### **California expected to roll out vaccination incentive program amid declining vaccination rates**

- As some states offer freebies or lottery tickets to get more people vaccinated against COVID-19, California leaders are set to roll out their own plan to do something similar.
- There is a decline in the rate of vaccinations nationwide, which has prompted more incentive programs all over the country.
- Gov. Gavin Newsom said California is also now starting to see a decline in the rate of inoculations, which is prompting his administration to take action with a statewide vaccine incentive program.
- Newsom has said the plans could be rolled out as early as this week, hinting at the announcement in front of the state's tourism committee last week.
- "We're looking at state overlays of incentives very soon. We were ready to do that a couple of weeks ago, but our numbers were holding pretty firmly," Newsom said.

### **Riverside County coronavirus cases lower than ever, but still short of yellow tier**

- Riverside County's coronavirus case rates are the lowest they've ever been, but still not quite low enough to qualify it for the least-restrictive stage of the state's reopening plan, the yellow tier.
- Since advancing to a new tier is based on numbers released each Tuesday and a county needs to post qualifying numbers for two straight weeks, the figures confirm what county officials predicted: Riverside County won't reach the yellow tier before June 15. That's when Gov. Gavin Newsom has said he'll scrap the tier system and essentially reopen the state with just a few virus-related restrictions.

### **San Diego Hospitals Among Local Employers Facing Potential Fines For COVID-19 Safety Violations**

- Several San Diego-area employers face tens of thousands of dollars in potential fines after the state alleges they had violated COVID-19 infection prevention protocols: putting employees, and in some cases, the public at risk.
- The California Division of Occupational Health and Safety or Cal/OSHA -- the agency tasked with policing employee safety across the state -- issued the citations and potential financial penalties based on the severity of the violations discovered.

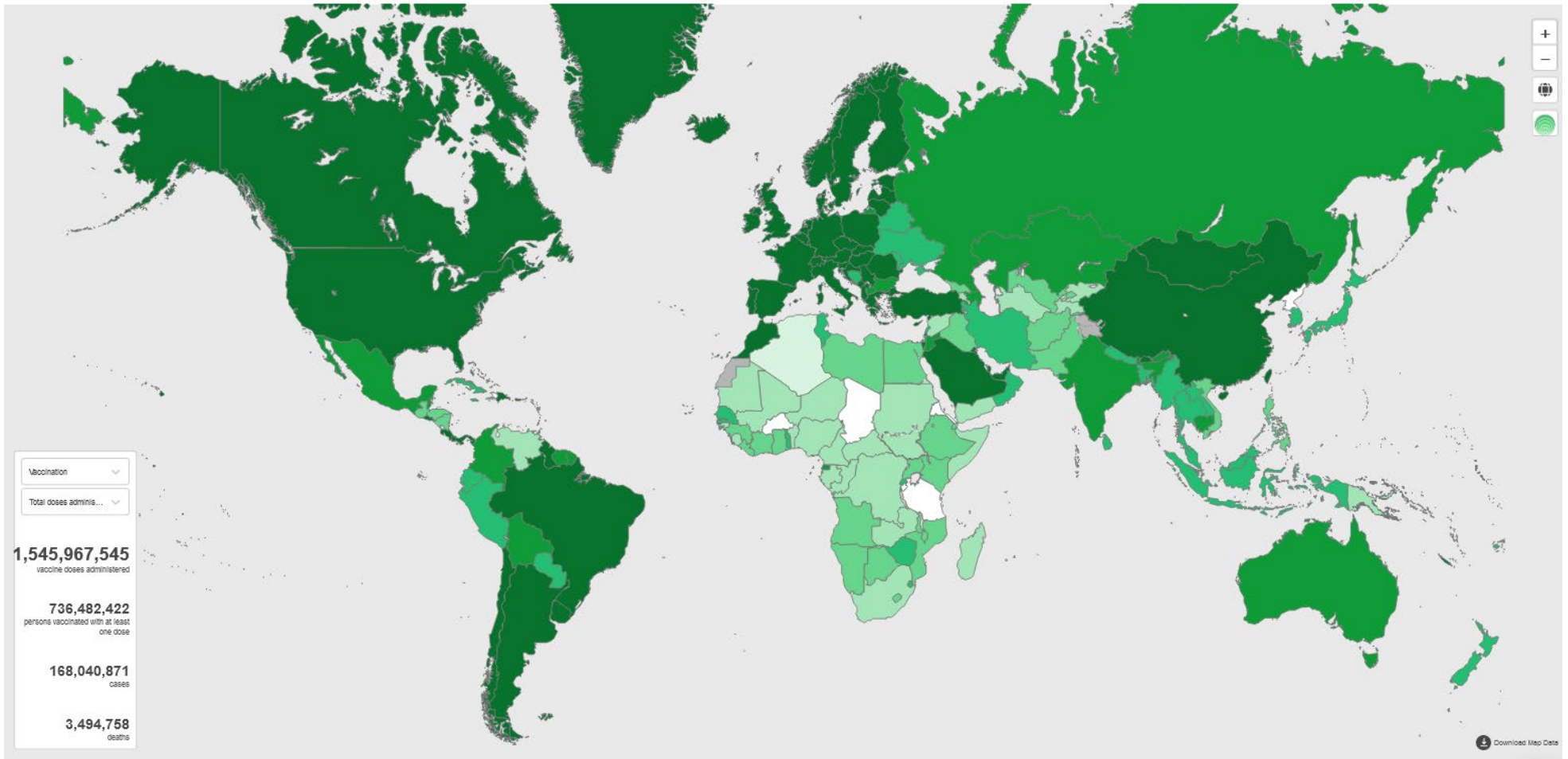

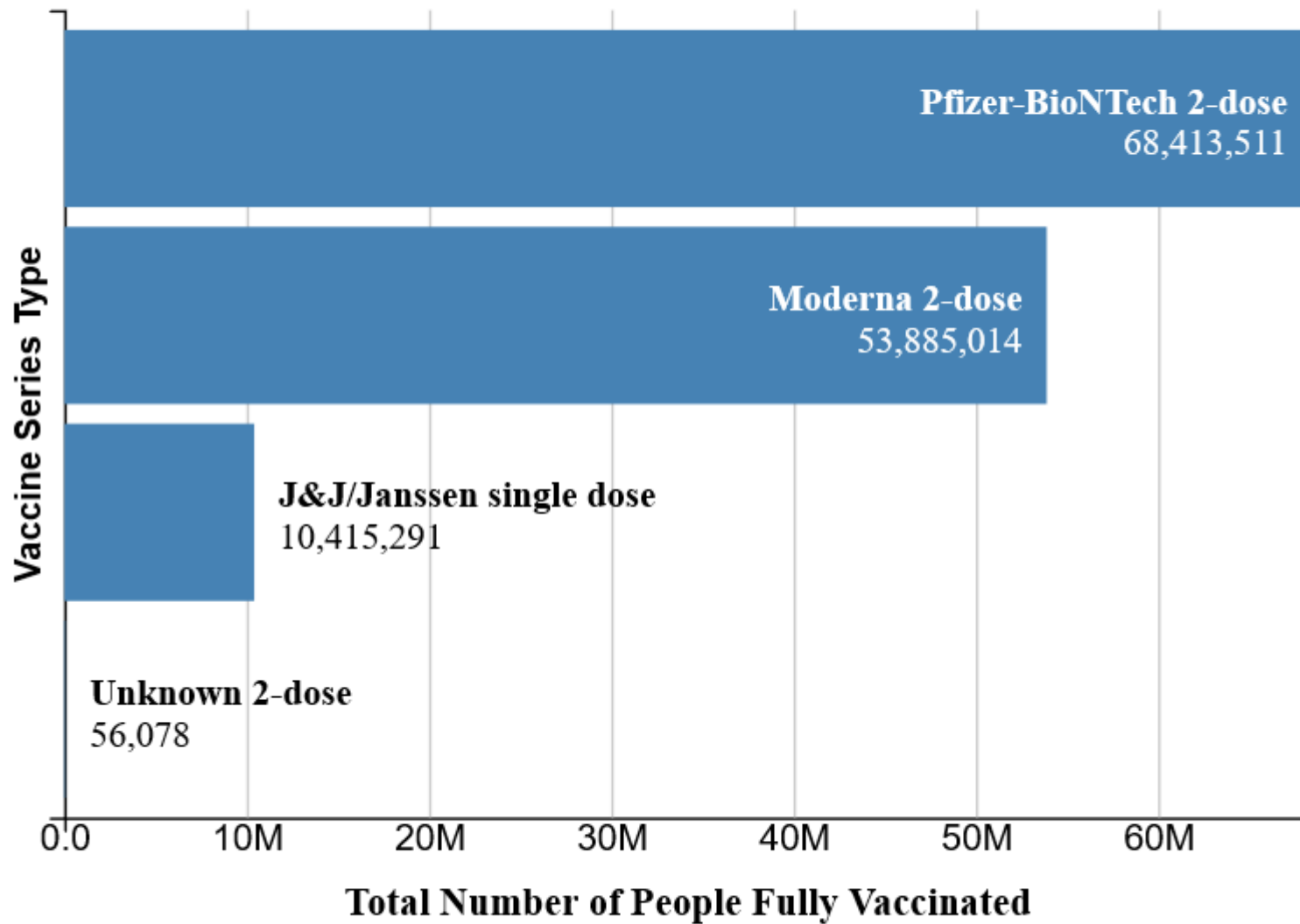

# Number of People Fully Vaccinated in the U.S. by COVID-19 Vaccine Series Type





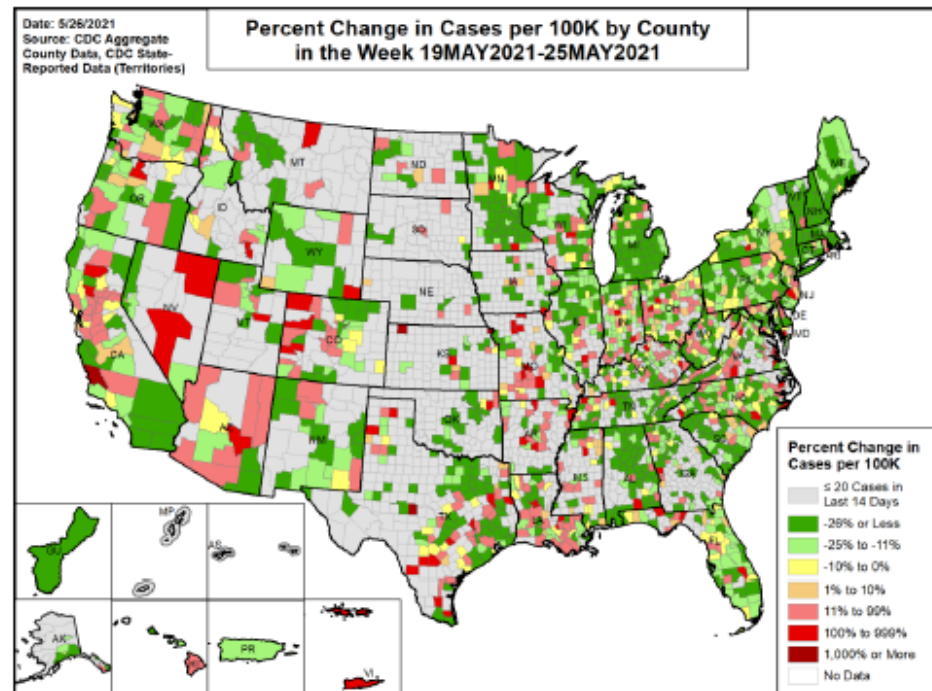
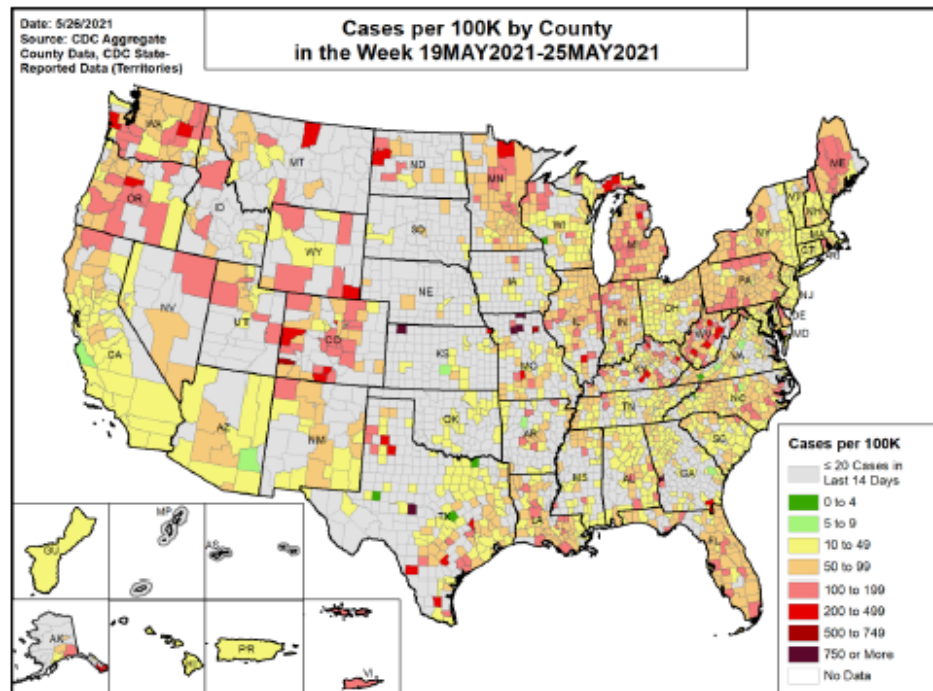

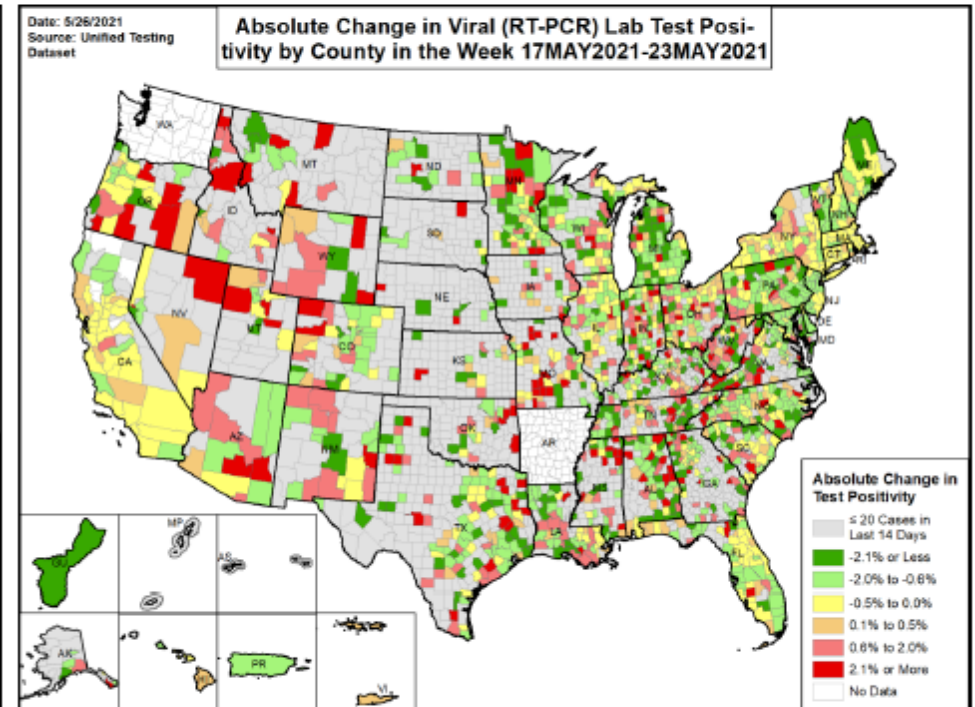
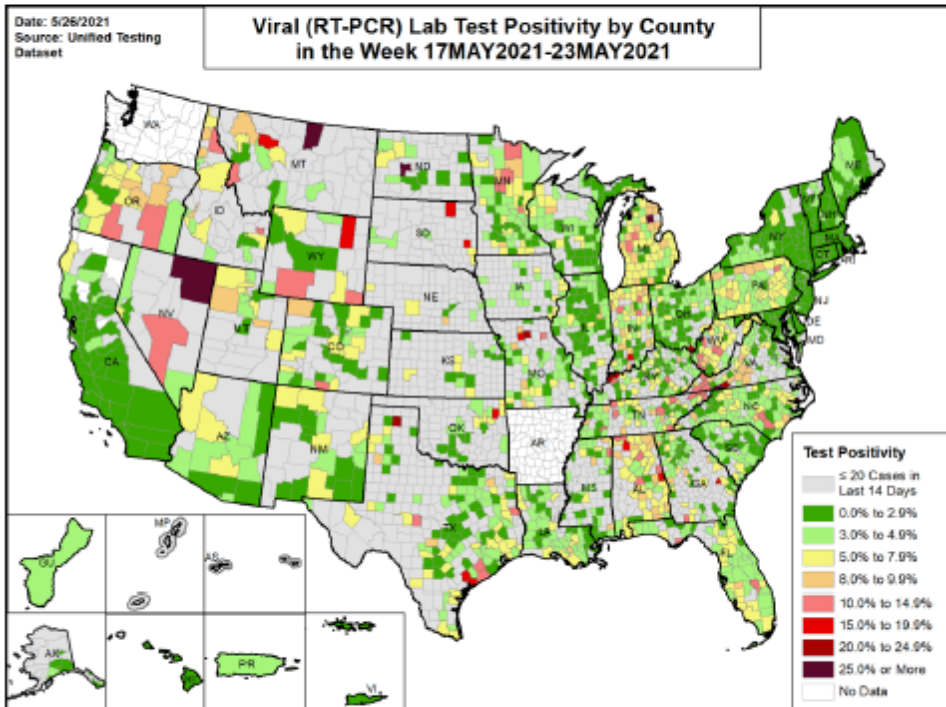

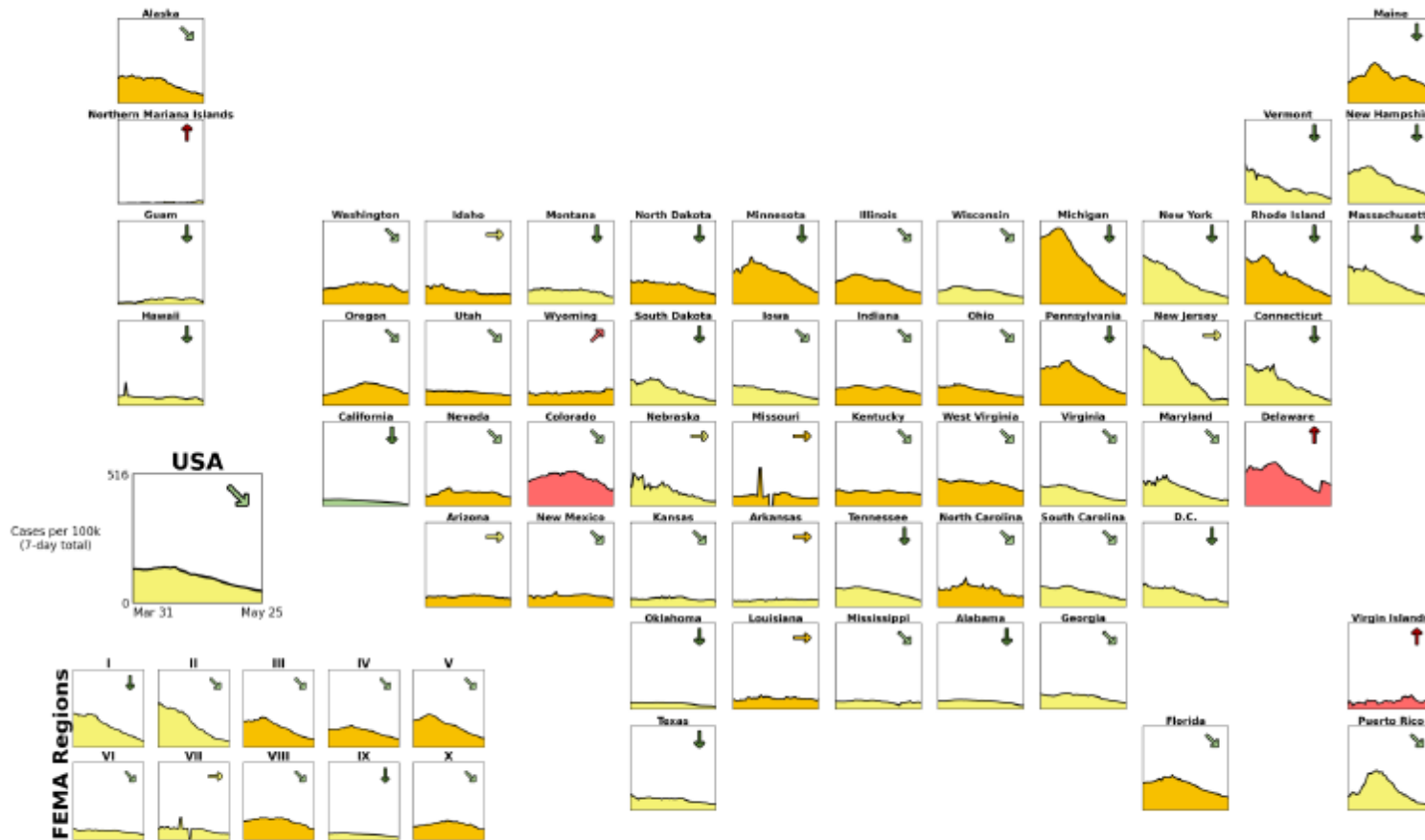

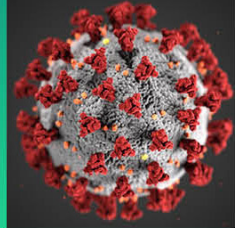
