#### Vietnam detects a suspected new coronavirus variant that's a hybrid of the UK and India strains

- Vietnam's health ministry has detected a suspected new coronavirus variant which it said appears to be a hybrid of two highly transmissible strains.
- "A new coronavirus variant with characteristics from the existing Indian and UK variants had been detected in Vietnam for the first time," Vietnam's Minister of Health Nguyen Thanh Long told a national news conference Saturday.
- The Southeast Asian country was held up as a leading example in containing the virus thanks to an aggressive strategy of early screening of passengers at airports and a strict quarantine and monitoring program.
- But since late April, Vietnam has reported a sharp increase in Covid-19 cases. Almost half its 6,396 confirmed infections were
  reported in the past month alone, according to Johns Hopkins University data.

#### Even Vaccinated California Workers May Have to Keep Masks on

- Major California businesses expressed frustration Thursday with proposed rules by state workplace regulators that would only allow workers to go maskless if everyone in a room is fully vaccinated against the coronavirus.
- The workplace rules could remain in place into early next year even though coronavirus cases have fallen dramatically in the state after a severe winter spike and as more people get vaccinated.
- That contrasts with the state's plan to fully reopen in less than two weeks and do away with virtually all mask and social distancing requirements for vaccinated people.
- "Cal/OSHA is out of step with the rest of the country," said Andrew Sommer on behalf of the California Employers COVID-19 Prevention Coalition.
- Gov. Gavin Newsom, who established the state reopening date of June 15, was noncommittal about what he would do if the idea is adopted. Newsom has the power to override it with an executive order.
- "We'll see where they land on the rulemaking before making a determination of next steps," he said, adding that Cal/OSHA must apply its rules to a wide variety of businesses, including places like meatpacking facilities that were hit especially hard by the virus.
- The proposal, which was under consideration at a meeting of the Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board that <u>began at</u> <u>10 a.m.</u>, reflects the latest possible relaxation of tried-and-true techniques for thwarting coronavirus transmission.

#### CDC Recommendations for Isolation, Quarantine and Testing

- The following recommendations apply to non-healthcare settings
- Fully vaccinated people with COVID-19 symptoms:

Although the risk that fully vaccinated people could become infected with COVID-19 is low, any fully vaccinated person who experiences symptoms consistent with COVID-19 should isolate themselves from others, be clinically evaluated for COVID-19, and tested for SARS-CoV-2 if indicated. The symptomatic fully vaccinated person should inform their healthcare provider of their vaccination status at the time of presentation to care.

• Fully vaccinated people with no COVID-like symptoms following an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19:

Most fully vaccinated people with no COVID-like symptoms do not need to quarantine, be restricted from work, or be tested following an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19, as their risk of infection is low.

However, they should still monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 for 14 days following an exposure.

Exceptions where testing (but not quarantine) is still recommended following an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 include:







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### **VACCINATION RATES BY COUNTY**



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### **AREA OF CONCERN CONTINUUM**



The Areas of Concern Continuum (AOCC) is used to describe communities as they progress through stages of the epidemic. There are 7 possible AOC classifications based on current and recent history of case and testing data for the location:

(1) Low Burden - communities with minimal activity

(2) Moderate Burden – communities with moderate disease activity

(3) Emerging Hotspot – communities with a high likelihood to become hotspots in the next 1-7 days


(4) Hotspot – communities that have reached a threshold of disease activity considered as being of high burden

(5) Sustained Hotspot – communities that have had a high sustained case burden and may be higher risk for experiencing healthcare resource limitations

(6) **High Burden – Resolving –** communities that were recently identified as hotspots and are now improving

(7) Moderate Burden – Resolving – communities that have a moderate level of burden, but are demonstrating improvement



- 5-day formation chance: Low (20%)


