WHO approves Moderna's COVID-19 vaccine for emergency use

- The World Health Organization has listed Moderna's COVID-19 vaccine for emergency use, the agency said on Friday, the fifth jab to be given the status meant to expedite countries' own approval of shots.
- "The objective is to make medicines, vaccines and diagnostics available as rapidly as possible to address the emergency," the WHO said in a statement.

COVID is killing 120 people an hour in India, and it could stay "really grim" for months

- A month after the second wave of coronavirus infections started sweeping over India, the country is mired in grief, and it could be weeks, even months before the situation improves. On Tuesday, yet another grim milestone was crossed: 20 million cases of COVID-19 registered since the start of the pandemic. About seven million of those were confirmed over the last month alone.
- There were reports on Tuesday that dozens of U.S. Embassy staff in Delhi were among the latest confirmed infections, but an embassy spokesperson told CBS News that while the health and safety of staff and their families was "among the [State] Department's highest priorities," and that it would "take all necessary measures to safeguard the health and wellbeing of our employees, including offering vaccines," they could not confirm details due to privacy concerns.

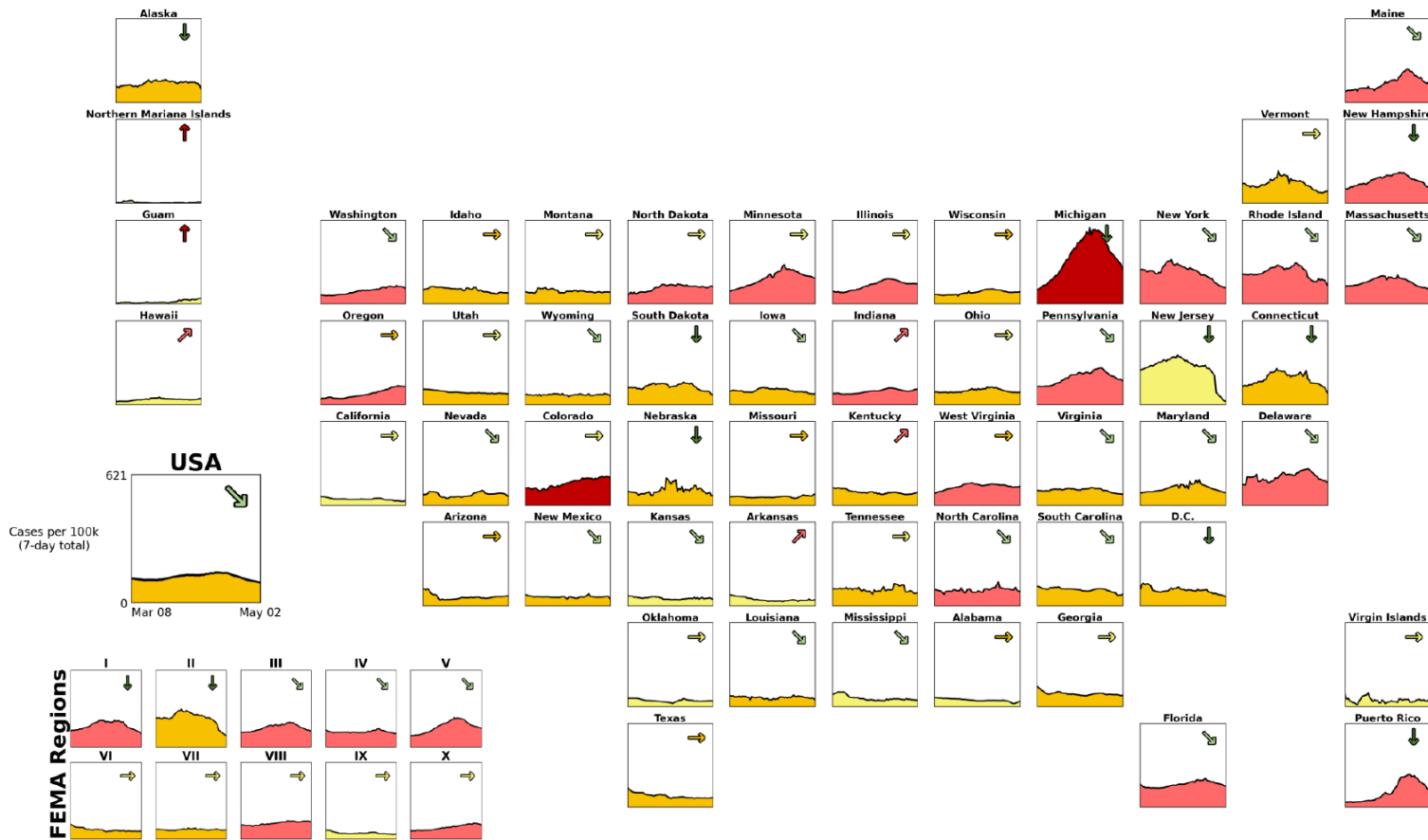

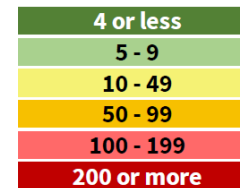

TRENDS IN CASE INCIDENCE DURING THE LAST 8 WEEKS



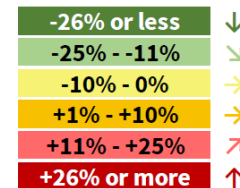
Case incidence categories

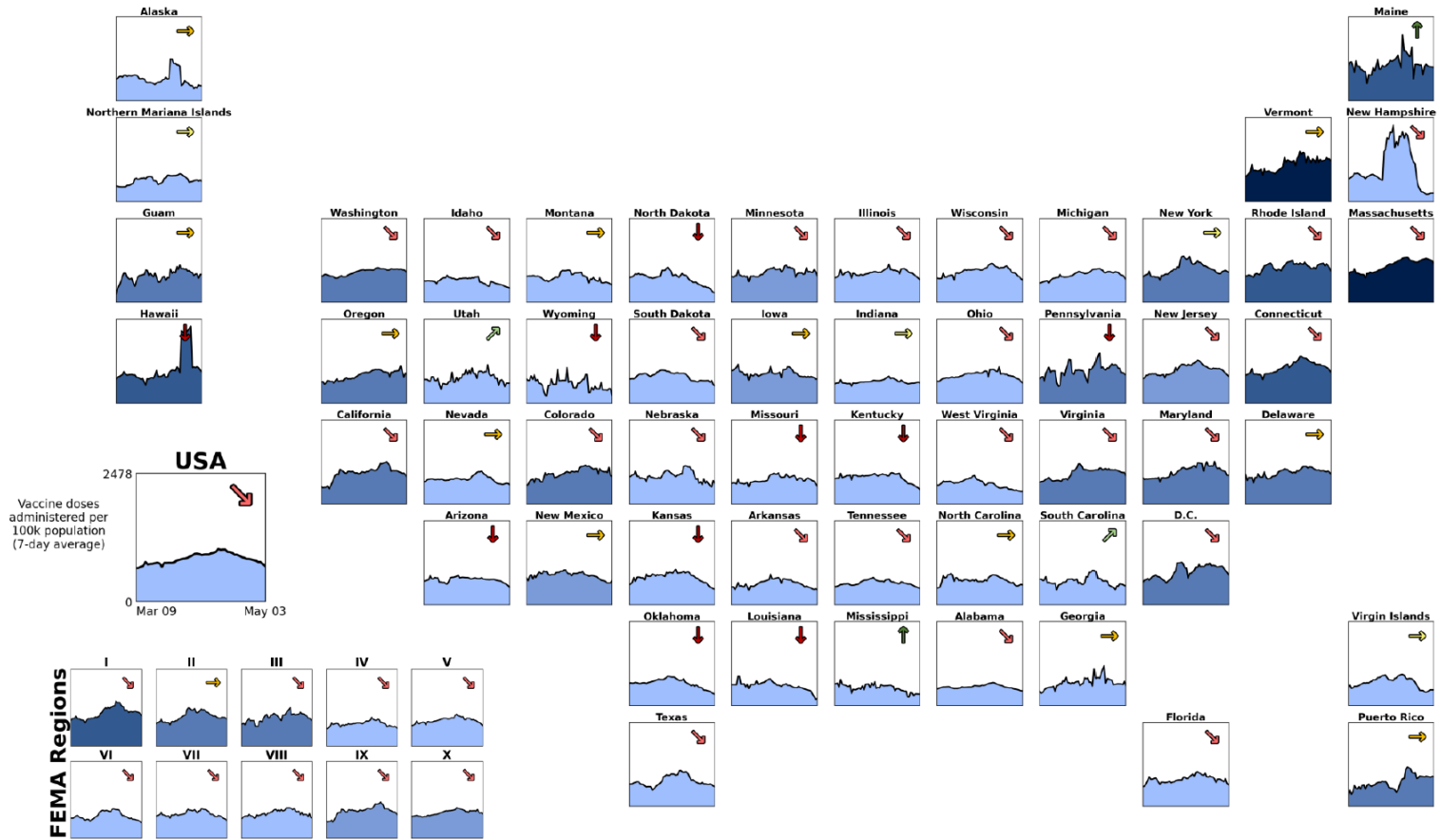

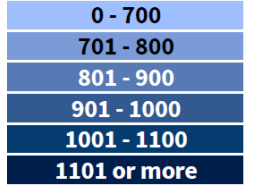

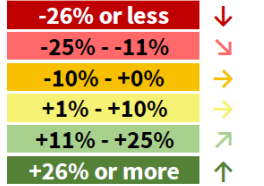
TRENDS IN VACCINE DOSES ADMINISTERED PER 100K POPULATION DURING THE LAST 8 WEEKS

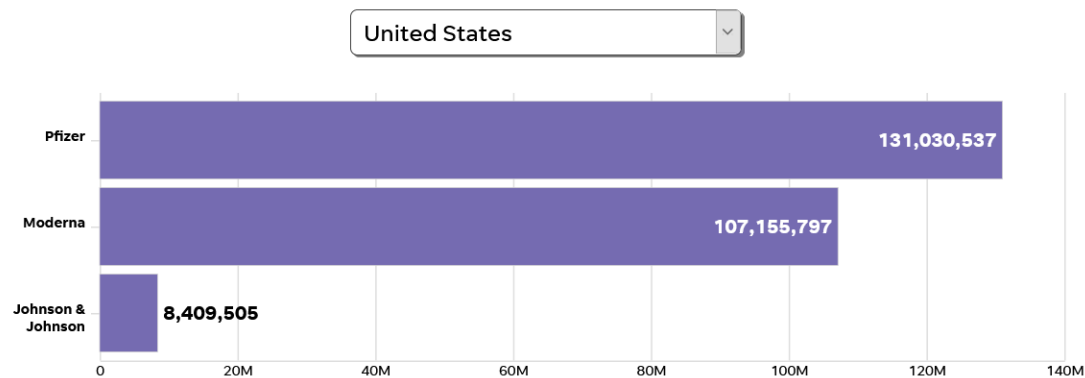

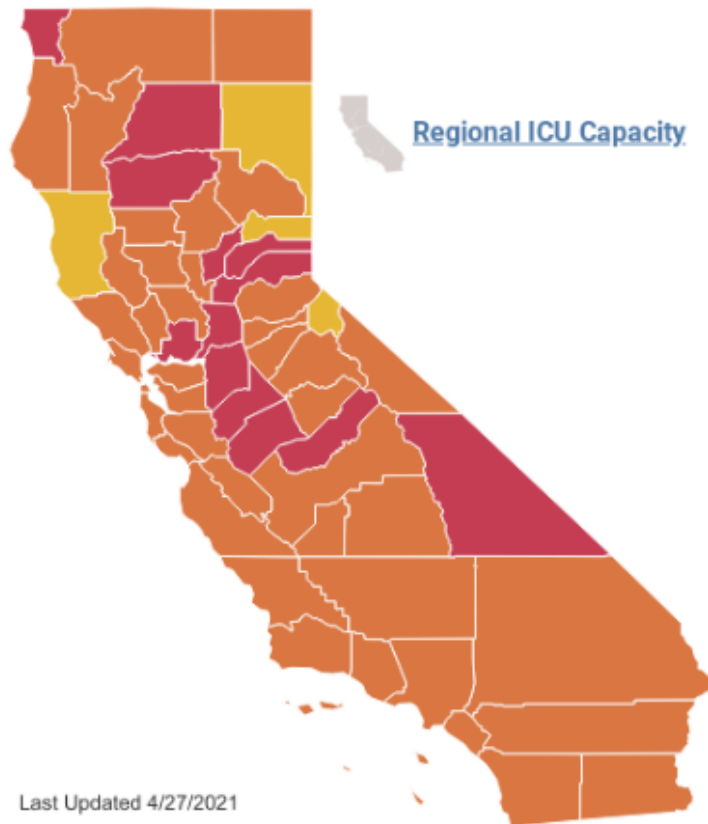

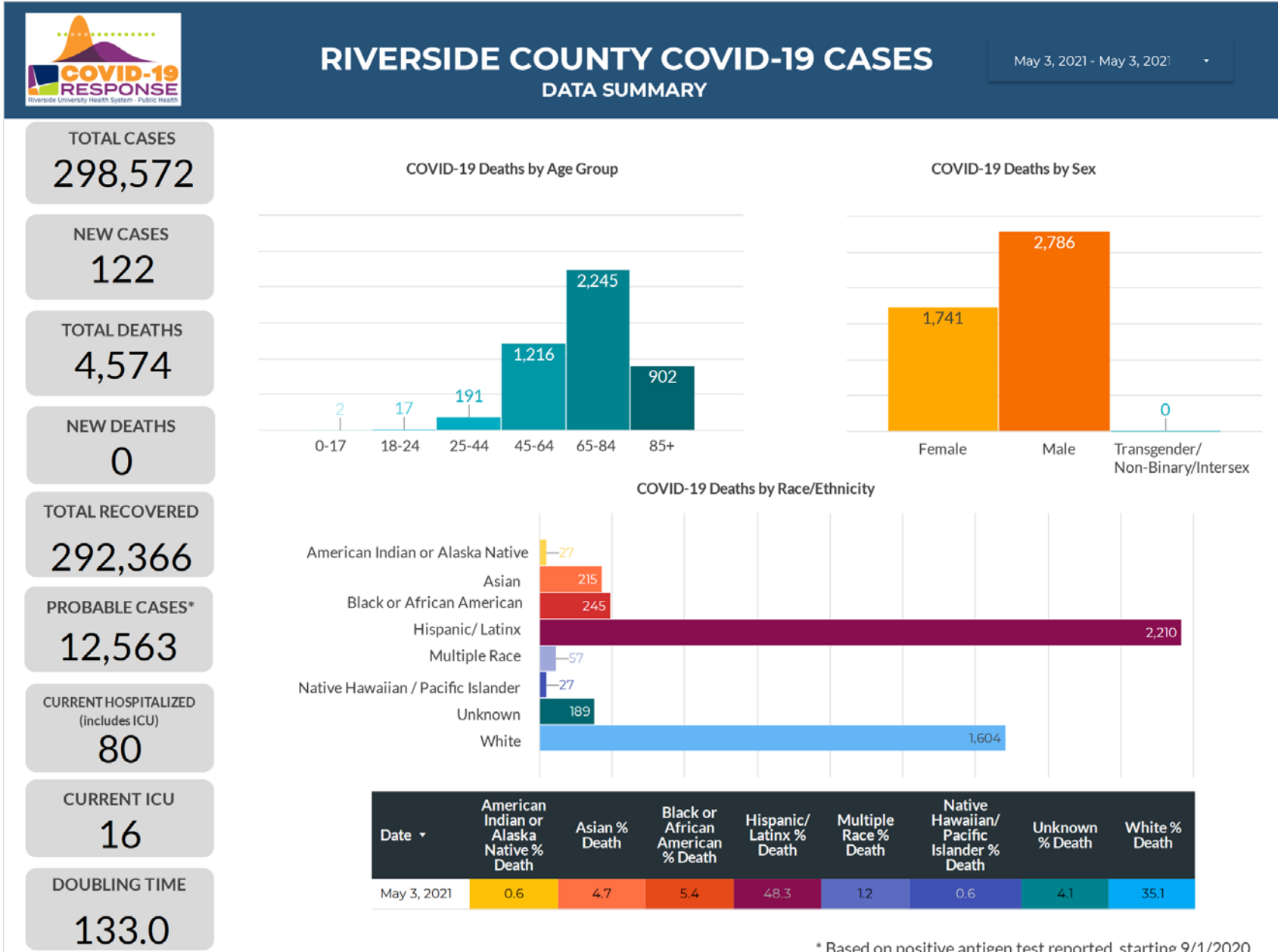

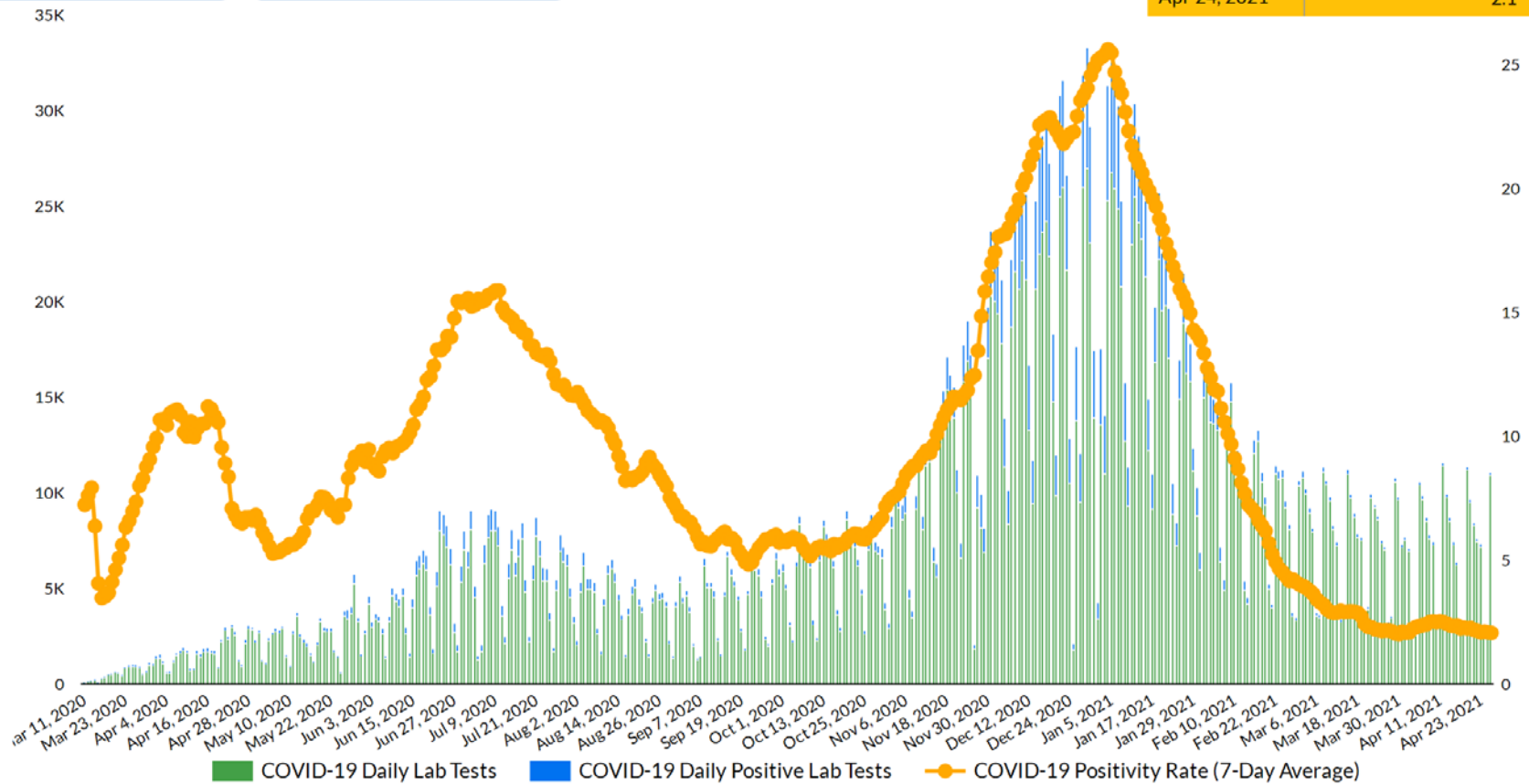

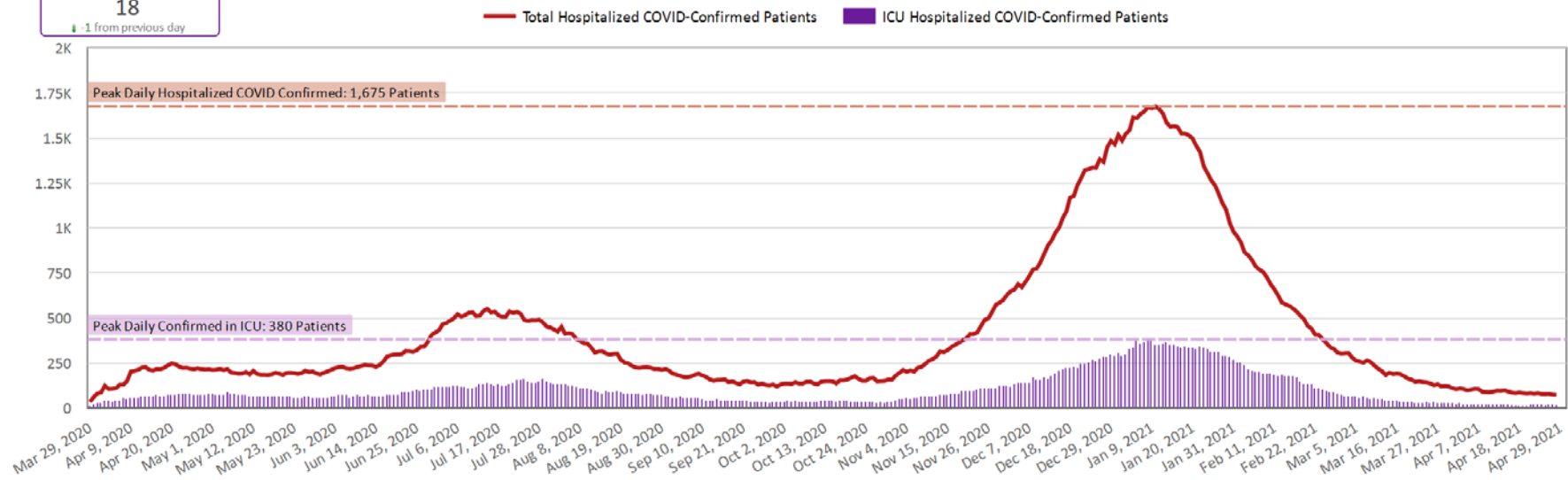

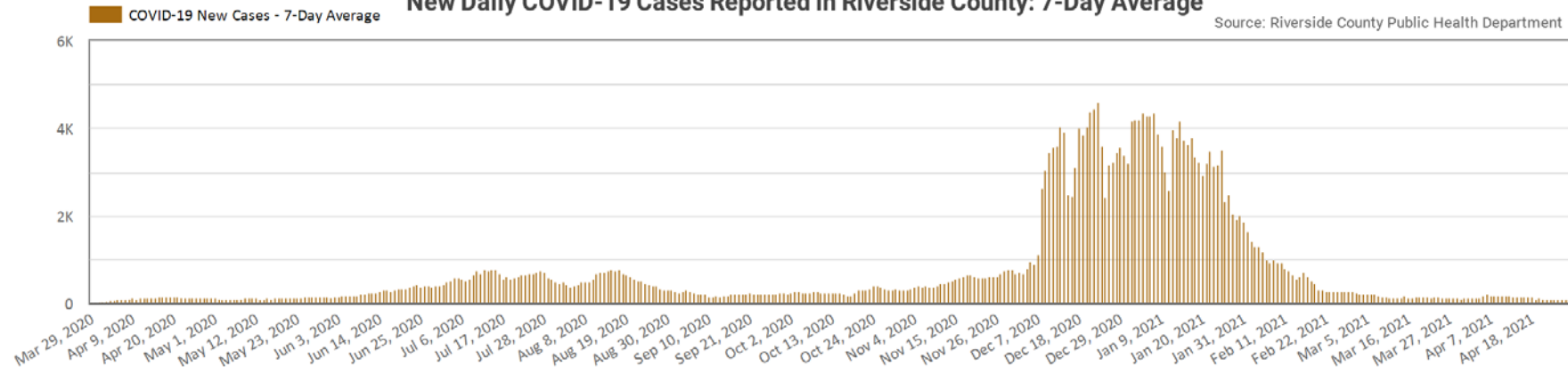

Severe Weather – Great Plains to the East Coast

Current Situation:

Severe weather moved through the Southeast and Southern Plains into the Great Lakes yesterday, resulting in the National Weather Service issuing several Tornado Watches and Warnings in GA, MS, TX. Large hail, high winds/straight line winds, and tornadoes have been the primary threats. Preliminary reports indicate 20 tornadoes touched down across TX (3), IL (5), GA (4), SC (7), and VA (1).

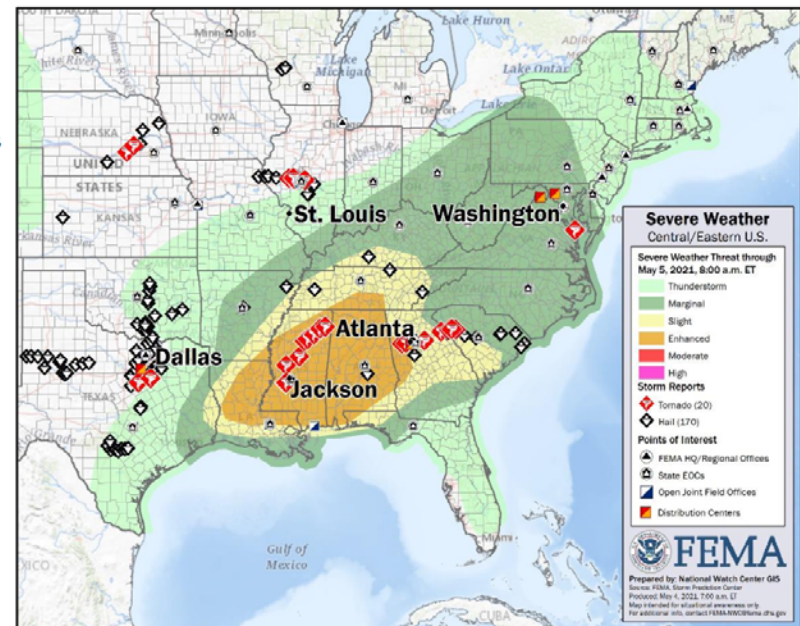
- 1 injury / 2 fatalities (unconfirmed) (FEMA RIV SPOTREP 10:53 p.m. ET, FEMA RVI SPOTREP 2:12 a.m. ET)
- Damage includes downed trees, scattered debris, and several homes and businesses damaged; assessments have begun
- 120k customers without power across the impacted areas (DOE Eagle-I as of 7:10 a.m. ET)
 - Majority in AR (54K), TX (13K), TN (21K), & KY (24K)

State / Local Response:

- IL EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- GA, VA, SC, AR, TN, TX EOCs at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- KY EOC at Monitoring (COVID-19 & Severe Weather)

FEMA Response:

- FEMA NWC and Regions III through VII RWCs continues to monitor
- No requests for FEMA assistance
