CDC says heart inflammation was higher than expected in 16- to 24-year-olds after second Covid vaccine shot, but still rare

- The number of cases of a heart inflammation condition in 16- to 24-year-olds was higher than expected after they received their second dose of Pfizer's or Moderna's Covid-19 vaccines, the CDC said.
- There have been 275 reported cases of myocarditis or pericarditis, which are inflammation conditions involving the heart, in people ages 16 to 24 as of May 31, according to a CDC presentation.

As more kids go down the 'deep, dark tunnel' of long Covid, doctors still can't predict who is at risk

- Kate learned last month from a team of doctors at Boston Children's Hospital that she is suffering from the post-Covid syndrome better known as long Covid. Her Covid-19 test was negative last fall after some teammates and coaches at her gym tested positive, but in February an antibody test ordered by her pediatrician confirmed she had been infected with Covid-19.
- Long Covid is not an adults-only phenomenon. Numbers are hard to come by, but more children and adolescents are experiencing chronic symptoms after Covid even as the pandemic ebbs in the U.S., say doctors at the few clinics devoted to caring for them. Although the disease has played out in ways that differ between adults and children, long Covid is posing the same mystery in kids as in adults.
- No one really knows how common the collection of lingering post-infection symptoms might be in adults; even less is known about its prevalence or course in children and adolescents.
- Experts told STAT they've all looked at one research paper from Rome that studied 129 patients from 2 to 18 years old, as well as data on about 9,000 children and adolescents from the U.K.'s health system. From that small base, they surmise a plausible range from 7% to 20%. In the U.S., nearly 4 million children and adolescents under 18 have tested positive for Covid.

You'll still need a mask at work after California's COVID reopening on June 15. Here's why

- California workers will still need to wear masks and practice social distancing at workplaces for at least a couple of weeks after Gov. Gavin Newsom's June 15 target to fully reopen the state's economy.
- A California state board on Wednesday withdrew proposed updates to its COVID workplace safety rule, meaning the current regulation — which requires masks to be worn at all times indoors, as well as outdoors if less than six feet away from others will stay in effect for now.
- The standards board of the state's Division of Occupational Safety and Health, commonly called Cal-OSHA, will consider updating its rule again on June 17 to better align with the state and federal guidance. Any update to the rule, if voted on by the board, will go into effect around June 28












CASE INCIDENCE IN LAST 7 DAYS AND COMPARISON TO THE PREVIOUS 7 DAYS
















- Several hundred miles S of the coasts of southern Salina Cruz, Mexico
- A tropical depression could form by the end of the week
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (near 0%)
- = 5-day formation chance: Medium (40%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- About 900 miles south-southwest of the southern tip of Baja California
- Gradual development is possible over the next few days
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (near 10%)
- = 5-day formation chance: Medium (20%)




National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall







