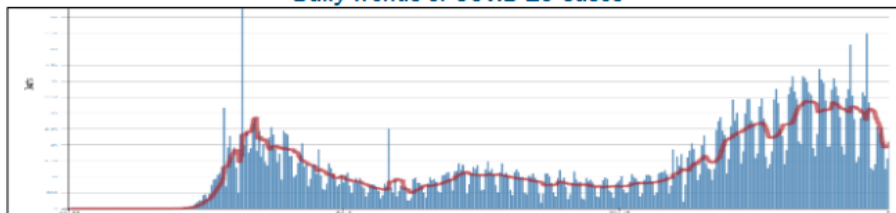

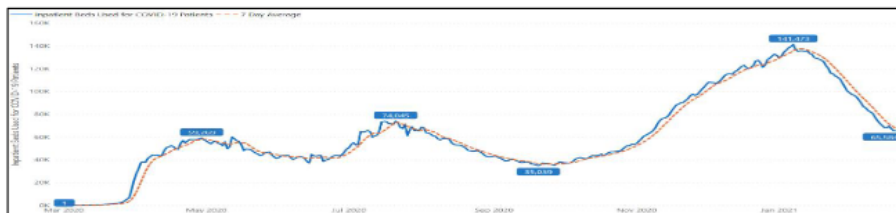

Daily Trends of COVID-19 Cases



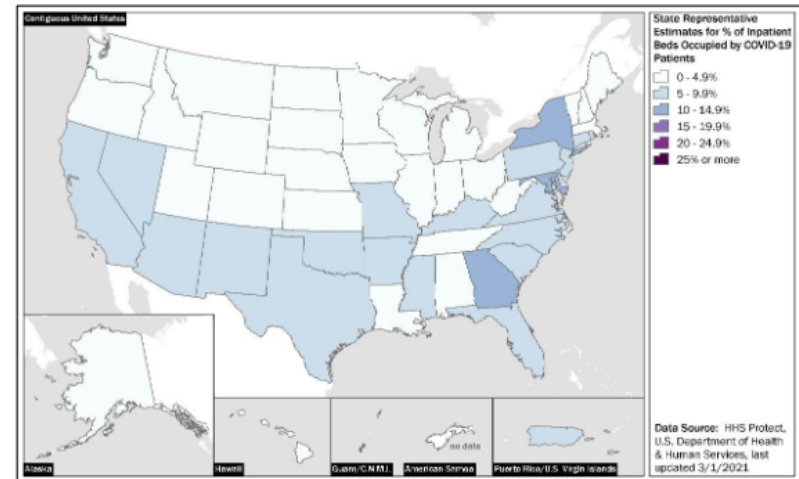
Daily Trends of COVID-19 Deaths

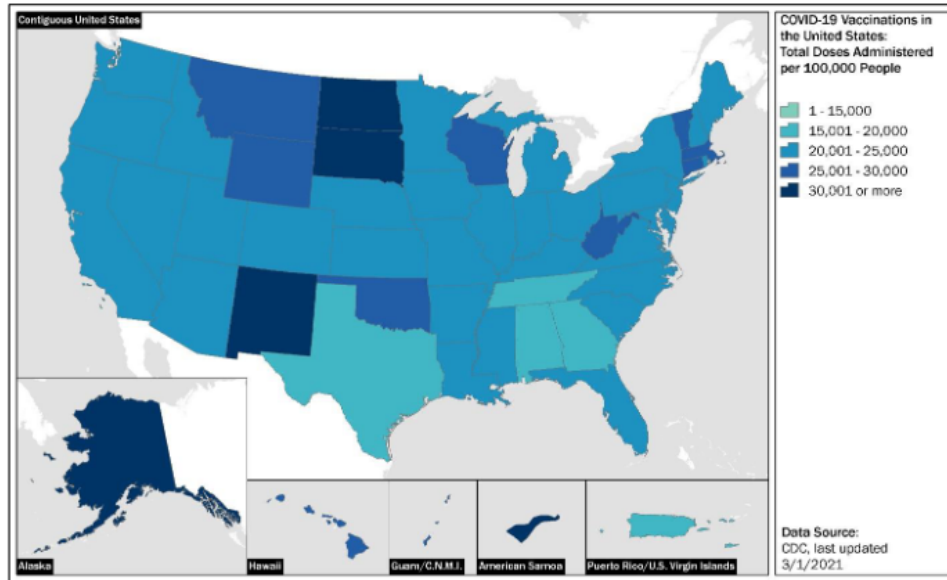

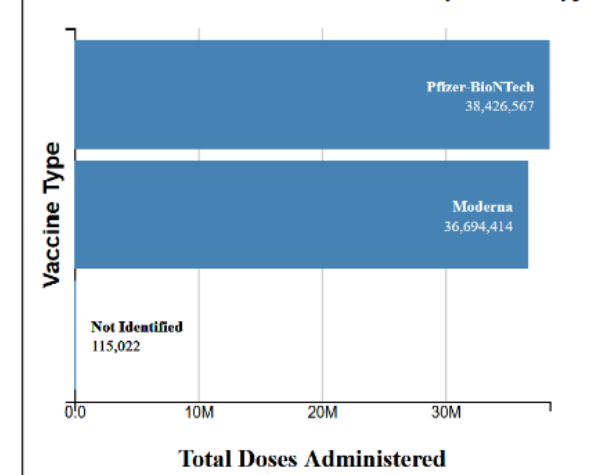

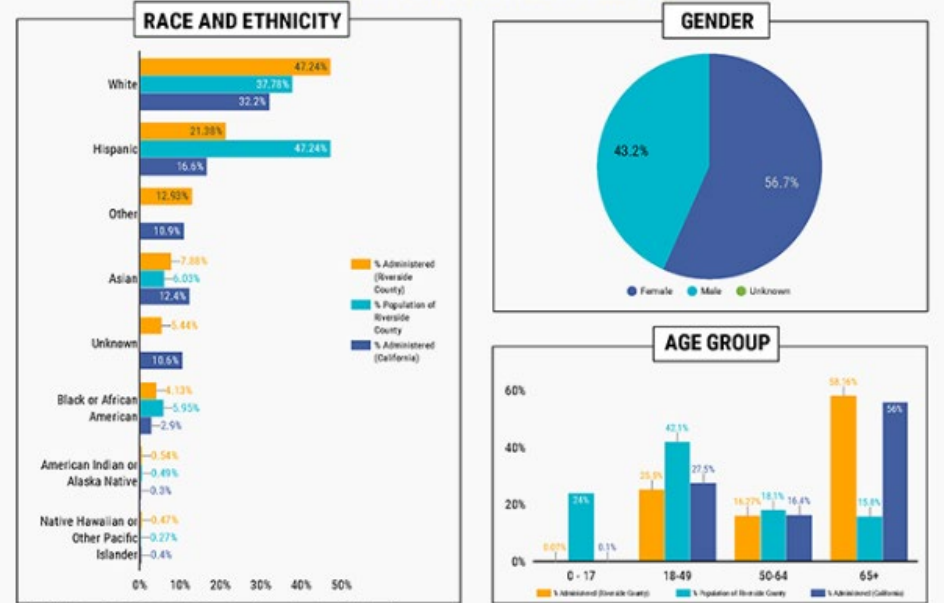

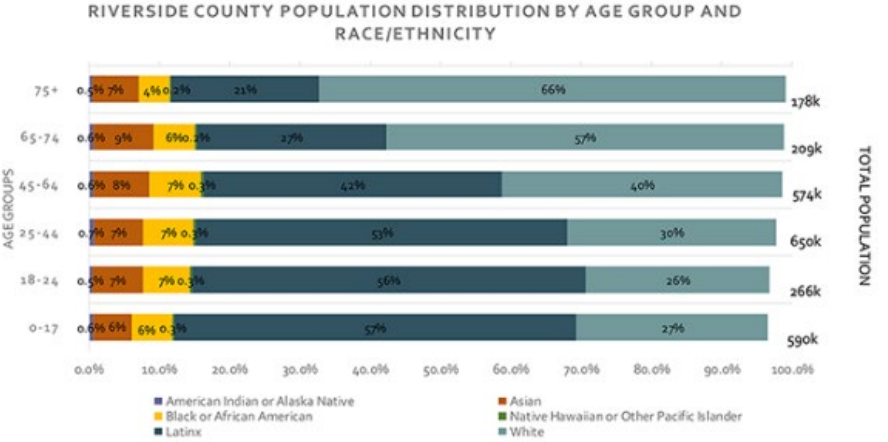
Percent of vaccines administered

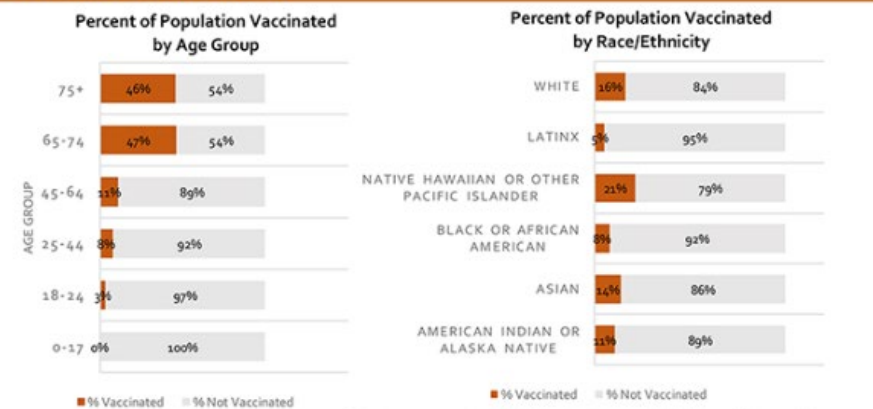

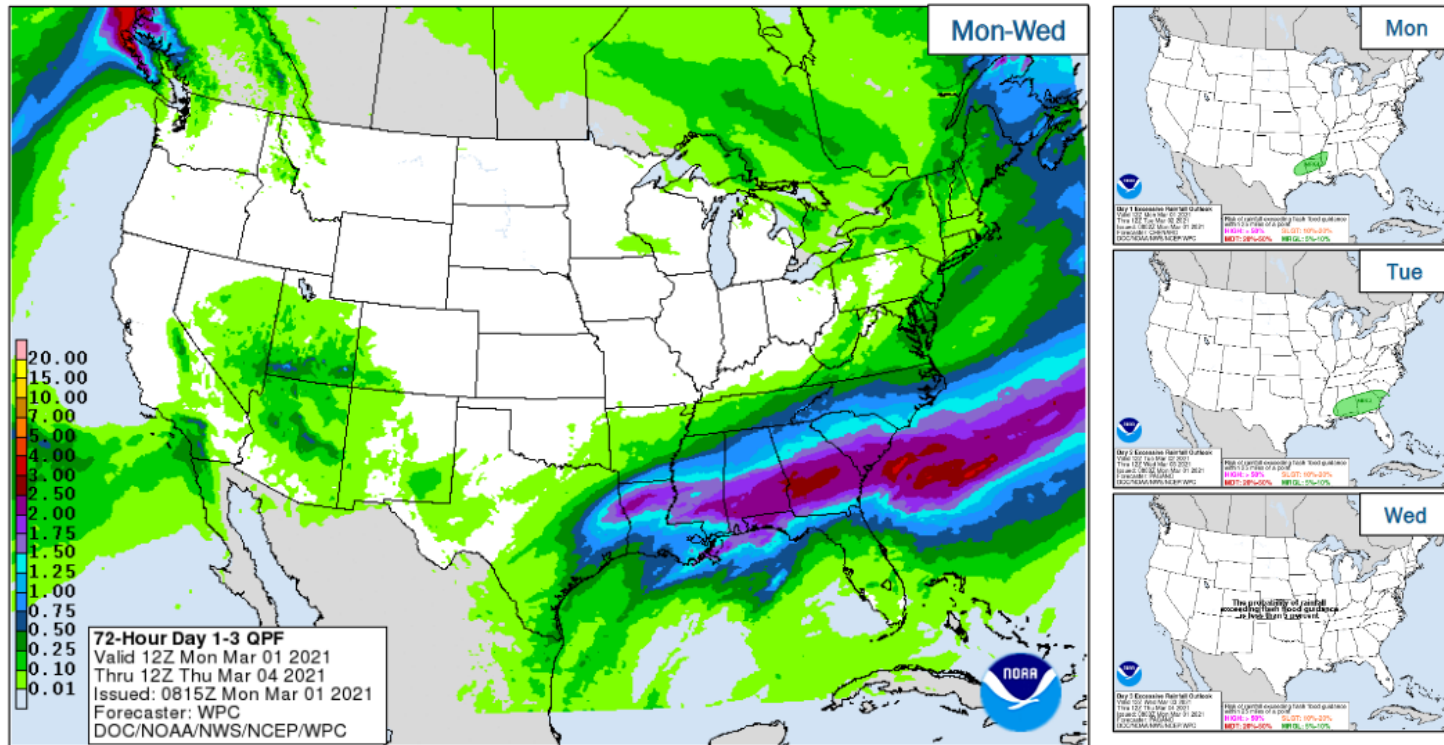

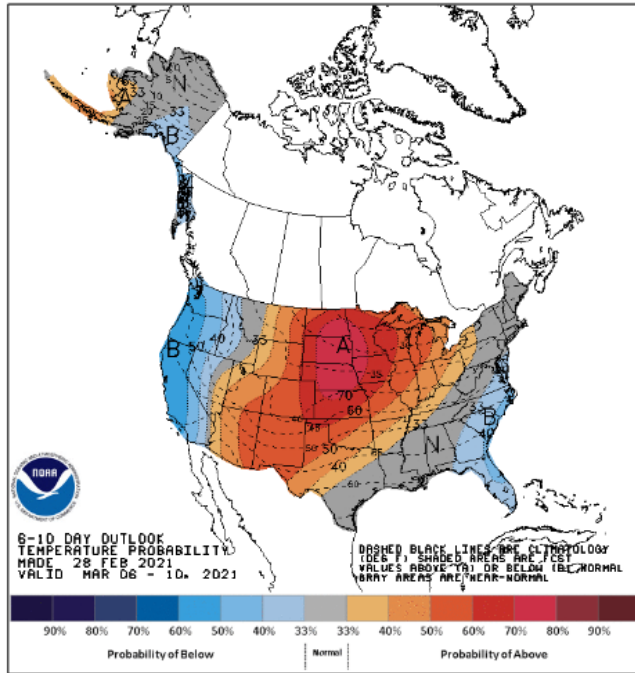
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



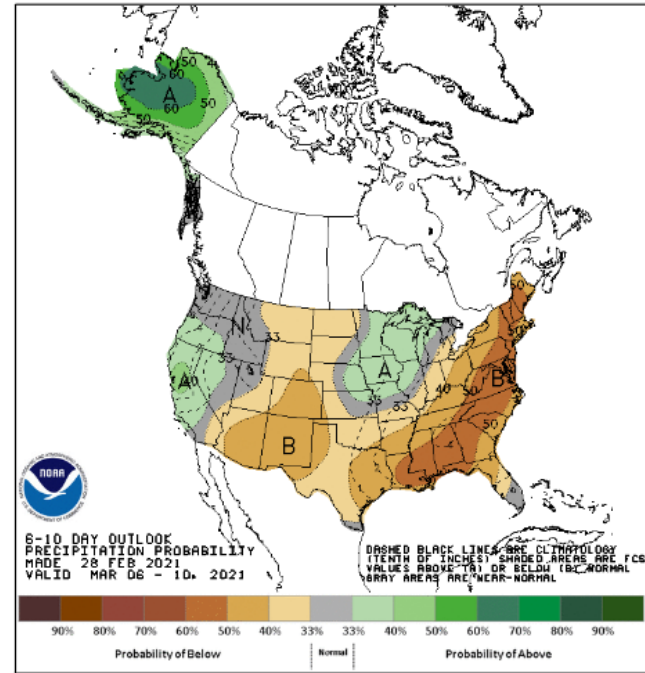
