US Expected to Approve Third Shot of COVID-19 Vaccines for Some Americans

- News outlets say the FDA will likely approve a third shot of either the two-dose Pfizer or Moderna vaccine as soon as Thursday. An advisory panel of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention will meet Friday to discuss giving booster shots of COVID-19 vaccines for some people with compromised immune systems.
- Scientists have been debating whether to offer extra doses of COVID-19 vaccines to certain immunocompromised people, such as organ transplant recipients or cancer patients. A recent study by Johns Hopkins University found that many transplant patients had little to no antibody protections after receiving the full two doses of a vaccine, but a third shot boosted their antibody protections.
- Anywhere between 3 million and 9 million Americans have weakened immune systems, either due to disease or because of medications they take.

Teachers unions split on endorsing vaccine mandates

- The nation's two major teachers unions on Thursday took differing stances on coronavirus vaccine mandates, highlighting the challenges facing city officials and administrators as children head back to school.
- The National Education Association (NEA), the country's largest teachers union, endorsed a policy of mandatory vaccination or regular testing for educators.
- But the American Federation of Teachers (AFT) stopped short of a full endorsement, and instead endorsed a policy of negotiating potential mandates with employers.

203 cases of COVID-19 linked to Chicago's Lollapalooza

- Chicago health officials on Thursday reported 203 cases of COVID-19 connected to Lollapalooza, casting it as a number that was anticipated and not yet linked to any hospitalizations or deaths.
- The four-day music festival, which started two weeks ago, drew about 385,000 people to a lakefront park. Critics questioned holding the event during the pandemic. Footage showed tightly packed crowds at concerts and on public transportation with few masks in sight. Last year's festival was canceled because of COVID-19.
- But Mayor Lori Lightfoot and other officials have defended the decision, saying there were safety protocols in place. Festival goers had to show proof of vaccination or a negative COVID-19 test and city officials said about 90% were vaccinated.
- "Nothing unexpected here," Department of Public Health Commissioner Dr. Allison Arwady said at a news conference. "No sign of a 'superspreader event'. But clearly with hundreds of thousands of people attending Lollapalooza we would expect to see some cases."

Florida governor deploying rapid-response team to fight Covid-19 surge

- As the Delta variant drives a surge of Covid-19 cases in Florida, a rapid-response unit will be deployed to administer monoclonal antibody treatments to residents infected with the virus, Gov. Ron DeSantis said Thursday.
- "This is the most effective treatment that we've yet encountered for people who are infected with Covid-19," DeSantis said. "This, applied early and properly, has the ability to reduce your likelihood of being hospitalized."
- The process will begin with referrals from the health systems, but the state is looking to move to allowing individuals to make appointments, he said. The intention is to expand the model to other parts of the state, the governor said.
- The state will also be deploying strike teams to long-term care facilities as well, DeSantis said, and the state "is going to bring in a lot more Regeneron into Florida." Riverside Community College District requiring coronavirus vaccinations for students, staff

- The district board of directors on Tuesday, August 10, resolved to request vaccinations to delay the spread of the disease. coronavirus, Thanks to the more transmissible Delta variant, is booming in California and other countries.
- "We need to maintain the protection of all students, all faculty and staff, all staff, and those who set foot on our campus," said Board President Mary Figueroa in a news release. I did. "That is our responsibility."
- The district operates Riverside City College, Moreno Valley College and Norco College.
- According to Chris Clark, Executive Director of the District's External Relations and Strategic Communications Department, the California community college system was left to the individual district to decide whether vaccination was required. ...
- More online and hybrid courses will be offered to accommodate vaccinated and unvaccinated students, according to district
 officials. These courses will be added to the fall semester class schedule, and freshmen and returnees will be able to start checking
 for new offerings next week.
