How A Medieval City Dealing With The Black Death Invented Quarantine

- It all started in 1377, when the Black Death was on its way to killing a third of all Europeans. Dubrovnik, the center of the Republic of Ragusa, was among that era's wealthiest merchant cities, and it wanted to maintain that status.
- But it was a small city and it couldn't afford to simply shut down like the large merchant cities of Venice or Milan did, so city leaders came up with a plan to force visitors to wait on one of the many desolate islands off the coast for 40 days before they were allowed to come ashore. But drilling down from national rates, the picture varies widely at the regional level, and from state to state.
- They called it *quarantino*, the Italian word for a 40-day period, a length of time historians believe was inspired by Biblical events.

Scientist says early coronavirus samples were deleted from NIH database

- Scientists investigating the origins of the coronavirus pandemic might be working with the wrong samples, because some early samples of the virus submitted by a Chinese researcher were deleted from a shared database, an expert in the evolution of viruses says.
- Jesse Bloom, a researcher, said he found genetic sequences taken from early coronavirus cases in China that were deleted from a US National Institutes of Health database. Examination shows some of the early cases in the Chinese city of Wuhan are different, genetically, from the variants that eventually spread to cause the pandemic.
- The sequences themselves do not shed any more light on the [renewed debate](#) about whether the virus spread naturally from animals to humans, or was the result of a laboratory leak, Bloom told CNN.
- But he said his analysis shows the samples being used to investigate the origins of the Covid-19 pandemic may not be complete.
- "I recover the deleted files from the Google Cloud, and reconstruct partial sequences of 13 early epidemic viruses," Bloom, who is helping with efforts to follow the genetic changes of the coronavirus, wrote in a [pre-print paper posted on bioRxiv](#). It has not yet been peer-reviewed.
- The NIH confirmed the sequences had been removed in June 2020 at the request of the investigator who originally submitted them in March 2020, and said it was standard practice to allow this. Geneticists have been sharing information in databases like this one since the start of the pandemic.

Lambda variant raises concern due to 'unusual' mutations

- The Lambda variant, which is believed to have been first detected in Peru about a year ago, is a new concern to scientists who say mutations could potentially be resistant to COVID-19 vaccines. The WHO said the variant's mutations could increase its transmissibility or possibly increase its resistance to "neutralizing antibodies."
- "So far we have seen no indication that the lambda variant is more aggressive," Jairo Mendez-Rico, a WHO virologist, told the Deutsche Welle. "We don't yet have enough reliable data to compare it to gamma or delta." The vaccines most used in Western countries still appear to offer strong protection against the highly contagious delta variant, first identified in India and now spreading in more than 90 other countries.

Campus Vaccine Mandates Face Legal Challenges

- More colleges and universities are now requiring students, faculty and staff who want to return to in-person classes to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.
- Campus Safety previously reported that the University of California (UC) system is mandating shots this fall, while the California State University (CSU) system will require the vaccinations once the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) fully approves at least one of the three vaccines currently available under emergency FDA authorization.
- Indiana University (IU) is also requiring students, faculty and staff be vaccinated for the coronavirus. However, eight students are suing the school, alleging the mandate violates the Fourteenth Amendment, which includes the right of personal autonomy and bodily integrity and the right to reject medical treatment, reports the IndyStar. The lawsuit even goes so far as to say IU's mandate is similar to the ethically abusive Tuskegee syphilis study conducted on Black males from 1932-1972.
- All of this comes after a Texas judge threw out a lawsuit filed by more than 100 Houston Methodist Hospital employees challenging the hospital's vaccine mandate.
- U.S. District Judge Lynn Hughes said the claim that the vaccines are "experimental and dangerous" are false and irrelevant, reports the [Associated Press](#). The judge also found another claim made by the lead plaintiff that likened the vaccine to the Nazis' forced medical experiments on World War II Holocaust victims to be "reprehensible."
- Although the Houston Methodist workers say they plan on appealing the ruling, their lawsuit's dismissal could persuade other courts to rule the same way, reports [Bloomberg Law](#).

As COVID Vaccinations Slow, Parts Of The U.S. Remain Far Behind 70% Goal

- July 4th was not the celebration President Biden had hoped for, when it comes to protecting more Americans with the coronavirus vaccine. The nation as a whole fell just short of the White House's goal, which was to give at least a first dose to 70% of adults by Independence Day.
- Currently, 67% of adult Americans have gotten either the first shot of the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine, or the one-shot Johnson & Johnson vaccine. If you include teenagers age 12-17, who are now eligible for Pfizer-BioNTech, the national percentage of those who have gotten at least one shot is 64%.
- But drilling down from national rates, the picture varies widely at the regional level, and from state to state.
- *Note this article does not take into account any that that may have acquired immunity by recovering from COVID-19.

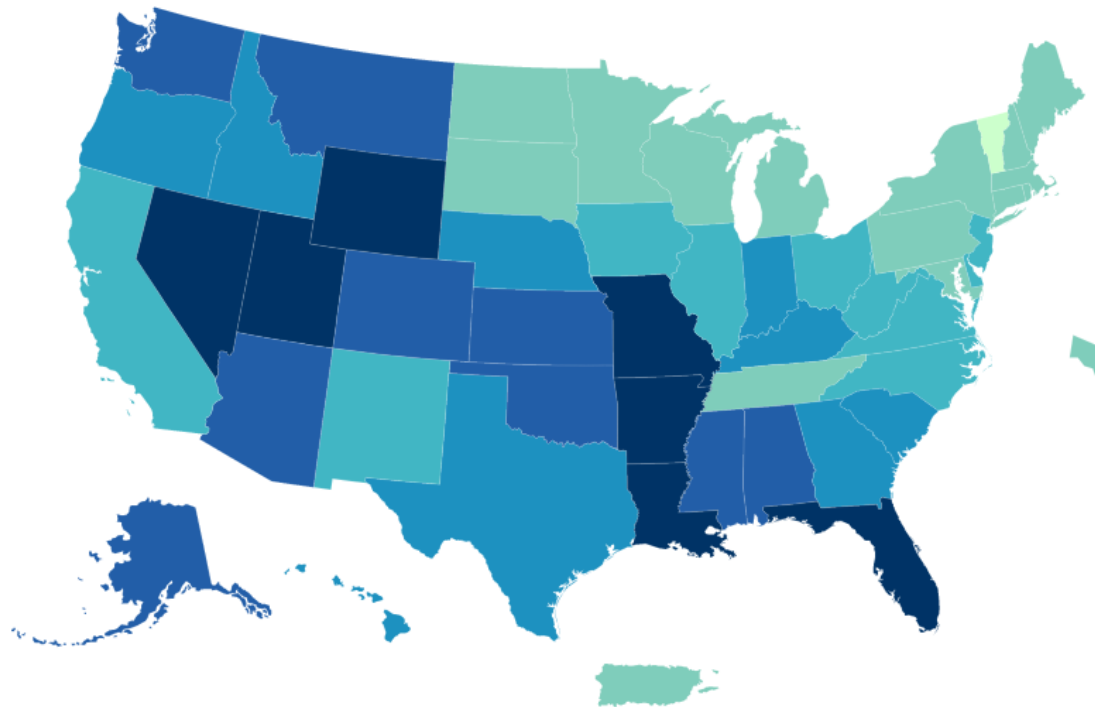

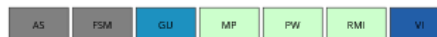

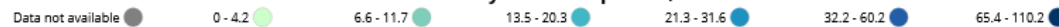
US COVID-19 7-Day Case Rate per 100,000, by State/Territory

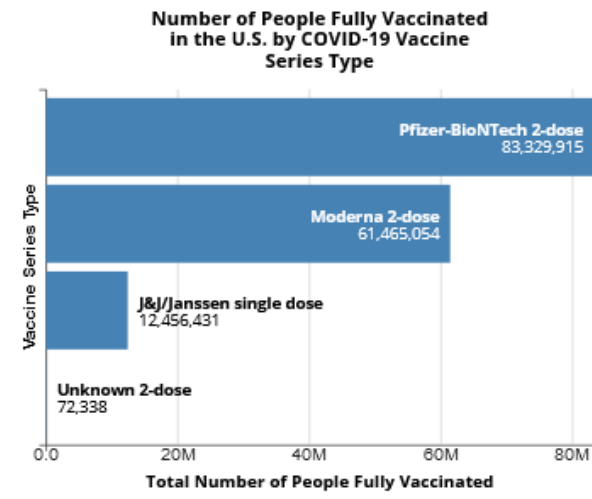

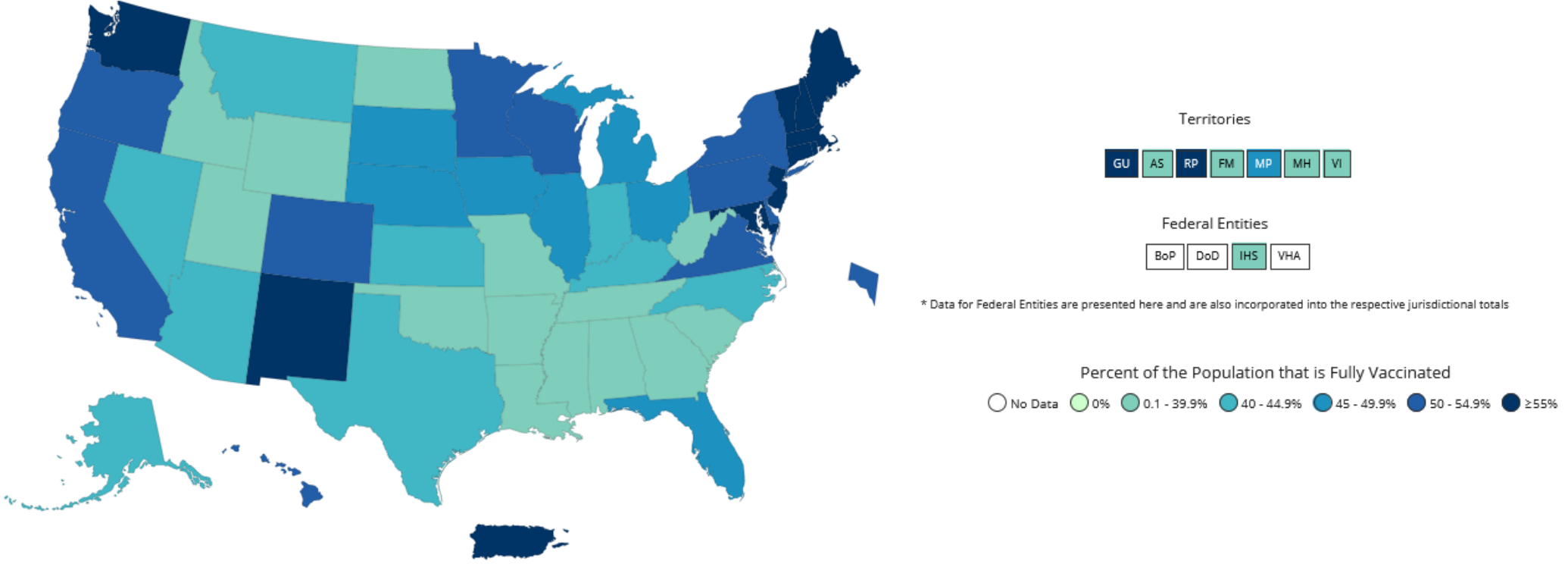

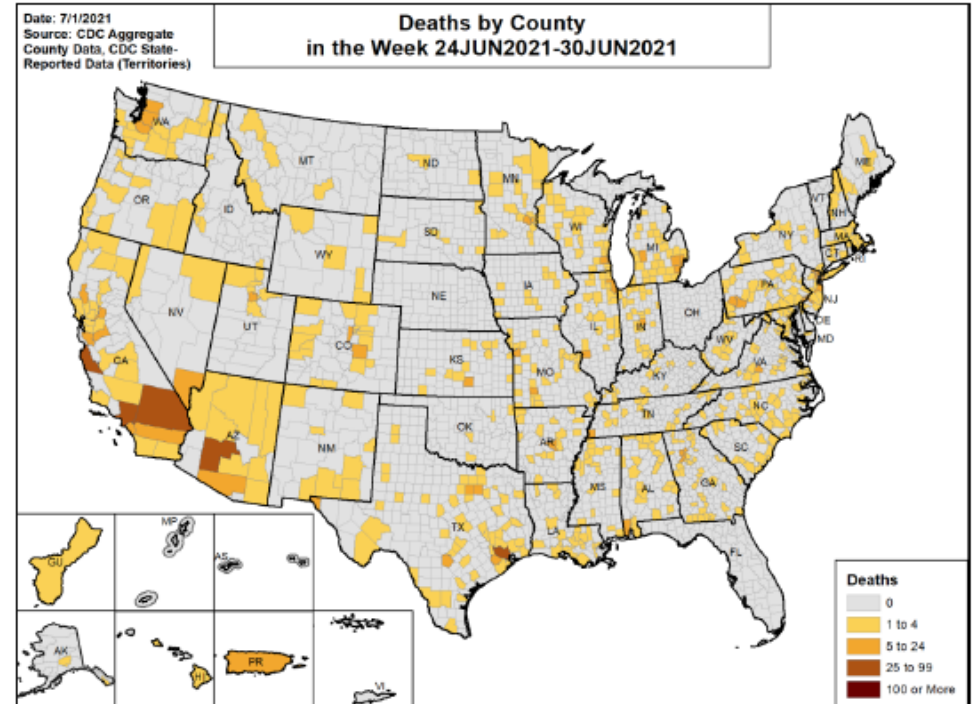

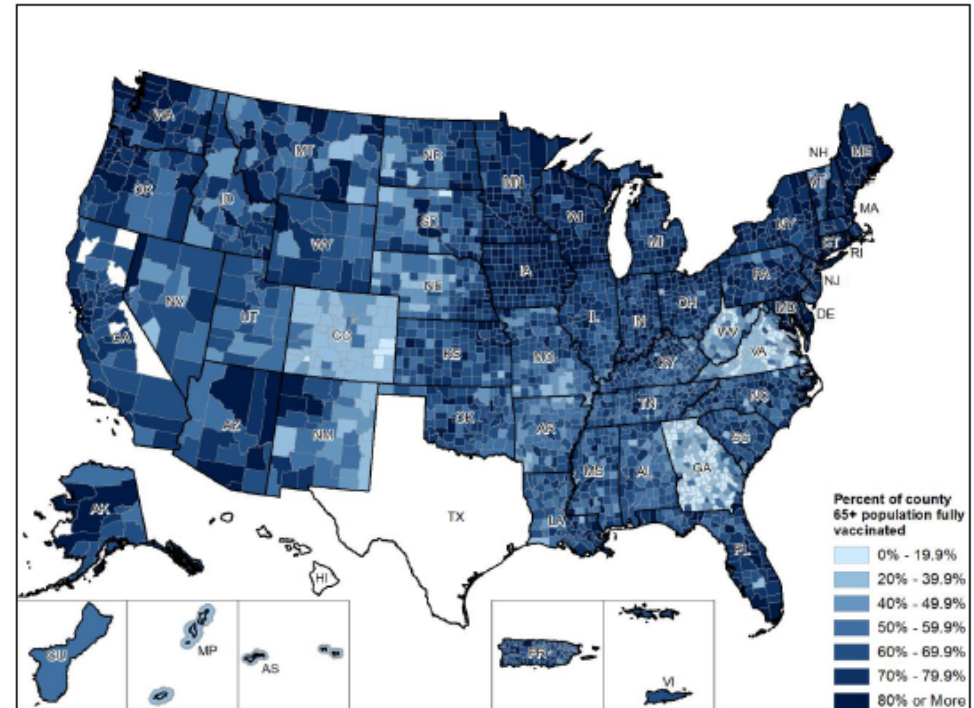

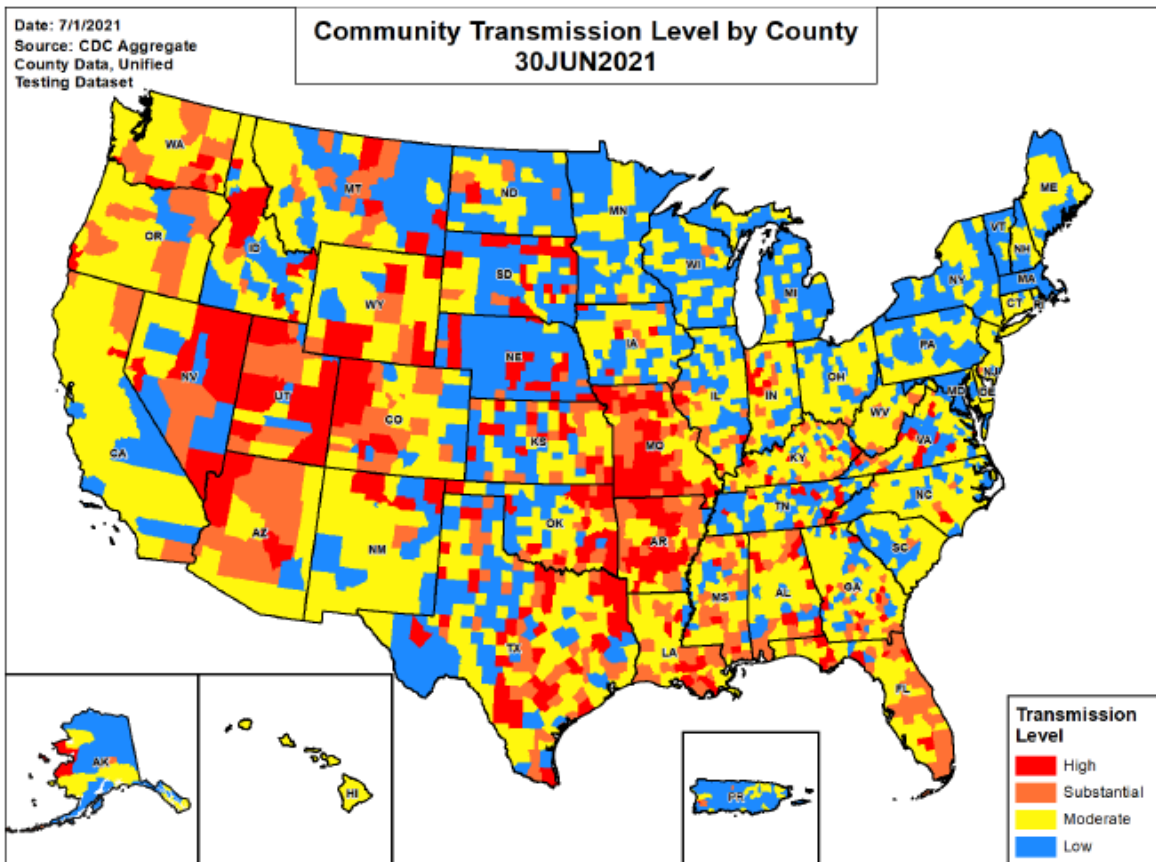

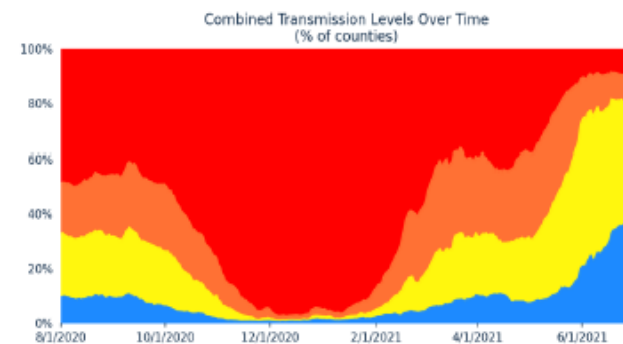

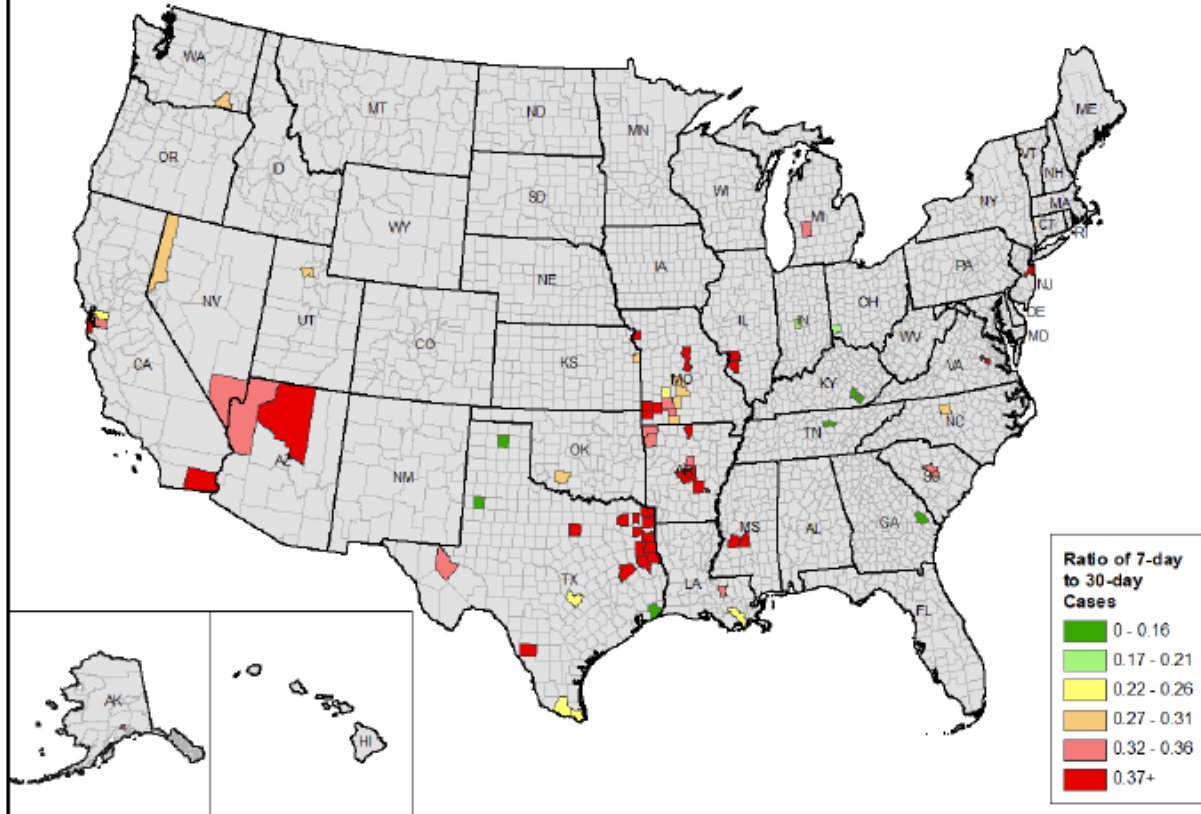
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AREA OF CONCERN CONTINUUM - RAPID RISER COUNTIES

Counties with Rapid Rise in Cases in the Last 14 Days



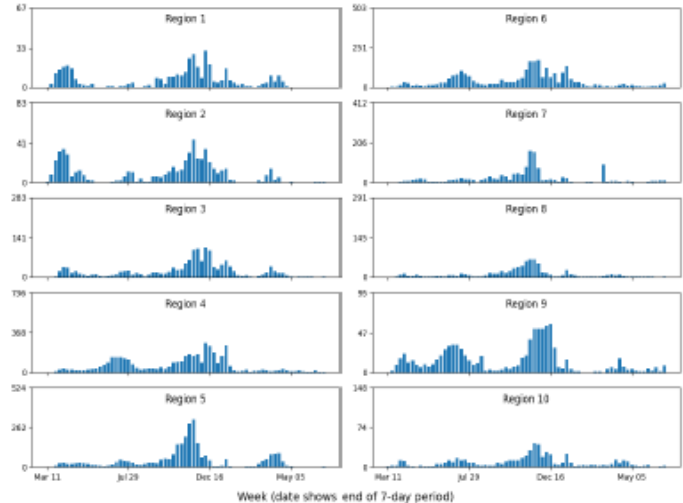
This map shows counties that have seen a rapid rise in cases within the last 14 days by meeting the following Rapid Riser County criteria:

- >100 new cases in last 7 days
- >0% change in 7-day incidence
- >-60% change in 3-day incidence
- 7-day incidence / 30-day incidence ratio >0.31
- one or both of the following triggering criteria:
 - (a) >60% change in 3-day incidence,
 - (b) >60% change in 7-day incidence

The color indicates *current* acceleration in cases (ratio of 7-day to 30-day cases). Counties in **light red** and **red** are continuing to see accelerating cases in the most recent week, while those in **dark green** and **green** may have seen declines in the most recent week.

The bar charts below show the history of rapid riser counties by FEMA region and week, indicating when different geographic areas have seen the greatest acceleration in cases.

 (vertical axis scaled to number of counties in region)



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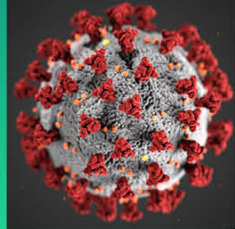

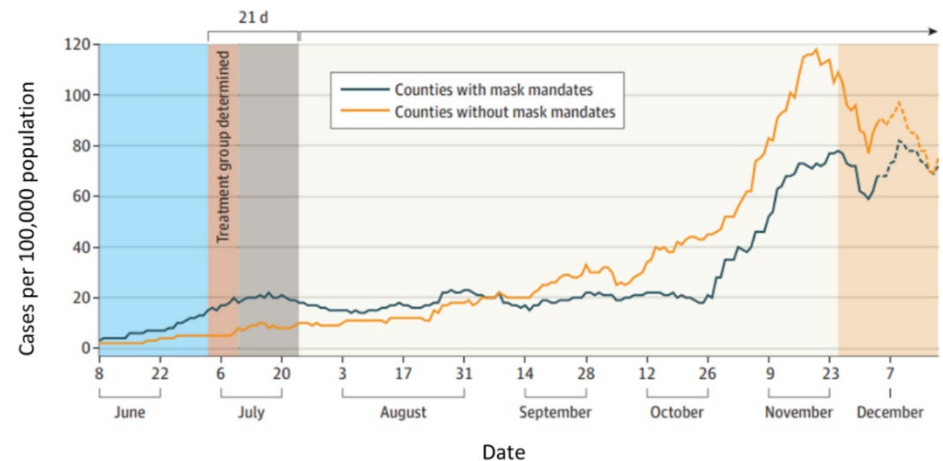

Hospitalized COVID-19 Patient Volume in Riverside County 05-27-2021

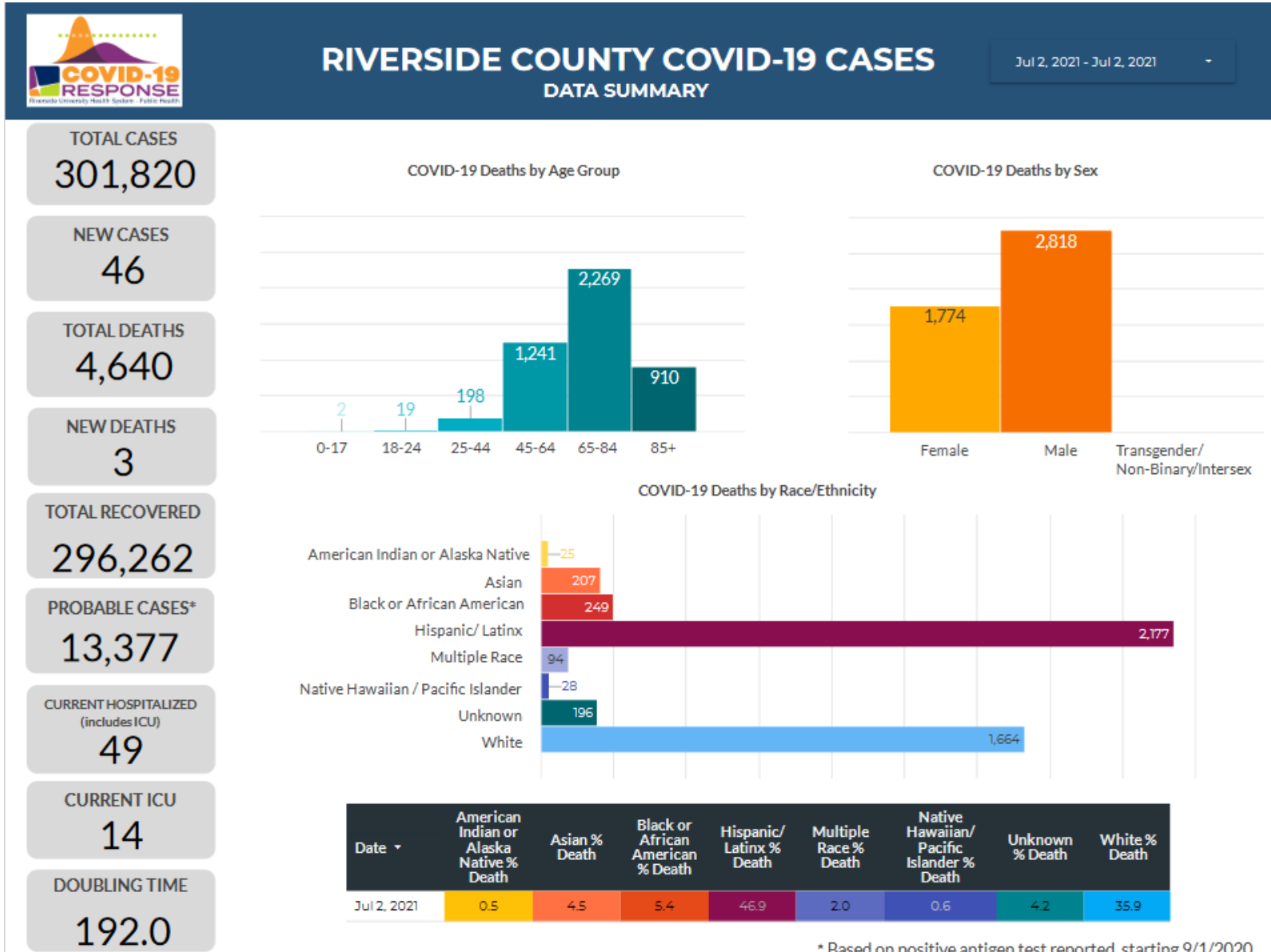

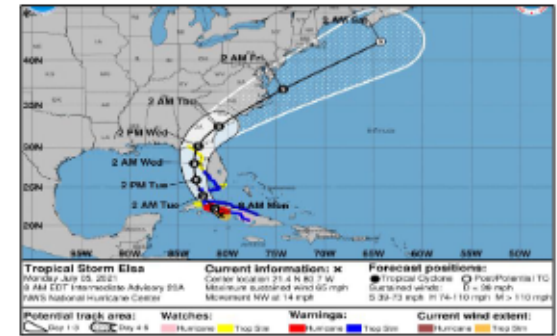

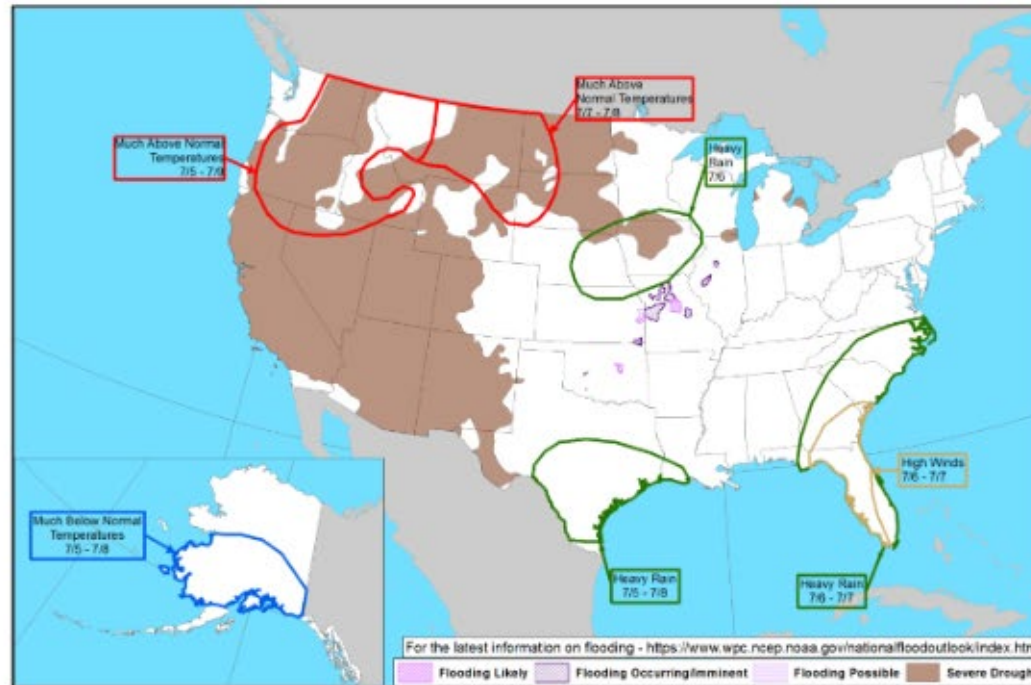

Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

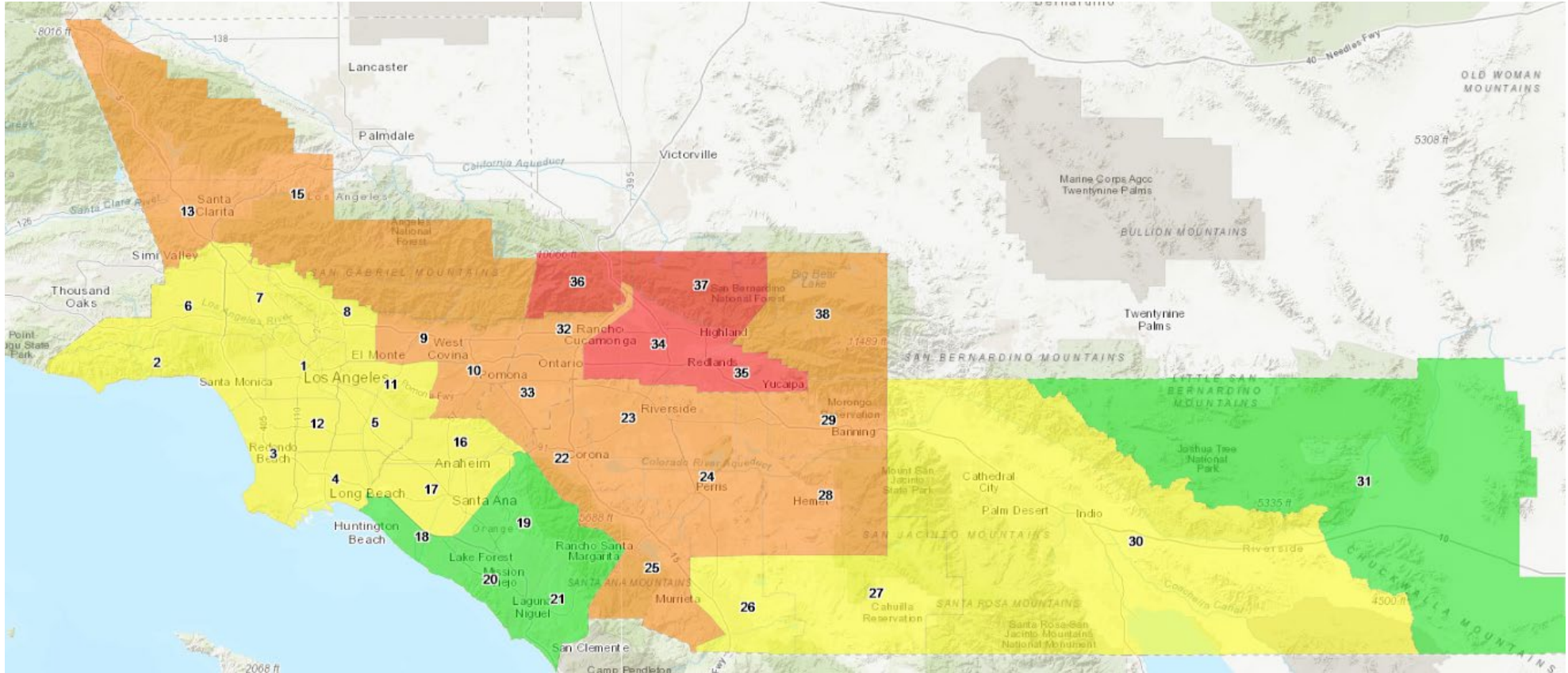

- AQI Value
- Hazardous (301-500)
 - Very Unhealthy (201-300)
 - Unhealthy (151-200)
 - Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (101-150)
 - Moderate (51-100)
 - Good (0-50)
