Case Of India COVID Variant Discovered In San Diego (8 min Listen)

- The first case of the COVID virus variant that has led to a major outbreak in India has been detected in San Diego. The B.1.617 variant was found in March because of the lag time between a positive test and viral sequencing.
- The variant was not detected until last week. Dr. Wooten also told members of the San Diego County board of supervisors that despite continued lower rates of COVID transmission in San Diego and across California, the state ordered COVID-19 emergency status is expected to continue through the end of the year.

US backs waiving intellectual property rules on vaccines

- The Biden administration on Wednesday joined calls for more sharing of the technology behind COVID-19 vaccines to help speed the end of the pandemic, a shift that puts the U.S. alongside many in the developing world who want rich countries to do more to get doses to the needy.
- U.S. Trade Representative Katherine Tai announced the government's position, amid World Trade Organization talks about a possible temporary waiver of its protections that would allow more manufacturers to produce the life-saving vaccines.

Moderna says Covid booster shot generates promising immune response against variants found in South Africa, Brazil

- Moderna is testing a 50-microgram dose of its vaccine in previously vaccinated individuals.
- It found the booster dose increased neutralizing antibody responses against the original virus as well as B.1.351 and P.1, two variants that have since spread to other countries, including the U.S.

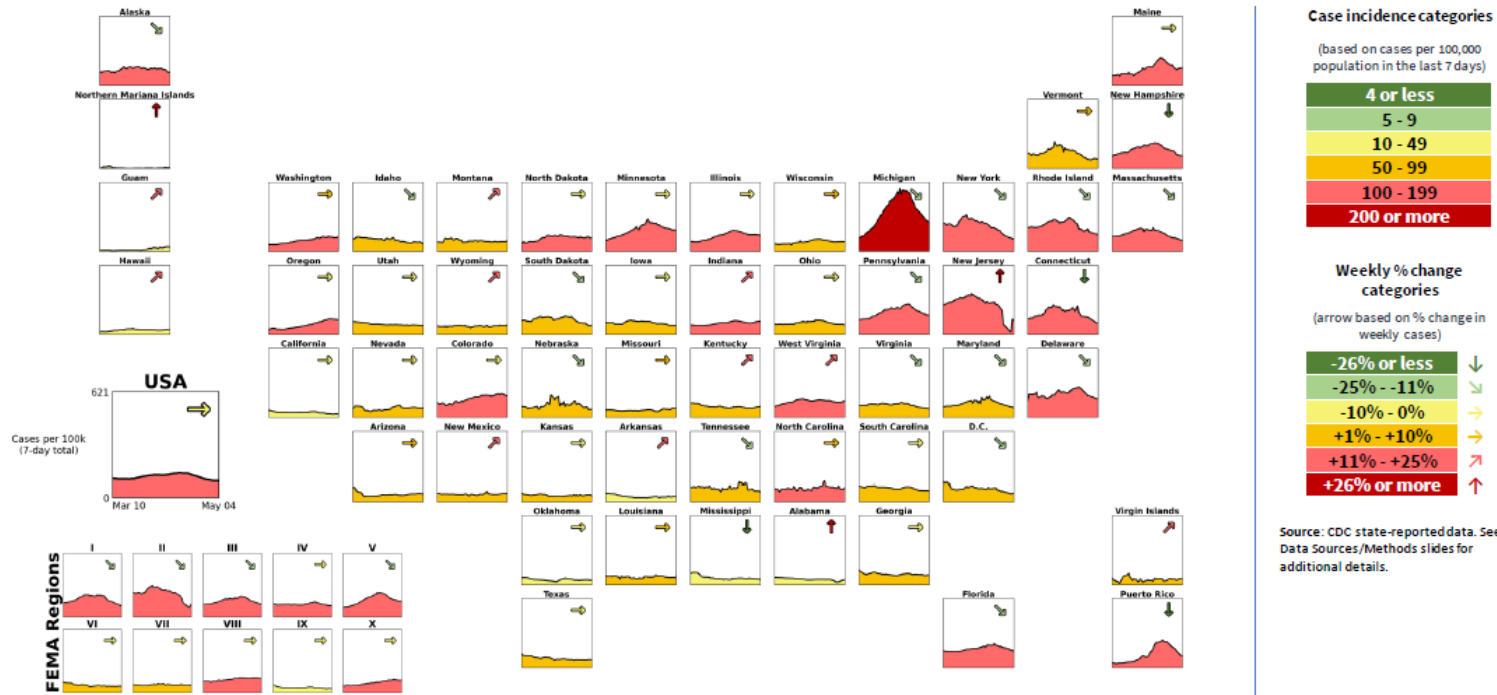

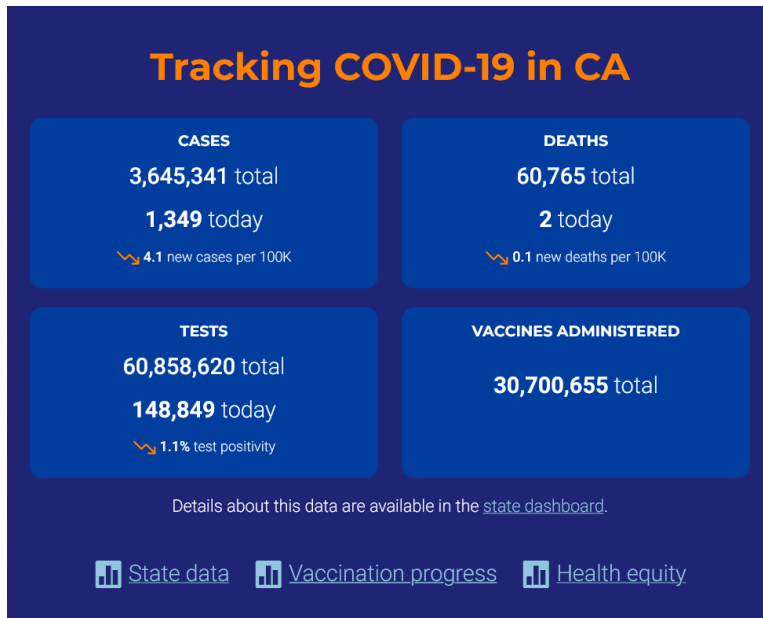

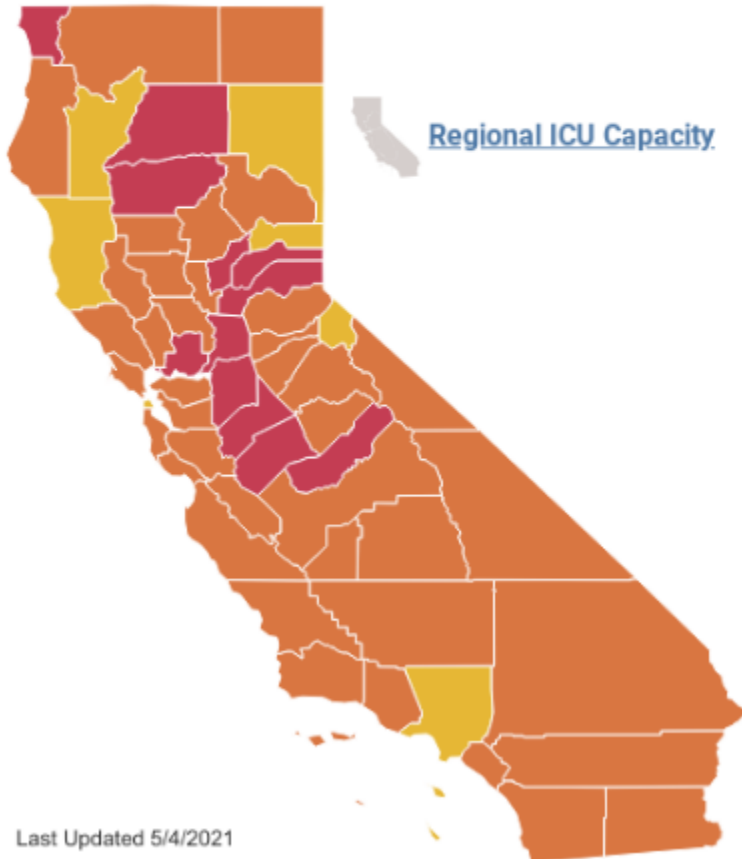

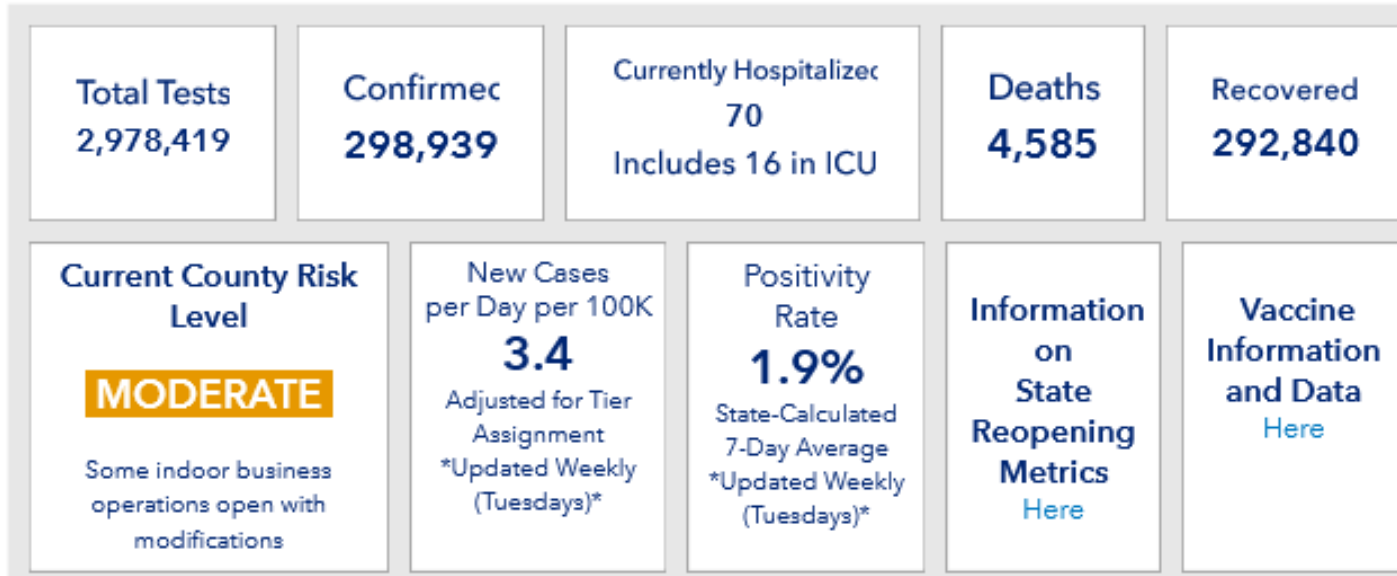

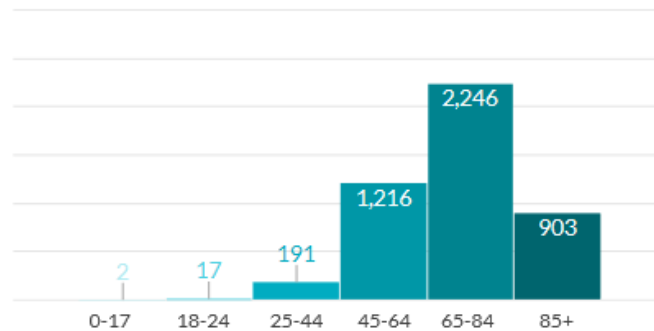

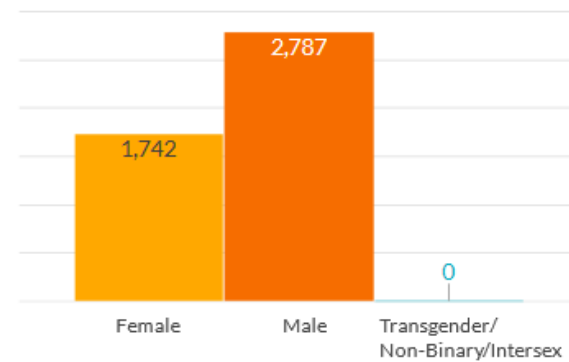

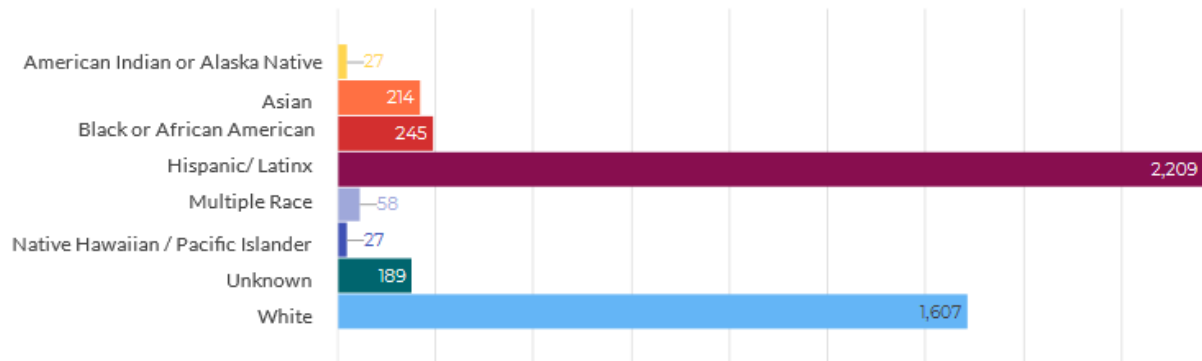

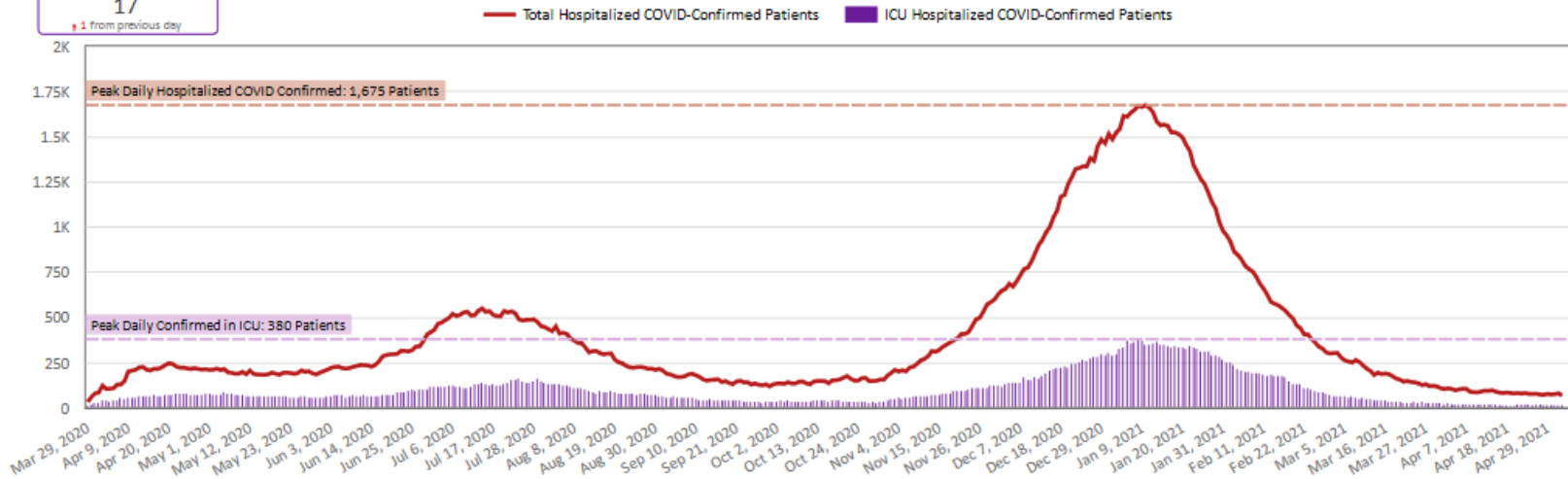

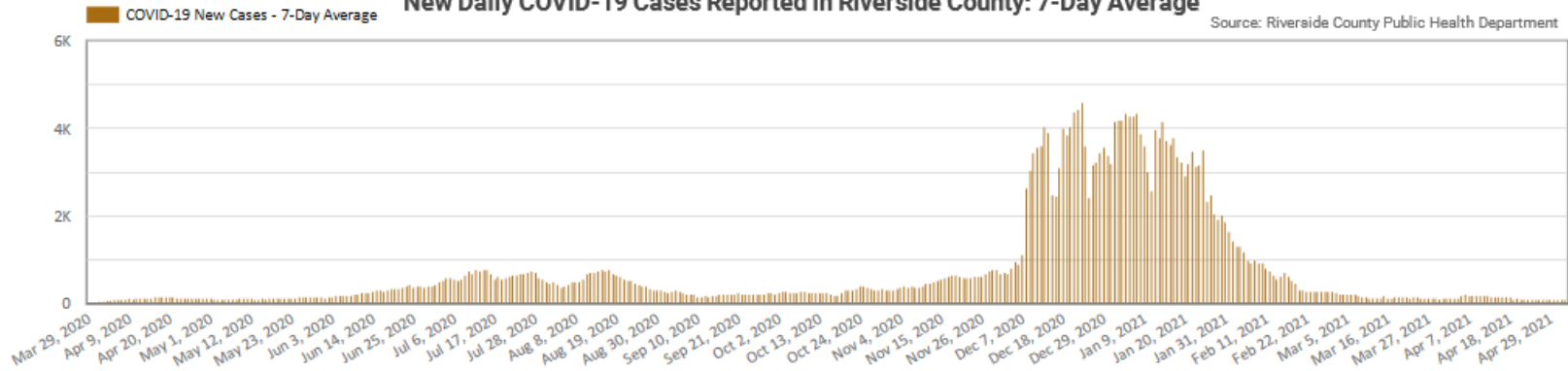

New Daily COVID-19 Cases Reported in Riverside County: 7-Day Average



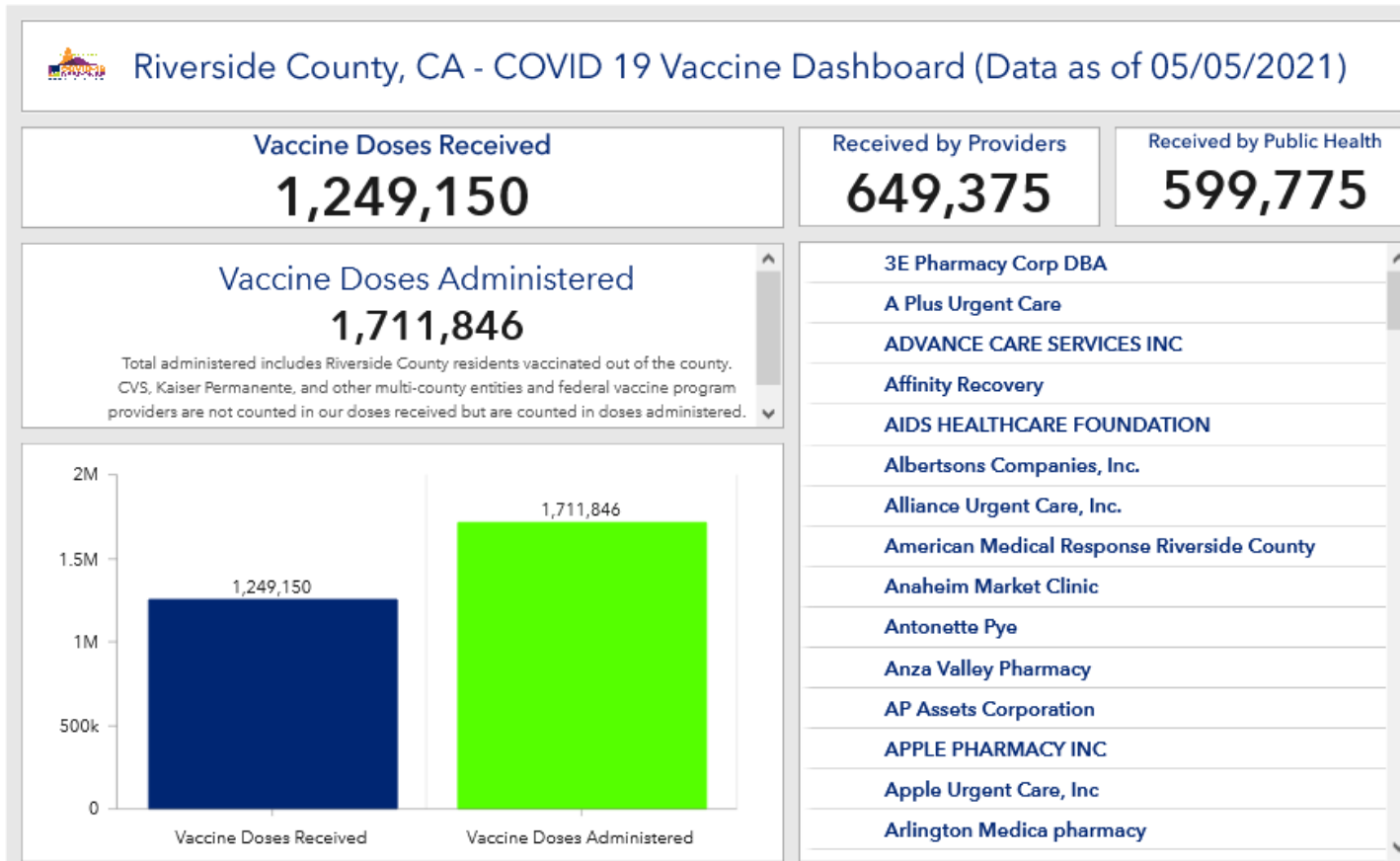

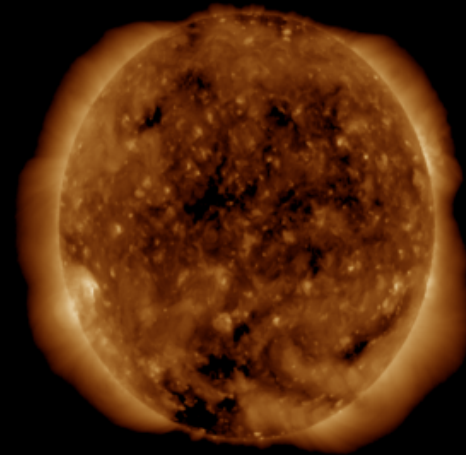
