Uneven vaccination rates across the US linked to Covid-19 case trends, worry experts

- Tuesday was a "landmark day," as the United States reached a new Covid-19 vaccine milestone: 60% of adults have now received at least one dose of Covid-19 vaccine, according to the US Centers and Disease Control and Prevention.
- But vaccination rates across the United States are uneven -- a worrisome trend that could obstruct efforts to end the Covid-19 pandemic. Rates range from more than 78% of adults in Vermont with at least one vaccine to less than 45% of adults in Mississippi.

Fauci says the public is 'misinterpreting' the CDC's latest mask guidance

- Anthony S. Fauci, the government's leading infectious-disease expert, told Axios that the public is misinterpreting the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's announcement last week that fully vaccinated people can go without masks indoors.
- "I think people are misinterpreting, thinking that this is a removal of a mask mandate for everyone. It's not," he told Axios. "It's an assurance to those who are vaccinated that they can feel safe, be they outdoors or indoors."
- Fauci emphasized that the health agency did not explicitly tell unvaccinated people to go without masks but instead
 communicated to vaccinated individuals that they won't get infected indoors or outdoors.

Emergent CEO says FDA is holding over 100 million J&J Covid vaccine doses for further testing after botched doses

- The FDA is holding over 100 million Johnson & Johnson Covid-19 vaccine doses for further testing after the agency found
 multiple safety violations at the plant run by Emergent BioSolutions that was helping make the shots, Emergent CEO Robert
 Kramer told lawmakers Wednesday.
- The U.S. put J&J in charge of the Baltimore plant last month after learning that Emergent, a federal contractor that had been making key ingredients for J&J and AstraZeneca, cross-contaminated the two shots.

San Diego COVID-19 patient receives new diagnosis: type 2 diabetes

- With new evidence emerging, researchers are now trying to figure out if COVID-19 can trigger new cases of diabetes.
- In mid-April, a 28 year old female, came down with a cough and fever, and tested positive for COVID-19, nine days after receiving
 her first dose of the Pfizer vaccine. Days later, she was admitted into a hospital with pneumonia, and treated with the antiviral
 drug Remdesivir, as well as steroids.
- According to a global analysis published in the journal Diabetes, Obesity and Metabolism, more than 14% of people hospitalized
 with severe COVID-19 developed diabetes. The researchers pointed to the possible impact of effects of COVID-19, citing the high
 doses of insulin that diabetes patients with severe cases require and the complications they often develop.
- "What we don't know -- and this is possible -- that the virus itself can damage the pancreas and make the pancreas secrete not enough insulin," said Dr. Eckel. He says it's also possible many of the apparent new cases were actually undiagnosed cases of diabetes. New studies are now underway looking into whether COVID-19 can trigger diabetes.










Hospitalized COVID-19 Patient Volume in Riverside County 05-17-20201







Hazards Outlook - May 21 - 25





Very Unhealthy (201-300)

Unhealthy (151-200)

Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (101-150)

Moderate (51-100)

Good (0-50)
