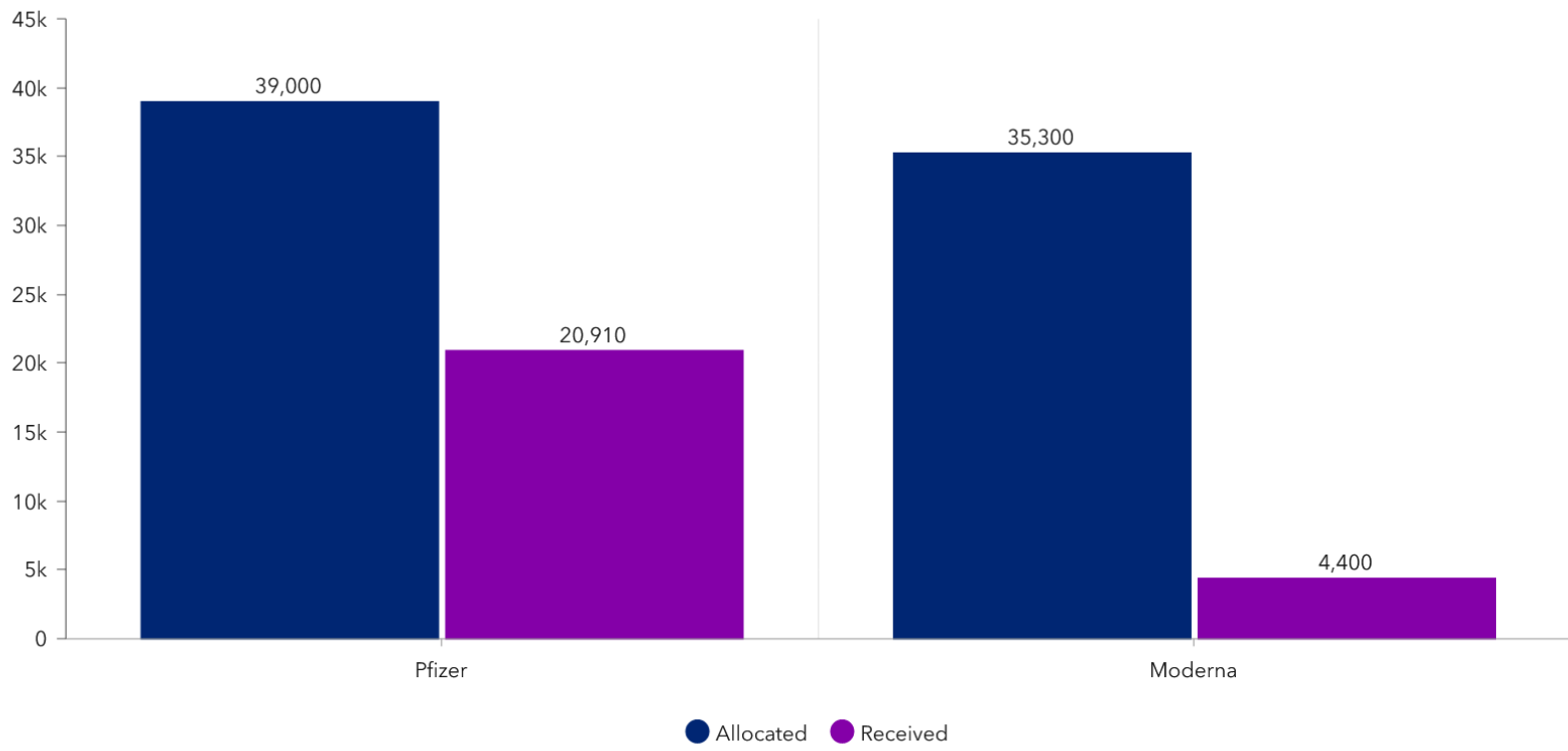
