Secret Service says nearly 900 employees tested positive for Covid-19

- The US Secret Service says 881 employees tested positive for Covid-19 between March 1, 2020 and March 9, 2021.
- in a Tuesday statement, follows a report by Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics Washington (CREW) that analyzed
 internal records obtained through a Freedom of Information Act request detailing the infection among agents and other
 employees
- In the statement 477 special agents, 249 members of the agency's Uniformed Division and 155 other employees tested positive. CREW said the records do not specify the names or assignments of any of the employees.
- "The Secret Service's essential law enforcement mission required agency employees to remain in continuous contact with the public during the pandemic," a spokeswoman said. "This included law enforcement operations at campaign events, during mass gatherings near the White House, and at multiple National Special Security Events—to include the Presidential Inauguration."



Are California's vaccine incentives working? It's complicated

- Gov. Gavin Newsom announced yet another new vaccine incentive last week -- 50,000 free tickets to Six Flags, if you're wondering -- he made the case that the lotteries, freebies and gift cards are making a difference in the race toward herd immunity.
- "Turns out these incentives have worked," Newsom said.
 "California lays claim as one of the only states that's seen a week-over-week increase in vaccination doses." the governor cited a 22% increase in doses administered week-over-week as evidence.
- But the data shows a much more complicated story (and we'll get to that 22% number in just a bit).
- The graph shows the number of COVID-19 vaccine doses administered across the state every day since December 2020. You can also click the dropdown menu to see individual counties. California launches electronic vaccine verification system

- California is launching a new way for people to keep track of their vaccination status online.
- The state is calling it a "Digital COVID-19 Vaccine Record." People can sign up, if they'd like, by logging onto <u>myvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov</u>. You'll enter your name, birthday, email, phone number and create a 4-digit pin.
- Then you'll be sent a digital version of your vaccination record that has the same information on it as the CDC card you already have. You'll also have a QR code that can be scanned if you need to prove vaccination to enter a venue, business or country that requires it.
- "While CDPH recommends that vaccinated Californians keep their paper CDC card in a safe and secure place, we
 recognize that some people might prefer an electronic version," said California epidemiologist Dr. Erica Pan in a press
 release. "And if one of the state's nearly 20 million vaccinated Californians misplaces their paper card, the Digital COVID19 Vaccine Record provides a convenient backup."

CA REAL ID Upgrade Offered: What To Know

- Californians who renewed their driver's license or identification card during the pandemic just became eligible to get a REAL ID upgrade for free, officials said Monday.
- The fee normally associated with the REAL ID will be waived for those who qualify, the Department of Motor Vehicles said in a statement Monday.
- "We don't want Californians to pay the price for not getting a REAL ID during the pandemic," said Steve Gordon, DMV director. "While the federal government has extended the enforcement date for a REAL ID, there is no need to procrastinate. OC Phasing Out COVID-19 Data


















Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall





Fire Weather Outlook






