How COVID-19 Can Lead to Diabetes

- Along with the pneumonia, blood clots, and other serious health concerns caused by SARS-CoV-2, the COVID-19 virus, some studies have also identified another troubling connection. Some people can develop diabetes after an acute COVID-19 infection.
- Both studies confirmed infection of pancreatic beta cells in autopsy samples from people who died of COVID-19. Additional studies by the Jackson team suggest that the coronavirus may preferentially infect the insulin-producing beta cells.
- This also makes biological sense. Beta cells and other cell types in the pancreas express the [ACE2 receptor protein](#), the TMPRSS2 enzyme protein, and neuropilin 1 (NRP1), all of which SARS-CoV-2 [depends upon](#) to enter and infect human cells. Indeed, the Chen team saw signs of the coronavirus in both insulin-producing beta cells and several other pancreatic cell types in the studies of autopsied pancreatic tissue.

HIV patient had COVID for over 7 months, infection mutated over 30 times

- An HIV-positive woman with a persistent coronavirus infection that lasted 216 days straight had the virus mutate within her over 30 times, according to new research.
- The study, which has yet to be peer-reviewed, detailed the HIV-positive patient's more than seven month infection as part of a cohort study of 300 other people with HIV - exploring the effect of a SARS-CoV-2 infection when introduced to an immune system with a present HIV infection.
- Of the mutations found in the patient, both the UK and South African variants were noted to be present at one point or another throughout the length of the woman's infection.

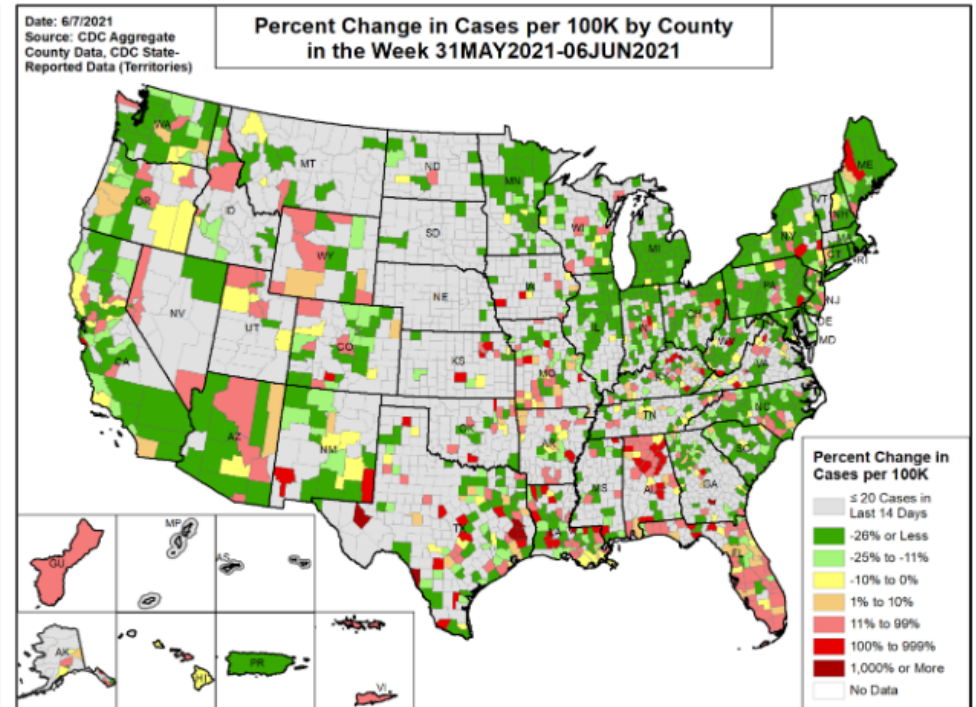

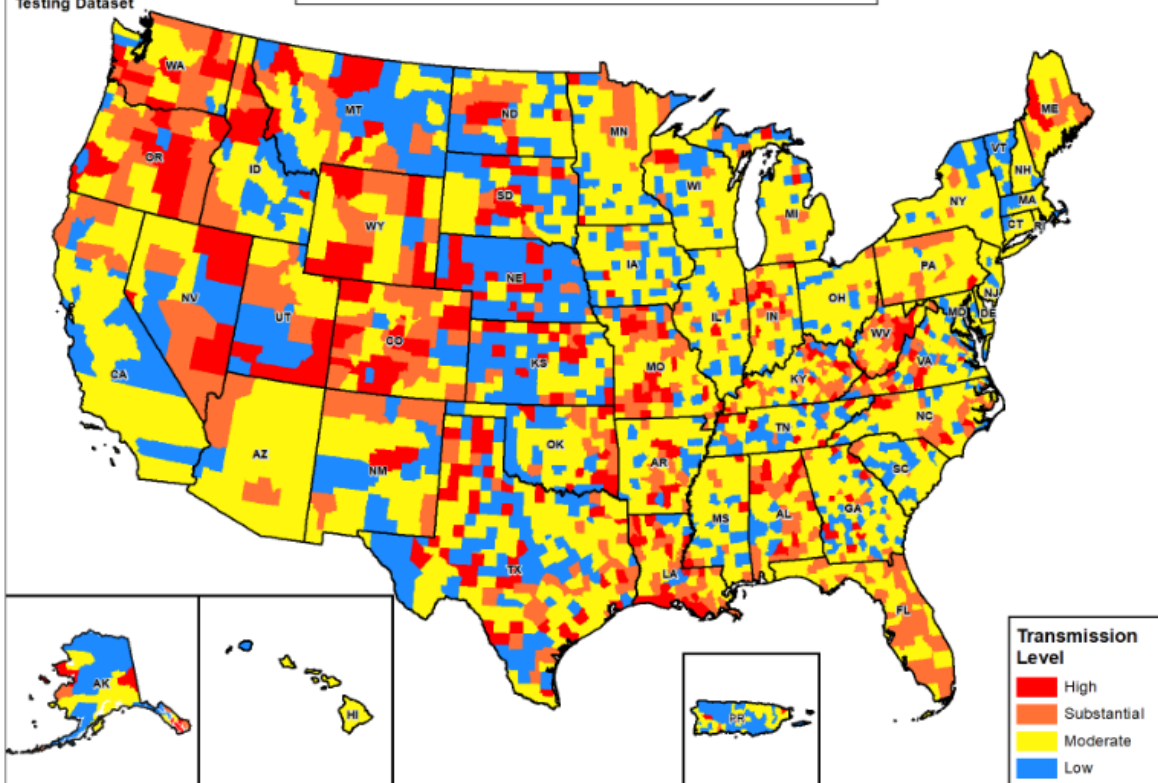

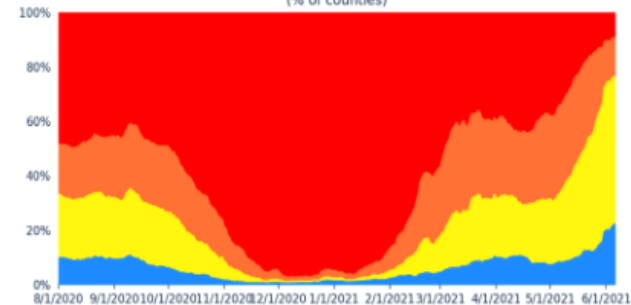

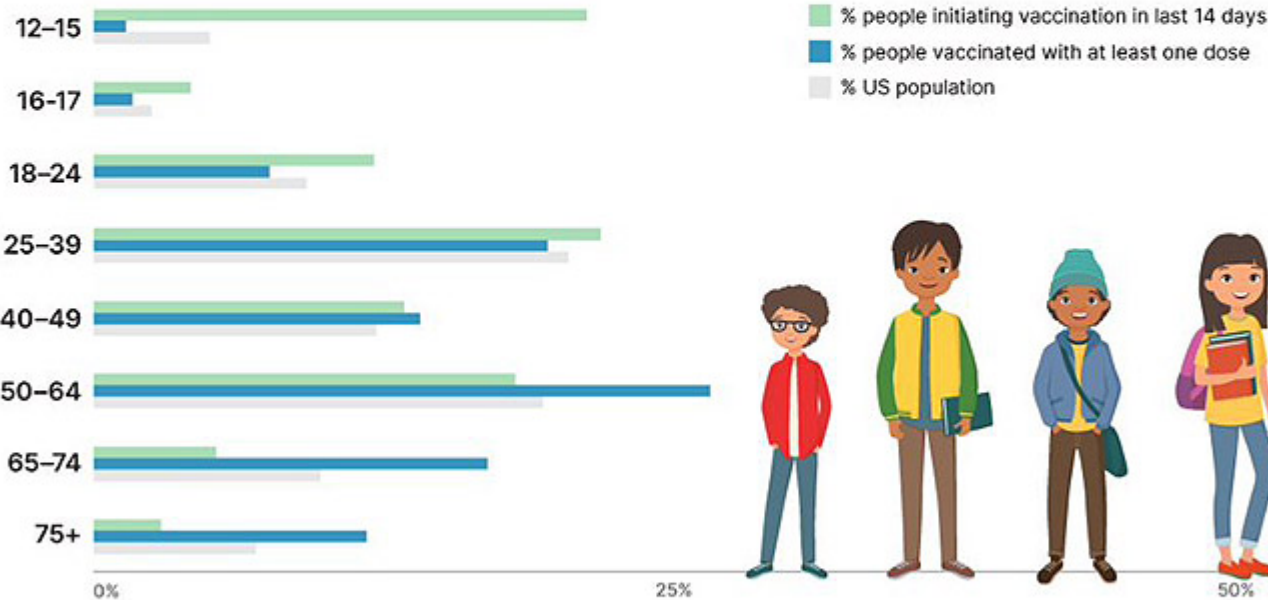

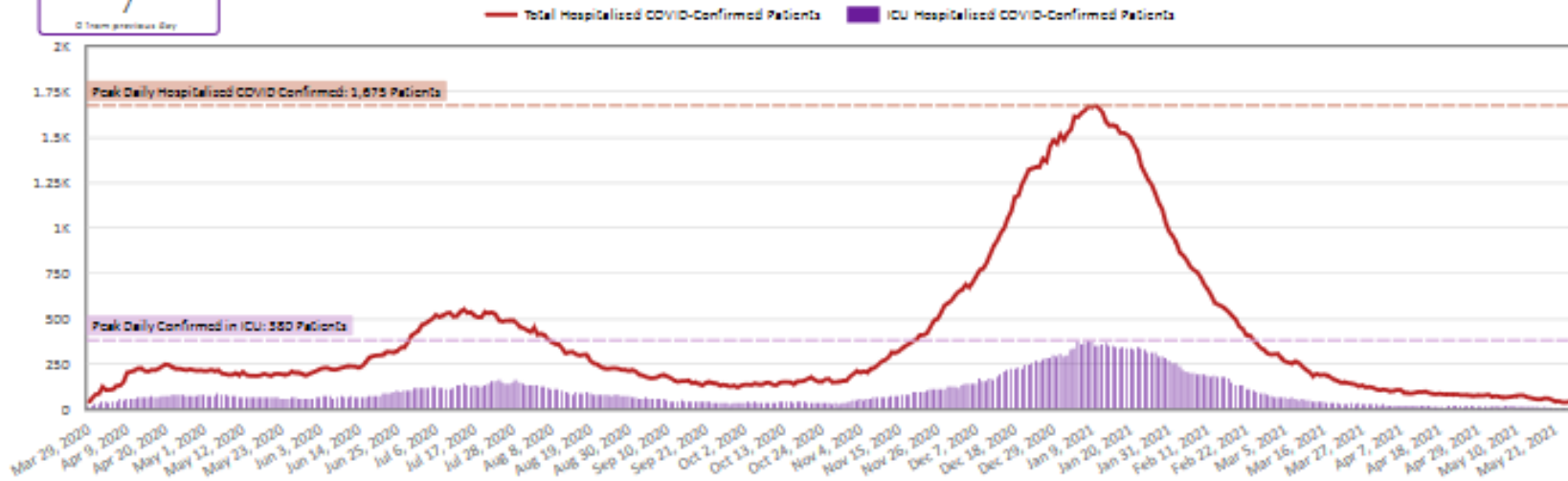

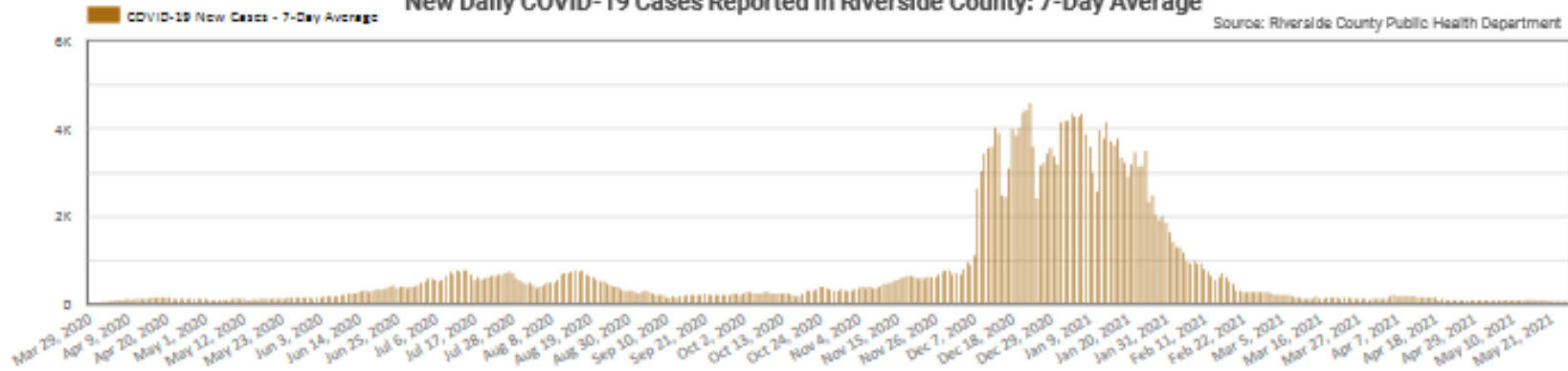

The Air Quality Index (AQI) is an index for reporting daily air quality that conveys how air pollution can affect public health. The AQI is divided into six levels of health concern:

- AQI Value**
- Hazardous (301-500)
 - Very Unhealthy (201-300)
 - Unhealthy (151-200)
 - Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (101-150)
 - Moderate (51-100)
 - Good (0-50)
