Alpha, Beta Instead Of Britain, South Africa. Why The WHO Is Renaming COVID Variants

- The World Health Organization is hoping to simplify the way the public talks about the growing number of variants of the coronavirus. It will start assigning different letters of the Greek alphabet to each new mutation of the virus.
- The new system takes the names of new variants of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, and moves them away from what can be sometimes confusing scientific nomenclature, or shorthand that puts heavy emphasis on where the variants were first discovered.
- For example, under the new system, the B.1.1.7 variant, which was first identified in the U.K., will be known as Alpha. The B.1.351 variant, first spotted in South Africa, will be called Beta, while the variant initially found in Brazil, known as P.1, will go by Gamma.
- The new names won't officially replace the scientific names already assigned to new variants, but the WHO said it is making the change in an attempt to avoid fueling stigma toward nations where new variants arise.

Covid has killed over 5 percent of lawmakers in Congo's Parliament.

- The coronavirus has now claimed the lives of 32 lawmakers in the Democratic Republic of Congo — more than 5 percent of its Parliament — the authorities say, a reflection of how the coronavirus continues to pose a widespread threat in some parts of the world even as others increasingly resume pre-pandemic behavior.
- The toll of the outbreak in Congo is also rising as the country struggles to roll out Covid-19 vaccines, fight off other deadly diseases and grapple with the eruption of one of the world's most dangerous volcanoes.

CA May Require Masks For Indoor Workers Until 2022 [Survey]

- Cal/OSHA recommends that the state keep a July 31 deadline to update some safety rules instead of lifting them on June 15. Take our survey.
- The California Division of Occupational Safety and Health last week proposed that employers keep mask and social distancing requirements in some settings until early next year, a departure from Gov. Gavin Newsom's guidance.
- The agency also recommended Friday that the state keep a July 31 deadline to update employer pandemic safety rules instead of lifting some coronavirus restrictions on June 15.
- Employers would need to supply N95 masks for those who are not fully vaccinated and for those working alongside them indoors.
- The extended masking requirement may also require employers to track vaccination status.

Riverside County Coachella, Stagecoach Music Festivals Announced For 2022

- The Coachella Valley economy has lost millions of dollars due to the absence of both festivals amid the COVID-19 pandemic.
- It's been more than two years since the Coachella and Stagecoach music festivals were staged in the desert, but on Tuesday the 2022 dates were announced.
- The Coachella Valley Music and Arts Festival will return to the Empire Polo Club in Indio next year on the weekends of April 15-17 and April 22-24. The country music Stagecoach Festival is set for April 29-May 1 at the same venue.
- Coachella and Stagecoach, which bring upward of thousands of fans to the Coachella Valley over three weekends, were originally scheduled last spring but were postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

California cafe charges customers extra if they wear a face mask

- A poster on the window at Fiddlehead's Cafe in Mendocino read, "\$5 fee added to orders placed while wearing a face mask," SFGate reported.
- Chris Castleman, owner of the cafe, told McClatchy News that he put the sign up "because the pro-mask people have been damaging our country for too long. It's time to end the mandates and start focusing on reversing the collateral damage done by these government restrictions."
- The sign also states that customers "caught bragging" about their COVID-19 vaccines would get "an additional \$5 fee" to their bill and that the money would be donated to "local charities assisting domestic abuse victims."

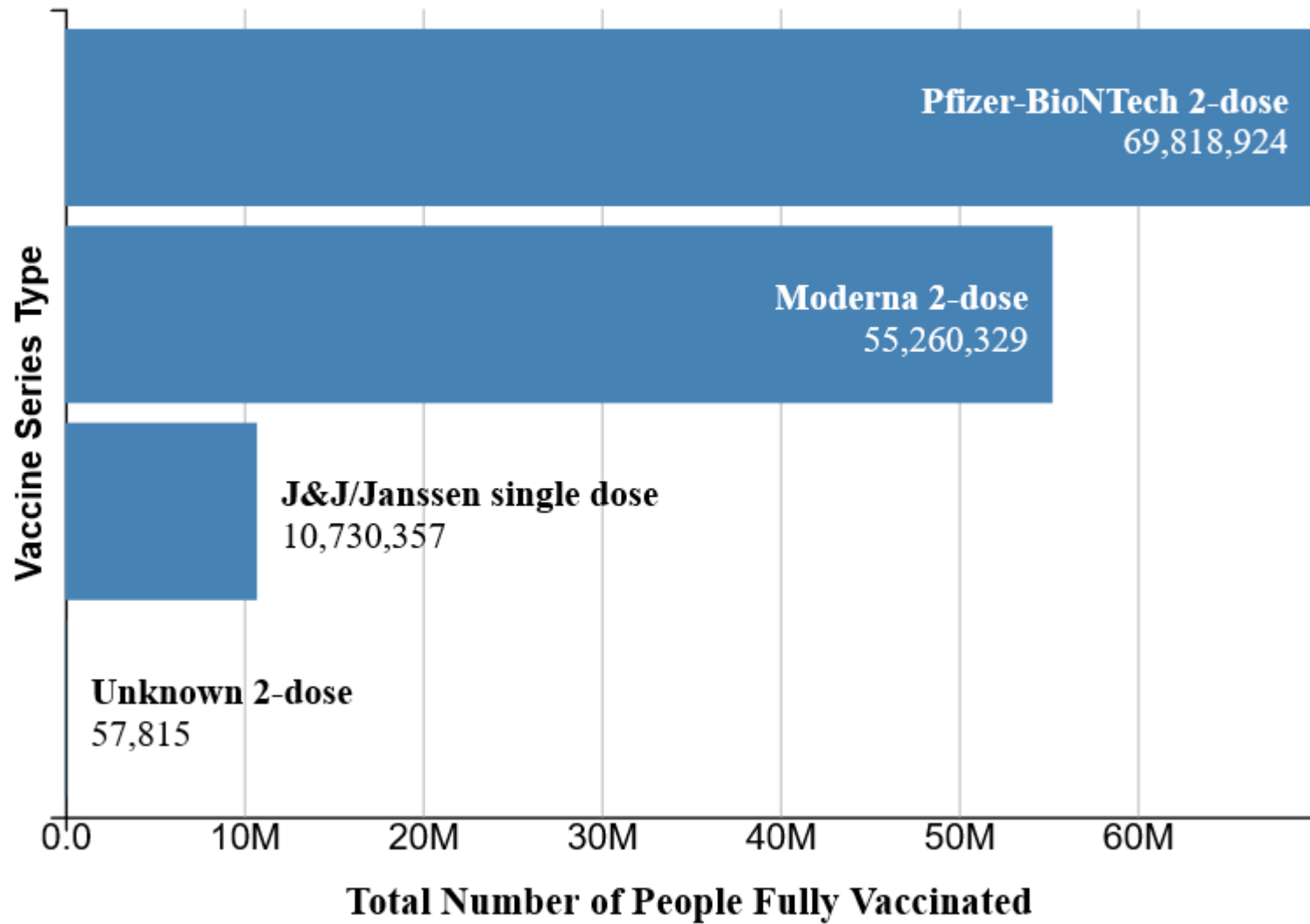

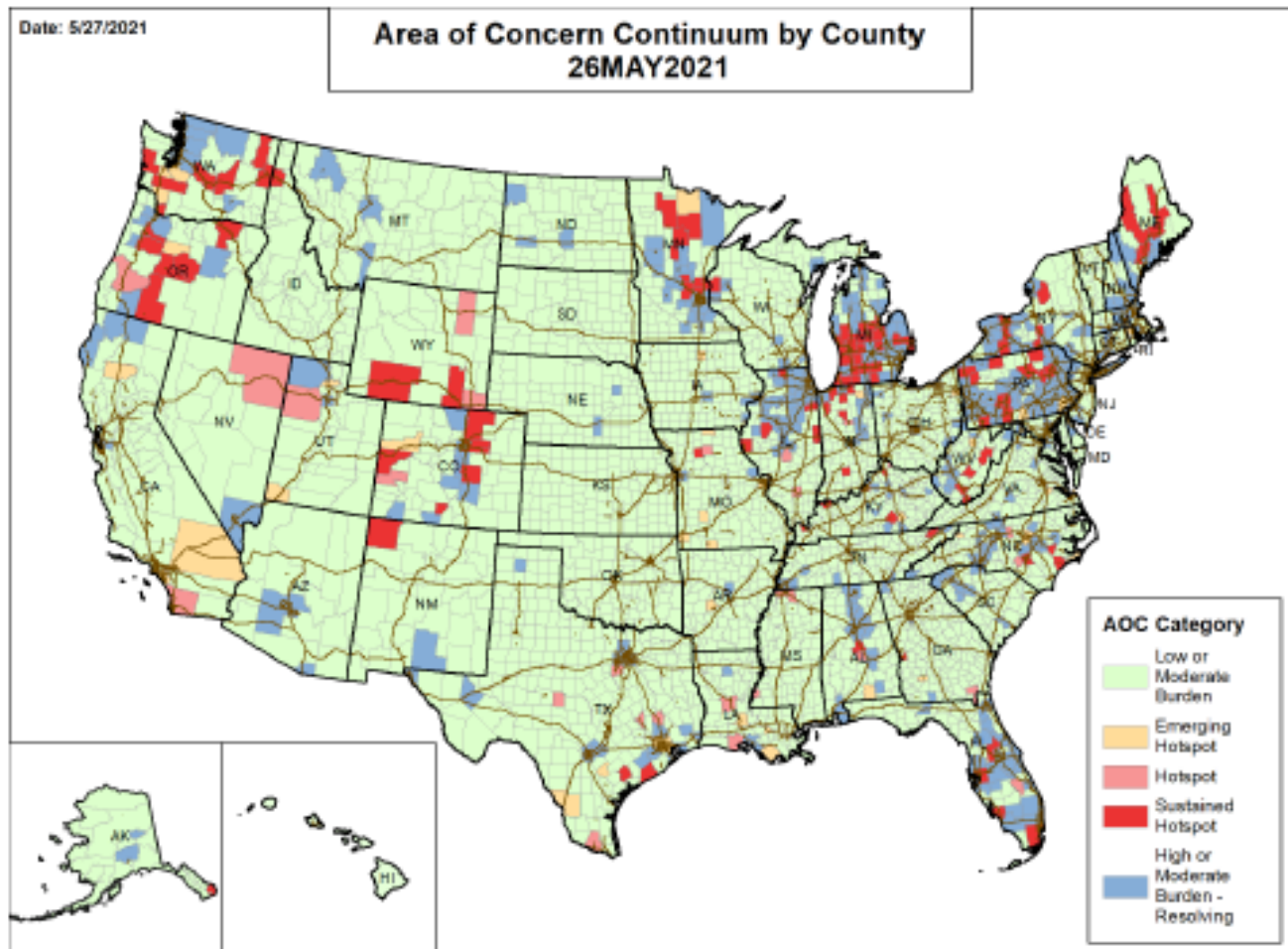
Number of People Fully Vaccinated in the U.S. by COVID-19 Vaccine Series Type

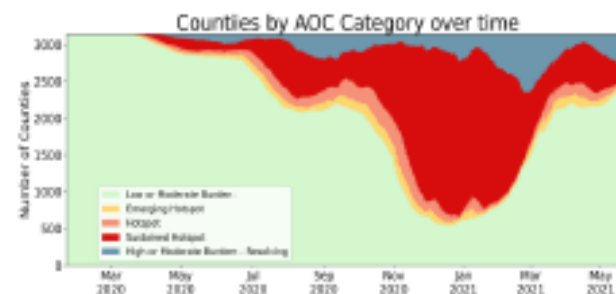
AREA OF CONCERN CONTINUUM



The Areas of Concern Continuum (AOCC) is used to describe communities as they progress through stages of the epidemic. There are 7 possible AOC classifications based on current and recent history of case and testing data for the location:

- (1) **Low Burden** – communities with minimal activity
- (2) **Moderate Burden** – communities with moderate disease activity
- (3) **Emerging Hotspot** – communities with a high likelihood to become hotspots in the next 1-7 days
- (4) **Hotspot** – communities that have reached a threshold of disease activity considered as being of high burden
- (5) **Sustained Hotspot** – communities that have had a high sustained case burden and may be higher risk for experiencing healthcare resource limitations
- (6) **High Burden – Resolving** – communities that were recently identified as hotspots and are now improving
- (7) **Moderate Burden – Resolving** – communities that have a moderate level of burden, but are demonstrating improvement

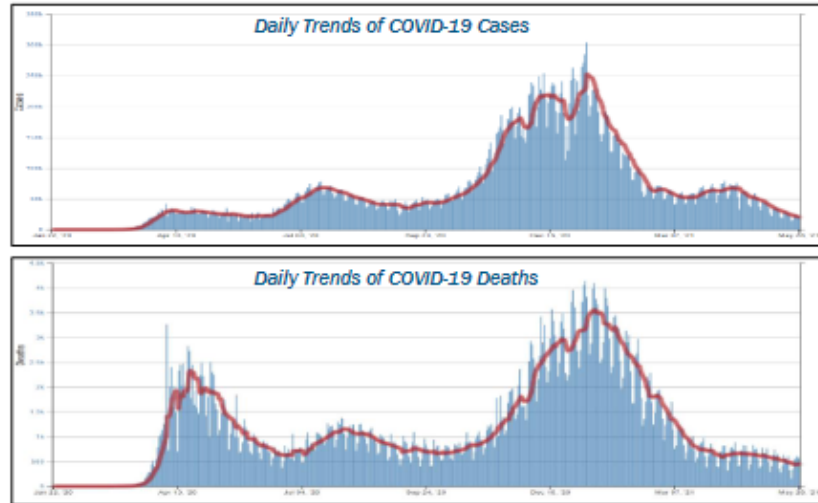

Hospitalized COVID-19 Patient Volume in Riverside County 05-27-2021

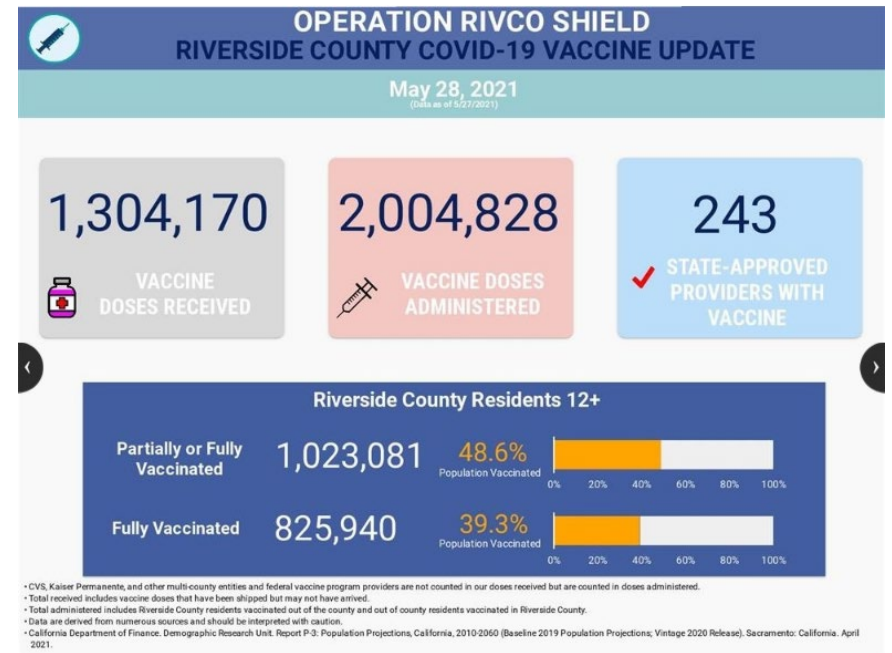
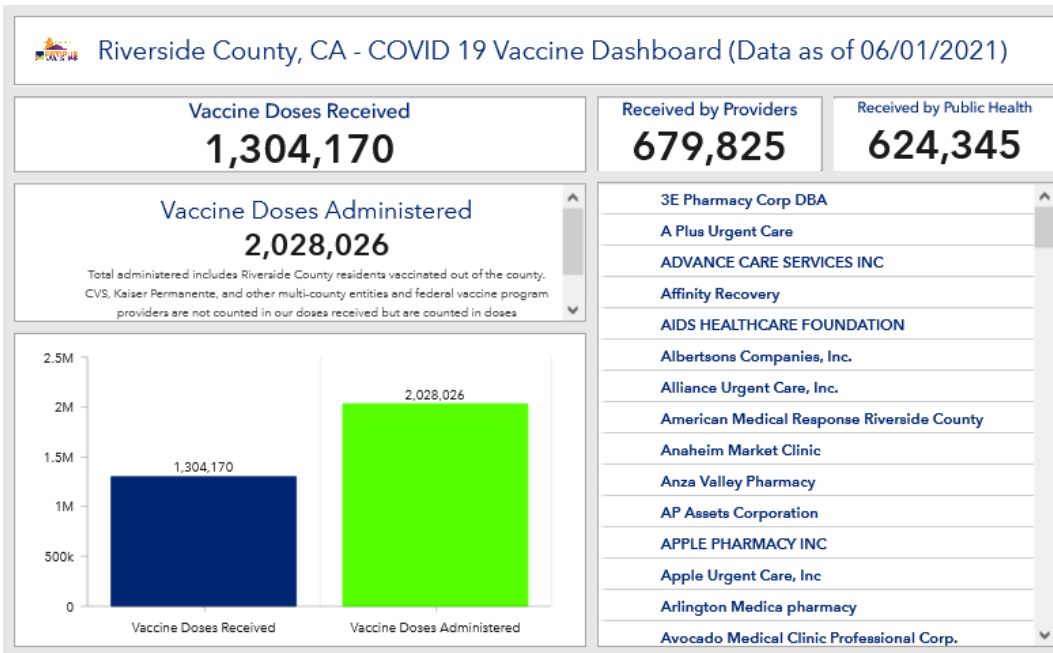

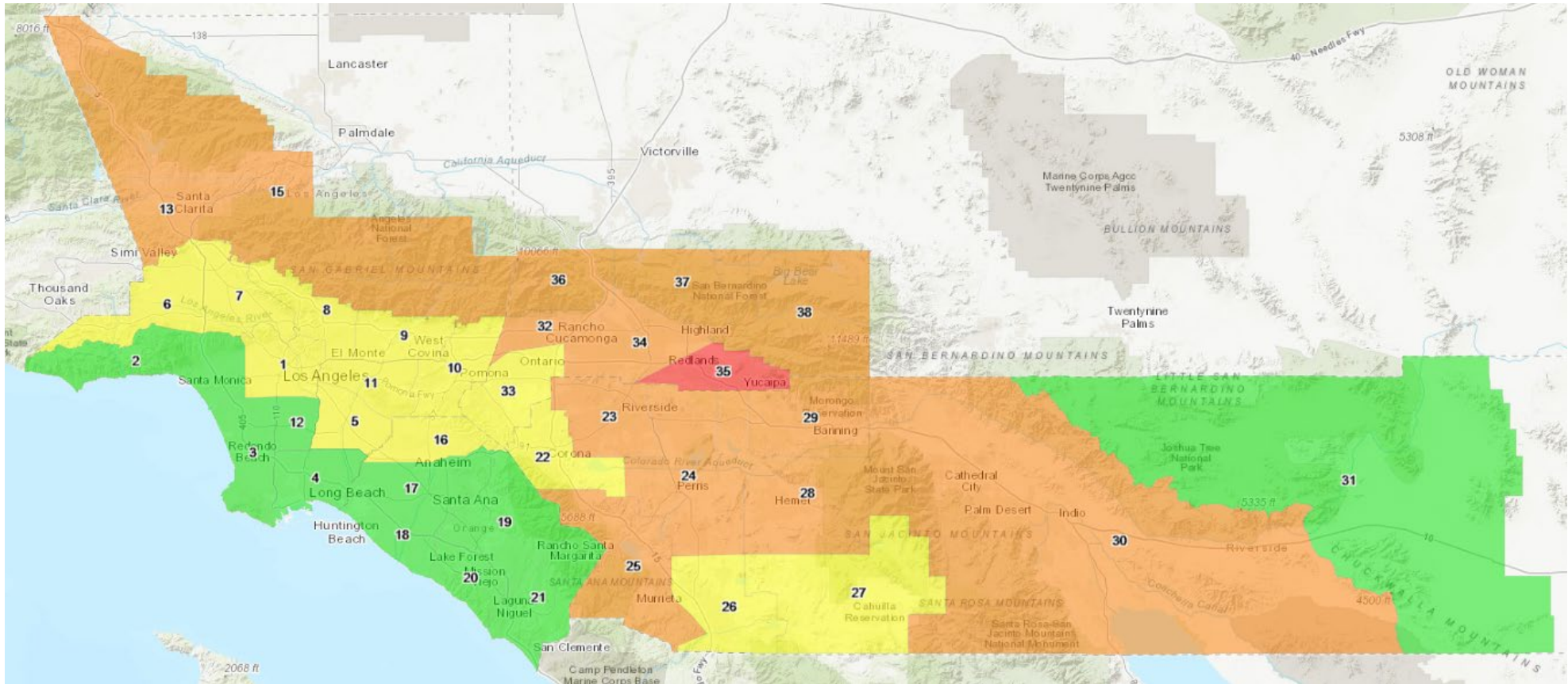

- AQI Value
- Hazardous (301-500)
 - Very Unhealthy (201-300)
 - Unhealthy (151-200)
 - Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (101-150)
 - Moderate (51-100)
 - Good (0-50)
